AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 28th day of March, 1923, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may make regulations prescribing all matters which by the said Act are required or permitted to be prescribed or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to the said Act; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth bereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, make the Regulations set out in the Schedule hereto, and doth declare that the said Regulations shall come into force on the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette:—

### SCHEDULE.

Regulations.

1. All onions imported into Western Australia from any State or part of the Commonwealth must be in new and sound bags, with the full name and address of the grower of the onions steneilled (not written) thereon in not less than two-inch letters,

- 2. All such onions shall have been inspected at the port or place of export by a competent officer duly appointed by the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State, and be accompanied by the following certificate:—
  - I hereby certify that I have duly inspected the below-mentioned onions, and have found them to be, to the best of my knowledge, clean and free from any disease mentioned in the note endorsed hereon.

Onion Rust (Puccinia allii, D.C.).

- 3. All onions imported into Western Australia shall be again inspected at Fremantle or at any other approved place of entry by an Inspector of the Western Australian Department of Agriculture, and if found to be free from all the diseases specified in the endorsement on the certificate mentioned in the preceding regulation may be removed on payment of the inspection free prescribed by Regulation 8.
- 4. In the event of any of the said diseases being found on inspection in any stage of development on any part of a consignment the whole of such consignment shall be condemned by the Inspector at the place of inspection, and no part of such consignment shall be allowed to be removed from the wharf or other place of inspection, but the whole consignment shall be forthwith re-shipped or sent to a place or port beyond Western Australia, and if not so shipped or sent shall be destroyed by the Inspector at the expense of the consignme.

Provided that-

- (a) Onions found upon inspection at Fremantle or other approved place of entry to be only slightly affected by any of the said diseases other than onion fly or onion maggot, may be resorted under the supervision of an inspector, if in the opinion of the Officer-in-Charge of the inspection work it is advisable to do so.
- (b) When sorted onions which are free from disease may be disposed of for consumption; the diseased portion of the consignment shall be re-shipped from the State of Western Australia or destroyed at the expense of the consignee as soon, and in such a way as directed by the Inspector.
- (e) A fee at the rate of 2s. (two shillings) per hour shall be paid by the consignee to the Department of Agriculture to cover the cost of supervising the work of re-sorting in addition to the fee as prescribed in Regulation 8.
- 5. The onions on arrival at the port or place of entry shall, at the expense of the importer, be delivered direct into a shed set apart by the Department of Agriculture for inspection, and such other treatment as may be decided upon from time to time by the Inspector.
- 6. The importer or his agent shall, at the importer's expense, provide the necessary labour to open the bags, and to re-bag the onions on inspection, and in every way facilitate the inspection.

- 7. Any consignment of onions being or having been in contact with any diseased or prohibited consignment of onions may be destroyed, disinfected, or otherwise dealt with, at the expense of the importer, as the Inspector may direct.
- 8. A fee of two shillings and sixpence for every ton or portion of a ton of imported onions shall be charged to defray the cost of inspection and of carrying these Regulations into effect.
- 9. If any importer or his agent fails or neglects to observe these Regulations, or to carry out the requirements of any Inspector aforesaid, the Inspector may destroy the onions or perform the work at the expense in all things of the importer.
- 10. All onions for use Eastward of No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence brought into the State of Western Australia by means of the Trans-Australian Railway, shall be admitted as far as Kalgoorlie, and there inspected by an Officer appointed by the Department of Agriculture before re-consignment.
- 11. All onions for use Westward of No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence brought into the State of Western Australia by means of the Trans-Australian Railway shall be admitted as far as Kalgoorlie and then be re-loaded at Kalgoorlie into covered railway vans, which shall be sealed to the satisfaction of an officer or representative of the Department of Agriculture before dispatch, and such seal shall be broken only by an officer of the Department of Agriculture at the place of destination.
- 12. All onions as described in Regulation 11 shall be inspected at Perth by an Inspector of the Department of Agriculture under and subject to the Regulations relating to the inspection of onions imported by sea, which in all other respects shall apply.
- 13. Any person who contravenes these Regulations by act or omission shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty-five pounds.
- 14. These Regulations may be cited as "The Plant Diseases (Onion) Regulations, 1923."

