Gull Rock Common, near Albany—Reserve 17387.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," of the following By-laws for the control and management of Reserve 17387 for "Common" at Gull Rock Lake, near Albany:—

(1.) Any person or persons desiring to depasture any horse or horses on Reserve 17387, South coast, South Albany, shall first apply to the Board for a permit. Each permit shall describe the brand, colour, marks, and sex of each animal.

(2.) The fee for each animal shall be ten shillings per annum, payable in advance at the Board's office.

(3.) Central Ward.—Bounded on the North-Eastward and Northward by the Southern boundary of the North Ward from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to intersect the District boundary.

On the Eastward and Southward by part of the District boundaries from the last-mentioned intersection to the East boundary of P.L. 1083/93; thence along part of the East and the North boundary of said Pastoral Lease, parts of the South and West boundaries of late Pastoral Lease 2506/93, a South and a West boundary of 186/113, parts of the South and West boundaries of 296/113 to the production East of the North boundary of Location 2764, and along said production and North boundary and the North-Eastern and North-Western boundaries of said Location 2764, the Northern boundaries of Locations 3683 and 2763, the North-Western boundaries of Location 2577, part of the Western boundary of Location 2175 thence along an Eastern side of Road No. 58 to the Northernmost corner of Location 2756, and along its Northern boundaries and the Southern side of Road 58 to and along the North-Western boundary of Location 3058 and Westward along said side of Road 58, to its intersection with the South boundary of that portion of Wellington Location 1 shown on L.T.O. Diagram 4303, and along part of the South and the East boundary of that portion, an East, a South, and an Eastern boundary of that portion of Location 1 shown on L.T.O. Plan 3509 to the Western side of the Tramway Reserve, and along said side of the Tramway Reserve to the North boundary of the said portion of Location 1, and along said North boundary, an Eastern boundary of Lot 69, the North boundaries of Lots 61 and 68 and Westward to and along a South side of Road 3030, and continuing Westward to the Eastern side of Arthur Road, and along said side of Arthur Road to intersect the Eastern boundary of the West Ward.

On the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of the West Ward from the last-mentioned intersection to the starting point.

Benger Ward.—Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the Southern boundary of the Central Ward from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to intersect the Northern side of Road 58.

On the Southward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending Southward and Westward along the said side of Road 58 to the Eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve, and along said side of the Railway Reserve to the production East of the North side of Mornington Road (No. 828), and along said production and side of the road to intersect the Eastern boundary of the West Ward.

On the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of the West Ward from the last-mentioned intersection to the starting point.

Roelands Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the Southern boundaries of the Benger and Central Wards from the former's intersection with the Eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve to the latter's intersection with the District boundary.

On the Eastward and Southward by part of the District boundary from the last-mentioned intersection to the District boundary's intersection with the Western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending Northward along said side of the Railway Reserve and the Western sides of Roads 1150, 46, and 806 to the production East of the North side of Mornington Road (No. 828), and along said production to the Eastern side of the Railway Reserve, and along said side of the Railway Reserve to the starting point.

Brunswick Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the Southern boundary of the Benger Ward from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to its intersection with the Western boundary of the Roelands Ward.

On the Eastward by part of the Western boundary of the Roelands Ward from the last-mentioned intersection to intersect the District boundary.

On the Southward and Westward by part of the District boundary from the last-mentioned intersection to the starting point.

THE DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT, 1922.**REGULATIONS.**

INTERPRETATION.

1. In these regulations the terms used, if not inconsistent with the context, shall have the meanings stated in Section two of the "Dairy Industry Act, 1922."

"Approved," if not otherwise expressed, means approved by an inspector.

REGISTER OF FACTORIES AND STORES.

2. The Minister shall cause to be kept a register of dairy produce, factories, and stores.

REGISTRATION OF FACTORY OR STORE.

3. Application for registration of a factory or store shall be made in Form 1 or 2, and shall contain the particulars indicated in such forms, and shall be accompanied by a fee of one pound.

CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

4. Every certificate of registration of a factory or store shall be in Form 3 or 4.

SALE OR LEASE OF FACTORY OR STORE.

5. When any registered factory or store is transferred or leased, the person holding the certificate of registration shall, within fourteen days after such transfer or lease, notify, in writing, the Director of Agriculture, at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, of such transfer or lease and the name of the transferee or lessee as the case may be.

Any transferee or lessee intending to use the premises as a factory or store shall make application for registration.

TEMPORARY CESSATION OF WORK IN FACTORIES.

6. If a factory ceases to manufacture dairy produce during any period of the year, a notification shall be sent to the Director of Agriculture, at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, within fourteen days of cessation, stating the period for which it is contemplated the dairy produce factory will be closed.

REGISTER OF BRANDS AND MARKS.

