Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921," it is enacted, among other things, that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the Legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the Commonwealth and outside the United Kingdom, for the enforcement within that part of His Majesty's Dominions of judgments obtained in the Supreme Court of this State, the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare that the said Act shall extend to that part of His Majesty's Dominions: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions are about to be made by the competent authority in the Colony of Fiji: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by Section 8 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921," doth hereby declare that the said Act shall extend to the Colony of Fiji.

The Forests Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 269/23

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:-

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation;
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the twenty-third day of July, 1924, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 4 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 4, Collie, by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to repeal the existing Rules and Regulations for the government and management of the Hospitals for the Insane of Western Australia, under the provisions of "The Lunacy Act, 1903–20," and approve of the annexed Rules and Regulations in lieu thereof.

REGULATIONS.

GENERAL CARE OF PATIENTS.

1. Unless medical direction to the contrary shall be given, every patient immediately on admission shall be undressed and bathed in the presence of the Head Attendant of the proper side.

2. The male and female patients shall be kept in separate wards, and no male attendant, servant, or patient shall be allowed to enter the female side, or any female to enter the male side, except in the discharge of some duty, or with adequate authority.

Any attendant or servant transgressing this rule, unless a satisfactory explanation is given to the Medical Superintendent, shall be immediately reported to the Inspector General.

3. During the day the patients shall be employed as much as possible in their respective trades, and in suitable occupations in or out of doors; and as a principle of treatment endeavours shall be made continually to occupy the patients, to induce them to take exercise in the open air, and to promote cheerfulness and happiness amongst them.

All attendants and nurses with patients working are also to work in order to set an example.

4. The patients shall be induced to have frequent recourse to the various amusements provided for them, both indoor and outdoor, and they shall be encouraged to read the books and publications which are provided for them.

Attendants and nurses are required as a matter of duty to enter into the amusements of the patients and to dance or participate in any game that the patients are engaged in, provided such participation does not interfere with the supervision of the other patients.

- 5. The airing courts shall be open to the respective classes of patients every day when the weather is favourable, and shall be used as far as circumstances will permit.
- 6. With the exception of rooms for single patients, no dormitory shall contain less than three beds. Patients shall sleep singly.
- 7. No naked lights shall be used in any of the wards or dormitories, nor shall any lantern be used which has not the sanction of the Medical Superintendent. No patient shall be allowed to have matches in his possession except by permission of the Medical Superintendent. Every possible precaution must be taken to avoid the occurrence of fire in the Hospital.
- 8. The religious persuasion of every patient will be, as far as possible, ascertained and recorded in the Register of Patients. Patients will be attended in sickness by the authorised minister of the form of religion to which they are ascertained to belong, and will not be permitted to attend the service of another denomination except with the permission of the Medical Superintendent.

REFRACTORY AND VIOLENT PATIENTS.

- 9. Under no circumstances whatever, under pain of instant dismissal, shall a patient be struck or threatened. Neither shall any patient be placed under restraint or seclusion except by the order of a medical officer.
- 10. In cases of extreme violence the Head Attendant or Matron or their deputies may order such a course, but they shall report the fact as soon as possible to the Medical Superintendent or Medical Officer.
- 11. In such cases, wherever possible, no employee shall attempt to deal singly with the patient, but shall procure the assistance of another employee, or, if need be, of more than one.

KINDNESS TO PATIENTS.

12. All attendants shall treat their patients kindly, and shall not speak harshly to them. They shall be responsible for the safety, tidiness, cleanliness, and general condition of their patients, and for the proper ventilation and good order of their wards. They shall attend to the dressing and undressing of their patients, carefully searching for injuries, bruises, and other marks, and report any such immediately to the Head Attendant of their side, who shall forthwith report thereon to the Medical Officer.

GENERAL STAFF REQUIREMENTS.

(Note.—Head Attendant and Attendant include Matron and Nurse).

- 13. No officer, attendant or servant shall directly or indirectly take any fee, reward, or perquisite of any kind from any tradesman, patient, or patient's friend, or sell anything to, or buy anything from a patient on pain of dismissal, without permission of the Minister.
- 14. No officer, attendant, or servant shall introduce any stranger into any part of the Hospital without permission of the Medical Superintendent.
- 15. No attendant, nurse, or any other person employed about the Hospital will be permitted to have any article made or repaired upon the premises without the sanction of the Medical Superintendent.
- 16. Except with the express permission of the Inspector General or Medical Superintendent no employee shall use or disclose either directly or indirectly for any purpose, other than in the discharge of his, or her, official duties, information gained by or conveyed to him, or her, through employment with the Lunacy Department.
- 17. No attendant, nurse, or any other person employed about the Hospital shall bring any intoxicating liquor into the Hospital, or allow it to be brought in, without a special order from the Inspector General.
- 18. No attendant, nurse, or other person employed about the Hospital shall be permitted to remove worn out or other stores belonging to the Hospital without the permission of the Managing Secretary.
- 19. No linen belonging to any officer, attendant, nurse or servant shall be received at the laundry for the purpose of being washed unless the same is marked with his or her name in full.