## Regulations.

- 1. All potatoes imported pursuant to the exception contained in the proclamation made this day under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," must be in new and sound bags with the full name and address of the growers of the potatoes stencilled thereon in not less than two-inch letters (not written).
- 2. All such potatoes aforesaid shall have been inspected at the port or place of export by a competent officer duly appointed by the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State, and be accompanied by the following certificate:

them to be, to the best of my knowledge, clean and free from any disease mentioned in the note endorsed here-

- 3. All potatoes imported into Western Australia under the conditions aforesaid shall be again inspected in Fremantic, or at any other approved place of entry, by an inspector of the Western Australian Department of Agriculture, and, if found to be free from all the diseases mentioned in the said proclamation, may be removed therefrom on payment of inspection fees as prescribed in Regulation 8.
- 4. In the event of any of the said diseases being found in any stage of development on any part of a consignment, the whole of such consignment shall be condemned by the inspector in Fremantle or other place of entry, and no part of such consignment shall be allowed to be removed from the wharf or other place of entry; but the whole consignment shall be forthwith re-shipped to a place or port beyond Western Australia, and if not so shipped shall be destroyed by the inspector at the expense of the consignee.

Provided that-

- (a) potatoes found upon inspection at Fremantle or other approved place of entry to be only slightly affected by any of the said diseases may be resorted under the supervision of an inspector, if in the opinion of the officer in charge of the inspection work it is advisable to do so.
- (b) when sorted, potatoes which are free from disease may be disposed of for consumption; the diseased portion of the consignment shall be reshipped from the State of Western Australia or destroyed at the expense of the consignee as soon as directed by an inspector.
- (c) a fee at the rate of 2s. (two shillings) per hour shall be paid by the consignee to the Department of Agriculture to cover the cost of supervising the work of resorting, in addition to the fee as prescribed in Regulation 8.
- 5. The potatoes on arrival at the port or place of entry shall, at the expense of the importer, be delivered direct into a shed set apart by the Department of Agriculture for inspection, and such other treatment as may be decided upon from time to time by the inspector.

- 6. The importer or his agent shall, at the importer's expense, provide the necessary labour to open the bags, and to re-bag the potatoes, on inspection, and in every way facilitate the inspection.
- 7. Any consignment of potatoes being or having been in contact with any diseased or prohibited consignment of potatoes may be destroyed, disinfected, or otherwise dealt with, at the expense of the importer, as the inspector may direct.
- 8. A fee of two shillings and sixpence for every ton or portion of a ton of imported potatoes shall be charged to defray the cost of inspection and of carrying these Regulations into effect.
- 9. Seed and other potatoes are prohibited from being sent by parcels post, except in accordance with these Regulations (see "Post Office Guide").
- 10. If any importer or his agent fails or neglects to observe these Regulations, or to carry out the requirements of any inspector aforesaid, the inspector may destroy the potatoes or perform the work at the expense in all things of the importer.
- 11. All potatoes for use Eastward of No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence brought into the State of Western Australia by means of the Trans-Australian Railway, shall be admitted as far as Kalgoorlie, and there inspected by an officer appointed by the Department of Agriculture before reconsignment.
- 12. All potatoes for use Westward of No. 1 Rabbitproof Fence brought into the State of Western Australia by means of the Trans-Australian Railway shall be admitted as far as Kalgoorlie, and then be reloaded at Kalgoorlie into covered railway vans, which shall be sealed to the satisfaction of an officer or representative of the Department of Agriculture, before despatch, and such seal shall be broken only by an officer of the Department of Agriculture at the place of destination.
- 13. All potatoes as described in Regulation 12 shall be inspected at Perth by an inspector of the Department of Agriculture under and subject to the Regulations relating to the inspection of potatoes imported by sea, which in all other respects shall apply.
- 14. Any person who contravenes these Regulations by act or omission shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty-five pounds.
- 15. These Regulations may be cited as "The Plant Diseases (Potato) Regulations, 1923."

### BUNBURY HARBOUR BOARD.

Amendment of Regulations.

Regulation No. 51, made by the Bunbury Harbour Board on the first day of October, 1909, is hereby repealed, and the following Regulation enacted in lieu thereof:

No. 51.

