ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 3013/24.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council redivide a Road District into Wards; and whereas it is desirable to redivide the Capel Road District into seven Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby redivide the Capel Road District into seven Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in the Schedule hereto.

To come into force on and from the 1st day of March, 1926.

CAPEL ROAD DISTRICT.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

Capel Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the North-Western corner of Suburban Area Lot 1 and extending Eastward along its Northern boundary to the right bank of the Capel River and along said bank of the Capel River and the right bank of the Gynudup Brook to the South-Eastern corner of Stirling Estate Lot 152; thence along West boundaries of Wellington Locations 204, 392, and 2199, and the South boundary of the lattermost and of Location 968 to intersect the production North of the West boundary of Location 2921.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the said intersection, and extending Southward along said production and West boundary and West boundaries of Location 930, Reserve 8669, and Location 2563 to the South-West corner of the lattermost.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the said intersection, and extending Northward along said side of Road No. 48 through Location 46 to a line extending South from the Eastern corner of Suburban Lot 16, and along said line and the South boundaries of Suburban Lots 16, 15, and 14, the West boundaries of Suburban Lots 14, 13, 8, and 7, South-Western boundaries of Suburban Lots 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 to the starting point. Stratham Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the District boundaries from their intersection with the shores of the Indian Ocean to intersect the Eastern boundary of Wellington Location 41.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the latter intersection, and extending Southward along part of the Eastern boundary of said Location 41. East boundaries of Locations 47, 118, 587. Lease 48/1607, and Location 980 to intersect the Northern side of the Busselton-Boyanup Railway Reserve.

On the Southward by the said side of the Railway Reserve and part of the boundaries of the Capel Ward from the last mentioned intersection to the South-West corner of Location 2199.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the said South-Western corner, and extending Northward along part of the boundaries of the Capel Ward, part of the West boundary of Location 47, the South boundary of Stirling Estate Lot 218, the South and West boundaries of Lot 217, the West and Northern boundaries of Lot 222. North-Western boundaries of Lots 221, 219, and 220, the East boundary of Lot 143, South-Western boundaries of Lots 198 and 140, the South-East and South-West boundaries of Location 340, part of the South-East and the South-West boundaries of

Locations 97 and 152 and the last mentioned boundary's production to the shores of the Indian Ocean, and North-Ward along the said shores to the starting point. One member.

Stirling Ward.—Bounded on the Eastward by part of the Western boundary of the Stratham Ward from the shores of the Indian Ocean to the boundaries of the Capel Ward.

On the Southward by part of the boundaries of the Capel Ward to the South-Western corner of Stirling Suburban Area Lot 2: thence by lines extending along the North-Western boundaries of Lots 156 and 155 to the Eastern side of a surveyed road being the production South-Eastward of the South-Western boundary of Lot 157, and along said side of the road and South-West boundary, the Southern boundaries of Lot 102, South-Western boundaries of Lot 101, and the Northern side of Road No. 2268 to the shores of the Indian Ocean.

On the Westward by the shores of the Indian Ocean to the starting point. One member.

Elgin Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the District boundaries from their intersection with the Eastern boundary of the Stratham Ward to the North-East corner of Boyanup Agricultural Area Lot 161.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the said North-East corner, and extending Southward along the East boundaries of Lots 161, 162, 170, 171, 176, 177, and 182, part of the Northern and the East boundary of Lot 7 of Wellington Location 3904 to the Northern side of the Busselton-Boyanup Railway Reserve, and along part of the Northern side of the Railway Reserve to the production North of the East boundary of Lot 58: thence along said production and East boundary and the East boundaries of Lots 77, 80, 223, and 335 to the South-East corner of the last mentioned.

On the West by the East boundary of the Elgin Ward to the starting point. One member.

Beclup Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the Southern boundary of the Stirling Ward from the shores of the Indian Ocean to intersect the Western boundary of the Capel Ward.

On the Eastward by parts of the Western and Southern boundaries of the Capel Ward from the said intersection to the Western side of the Boyanup-Busselton Railway Reserve: thence by said side of the Railway Reserve to intersect the district boundaries.

On the South-Westward and North-Westward by part of the district boundaries to the starting point. One member.

