That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of "Crayfish" by means of pots or "cribs," hoop nets, or meshing nets, from the 1st day of January, 1914, until the 31st day of December, 1924.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13,'' it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclama-

13, '' it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit (*inter alia*) all persons from—

(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture,
in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the ''Prawn'' is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the comparison day. the same Act the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for eatching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:

That those portions of Western Australian waters de-fined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a handscoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line), from the 1st day of January, 1924, until the 31st day of December, 1924, inclusive: And further that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh through-out the whole of the net of net loss then one helf juck out the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

#### Schedule.

That portion of the Swan River extending in a Westerly and Southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter Jetty (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan River and its tributaries extending upwards in a North-erly and North-Easterly direction to its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by proclamation, prohibit all persons from-

- (a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture;
- (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture;
- (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever;

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or dur-

ing a specified portion of any year: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

1. That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1924, until the 30th day of April, 1924, and as from the 1st day of August, 1924, until the 31st day of December, 1924, inclusive.

2. That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1924, until the 30th day of April, 1924, and from the 1st day of November, 1924, until the 31st day of December, 1924, inclusive.

3. That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1924, until the 31st day of March, 1924, and from the 1st day of October, 1924, until the 31st day of December, 1924, inclusive.

4. That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1924, until the 23rd day of March, 1924, and from the 16th day of May, 1924, until the 31st day of December, 1924, inclusive.

5. That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fifth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1924, until the 31st day of December, 1924, inclusive; provided that subject to certain provisions (*vide* separate proclamation) it shall be lawful to fish within the waters of the Leschenault Estuary North of a line drawn from the South-Eastern corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the North-Western corner of Leschenault Location 31, between the hours of twelve o'clock noon on Monday to twelve o'clock noon on Tuesday, and from twelve o'clock noon on Thursday to twelve o'clock noon on Friday in each week.

6. That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Sixth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the 1st day of July, 1924, until the 31st day of October, 1924, inclusive.

7. That all those waters mentioned in the Seventh Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of sunk or set nets as from the 1st day of January, 1924, until the 21st day of December, 1924, inclusive.

#### First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said island), and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island), and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

#### Second Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay, extending in an Easterly direction from the Eastern side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore half-a-mile from the said pier or jetty and half-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay, extending in a Westerly direction from the Western side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore one and a-quarter miles from the said pier or jetty and half-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

#### Third Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay, extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay, extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

## Fourth Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar, and thence in a generally Westerly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement.

## Fifth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Estuary (Bunbury).

## Sixth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (uear Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

### Seventh Locality Schedule.

The whole of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northern-most extremity of Coffee Point to the North-Western extremity of Cale Street, and the Lower Canning Bridge.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

#### P.W. 622/22.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, redivide a district into wards and may from time to time declare and determine the number of members constituting a Road Board: And whereas it is desirable to redivide the Claremont Road District into wards and increase the number of members of the Board from seven to eleven: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:---

- Redivide the Claremont Road District into five Wards, with the names and boundaries as described in Schedule "A" hereto.
- (2.) Declare and determine that the number of members constituting the Claremont Road Board shall be eleven in lieu of seven as heretofore, and shall be allocated as shown in Schedule "B" hereto.

## CLAREMONT ROAD DISTRICT.

## Description of Ward Boundaries.

North Ward.—Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the District boundary, from its intersection with the centre line of Smyth Road to intersect the centre line of the Perth-Fremantle Road. On the Southward by the centre line of the Perth-Fremantle Road, from the aforesaid intersection to in-tersect the West boundary of Location 689.

On the Westward by part of the said West boundary of Location 689 and part of the North boundary of said location to the centre line of Smyth Road and along said centre line to the starting point.

East Ward.-Bounded on the Northward by the centre line of the Perth-Fremantle Road, from its intersection with the centre line of Dalkeith Road to intersect the Eastern boundary of the district.

On the Eastward and South-Eastward by part of the district boundary, from the latter intersection to inter-sect the centre line of Success Road.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the last mentioned intersection, and extending Northward along the centre lines of Success and Dalkeith Roads to the starting point.

South Ward.-Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the intersection of the centre lines of Stone and Alice Roads, and extending Eastward along the latter to intersect the West boundary of the East Ward.

On the Eastward by part of the West boundary of the East Ward, from the said intersection to the district boundary

On the Southward and Westward by portion of the district boundary to the starting point.

Central Ward .- Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the intersection of the district boundary with the centre line of the Eastern Railway Reserve, and extending North-Eastward along the said centre line to the production Westward of the Southern alignment of Aberdare Road, and along said alignment (the district boundary) to intersect the Western boundary of the North Ward.

On the Eastward by the Western boundary of the North Ward and part of the Western boundary of the East Ward, from the last mentioned intersection to intersect the Northern boundary of the South Ward.

On the Southward by the Northern boundary of the South Ward and part of the District boundary, from the last mentioned intersection to the centre of Bay Road.

On the Westward by part of the district boundary to the starting point.

West Ward .- Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary.

On the South-Eastward and Southward by part of the district boundary, portion of the Northern boundary of the Central Ward, and again by parts of the district boundaries to the shores of the Indian Ocean.

On the Westward by the shores of the Indian Ocean to the starting point.

### Premier's Department, Perth, 21st December, 1923.

IT is hereby notified, for public information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to apply to the camping area on Crawley Re-serve A17375 the following Regulations:--

1. Campers are prohibited from bringing any domestic animals such as horses, cows, goats, or fowls into camp.

2. Campers must at all times be decently elad, quiet and orderly, and in no circumstances will they be permitted to sublet their camps. In the event of any campers desiring to leave their camping area before the ex-piry of their permit, others desiring to occupy the camp must first obtain a permit from the Camp Controller.

Campers must keep their camping areas free from rubbish, and a clean and sanitary condition at all times.

All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided, and in no circumstances will improvised conveniences on individual camping areas be permitted.

The presence of green timber and foliage on any camping permit in a damaged condition will be held to be evidence that the camping permit holder has done the damage, unless the permit holder has pointed out the damage on taking over the area.

6. Camping permits are issued only on the distinct understanding that they are revocable by the Camp Controller at any time for breaches of any of the rules and regulations. All camp permits will be reviewed at least once a month, and extensions of permits may be refused at the discretion of the Camp Controller.

Casual visitors to the reserve and beaches will not be charged any fees, but they are hereby prohibited from invading the area cevered by camping permits.

8. No fires must be lighted on the reserves except in places approved by the Camp Controller.

The tops to be properly aligned. Two rails to each panel of not less than three inches by two index in arrow certains and accound with wighter

by two inches in cross sections and covered with pickets three inches wide and not less than three-quarters of au inch thick, spaced not more than three inches apart. The whole to be constructed to the satisfaction of the Board or its agent.

Or-post and wire fence.

Posts not less than five inches by three inches in sections not less than four feet out of the ground and two feet in the ground, nor nore than six feet out of the ground nor less than one-third of their total length in the ground, and placed nine foot centres. The tops to be properly aligned.

Top rail to each panel of not less than three inches by two inches in cross sections to be four feet above footpath level.

Bottom rail to each panel of not less than six inches by two inches to stand two inches above footpath level, with not less than six wires to be not more than five inches apart.