Signals on Vessels.

The following signals are to be used when requisite at the Port:-

Pilot required .- The following signals used or displayed together or separately:-

In daylight.

- To be hoisted at the foremast head the Union Jack or other National colour having round it a white border one-fifth of the breadth of the flag.

  2. The International Code Pilotage Signal indicated by "P.T."

3. The International Code Flag "S," with or without the Code Pennant over it.

4. The Distant Signal, consisting of a cone point upwards, having above it two balls or shapes resembling

At night.

1. The pyrotechnic light commonly known as a blue light shown every fifteen minutes.

2. A bright white light flashed or shown at short or frequent intervals just above the bulwarks, for a minute at a time.

- Quarantine.—The sea quarantine regulations are made by the Commonwealth Government of Australia under "The Quarantine Act, 1908-15." The signals are:—
  1. In daylight: (a) By oversea vessels requiring pratique, Commercial Code Flag "Q" (being a yellow flag of six breadths of bunting) hoisted at the mainmast head.
- (b) By vessels having or suspected of having a quarantinable disease on board, or actually performing quarantine, Commercial Code Fag "L," being a large flag of yellow and black borne quarterly hoisted at the mainmast head.
- At night: Three lights (two red and one white, each being not less than eight inches in diameter) of such a character as to be visible on a clear night all round the horizon for a distance of two miles, and placed as nearly as practicable amidships at distances of six feet apart in the form of an equilateral triangle with the apex (the white light) above.

Note.—The Quarantine Act prescribes heavy penalties against the shipmaster who fails to display these signals within three miles of a port, or while entering or within a port, and keeping them displayed until authorised by a quarantine officer to take them in. No boats other than those containing port officials or quarantine officers may be allowed in close vicinity of a ship awaiting pratique, or performing quarantine, under heavy penal-

Customs Officer Wanted .- International Code Flags "K.G.W." at peak, or other prominent place.

Medical Assistance Wanted Immediately.—International Code Flags "Y.L." at peak, or other promineut place.

Police (Water, River, or Harbour) Wanted-

(a) In daylight-International Code Flags "Y.V.X." at mainmast head.

(b) At night-Two white lights shown vertically five feet apart from peak, or other prominent place.

Mails on Board .- International Code Flags "R.E.W." at mainmast head, or other prominent place.

Explosives or Inflammable Cargo on Board—

(a) In daylight—International Code Flag "B" at

foremast head, or other prominent position.

(b) At night—A red light of such a character as to be visible all round the horizon for a distance of one mile, shown from a prominent position clear of all other lights on the vessel.

Sound Signals.

Steamers or other vessels fitted with sound whistles or horns are not permitted to use those in the Harbour except for navigational or manœuvring purposes, as set out in these Regulations.

Steering Sound Signals, Day or Night.

When vessels are in sight of one another, a steam vessel under way, in taking any course authorised by the steering and sailing rules for preventing collisions, embodied in regulations made under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," shall indicate that course by the following signals on her whistle or siren, viz .:-

- (a) One short blast to mean "I am directing my course to starboard."
- (b) Two short blasts to mean "I am directing my course to port."
  (c) Three short blasts to mean "My engines are
- going full speed astern."
- (d) Four short blasts to mean "My ship is out of control; keep clear."

## COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 13 of 1921.

Between the Metropolitan Jewellers, Watchmakers, and Allied Trades' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Levinson & Sons; Caris Brothers; Donovan & Overland; J. Pearl; J. S. Cox; Doig & Horn; and J. W. Dunkerton, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties:—

#### Award.

- 1. Scope of Award.—This award shall apply to workers employed as watchmakers, clockmakers, and watch and clock repairers, jewellers, and general jewellers' tradesmen, and female assistants in any of the said trades.
- 2. Hours.—Forty-eight per week. Such hours may be worked between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturdays.
- 3. Overtime.—All time worked before 7 a.m., and after 6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and before 7 a.m. and after 1 p.m. on Saturdays, or in excess of eight and three-quarter hours on any day from Monday to Friday inclusive, or beyond four and one-quarter hours on Saturdays, shall be deemed to be overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

Rates for Sundays and Holidays.—All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at double the ordinary rates of pay. For time worked on the holidays prescribed in Clause 4 hereof the worker shall be entitled to an additional day's pay or so much thereof as is proportionate to the time worked.