The attendants, nurses, and servants are to take their clothes to the laundry with written lists, and the quantity is not to exceed that authorised.

- 20. All attendants, nurses, and servants, when engaged, shall be put on probation for twelve months, subject to giving entire satisfaction, before being finally confirmed in their appointments. Uniforms may be issued after six months. During their probation the attendant, nurse, or servant may be discharged at any time by reason of incompetence, misconduct, or being temperamentally unfit, wages being paid only to the date of discharge, but after appointment is confirmed one month's notice will be given, except in case of extreme misconduct.
- 21. In all cases attendants, nurses and servants are expected to give one month's notice in writing, prior to leaving their situations (except with the consent of the Medical Superintendent) or to forfeit one month's salary.
- 22. No attendant, artisan or servant will be permitted to take any parcel from the Institution without a note from the Medical Superintendent, which must be shown to the lodgekeeper.
- 23. Leave breaking and any negligence which may lead to the escape of a patient will be punished by dismissal, reduction in status, fine, or reprimand.
- 24. Any attendant, nurse, artisan, or servant desiring to make representation respecting their duties, positions, etc., to the Inspector General shall do so through the Medical Superintendent or the Managing Secretary, as the case may be, who shall forward all such communications. Attendants, nurses, artisans, and servants are prohibited from addressing on official business the permanent head or any officer in other departments of the Public Service except through the Inspector General.
- 25. Employees are prohibited from seeking the interest or influence of any person not connected with the Department in order to obtain promotion or other advantage.
- 26. Employees will not be permitted to receive visitors within the grounds without the permission of the Medical Superintendent, nor will they be permitted to leave their duty to send or answer telephone calls.
- $27.\,$ Monetary transactions are strictly forbidden between employees and officers, other employees or patients.
- 28. No address or testimonial shall be accepted by any employee in connection with his public duties without the sanction of the Minister, unless it is from the Inspector General, the Medical Superintendent, or Managing Secretary, giving an employee a reference of character and ability.

29. Any attendant or other employee is liable to instant dismissal by the Inspector General for being intoxicated, or neglecting any of the patients, or for any act of insubordination or misconduct.

GOVERNMENT GAZETTE, W.A.

- 30. The authorised entrance or exit for all employees and servants to and from the Hospital is only by the authorised gates.
- 31. The most scrupulous cleanliness is required in every part of the Institution.
- 32. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Regulations, any employee may communicate to the members of his Union such information as is necessary to enable action to be taken on the part of such Union to obtain by lawful means the redress of any grievance under which such employee considers he is suffering in connection with his official position.

UNIFORM REGULATIONS.

33. All employees entitled to uniforms after the expiration of six months (subject to the condition of Regulation 20) will be supplied with uniform clothing, which shall remain the property of the Hospital.

Uniform shall be worn by employees at all times when on duty, and at entertainments, dances, etc., and shall be given up at the time of leaving the Department's service unless special permission is given by the Medical Superintendent for it to be taken away. In such cases payment shall be made as under:—

For one month from issue 80 per cent. of cost; two months, 60 per cent.; three months, 40 per cent.; four months and over—20 per cent. This does not apply to waterproof coats, which shall remain the property of the Department.

4 uniforms with 4 pairs cuffs, 4 collars, and 2 caps every year. Linen for aprons as approved.

- 2 print uniforms every twelve months, with 4 pairs cuffs and collars.
- 6 aprons every year.
- 2 caps every year.
- 1 serge uniform every year.
- 1 hat every year.
- 1 cloth cape when necessary.
- 1 waterproof cloak every three years.

Charge Nurses wear white military braid on their left arms.

Nurses wear cornflour blue uniforms.

Probationer nurses wear pink stripe uniforms.

Laundresses:

- 4 print uniforms every year, and 4 collars.
- 1 hat every year.
- 6 aprons every year.

House maids:

- 4 print uniforms every year, and 4 pairs cuffs and collars.
- 3 caps every year.
- 6 aprons every year.

LEAVE.

34. All applications for leave of absence shall be made through the proper quarter. Any officer exceeding his or her leave will be considered to be absent without permission, and treated accordingly.

