WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia to fix the time and place for the holding of the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that the Second Session of the Twelfth Parliament of Western Australia shall be holden for the despatch of business on Thursday, the 30th day of July, 1925, at the hour of 3 o'clock in the afternoon, at the House of Parliament, in the city of Perth; and Members of the Legislative Council and Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.
