Alteration of Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1326/23.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District; and whereas it is desirable to sever portion of the Quairading Road District and annex it to the Beverley Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby sever that portion of the Quairading Road District, as described in the Schedule hereto, and annex it to the Beverley Road District.

BEVERLEY ROAD DISTRICT.

Transfer of Territory from the Quairading Road District.

All that piece of land at present forming part of Quairading Road District to the Westward of a line commencing on the present district boundary, at the North corner of Avon Location 16325, and extending Southward along the North-East boundary of said Location 16325, the North-East and South-East boundaries of Location 18583, part of the East boundary of Location 10517, the East boundary of Location 7640, part of the North, the East, and the South boundary of Location 15003, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 10786, the East boundary of Location 8790, the East and the South boundary of Location 8065, to rejoin the present district boundary at the South-West corner of the last mentioned location. WHEREAS by "The Mctropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stornwater Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Water Supply Improvements.

Proposed 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main along the North side of Adelaide Terrace, from the existing main at Victoria Avenue to the existing main at Bay View Street; together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary connections and apparatus (length about 65 chains), as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D. No. 4224.

Perth, 7th September, 1923. 764/21. HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the repeal of existing Regulations for the use of the Slip at Geraldton, and the substitution in lieu thereof of the following revised Regulations.

GERALDTON SLIP.

Regulations and Charges.

For use of the Slip at Geraldton.

All Government vessels will be permitted to use 1. the slip free of charge.

2. All other vessels will be charged for services rendered as prescribed by schedule from time to time. 3. The dues charged will cover the use of the slip and the haulage of the vessel on to the slip. The owner

or master of the vessel must arrange for the proper wedging, blocking, etc.

4. The department will not undertake the repairs of vessels; all parties availing themselves of the use of the slip will be required to make their own arrangements for these and provide all necessary material.

5. The department will not be responsible for and shall incur no liability in respect of any damage to any vessel while being hauled up, remaining on or being lowered from the slip or in any way in connection with

the use of the slip. 6. Applications for the use of the slip will be regis-tered in the order of their receipt, but the department reserves to itself the right of determining the order of priority in special cases. 7. Vessels registered for and not arriving at the slip

at the appointed time will be liable to the forfeiture of their turn on the register.

The owner or master of any vessel using the slip will be held responsible for the payment of all charges. 9. All parties requiring the use of the slip shall apply in writing to the Treasury Cashier, Geraldton.

10. Government vessels shall, when considered necessary, take precedence of all other craft, notwithstanding any previous application by private owners for the use of the slip.

11. No vessel will be allowed on the slip whose gross deadweight or build is, in the opinion of the Chief Harbour Master, likely to cause undue wear and tear to the slip.