It is to be distinctly understood that attendants, nurses, and other employees when on leave are liable to be recalled at any moment should the exigencies of the service so require.

LATE LEAVE.

35. Any nurse, attendant, or servant desiring late leave must give notice to the Matron or Head Attendant before 10 a.m. of the day such leave is desired.

The granting of late leave is left to the discretion of the Medical Superintendent, and will not be granted more than twice in any one week except under exceptional circumstances.

SICK LEAVE.

36. A medical certificate shall be required in all cases of absence from duty owing to illness. The Inspector General in his discretion may reject any medical certificate from an outside practitioner.

An officer who is too unwell to attend to his duties, but who is not confined to the house, may be required to take his annual leave.

LONG SERVICE LEAVE.

37. Officers, except the Matron, Deputy Matron, Head Attendant, Deputy Head Attendant, and Farm Manager, are not entitled to long service leave.

CARE IN ISSUE OF STORES.

38. Employees shall be held responsible for the careful use and preservation of all stores and public property in their custody or care. Strict economy is to be observed in the use of stores supplied for public requirements. The employee in charge of, or occupying public buildings, shall make timely requisition for repairs when such are necessary.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ISSUE OF STORES.

39. All stores shall be issued under the authority of the Managing Secretary.

The following officers will enter their requirements in special books, which shall be sent to the store when articles are required; the counterfoil shall be retained by the Storekeeper and the original signed as a receipt by each officer receiving, viz.:—

Inspector General.
Medical Superintendent.
Medical Officers.
Managing Secretary.
Matron.
Deputy Matron.
Housekeeper.
Head Attendant.
Deputy Head Attendant.
Farm Manager.
Engineer.
Attendant authorised to draw stores.

A special requisition book shall also be kept by the Storekeeper for any stores others than those requisitioned by the above officers.

The Farm Manager shall requisition for stores required for the Pure Milk Supply, Farm, Garden, and Lodge; the Engineer for the requirements of himself and the artisan staff; and the Housekeeper for dining room, kitchen, laundry, and nurses' quarters (domestic side).

Materials issued for making up shall be entered in "Material Issue Book," and signed by the officer receiving. Articles or goods made up shall be brought to the Storekeeper, who will sign for them in the "Work Book."

STORES CONDEMNED AND REPLACED.

40. Stores condemning day shall be :--

On the female side, the first Monday in every month.

On the male side, the second Monday in every month. Stores replacement days shall be:—

The Thursdays following the first and second Mondays respectively.

The nurses in charge of wards shall deliver their stores condemned and replacement sheets to the Matron on the morning of stores condemning day. The Matron will review them, and, if necessary, revise them, and shall deliver them to the Storekeeper prior to condemnation. Articles to be condemned shall be produced to the Storekeeper at two o'clock on stores condemning day.

The attendants in charge of wards shall act similarly, the Head Attendant taking the place of the Matron.

On replacement day at 3 p.m. the attendants and nurses will receive the stores and shall sign the condemned and replacement sheets as a receipt.

Farm Manager, Engineer, Housekeeper, etc., act in the same way as the nurses and attendants with regard to condemning and replacing stores; all the female side drawing stores at 3 p.m. on the Thursday following the first Monday, and on the male side on the Thursday following the second Monday in each month.

In submitting their replacement sheets the staff shall give the correct names' and, where necessary, the sizes of the articles required.

BRANDING OF STORES.

41. Whenever it is possible to do so, all stores shall be branded "M" or "F" (male or female side) with the number or name of ward or section to which they are going.

BATHING RULES.

- 42. (a.) Every patient shall be bathed immediately after admission, and once a week afterwards, unless a medical order to the contrary is given. Should there be any doubt as to the advisability of bathing any patient, owing to sickness or other cause, immediate reference shall be made to the Medical Officer.
- (b.) A fresh bath shall always be prepared for each patient, and no bath, except for purposes of cleanliness, shall be given without a medical order.
 - (c.) In preparing a bath the cold water shall first be turned on.
- (d.) Before a patient enters the bath the attendant shall ascertain, with a thermometer, the temperature; this must not be below 90 degrees or above 98 degrees F. No patient shall be permitted to be in the bath whilst the water is turned on.
 - (e.) After the preparation of each bath the key shall be removed.
- (f.) Under no circumstances whatever shall a patient's head be placed under water.
 - (g.) No patient whilst bathing shall at any time be left without an attendant.
 - (h.) No patient shall bath another, or assist the attendant in bathing a patient.
- (i.) The name of every patient not having a customary bath shall be entered in the Daily Report Book.
- (j.) It is the duty of the Head Attendant or Matron to supervise the general bathing operations, to see that the bathing rules are rigidly adhered to, and to report to the Medical Superintendent any infringement thereof.
- (k.) All marks, bruises, sores, complaints of pains, evidence of diseases, etc., in the patients shall be reported to the Medical Officer, and entered on the report sheet.
- (l.) At all times when bathing is not in progress, the water shall be turned off and the bath key locked away.

