WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purpose of the said Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, acting under the powers contained in the said Act, and every other power me in this behalf enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that Saturday, 7th November, shall be a public holiday in the Townsite of Cranbrook for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

2469/19.WHEREAS by a Proclamation under "The Game Act, 1912-13," dated the 17th day of December, 1924, and published in the Government Gazette of the 19th December, 1924, it was declared that the Opossum should be

at all times strictly preserved throughout the State from at all times strictly preserved throughout the State From the 1st day of January, 1925, until the 31st day of December, 1925: And whereas it is desirable to tem-porarily suspend the operation of the said Proclamation throughout the State: Now therefore I, the said Gover-nor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that notwithstanding the provisions of the said Proclamation the taking or killing of Opossums shall be lawful for a period of five (5) weeks on and after the 1st day of November, 1925, to the 7th day of December, 1925, throughout the State of Western Australia.

Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921," it is enacted, among other things, that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the Legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the Commonwealth and outside the United Kingdom, for the enforcement within that part of His Majesty's dominions of judgments obtained in the Supreme Court of this State, the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare that the said Act shall extend to that part of His Majesty's Dominions: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by competent authorities in the Territory of New Guinea and the Territory of Norfolk Island: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by Section 8 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921," doth hereby declare that the said Act shall extend to the Territory of New Guinea and the Territory of Norfolk Island.