7. The Minister shall cause to be kept a register of registered brands. Such register shall contain the following particulars:—

- Number of registered brand.
- Date of application.
- Date of registration.
- Name and address of the owner of the brand.
- Copy or exact representation of the brand.
- Grade of butter represented by brand.

APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION OF BRAND.

8. Application for the registration of a brand shall be in Form 5, and shall be accompanied by a fee of five shillings.

CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION OF BRAND.

9. A certificate of the registration of a brand shall be in Form 6.

TEMPORARY REGISTRATION OF BRANDS.

10. Brands may be temporarily registered pending their registration under the Trade Marks Act (Commonwealth), but the period of such registration shall not exceed six months. The particulars of such brands shall be kept in a temporary register.

BRANDS WHICH MAY BE REGISTERED.

11. No brand shall be registered except—

- (a) a brand which has been registered under the Trade Marks Act (Commonwealth), and which is used to indicate the dairy-produce factory and the grade of butter manufactured thereat; or
- (b) a brand consisting of the name and address of the factory at which butter is manufactured and the grade of the butter, namely superfine, choice, first grade, second grade, third grade, or pastry.

No brand used to represent superfine, choice, or first grade of butter shall be registered unless such brand includes the word "pasteurised."

No brand shall be registered which closely resembles or is identical with a brand already registered.

BRANDING PACKAGES.

12. Every package of butter of 28 lbs. or over, for export or ships' stores, shall be indelibly marked on the outside with a registered brand.

ALTERATION OR REMOVAL OF BRANDS.

13. Any person who, without the written consent of an Inspector, removes or alters or defaces any brand, or removes, alters, or defaces any mark or brand placed on boxes or other packages by or at the request of an Inspector, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

BRAND TO BE USED IN CONNECTION WITH ONE FACTORY ONLY.

14. The registered brand of one butter factory shall not be used in connection with butter manufactured at a factory belonging to any other owner.

BUTTER PACKED AT DIFFERENT FACTORIES BELONGING TO THE SAME OWNER.

15. When butter is packed under the same brand at more than one factory belonging to the same owner, there shall be marked on each package containing such butter, in addition to the brand, a letter or letters indicating the factory at which such butter was made.

DIMENSIONS OF LETTERS TO BE USED IN BRANDING BUTTER BOXES.

16. When packages of butter are branded with a brand containing the word or words "superfine," "choice," "first grade," "second grade," "third grade," or "pastry grade," as the case may be, such word or words shall be in letters not less than three-quarters of an inch in length, and half an inch in width, and shall be placed in the most prominent position in the brand, which shall itself be in a prominent position on the box.

CANCELLATION OF REGISTERED BRANDS.

17. A registered brand shall be cancelled on the written request of the owner of such brand, and may be cancelled if the Director of Agriculture is satisfied that such brand is intentionally being used in connection with butter of a lower grade than that represented by it, or to mislead the public.

BUTTER BRANDS WHERE THE MANUFACTURER AND OWNER OF THE REGISTERED BRAND ARE DIFFERENT.

18. When butter is packed in packages of 28 lbs. or over, bearing a registered brand other than that owned by the manufacturer, the package which contains the butter must also bear the name and address of the manufacturer, or his registered serial number.

TRANSFER OF BRAND.

19. Where the right to use a registered brand has been transferred, such transfer shall be noted in the register of brands, and for this purpose a joint application for transfer shall be made by the owner and the transferror.

BUTTER BEARING AN INCORRECT REGISTERED BRAND.

20. If, after butter has been despatched from a factory, the manager thereof has reason to believe that circumstances have arisen which will cause the quality of the butter to deteriorate, so that it will be of a lower quality than that indicated by the registered brand on the package containing the same, the manager of such factory shall immediately notify the Director of Agriculture, at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, of such circumstances.

CREAM-GRADER'S CERTIFICATE.

21. For a cream-grader's certificate there shall be an examination in two parts, theoretical and practical. The theoretical examination may be oral or written. In the practical examination, candidates will be required to grade in accordance with these Regulations at least 50 creams, 80 per cent. of which must, in the opinion of the examiner, be correctly graded in order to secure a pass: Provided, however, that any person possessing the certificate of Dairy Practice and Dairy Science, issued by the Department of Agriculture and the University of Western Australia, shall be deemed to have passed the necessary examination.

The certificate shall be in Form 7.

MILK AND CREAM-TESTER'S CERTIFICATE.

22. For a milk and cream-tester's certificate there shall be an examination in two parts, viz., theoretical and practical. The examination in theory may be oral or written, and shall include the subject of testing or analysing milk and cream for fat by the Babcock method. The practical examination will include a test for accuracy, combined with fair speed in the testing of milk and cream by the Babcock method: Provided, however, that any person possessing the certificate of Dairy Practice and Dairy Science, issued by the Department of Agriculture and the University of Western Australia, shall be deemed to have passed the necessary examination.