- 4. Holidays.—The following shall be regarded as holidays in respect of which no deduction shall be made from the weekly wage: New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day.
- 5. Annual Holidays.—One week's leave on full pay shall be granted on the expiration of twelve months' service. The time of such leave shall be fixed by the employer, who shall give fourteen days' notice thereof to the employee claiming such leave, and no deduction of wages shall be made for such leave.
- 6. Wages.—The minimum rate of wages to be paid to the classes of workers specified hereunder shall be as follows:—

- 7. Apprentices.—(a) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the clerk of the Arbitration Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause, and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation of whose probationary period notice has been given to the said clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause: Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.
- (b) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer by giving notice thereof to the clerk of the Court in the prescribed form.
- (c) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been registered as such, he shall register such, apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.
- (d) The maximum number of appprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him in the jewellery trade, and also in the watchmaking trade, respectively: Provided that the fraction of two shall not be less than one.
- (e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the average

- number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed.
- (f) Apprentices may be taken to any branch or branches of the jewellery trade or to the watch and clock-making and/or repairing trade.
- (g) The term of apprenticeship shall be six years. A probationary period of six months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.
- (h) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto.)
- (i) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—
  - (1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award and shall, subject to the provisions of Subclause (j), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
  - (2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original em-ployer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to ployer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give a certificate for the time actually served.
  - (3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibilty of teaching him.
  - (4) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge and the cause thereof to the said clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).
- (j) The minimum wage payable to apprentices to the jewellers' section of the trade shall be as follows:—

The wages of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration at such time as the Court may determine. Provided that no such alteration shall be made except when the wages of tradesmen under this award are being reviewed.

- (k) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each year of his service when called upon by the clerk of the Court so to do.
- (1) The clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.
- (m) The examination will be held in the month of October in each year. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade to be nominated by the said Union and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies, or failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.
- (n) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.
- (o) The clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (j) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.
- (p) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn the employer shall be deemed prima facie guilty of a breach of this award under Section 90 of the Act and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.
- (q) Such fees shall be paid by the clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.
- (r) This ward shall not operate to render unlawful or to vary the terms or provisions of any apprenticeship existing on the 18th August, 1920, or made under the industrial agreement registered No. 43/1920.
- 8. Under-rate Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such less rate as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall if he so desires be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate. Provided that all under-rate workers employed for any reason other than old age or infirmity may continue to be employed under this

award for a period of six months from the date hereof on the terms on which they are working at the date of this award, if within fourteen days from the date hereof notice in writing of such employment and the terms thereof be given by the worker or his employer to the Metropolitan Jewellers, Watchmakers, and Allied Trades' Industrial Union of Workers.

- 9. Record Book.—A time and wages book shall be kept by each employer in which book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week. The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the said secretary of the Union during working hours.
- 10. Term of Award.—The currency of this award shall be two years from the date hereof. Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions
- 11. Engagement.—One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

The minimum engagement shall be for one week. After the first week employment for less than a week shall be lawful at rates of pay proportionate to the weekly rate plus 10 per cent.

- 12. Junior Females.—(a) The maximum number of junior female workers allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one to every two or fraction of two adult female workers employed by him: Provided that the fraction of two shall not be less than one.
- (b) The minimum wage payable to junior female workers in any section of the trade shall be:—

Provided always that any female worker who attains the age of twenty-one years shall be paid at the rate of £2 13s. 6d. per week pursuant to Clause 6 hereof without regard to the number of years for which she may have been employed.

- 13. Piecework.—The lowest rate of pay to be paid to any person for doing any of the work mentioned in the schedule of piecework rates hereinafter set out and for supplying materials therefor shall be the amount appearing in such schedule opposite the description of such work. In the event of the employer supplying such material the schedule rates shall be paid minus the wholesale price of the material per single piece. Piecework not described in the schedule shall be paid for at such rate as shall enable an average worker working forty-eight hours per week to earn not less than the minimum weekly wage. No employee who is not a journeyman shall be employed on piecework.
- 14. Area.—This award shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of furteen miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.