Goodwood Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by parts of the Southern and Eastern boundaries of the Capel Ward, part of the Southern boundary of the Stratham Ward, part of the West and the South boundary of the Elgin Ward, the South boundary of the Boyanup Ward, and part of the district boundaries from the Western side of the Railway Reserve to the production North of the East boundary of Reserve 6230.

On the Eastward, Southward, and Westward by part of the district boundaries and part of the Eastern boundary of the Beclup Ward to the starting point. One member.

The Pearling Act, 1912-24.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

1550/25.
WHEREAS by Subsection 5 of Section 33 of "The Pearling Act, 1912-24," it is provided that when the remuneration to which a diver or other pearl-fisher employed in pearling in connection with any ship consists wholly or in part of an allowance or lay calculated with reference to the quantity of pearlshell or pearls fished by him or with his assistance, then the right to such allowance or lay shall be deemed to be a right to share in the result or proceeds of the pearling, within the meaning of this section, unless the allowance or lay is calculated on such basis as shall be prescribed, and at a percentage not exceeding the prescribed percentage:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council of the State are of opinion that it is desirable to cancel the Order in Council dated the 21st day of January, 1925, prescribing such basis and percentage: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Pearling Act, 1912-1924," and all other powers him in this behalf enabling, cancel the Order in Council aforementioned and in lieu thereof doth make the following regulation, and order and prescribe that the bases and maximum percentages on and at which such allowances or lay as aforesaid shall be calculated with reference to the quantity of pearlshell fished. Where such allowance or lay as aforesaid is paid to more than one pearl-fisher on any pearling ship, the aggregate of such allowances or lays shall not exceed the amount which would be payable to one person in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule.

Provided that in the case of—

- (a) hand pump boats, where less than 5 tons fished,
- (b) single connection engine boats, where less than 6 tons fished, and
- (c) double connection engine boats, where less than 10 tons fished,

the maximum allowance or lay shall in all cases whatever be assessed as if the value of the shell were £150 per ton. Provided further, that the maximum allowance or lay shall—

- (a) if the value of shell is less than £180 per ton, be the same amount as it would be if the value were £150 per ton;

- (b) if the value of shell is less than £200 but not less than £180 per ton, be the same amount as it would be if the value were £180 per ton;

- (c) if the value of shell is £200 or more per ton, be the same amount as it would be if the value were £200 per ton.

N.B.—The value of shell is to be deemed to be the average price at Broome (as determined by the Pearling Inspector at Broome) of loose shell during the period worked by the pearl-fisher.

Narembeen Police Station.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2400/23; Ex. Co. No. 300.

COTTESLOE MUNICIPALITY.

By-law No. 1.

Standing Orders.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and the Acts amending the same, the Mayor and Councillors of the Cottesloe Municipality do hereby repeal all By-laws of the Cottesloe Municipality heretofore made in reference to the several matters dealt with in the By-laws herein-after set out, and do make and order the following By-laws:—

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to the following regulations, which shall be called the Standing Orders:—

Chairman.

2. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word "Mayor" shall include the Councillor chosen to preside at any meeting of the Council.

3. The Mayor, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and in his absence, or if after being present he retires, one of the Councillors chosen by the Councillors present shall preside.

Quorum.

4. At any meeting of the Council a quorum shall consist of not less than three Councillors in addition to the Mayor, or not less than four (4) Councillors in the absence of the Mayor. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Adjournment in absence of quorum.

5. If at any meeting a quorum is not present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, the majority of the Councillors present, or the Town Clerk if no Councillor be present, may adjourn such meeting to any date not later than seven (7) days from the date of such adjournment.

Count out.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a Councillor shall call the attention of the Mayor to the fact that a quorum is not present, the Mayor shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of such period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Mayor shall adjourn it to some future date.

Record of Councillors present.

7. At all meetings at which there are not present three Councillors and the Mayor, or four Councillors as the case may be, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the Councillors then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Open doors.

8. The business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Council shall by resolution otherwise decide, which resolution may be moved without notice.

Reporters.

9. At all meetings accredited newspaper reporters shall be permitted to attend in such part of the Council Chamber as may be appropriated for their accommodation, but they shall withdraw upon a vote of the Council so requiring during any portion or the whole of the meeting.

Disturbance by Visitors.