The certificate shall be in Form 8.

PERSONS HOLDING CERTIFICATES FROM OTHER STATES.

23. The Director of Agriculture may grant a certificate to test or grade milk or cream to any person holding a certificate obtained after examination conducted under the authority of the Government of any other State of the Commonwealth, but such certificate may be limited to the period stated therein. Any such person shall submit himself for examination if required to do so.

APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES.

24. An application for a cream-grader's certificate shall be in Form 9, and an application for a milk or cream-tester's certificate shall be in Form 10.

CANCELLATION OF CERTIFICATES.

25. A certificate authorising any person to test or grade milk or cream may be cancelled by the Director of Agriculture:

- (i) if the testing or grading performed by such person is found by an Inspector to be so inaccurate that in his opinion such person should not be further permitted to test or grade;
- (ii) if the Director of Agriculture is satisfied that such person has become incapable of testing or grading;
- (iii) if the Director of Agriculture is satisfied that any tests are intentionally falsified by such person;
- (iv) if, in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture, such person has committed any offence against the Act or these Regulations, or has advised or assisted any other person so to do;
- (v) if there are other grounds which, in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture, justify such cancellation.

CLASSIFICATION OF CREAM.

26. Cream supplied to a dairy-produce factory for the manufacture of butter shall be classified as follows:—

- No. 1.—Untainted, being superfine, or choice grade.
- No. 2.—Inferior, being first grade.
- No. 3.—Tainted, being second grade or under.

Untainted cream shall be free from all taints, from whatever source arising, and have a smooth and even texture.

Inferior cream shall be cream affected by food flavour, slight physical, biological, or chemical flavour, by an odour absorbed from any substance which is not of an unclean or putrescent nature, or by a combination of any of these.

Tainted cream shall be a cream (a) affected by an advanced physical, chemical, or absorbed taint, or by an advanced biological taint which has not reached the putrescent stage, or (b) cream in which are any flies or vermin of any other nature whatsoever.

GRADING OF CREAM.

27. Cream of the classes mentioned in the last preceding regulation shall score the following points out of a maximum of fifty points for flavour and aroma—

- Superfine—46-50.
- Choice—43-45.
- First Grade—40-42.
- Second Grade—36-39.
- Third Grade—32-35.
- Pastry—25-31.

BASIS OF PAYMENT FOR CREAM.

28. In factories where the Babcock system of cream-testing is used, and where the samples are measured, the amount of fat which will be produced from such cream shall be estimated in accordance with a chart approved by the Director of Agriculture.

In factories where the cream supplied is paid for on the basis of the butter-fat results, the samples used for testing shall be weighed with a scale approved by an Inspector and the entire value of the butter made from such cream shall be credited to the suppliers in proportion to the butter-fat supplied.

WEIGHING AND SAMPLING CREAM.

29. When more than one can of cream is received from the same supplier, each can shall be weighed, sampled, and tested separately: Provided that if the whole of such cream is mixed together in an approved receptacle, a single sample may be taken for testing purposes.

FAT STANDARD OF CREAM.

30. Cream delivered at factories during the months of September, October, November, December, January, February, and March for the manufacture of butter shall contain not less than 37 per cent. of butter-fat, and during the other months of the year shall contain not less than 30 per cent. of butter-fat.

SUPPLIES OF PUTRESCENT CREAM.

31. The manager of every factory shall report to an Inspector the name and address of every person supplying putrescent cream, and shall state the date on which such cream was supplied. He shall also add either kerosene or tannate of iron to such an extent as to make the cream easily identifiable and prevent its manufacture into butter. All cream in which rats, mice, or maggots are found or which is otherwise unfit for human food shall be treated as putrescent.

EXAMINATION OF BUTTER.

32. All butter forwarded from a factory for export or ships' stores shall be consigned to a registered store, and full particulars of such consignment shall be given by the person forwarding the butter to the Director of Agriculture, at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, at the time of despatch in Form 11.

All such butter shall be submitted to an Inspector for examination and marking at the store to which it was consigned, or at such other store as may be directed by the Inspector.

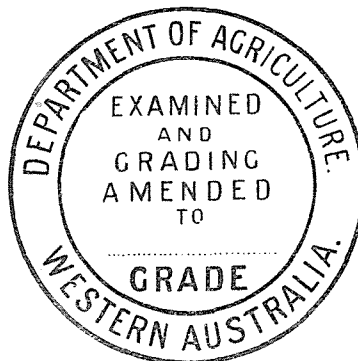
MARKING OF BUTTER.

33. If, upon the examination mentioned in the last preceding Regulation, the Inspector finds such butter to be of the grade indicated by the brand on the package containing it, he shall mark such package as follows:—



the grade indicated being that of the butter as found upon his examination.