DIET SCALE FOR PATIENTS.

43. The following shall be the scale for all patients, except those for whom special diet may be ordered by the Medical Officer.

Curry powder, spice, vinegar, mustard and pickles may be allowed in moderation, but the Storekeeper shall report to the Managing Secretary if at any time he considers the demand excessive.

Fish may be substituted for meat.

Unless otherwise authorised, the dinners shall be as follows:--

SPECIAL DIETS.

44. (a.) In the case of hospital patients, and those for whom a special diet is ordered by the Medical Officer, diet sheets requisitioning the additional articles shall be given to the Storekeeper by the Head Attendant or Matron.

(b.) Patients actively employed, viz.—doing at least four hours' work daily, may be allowed an additional 20zs. bread, 10z. cheese, half-pint of milk, lemonade,

oaten water or tea.

(c.) Special allowances—3ozs. flour, 2ozs. raisins or currants, 2ozs. suet, 1½oz. sugar, on the King's birthday and Christmas Day to each patient; also half pint of beer or lemonade on the King's birthday, and one pint on Christmas Day.

REGULATIONS IN CASE OF FIRE.

45. (a.) In the case of a fire breaking out in any ward of the building, the safety of the patients must be the first consideration, and every effort shall be

made to secure them from all danger.

(b.) The attendant, or the employee detecting the fire, shall immediately use every effort to extinguish it by means of the water that is at hand in the fire bucket, but if the fire appears likely to extend he shall immediately give the alarm, and if the fire occurs at night see that the Medical Superintendent and the attendants sleeping in the buildings are advised.

(c.) The nearest hose pipe must then be got to work with all possible speed

without waiting for the arrival of the fire brigade.

(d.) The officer in charge shall see to the safety of the patients.

(e.) The alarm shall never be exercised except in the case of a fire or a fire brigade practice.

(f.) On no account must fire buckets be used for other than fire fighting pur-

poses.

(g.) It is the Charge Attendant's duty to see that the fire fighting appliances are in perfect order; any defect shall be immediately reported.

EXAMINATIONS.

- 48. (a.) Written and oral examinations for the mental nursing certificate will be held each July for the first, second, and third year nursing staff.
- (b.) It is compulsory for the nursing staff to sit for these examinations in their respective years.
- (c.) Attendants must attend three-fourths of the lectures given for each course, or they will not be permitted to sit for the examination.
- (d.) Any attendant who has been in the service over six months prior to the 1st July, shall sit for the first year examination.
- (e.) Any attendant failing twice in any one year's examination shall leave the service.
- (f.) Attendants who pass their examinations become senior to those who fail.
- (g.) An attendant may not sit for two examinations in the same year unless through no fault of their own they were unable to sit in the previous year.
- (h.) A mental nursing certificate will be granted to attendants who pass the third year examination.

SMOKING (FOR PATIENTS).

- 49. (a.) The allowance of tobacco will be regulated from time to time by the Medical Superintendent.
- (b.) Tobacco will not be given to those who are dirty in their habits, to those under medical treatment, to those who will not work (except in cases of old age or infirmity), to those who do not use it, or to boys.

- (c.) No new patient will receive tobacco without the special permission of the Medical Officer.
- (d.) Smoking is permitted at all times in the open air, but it is strictly prohibited in any of the corridors, kitchens, offices, stores, and workshops. In the day-rooms, on wet days, and after tea, it is allowed.
- (c.) Matches shall not be given to the patients except by permission of the Medical Superintendent, but their pipes will be lighted for them by the attendants. Newspaper shall not be used for lighting pipes.

Only safety matches are allowed on the Hospital premises.

ENTERTAINMENTS.

- 50. (a.) Attendants conducting patients to the recreation hall or recreation grounds, to dances or other entertainments, from the wards, shall pay particular attention to the tidiness of those under their care, and see that they do not escape or wander away between the wards and the hall, or the grounds.
- (b.) Attendants shall count the number of patients they take from the ward, as they leave the ward, and again when they reach the hall or grounds, and again when reaching the ward.
 - (c.) As many patients as possible shall be allowed to attend entertainments.
- (d.) The Head Attendant or Matron (subject to the approval of the medical staff) shall advise the attendant in charge of those patients who are not permitted to attend entertainments.
- (c.) The attendant in charge shall inform the Head Attendant or Matron should there be any change in the behaviour of a patient, and shall obtain their instructions with regard to those patients attending entertainments.

