WHEREAS by "The Government Railways Act Amendment Act, 1907," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette, declare that any Branch, Spur, or other Railway shall be a District Railway; and whereas it is desirable that the undermentioned Branch or Spur Railway should be declared a District Railway: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Exceutive Council, does hereby declare that the Branch Railtrial, by and with the active consent of the Executive Council, does hereby declare that the Branch Railway known as the Beneubbin-Kalkalling Section, 31 miles 77 chains or thereabouts, and running from Beneubbin to Kalkalling, shall be a District Railway.