If such butter is found to be not of the grade indicated by the brand on the package, he shall mark the package as follows:—



the grade indicated on such mark being that of the butter as found upon his examination.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO EXPORT BUTTER.

34. The owner or the authorised agent of any owner of butter intended for export shall give three clear days' (exclusive of Sunday or public holiday) notice in Form 12 to an Inspector of his intention to so export.

STORAGE OF BUTTER INTENDED FOR EXPORT.

35. Butter shall not be exported from the State unless it has been held for three clear days (exclusive of a Sunday or public holiday) in a dairy-produce store, the temperature of which does not at any time exceed 15 degrees Fahrenheit, or unless such butter is itself at a temperature not exceeding 25 degrees Fahrenheit at the time of loading in the vessel for export.

EXAMINATION OF BUTTER BEFORE EXPORT.

36. No person shall export or attempt to export butter from the State until it has been examined and the grade thereof checked by an Inspector, and until an Inspector has issued a certificate in Form 13 that the requirements of the Act and regulations have been complied with, and a certificate in Form 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, or 19 that the grade and weight of the butter correspond with the brand and weight marked on the package containing it.

BRANDING OF BUTTER PACKAGES.

37. Packages containing 28 lbs. (or more) butter intended for export shall be legibly and indelibly branded with the words "pure creamery butter," "pure dairy-butter," "milled butter," or "pastry butter," as the case may be, the net weight of the contents, the words "Western Australia" in block letters of not less than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch in length, the grade of the butter, and the name of the manufacturer, or, in lieu of such name, a trade mark registered as a brand under the Act.

DETERMINATION OF GRADES OF BUTTER.

38. The following scale of points shall be the maximum used as a basis for determining the grade of butter:—

Flavour and aroma—50 points.

Texture, including body, grain, and moisture—30 points.

Condition, including colour, finish, salting, packing, and package—20 points.

There shall be six grades of butter. The designation of each grade shall be—

Superfine—Pure creamery butter made from pasteurised cream and scoring 96-100 points, both inclusive.

Choice—Pure creamery butter made from pasteurised cream and scoring 93-95 points, both inclusive.

First Grade—Pure creamery butter, made from pasteurised cream, scoring 90-92 points, both inclusive.

Second Grade—Pure butter scoring 86-89 points, both inclusive.

Third Grade—Pure butter scoring 82-85 points, both inclusive.

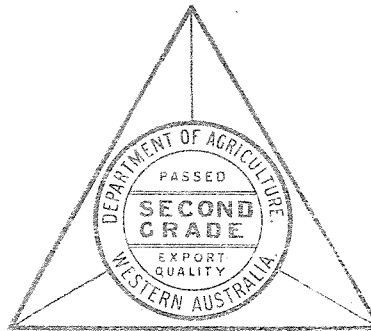
Pastry Grade— Pure butter, not being rancid, and scoring 75-81 points, both inclusive.

MARKING OF PACKAGES WHERE BUTTER IS BELOW STANDARD OF 32 POINTS FOR FLAVOUR.

39. All packages containing butter which is below the standard of 32 points for flavour shall be indelibly marked with the words "Pastry butter," in addition to any other brands on the packages, before being submitted for export, or submitted for sale within the State, or for ships' stores.

MARKING OF BUTTER FOR EXPORT.

40. All butter approved or passed for export shall be stamped as follows:—



A certificate number for identification purposes shall also be applied in all cases.

CERTIFICATE TO BE PRODUCED BEFORE EXPORT.

41. No person shall receive any butter for export until he has obtained from the person exporting such butter a certificate in Form 13.

FEE FOR GRADING BUTTER.

42. The fee for grading butter shall be 1d. per cwt. or fraction thereof.

RE-EXAMINATION OF BUTTER.

43. If an Inspector has reasonable cause to think that the grade of any butter examined under these Regulations has changed since such examination, he may re-examine same and, if necessary, cancel the certificates already given and the stamp applied to the package, and may deal with the certification and stamping of the butter as if it had not been previously examined.

APPROVED STAMP.

44. No person other than an Inspector shall use any stamp identical with or resembling a stamp mentioned in Regulations 33 and 40. Any package bearing a stamp or impression resembling such approved stamp shall have such stamp removed before the butter is exported.

STANDARD FOR BUTTER.

45. Butter shall contain—

No fat other than milk fat;

Not more than 16 per cent. of water, 3 per cent. of casein, 0.5 per cent. of boric acid, 4 per cent. of salt;

Not less than 82 per cent. of milk fat, and no added colouring matter.

BRANDING OF MARGARINE FOR EXPORT.

46. Margarine for export outside the State shall be put up in packages bearing the word "Margarine" conspicuously and indelibly impressed in block letters at least three-quarters of an inch square, in a prominent position on the top, bottom, and sides of the package.