ESCORT DUTY.

- 51. (a.) No attendant on escort duty shall take alcoholic stimulants, nor shall he or she give any patient any such stimulants, except for medicinal purposes in emergencies as may be authorised. Any attendant who is found guilty of a breach of this rule shall be liable to be dismissed.
- (b.) While escorting male patients, attendants shall be required to wear ordinary clothes, unless otherwise specially instructed.

VISITORS TO PATIENTS.

- 52. (a.) The patients may be visited by their relatives or friends every Sunday, between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., and on Wednesdays, between 11 a.m. and 12 noon, and between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m.
- (b.) Patients shall be at liberty to hold private conversations with persons visiting them, but no male shall remain in the room with a female without a special permission of the Medical Superintendent, and except in the presence of an attendant or other third person not a patient. Letters to and from patients must pass through the hands of the Medical Superintendent.
- (c.) No visitor shall be allowed to remain more than half an hour with a patient without special leave from the Medical Superintendent.
- (d.) Visitors are prohibited from bringing into the Institution wine, beer, spirits, matches, knives, or other dangerous articles.
- (e.) In conversation with the patients, visitors are requested not to depress those they are visiting, or to say anything to cause them to be discontented. It is to be regretted that from inattention to this caution patients are frequently much worse after a letter, or interview with their relatives.
- (f.) No patient can under any pretext be visited should the Medical Superintendent consider such visit injurious to the patient.
- (g.) No correspondence, legal or otherwise, is permitted to be signed or passed between any patient and visitors except with the sanction of the Medical Superintendent.
- (h.) No gratuity shall be given to or received by any attendant or servant of the Institution.
- (i.) When patients are dangerously ill relatives or friends will be admitted at any time by the direction of the Medical Superintendent.

DAY ATTENDANTS AND NURSES.

- 53. (1.) Accompanied by the night attendant, and after having received from him a report of any changes that have occurred during the night the first duty of a charge attendant shall be to check the number of the patients and take over the full responsibility of the ward.
- (2.) A list of patients shall be kept in each ward by the charge attendant, and the attendant in charge who is required to count the patients at each meal time and before going to bed.

- (3.) The charge attendant is responsible for the custody and due administration of all medicines, and for the carrying out of all instructions of the medical officers. All medicines shall be kept locked in the proper cupboards.
- (4.) The charge attendant shall be accountable for all linen, clothing, and other articles belonging to the ward, and shall be liable to replace or pay for any deficiency.
- (5.) The charge attendant of every ward shall, on ceasing duty, give over the charge of patients in his ward to the relieving attendant, reporting all patients newly admitted into the ward, all who are epileptics, suicidal, and all who may require special attention during the night.
- (6.) The charge attendant of every ward shall, before going off duty every evening, make the following written returns to the Head Attendant:—Number of patients in the ward; number employed, and in what manner; the names of those excited or sick; the names of admissions, removals, and deaths; the names of those patients who have had fits; the names of destructive patients, and the articles destroyed; all accidents and other occurrences worthy of note.
- (7.) All attendants shall obey the instructions and directions of the Head Attendant, to whom they shall apply without delay if in any doubt as to the mode of performing any required duty.
- (8.) The attendant in charge of the ward is responsible for the care and safe custody of each patient, for the good order of the ward, and for the due observance of the Regulations. The other attendants attached to the ward are subject to the directions of the attendant in charge in matters relating to the patients and the work of the ward.
- (9.) The attendant in charge shall on no account leave the ward even for a few minutes without handing over the charge to another attendant.
- (10.) As soon as the doors are unlocked, the shutters and all windows, top and bottom, or as many as may be necessary to ensure proper ventilation of all the sleeping rooms, shall be opened. The bedding shall then be fully exposed to the air for at least one hour before the beds are made up.
- (11.) The hair of all male patients shall be cut at least once a month, and all those who do not wear beards (except suicidal cases) shall be shaved twice a week.
- (12.) The attendants shall see that every patient is washed and tidied. Those patients who are capable should be encouraged to do so themselves, but all feeble and helpless patients require the active assistance of the attendants. The patients' heads are to be frequently examined and kept thoroughly clean.
- (13.) Whenever the whole or any number of the patients leave their ward they shall be counted out, and on their return they shall be counted in. When patients return from the farm or workshops, or from the airing courts, the attendants shall be careful that they do not carry anything with them.
- (14.) All attendants on duty shall be present at each meal and shall remain until the close; the tables shall be laid neatly before the patients take their seats. Grace shall be said or sung before and after each meal. The attendants shall see that all patients have their hair brushed and are clean and tidy in their person before entering the dining hall, and at the table they shall encourage them to use their knives and forks as far as possible.
- (15.) Those patients who are in the habit of bolting their food or eating ravenously must have it cut up into small pieces for them, and those patients who are on mince dinner are not to be allowed to eat the ordinary food.
- (16.) The attendants shall take special pains with those patients who refuse their food by first coaxing them to take it, and then, if necessary, feeding them.
- (17.) After each meal before the patients leave the tables the knives and forks shall be collected, counted, and locked up in the proper boxes; should any be missing, strict search shall immediately be made, and the loss reported to the Head Attendant; and under no circumstances shall a patient be allowed to use the carving knife and fork.
- (18.) In the employment of the patient it is essential that the attendant himself take an active share, by which means very often those patients who are listless and indolent are induced to assist in the work. The patients shall not be employed in any work other than that of the hospital, unless by order of the Medical Superintendent.
- (19.) It is the duty of an attendant to perform any work which is carried out by a patient.
- (20.) The attendants shall not indulge those patients who assist in ward work by giving them extra food beyond what is allowed them on the extra diet sheet, and they shall not allow such patients to exercise any authority over the other patients.

