(a.) All persons over the age of four years bathing in any waters exposed to the public view shall be clad in a bathing costume covering the body from the neck to the knee and of such a size and material as to secure the observance of decency.
(b.) In any case where, in the Superintendent's opinion, any person's bathing costume is indecent or inadequate, or the material thersof is too thin, or is not in a proper state of repair, or is for any reason unsuitable, the Superintendent may direct such person to resume at once his ordinary dress.
(c.) If any person shall refuse or neglect to resume immediately his ordinary dress on being directed so to do by the Superintendent, he slall be guilty of an offence under this By-law and may be removed by the Superintendent with any necessary force to the dressing enclosure or shed.
(d.) No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.