If the margarine is packed in packets before being placed in boxes, the wrappers containing such packets shall bear the word "Margarine" conspicuously placed thereon in letters not less than a quarter of an inch in depth.

FEES FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MARGARINE.

47. The fee for the examination of margarine shall be 1d. per cwt. or part thereof.

MONTHLY RETURN OF BUTTER MANUFACTURED AND FAT PAID FOR.

48. The monthly return required by Section 15 of the Act shall be made in Form 20.

REGISTER OF CREAM SUPPLIERS.

49. A register shall be kept at every factory showing the name and address of each person who supplies cream to such factory, and shall at all times be available for examination by an Inspector.

CREAM-TESTING AND GRADING ADVICE DOCKETS.

50. The secretary or manager of each butter factory shall forward to each cream supplier, at least four times a month, a statement in Form 21, showing the particulars of cream received, the test, and the quantity of fat calculated; and shall, at the end of each month, when payment is being made, furnish a statement to each supplier in Form 22.

When on the final advice docket on Form 21, supplied to farmers each month, the total fat calculated, and the total butter produced are shown, these particulars need not again appear on the monthly statement on Form 22, the total only of each grade of butter-fat being then sufficient.

BOOKS TO BE KEPT AT BUTTER FACTORIES.

51. The owner of every butter factory shall cause to be kept at the factory or at a place or premises approved by the Minister the following books, which

shall be made up at the end of each calendar month, and shall at all times be available for examination by an Inspector:—

- (a) a cream-grading book, in which shall be recorded the weights and grades of cream received from each supplier daily. This book shall be signed daily by a grader holding a certificate issued under these Regulations;
- (b) a cream test-book, which shall show the test of each supplier's cream. This book shall be signed each day by the cream-tester holding a certificate under these Regulations;
- (c) a cream and butter record-book, showing on each day the names of suppliers, weight of cream, grades or quality of cream, test of cream, and quantity of butter-fat calculated in the prescribed manner of each supplier;
- (d) a churn-book showing the weight in pounds of each grade of butter manufactured daily. The book shall be signed daily by the butter maker or packer;
- (e) a butter stock and sales book showing on each day the opening stock on hand, the butter manufactured, butter-fat purchased, consignments, sales, donations, and closing stock on hand. Each grade of butter shall be shown separately, and the quantities shall be stated in pounds;
- (f) a pay-sheet book, showing the total quantity of each grade of butter-fat each supplier is paid for, and showing all debits;
- (g) a supplier's individual ledger, containing all the particulars shown in Form 22, with the exception of the total quantity of butter manufactured, and the total quantity of butter-fat paid for. In cases where carbon copies are kept of the statements to suppliers, showing the cream supplied, test, and butter-fat calculated, this book may be dispensed with;
- (h) A computed and manufactured butter book, showing the total butter-fat calculated in each day's churning side by side with the quantity actually churned. Each grade shall be shown separately, and explanations shall be given of any discrepancies in the grades.

Note.—The information supplied through the above set of books may be made available to an Inspector under the Act, by the keeping of any number of books of the above character of a number not less than three; and books marked (a), (b), and (c), where convenient, may be incorporated in one book, provided that the entries of grades, tests, and weights are made by the persons who carry out such work.

CREAM CANS.

52. No person shall receive cream at a dairy-produce factory unless the name and address of the supplier are indelibly stamped on or permanently attached to the can, and unless the cans contain not more than 10 gallons of cream.

CONDEMNED MILK AND CREAM CANS.

53. Milk and cream cans which have been condemned by an Inspector shall not be used to contain milk and cream for human consumption or for manufacture into dairy produce, and an Inspector may order any such cans to be made fit for use.

STANDARD FOR MILK PIPETTES.

54. Pipettes used in connection with tests for butter-fat content in milk shall have a capacity of 17.6 cubic centimetres at 60 degrees Fahrenheit, so as to deliver 18 grammes of milk of an average specific gravity of 1.003. The inlet shall have an internal diameter of 1.3 to 1.5 millimetres, and the glass shall not be less than 1 millimetre in thickness.

STANDARD FOR CREAM PIPETTES.

55. Pipettes used in connection with tests for butter-fat content in cream shall have a capacity of 8.8 cubic centimetres at 60 degrees Fahrenheit. The inlet shall have an internal diameter of 2.8 to 3.8 millimetres, being reduced by tapering from an inside diameter of 4.5 to 5 millimetres one quarter of an inch from the inlet. The glass in such pipettes shall be not less than 1 millimetre in thickness.

GLASS MEASURES TO BE EXAMINED.

56. All glass measures used for testing milk or cream for butter fat and acidity content or temperature in a factory shall be submitted for examination to, and shall bear the mark of the Department of Agriculture, showing that the measures have been passed as accurate. Those found on examination to be inaccurate shall be so marked and returned to the owner or owners, but shall not be used for testing milk or cream as aforesaid.