Tobacco and cigarettes are supplied to patients as an inducement to work and to proper behaviour. No attendant, whilst on duty, shall smoke until after the patients' tea.

- (21.) All letters and documents written by patients are to pass through the Medical Superintendent.
- (22.) No bedroom shall be washed whilst occupied by a patient, and no covering shall be placed on a damp floor.

- (23.) All accidents, however slight, illness, and death, shall be immediately reported to the Head Attendant.
 - (24.) All waste or needless consumption of any article shall be strictly avoided.
- (25.) The attendants shall on no account give up any key to any patient, but shall always keep them attached to their persons, and they shall lock all doors as they pass in and out of any ward. Attendants are liable to be fined for losing their key or keys.
- (26.) No patient is allowed to enter an attendant's room unless the attendant is present. The doors of the attendants' rooms shall always be kept locked. Attendants are responsible for keeping their rooms tidy.
- (27.) On the escape of any patient the attendant in charge of such patient renders himself or herself liable to repay the whole of the expenses of re-capture; and in any case of neglect the attendant or nurse is liable to be fined or dismissed. Any escape shall be immediately reported to the Head Attendant and Lodge-keeper, and the former shall forthwith report to the Medical Superintendent.
- (28.) When patients sleep in a ward other than their own the attendant in charge of the ward from which they are sent is to forward with them a written list of the patients so removed, which list shall be given to the attendant in charge of the ward to which they are taken, and this arrangement shall be carried out in every case of transfer from ward to ward.
- (29.) Should any patient require to be bathed, removed from one ward to another, dressed or undressed, or otherwise dealt with whilst in a state of excitement or violence, the attendant in charge shall always be present.
- (30.) No patient shall be allowed to leave his or her ward unless accompanied by an attendant or some other responsible person except by special permission of the Medical Superintendent.
- (31.) No patient shall be left alone in any workshop except by authority of the Medical Superintendent.
- (32.) All tools of a dangerous character are to be kept in a secure place, and inaccessible to the patients. The clothing of each patient shall be searched every night after the patient is in bed.
- (33.) Unless there are special directions to the contrary, all articles of clothing belonging to each patient shall be removed from his or her reach at bed time.
- (34.) The attendants shall, on no consideration, remove tools, utensils, etc., from the artisans' shops, kitchens, toolhouse, garden, etc., without the knowledge of those having charge of them; and all borrowed tools, etc., shall be returned as soon as done with.

VISITORS TO WARDS.

54. When the door of a ward is opened by a visitor or by an officer of the Hospital, one of the attendants shall meet and accompany such officer or visitor through the ward unless ordered to the contrary.

ILL-TREATMENT OF PATIENTS.

55. Any attendant witnessing the ill-treatment of a patient and not endeavouring to prevent it, or not reporting the matter immediately to one of the Medical Officers, the Head Attendant, or his deputy, renders himself liable to dismissal.

SUICIDAL PATIENTS AND ESCAPEES, ETC.

56. Special attention shall be given to patients who have a suicidal tendency, and the greatest watchfulness shall be employed in preventing such patients obtaining possession of dangerous articles. When a window is broken the glass shall immediately be removed. Prompt search shall be made for either weapons or matches when their existence is suspected, and both bedding and clothing shall be searched for concealed articles.

