THE DENTAL ACT, 1894.

Amended Rules.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Dentists Act, 1894," "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," and "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920," the Dental Board may make Rules, and may amend, repeal, and add to any such Rules: Now, therefore, the Dental Board doth hereby amend the Rules made under the said Act by deleting Sections (a) and (b), and relettering Sections (c) and (d) of Rule 29, making the Rule to read as follows:—

All articles of apprenticeship shall be submitted to the Board for registration between the first day of December of one year and the 31st day of March of the next year, and should be drawn up on the form prescribed by the Board.

No articles of apprenticeship shall be registered unless and until the apprentice therein named shall have passed-

- (a) An examination at the Leaving Standard of the University of Western Australia in:
 - (1) English.
 - (2) Another language.
 - (3) Two other subjects selected from the following list, of which at least one shall be selected from amongst the first ten of this list:
 - 1. Latin.
 - 2. Greek.
 - 3. French.
 - 4. German.
 - 5. Italian.
 - 6. Spanish.
 - 7. History.
 - 8. Geography. 9. Mathematics.
 - 10. Applied Mathematics.
 - 11. Physics.
 - 12. Chemistry.
 - 13. Biology.
 - 14. Geology.
 - 15. Agricultural Science.

If Mathematics and Physics be not selected under (3), the candidate must have obtained a pass in these subjects at the Junior Standard.

Of the four subjects necessary at the Leaving Standard, at least three shall be passed at one and the same examination, and the remaining subject at any subsequent examination; or,

(b) An examination which, in the opinion of the Board, is equivalent to that prescribed in (a).