CARRIAGE OF DAIRY PRODUCE.

57. Dairy produce shall not be carried to or from any store, dairy-produce factory, boat, railway depôt, or wharf between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., unless it is protected from heat by a method recommended by the Government Dairy Expert, and approved by the Minister. The person or company who owns or controls the vehicle used for the transit of dairy produce will be held responsible for the carrying out of this regulation.

METHODS FOR PROTECTION OF DAIRY PRODUCE FROM CONTAMINATION.

58. Vehicles (including railway vans) used in the carriage or delivery of any dairy produce shall be kept at all times clean to the satisfaction of an inspector; no such vehicle and no receptacle shall at any time be used for the carriage of any matter whereby the wholesomeness or quality of any dairy produce carried, or usually carried therein, would or might be endangered.

Any person having in his possession or in transit any dairy produce for sale or for delivery shall, when required by an Inspector, state his name and place of abode to such Inspector, and any person who refuses so to do, or states a false name or place of abode, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

No person shall smoke or chew tobacco, while engaged in the manufacture, packing, or storing of dairy produce intended for sale, and no person shall smoke in any place used for the manufacture, storage, or preparation of such dairy produce.

Every person who is engaged in the manufacture or preparation of dairy produce for sale shall, when so engaged, maintain his clothing and his body clean.

PROTECTION OF CREAM FROM CONTAMINATION BY FLIES AND VERMIN.

59. All vessels in which cream is being held in storage (unless such are in a cream ripening room or factory specially designed to shut out flies and vermin) shall be covered by a wire or metal gauze of a mesh so fine as to prevent the ingress of ordinary house flies.

TRANSIT OF CREAM.

60. Vehicles used for the transit of cream (for hire) must be so protected by a raised hood as to prevent the direct rays of the sun from shining on the cream cans.

STORAGE OF CREAM WHILE AWAITING TRANSIT.

61. No person shall store cream while awaiting transit to a dairy-produce factory in any place where any can containing such cream is exposed to the direct rays of the sun, nor shall any carrier or dairy-produce factory manager retain cream overnight in the cans in which it was despatched by the farmer: Provided that where it is shown that the cream cannot be brought to the factory in one day, owing to distance or unfavourable weather, no penalty will be imposed as the result of cream being held overnight in the same cans.

TEMPERATURE OF BUTTER-STORING ROOMS.

62. The temperature of the room in which butter is stored in a dairy-produce factory shall not exceed 50 degrees Fahrenheit.

STORAGE OF FOREIGN MATERIALS IN DAIRY PRODUCE STORES.

63. No material other than that required for use in connection with the running of a dairy-produce factory shall be stored in rooms used for the manufacture or storage of dairy produce.

CONDITIONS OF REGISTRATION OF PREMISES.

64. **Sanitation.**—Every dairy-produce factory must be so situated that good sanitation, as regards disposal of sewage and freedom from the ill-effects of noxious trades, is permanently and economically possible.

Proximity to Pig-sties.—No dairy-produce factory will be registered under the Act if it be situated within 200 yards of a pig-sty, where less than twenty-five pigs are kept. If the number of pigs kept exceed twenty-five, the distance must not be less than 300 yards.

Where pigs are grazed in paddocks, and are allowed plenty of room, the nearest boundary fence of such paddock to a dairy-produce factory must not be less than 100 yards.

Proximity to a Slaughter-house.—No dairy-produce factory which is within 200 yards of a slaughter-house will be registered under the Act. If pigs or sheep are kept for the purpose of slaughter at such slaughter-houses, more than six hours prior to being killed, the provision as regards distance shall be the same as that applying to pigsties where at least twenty-five pigs are kept.

Provided that, where factories previously registered under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920, or otherwise lawfully established to the satisfaction of the Minister, do not comply with the above conditions as to distance from pig-sties or slaughter-houses, the Minister may permit registration on the recommendation of an Inspector, and on being satisfied as to the good sanitary condition generally of such pig-sties or slaughter-houses; but pigs or sheep may not be yarded in such slaughter-houses more than three hours before slaughter.

CONSTRUCTION.

Floors.—The floors of butter-making, cheese-making, or condensing rooms must be of an impervious substance, such as concrete; must be smooth on the surface and so graded that the washings will be readily run away into suitably made drains.

Walls.—In order that the walls of manufacturing rooms shall not become offensive, they shall be of an impervious character; and capable of being washed down to a height of at least 6 feet in the case of butter and margarine factories.

Ceilings.—Every manufacturing room or cream room, whether in a cheese, butter, or margarine factory, must be provided with a ceiling so constructed as to prevent deposit of unnecessary and avoidable dust, where deemed necessary.