Tickets shall be issued by the Medical Officer for the special observation of certain patients, e.g., suicidals, escapees, etc. The attendant holding a ticket or tickets shall on no account let such patient or patients out of his sigh, and is personally responsible for such patient or patients. On being relieved, he shall hand over the ticket or tickets to the attendant relieving him.

BED LINEN AND CLOTHING.

57. Clean bed linen and underclothing as required shall be supplied to every patient at least once a week.

Patients without hats and shoes shall not be allowed in the grounds, and the habit of lying on the ground and crouching in corners shall be discountenanced.

MEDICINES.

58. Every care shall be exercised in giving medicines as directed, and all jars, bottles, etc., unused and empty shall be returned to the dispensary clean.

RETURNS AND REPORTS.

- 59. The following returns and papers shall be kept by the attendant in charge of each ward, or in his absence by his substitute:—
 - (a.) The "Daily Report," which shall be filled in, signed, and left in the Head Attendant's office before the Head Attendant leaves at night.
 - (b.) The "Diet List," which shall be ready for the signature of the Medical Officers at the morning visit.
 - (c.) The "Working Patients" List, which shall be made up and delivered to the Head Attendant at the end of each week.
 - (d.) The "Laundry List," which shall be made up and delivered to the Head Attendant at the end of each week.
 - (e.) The "Stores Requirement List," which shall be delivered with all the worn out or torn articles, to the Head Attendant on the morning before the stores issue day.
 - (f.) An inventory of all clothing, bedding, utensils and other articles belonging to the respective wards, which at all times shall be ready for inspection.
 - (g.) "List of Patients," which at all times shall be ready for inspection.

NIGHT ATTENDANTS.

- 60. (a.) In their first visit at night the night attendants shall be accompanied by the attendant in charge of each respective ward, and shall learn from him or her what patients require special attention during the night.
- (b.) The attendants on the rounds shall visit all dormitories and single rooms, and see all the patients at least once an hour, except observation and sick patients, who shall have their special attendants.
- (c.) The attendants in the observation dormitories shall on no account leave their dormitories during the hours of duty, unless relieved.
- (d.) They shall become acquainted with those patients who habitually wet their beds, and as often as may be necessary, must wake them and make them attend to natural calls; the names of the patients and the hours of awakening shall be entered in the night report.
- (e.) They shall, before going off duty every morning, collect all the soiled linen and clothing in readiness for removal to the laundry.
- (f.) They shall see that all lights in the attendants' rooms are extinguished at $11\cdot15$ p.m., with the exception of those coming off or going on duty, or those granted late leave, and shall call the attendants at $6\cdot30$ a.m.
- (g.) They shall make a report every morning in the "Night Book" under the several heads required.
- (h.) The night attendants are subject to the same regulations, as far as they are applicable, as the day attendants.

DOMESTIC STAFF, ARTISANS AND SERVANTS.

61. (a.) The Farm Manager, Engineer, Housekeeper, Gardeners, Artisans and Servants, Hall Porter and Lodgekeeper, shall be under the control of the Managing Secretary.

They shall:-

- (b.) Whether resident or not, be subject to the same regulations as the Attendants or Nurses as far as they are applicable; and on emergencies they are liable to be called upon to act as Attendants or Nurses.
- (c.) Receive from the wards every morning such patients as the Head Attendant directs, and shall employ them during the day at their respective trades, return them to their own wards at the proper time and give them in charge of an attendant. They are responsible for the care and custody of all the patients employed with them, until they are returned to the wards.
- (d.) Be responsible for the tools, etc., used in their departments, and shall make an inventory every six months, which shall be checked by the Storekeeper.
- (c.) Be specially careful to keep dangerous tools and implements in a place of safety, and shall see that all those in use are locked up before the patients leave their shops to return to the wards.
- (f.) Male artisans and servants shall not enter the female wards without being accompanied by a female officer.
- (g.) Repairs required shall be entered in a special book kept for the purpose, and approved by the Managing Secretary, and no work shall be undertaken which is not entered in this book, except in case of extreme urgency, which shall be forthwith reported to the Managing Secretary.

FITTER, CARPENTER, PLUMBER, ELECTRICIAN, PAINTER, UPHOLSTERER, ETC.

62. Under the immediate direction of the Engineer they shall respectively carry out their trades in the repairs and additions of the fabric, fittings and furniture as may from time to time be instructed by the Managing Secretary.

HALL PORTER.

- 63. He shall:—
 - (a.) Have charge of and keep clean the Administration Block.
- (b.) Act as general messenger in the Hospital, and shall distribute the letters, receive visitors, answer inquiries, do minor clerical work, and direct all persons who come to see patients to the proper visitors' room, and inform the Head Attendant or Matron.
- (c.) Keep the Patients' Visiting Book, entering the names and addresses of every visitor, and the name of the patient visited, except on visiting days, when this duty will be performed by the attendant or nurse in charge of the visiting rooms.