Cream-ripening Rooms.—Cream shall be ripened in vats held in rooms specially protected from flies; and, in the absence of a special room, either the cream vats themselves or all the windows in the manufacturing rooms of the factory must be protected from flies in a manner approved by an Inspector. Such cream vats must be placed on an impervious floor or stage.

Ventilation.—Cream-ripening rooms, butter-making rooms, butter store-rooms, cheese-manufacturing rooms, and cheese-curing rooms must be so ventilated that a reasonably pure atmosphere always obtains.

Water.—Water used for the washing of butter shall be obtained from a pure source, shall be free from avoidable organic matter, and from deleterious mineral matter.

Cream-receiving Platform.—The platform on which cream is received in cans shall be constructed of an impervious material, or of wood, thoroughly caulked, so that it will be practically impervious.

Can-storage Accommodation.—At each factory there must be suitable storage accommodation for such cream cans as are not sent out daily to suppliers. The accommodation should be of a character which will enable the cans to drain, and which will also admit of plenty of pure air. Such accommodation may take the form of a special can-house with an impervious floor, or cans may be stored in racks over a verandah with an impervious floor, protected by a lean-to roof or other similar arrangement approved by an Inspector.

Cool-storage Rooms.—The cool-storage rooms in butter factories shall be kept free from unnecessary moisture. Any drip from thawing ice must be carried away in suitably arranged open guttering.

Can-washing Accommodation.—Suitable can-washing accommodation must be provided in every factory. Such must include both hot and cold water, and the situation of same may not be inside the manufacturing or packing rooms.

Disposal of Sewage.—Factory sewage must be disposed of in a manner which will preclude the possibility of said sewage contaminating the atmosphere surrounding the factory. Open concrete drains should be used for the passage of factory washings where possible.

Butter-milk Tanks.—Tanks used for the purpose of holding butter-milk at dairy produce factories must be constructed so that they can be easily cleansed. Butter-milk must be removed from same daily, and the tanks kept in a clean and sweet condition. Where such tanks are elevated, the space underneath same must be concreted and graded so that the drip may be washed away without causing offence.

Curing Rooms.—Curing rooms in cheese factories must be so constructed that an atmosphere not exceeding 75 degrees Fahrenheit may be maintained.

Protection from Flies.—The manufacturing room of a cheese factory shall have doors and windows fitted with fly-proof metal gauze.

Whey Tanks.—All tanks used for holding whey in connection with cheese-making must be situated at a distance not less than 25 yards from the factory: Provided that, when a farmer manufactures cheese from milk supplied by his own dairy herd only, the distance of the whey-tank from the factory need not be more than 10 yards.

Atmosphere.—No dairy produce factory will be passed by an Inspector for registration under the Act if, through proximity to any noxious trade centre, or through any other cause whatsoever, the atmosphere surrounding the factory becomes tainted in a manner which can be detected by the sense of smell.

Lighting.—The milk and cream-testing room and the manufacturing-room in all butter and cheese factories must be sufficiently well lighted to enable accuracy to be assured in all operations.

Size.—The manufacturing room must have a floor space of at least 168 square feet, and the height of same from floor to ceiling must be at least 10 feet.

Where cheese is stored for sale, it must be kept on shelves, and at a temperature below 80 degrees Fahrenheit.

Where butter is exposed for sale, the temperature of the stores shall not exceed 70 degrees Fahrenheit.

Where, however, any store is cleared of the unsold butter daily and such unsold butter is transferred to a cold store, the temperature of the ordinary store need not be reduced by any special machinery, and may be allowed to be controlled by weather conditions, provided ordinary precautions are taken to exclude heat.

Atmosphere.—No stores will be registered as suitable for the storage of butter if, in the opinion of an Inspector, the atmosphere therein is tainted to an extent noticeable by the sense of smell by an odor which, when absorbed, would be detrimental to the flavour of the butter.

STORES USED AS COLD STORES.

65. No cold store will be registered as a dairy-produce store for the purpose of freezing butter for export, unless the atmosphere during the time that such store is in use is maintained below 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

No cold store will be registered as a dairy-produce store unless rooms are provided for dairy produce only; and cheese and butter may not be stored in the same cold chamber at the same time, unless by special permission of an Inspector.

If the refrigerating machine in any registered store which is used as a cold store be wholly or partly inoperative, and the temperature of such store is allowed to rise above 20 degrees Fahrenheit where butter is held for export, or 40 degrees Fahrenheit if held for temporary storage, notice must be given to the Dairy Expert, Department of Agriculture, or to an Inspector.

DATE MARKING OF BUTTER PACKAGES.

66. All packages of butter shall bear on the outside covering figures or letters indicating the dates on which such butter was churned, and the churn number of the cream at time of churning. For example:—

C. 1, 2, 3

means churn No. 1, second day of the third month. Such marks may be applied with a rubber stamp by using numerals half-an-inch in size.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF REGULATIONS.

67. Any person who commits a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, or, when the breach is a continuing one, not exceeding two pounds for every day during which such breach continues.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, on the recommendation of the Conservator of Forests, to repeal the second schedule to the Forest Regulations, 1920, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of October, 1921, in substitution for the second schedule to the said Regulations originally published on the 12th day of November, 1920, and to insert in such regulation a schedule in lieu thereof, as follows:—

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

Royalties payable under Permits.

Jarrah and Karri Logs in the Round.

From Permits within 81-100 or more miles, inclusive, from main line siding to Port, £0 0s. 0.6d. per cubic foot.

From permits within 61-80 miles, inclusive, from main line siding to Port, £0 0s. 0.89d. per cubic foot.

From permits within 41-60 miles, inclusive, from main line siding to Port, £0 0s. 1.25d. per cubic foot.

From permits within 21-40 miles, inclusive, from main line siding to Port, £0 0s. 1.67d. per cubic foot.

From permits within 1-20 miles, inclusive, from main line siding to Port, £0 0s. 2.19d. per cubic foot.

Hewn Jarrah or Karri sleepers measured in the square, three times the above rates.

Sawn and hewn beams with heart in, £0 0s. 3.6d. per lineal foot.

Split, sawn, and round timber cut for mining purposes other than firewood, £0 0s. 1.2d. per cubic foot.

Royalty on Mallet Bark, 10s. per ton.

The foregoing scale of Royalties shall come into force on the first day of January, 1924.

In the meantime the Royalties as prescribed by the second schedule to the Regulations under "The Forests Act, 1918," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th day of November, 1920, shall (subject as hereinafter provided) apply, and be deemed to have applied from the publication thereof to the coming into force of the foregoing scale, namely:—

Jarrah and Karri logs in the round, £0 0s. 0.6d. per cubic foot. Sawn and hewn beams with heart in, £0 0s. 3.6d. per lineal foot. Hewn Jarrah sleepers, measured in the square, £0 0s. 1.2d. per cubic foot.

The royalty on Mallet Bark shall continue at ten shillings per ton, and the royalty on split, sawn, and round timber cut for mining purposes other than firewood shall continue at £0 0s. 1.2d. per cubic foot, as prescribed by regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of October, 1921.

Discount.

If payment of royalties is made within the month within which accounts are rendered, or such extended period, if any, as the Conservator in his discretion may determine, a discount of 15 per cent. will be allowed.

Inspection Fees.

Sawn and hewn timber for railway sleepers, £0 0s. 0.6d. per cubic foot.

Other sawn and hewn timber, £0 0s. 0.8d. per cubic foot.

Piles, poles and beams, one-third of the royalty.

THE AGRICULTURAL SEEDS ACT, 1923.

Regulations.

Agri. No. 2802/11.

1. Sales of seeds by the grower to a seed merchant are exempted from the operation of "The Agricultural Seeds Act, 1923" (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and sales of seeds by a farmer, who does not carry on the business of a seed merchant, to another farmer who resides within ten miles of the residence of the seller are exempted from the operation of the Act.

2. The name of the agricultural seed to be written on or attached to a parcel of agricultural seeds shall be the common name of the seed. The common names of seeds and plants having the botanical names set out in Schedule "A" shall be the common names as stated in such schedule.

3. In the application of Section 6 of the Act, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) The proportion in which seeds contained in a mixture are mixed shall be stated by weight.

(b) The percentage of pure seeds capable of germination shall be expressed by number.

(c) In the case of seeds belonging to the Family Leguminosæ, hard seeds, if any, shall be stated as a percentage of the pure seeds.

(d) The proportion or amount of weed seeds shall be expressed as a percentage of the weight of the parcel.

(e) The proportion or amount of impurities shall be expressed as a percentage of the weight of the parcel.

(f) In the case of lucerne seed, the country or State where the seed was grown (country of origin) shall be indicated on the label or statement.

4. Any statement in regard to germination, weed seeds, and impurities shall be deemed correct if, on examination by the Botanist, it does not differ from his finding more than the limit of variation stated in Schedule "B."

5. The minimum amount of seed required to constitute a sample under Section 7 of the Act shall be as stated in Schedule "C."

6. The seeds of the plants mentioned in Schedule "D" are hereby declared to be noxious weed seeds.

7. The fee for an examination or for a copy of a report by a botanist shall be as stated in Schedule "E."

8. Every vendor within the meaning of the Act, that is to say, every person who sells or offers or exposes for sale or contracts or agrees to sell or deliver any seeds shall cause his name and place of business to be registered annually at the Department of Agriculture in Perth not later than the 1st day of July in every year, and shall pay a fee of 2s. 6d. for such registration, and for every annual renewal thereof.

9. Any person who commits a breach of, or fails to duly observe, any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