THE LODGEKEEPER.

64. He shall:—

- (a.) Have charge of the main entrance gate, and shall keep that part of the ground allotted to him tidy and in good order.
- (b.) Be always ready to admit such persons as have business in the Hospital, but persons having no particular business are not to be admitted except by permission of the Medical Superintendent. He shall not allow patients to pass the gate, unless under charge of an attendant, and shall keep a general look-out to prevent escapes. He shall be particularly careful to prevent improper articles, spirits, wine or beer for the use of the patients, attendants or servants from being brought into the Hospital, or any provisions, clothing or stores, from being carried out, except under the direction of the Medical Superintendent, and it is his imperative duty to report to the Managing Secretary whatever in the discharge of his duties he may observe contrary to good conduct or the rules of the Hospital.
- (c.) Be at liberty to examine all bundles and parcels coming into and going out of the Hospital, except on a written order of the Medical Superintendent.

THE HOUSEKEEPER.

- 65. She shall:—
- (a.) See that the provisions of the staff and patients are properly cooked and distributed in accordance with the issue sheet and dietary, and, if she deems necessary, shall submit for the inspection of the Managing Secretary a portion of the food which the cooks have prepared for the staff or patients' meals.
 - (b.) Be responsible for the receipt and issue of all laundry.
- (c.) Keep an inventory of all tools, utensils, etc., used in her respective departments.
- (d.) See that all machinery and fittings of the laundry and drying-rooms are properly used and taken care of, and shall report any defects to the Managing Secretary.

THE COOKS.

- 66 They shall:—
- (a.) Perform their duties under the immediate direction of the House-keeper. Attend at the Store at the appointed time to receive all provisions and see that they correspond in weight with the issue sheets furnished.
 - (b.) Observe the strictest punctuality as regards the hours of meals.
- (c.) Observe the greatest cleanliness in their persons and see the patients employed under them are clean in their persons and habits.
- (d.) Be responsible for the cleanliness and good order of the kitchen, scullery, meat-store, refrigerating room, vegetable room and kitchen lavatory, and all coppers, tanks and utensils used therein, and shall take care that neither attendants, servants, or patients loiter about the kitchen.
- (e.) Be responsible for all patients employed by them, and see that they are returned to their respective wards when their work is performed.

STEWARDS AND HOUSEMAIDS.

- 67. They shall:—
- (a.) Perform their duties under the immediate direction of the house-keeper.
 - (b. Observe the strictest punctuality as regards the hours of meals.
- (c.) Observe the greatest cleanliness in their persons and see that the patients employed under them are clean in their persons and habits.
 - (d.) Be responsible for the cleanliness and good order of the dining rooms.
- (e.) See that the tables, chairs, cutlery, crockery and all utensils under their care are scrupulously clean, and that clean table cloths, towels, etc., are provided as authorised.
 - (f.) Exercise the greatest care in the proper distribution of food.

LAUNDRY REGULATIONS.

68. Laundresses shall:-

(a.) Perform their duties under the immediate direction of the Housekeeper.

(b.) Be responsible for all patients employed in the laundry. Receive them from their wards, and be responsible for their safe return to the wards at dinner time and when work for the day is over.

FINE LAUNDRY.

69. The Head Laundress shall:-

(a.) Be responsible for the proper washing, drying, and getting up of all linen and other articles belonging to the resident administration staff, and the uniforms and linen of attendants, nurses and servants.

(b.) Take care that the number of articles does not exceed that authorised. and not receive attendants' clothing when sent by patients.

(c.) Be responsible for the cleanliness and order of the fine laundry and the portion of the drying yard set apart for it.

COARSE LAUNDRY.

70. The Head Laundress shall:

(a.) Be responsible for the proper washing and drying of all clothes used by the patients.

(b.) Receive the clothes, with proper lists, from each ward every morning before 10.

(c.) Deliver all clothes which the Housekeeper may direct to be washed in the fine laundry, and receive them when ready for use.

(d.) Be responsible for the cleanliness and order of the coarse laundry and the part of the drying yard set apart for it.

(e.) See that no linen is received at the laundry from any officer, attendant, nurse or servant for the purpose of being washed, unless same is marked with the owner's name in full.

(f.) Keep a laundry book in an approved form, in which shall be entered details of all clothes received or issued by her.

(g.) Attendants, nurses and servants shall take their clothes to the laundry with written lists, and the quantity shall not exceed that authorised. Any complaints with regard to the washing shall be made to the Housekeeper, and not to the laundresses.