10. The admission of citizens, reporters, and visitors to the Council Chamber shall be under and subject to the regulations that no expression of dissent or approval, conversation, or interruption to the proceedings of the Council shall take place, and in the event of any breach of this regulation the Mayor may, at his discretion, and without a vote of the Council, require the person or persons so offending to withdraw, and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately withdraw from the Council Chamber.

Removal of Disturbers.

11. Any person, not being a member of the Council, who interrupts the orderly conduct of the business of the Council, who does not, immediately upon being called upon by the Mayor so to do, withdraw from the Council Chamber, may by order of the Mayor be arrested and removed from the Council Chamber forthwith by any officer of or other persons appointed by the Council, or by members of the police force acting at the request of the Council.

*Business of Council Meetings.**Order of Business.*

12. The order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Council, at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Confirmation of Minutes.
- (2) Outward Correspondence ordered by the Council.
- (3) Inward Correspondence.
- (4) Announcements by the Mayor, without discussion.
- (5) Questions of which due notice has been given, without discussion.
- (6) Petitions and Memorials and Tenders.
- (7) Reports of Committees and Officers.
- (8) Orders of the Day, including considering and ordering upon business left over from the previous meeting, and any business the Mayor may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day, and motions of which previous notices have been given.
- (9) Ordinary Business.
- (10) Notices of Motion for consideration at the following meeting if given during the meeting.

Order at Special Meetings.

13. The order of the business at any special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Minutes.

14. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Council in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the Mayor as by Section 176 of the Act required.

Questions.

15. Any Councillor desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Council shall give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk prior to the meeting.

16. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Notices of Motion.

17. Any Councillor may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to the Town Clerk, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than seven clear days before such last-mentioned meeting.

Motion to lapse.

18. Every such motion shall lapse unless the Councillor who gave the notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

Deputations.

Reception of Deputations.

19. Deputations wishing to be received by the Council shall be requested, in the first instance, to send in a memorial in writing, and the Town Clerk shall bring the memorial before the Committee concerned, which shall be authorised, if it see fit, to receive the deputation and to report to the Council. If the Committee is of opinion that the memorial is one that should be brought before the Council, the Committee shall so report; and, if the Council shall so order, the deputation shall be invited to attend.

Number of Deputation.

20. A deputation shall not exceed six in number, and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee, and the matter shall not be further considered by the Council or the Committee until the deputation shall have withdrawn.

Conduct of Debate.

Councillors to address the Chair—Point of Order.

21. Any Councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Mayor, and shall not be interrupted unless upon a point of order, when he shall resume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon, and the question of order has been disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the Chair may proceed.

Nature of Motion to be stated.

22. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state the nature of same before he addresses the Council thereon, and, if so required by the Mayor, shall put the same in writing.

Motions to be seconded—Enforcement of Standing Orders.

23. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

Use of Titles.

24. At meetings of the Council, speakers in referring to others present thereat shall designate them by their respective titles of Mayor or Councillor, as the case may be.

Priority of Speakers.

25. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Mayor to speak.

26. Whenever the Mayor rises during a debate any Councillor then speaking or offering to speak is to sit down, and the Council is to be silent so that the Mayor may be heard without interruption.

Councillor not to speak twice.

27. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may be the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. And no Councillor shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply.

Calling to order for speaking twice.

28. The Mayor shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any Councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

Mover and Seconder speaking to Motion.

29. A Councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Councillor merely seconding a motion *pro forma* shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

No speaking after Notice put.

30. No Councillor may speak to any question after the same has been put from the chair.

Time Limit.

31. No Councillor shall speak or address the Council upon any motion or amendment before the Council, or in reply for a longer period than ten minutes without the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate.

Speaking in Reply.

32. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introduced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of Complicated Resolutions.

33. The Mayor, at his discretion, may, or the Council may by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of several resolutions.

Withdrawal of Motion.

34. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover with the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any Councillor to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Production of Documents.

35. Any Councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

Reflection upon Vote of Council.

36. No Councillor shall reflect upon any vote of the Council except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

All Councillors to Vote.—Casting Vote.

37. At all meetings of the Council, save where the Act otherwise provides, all the Councillors present shall vote. If there be an equal division of votes upon any question the Mayor, or Councillor chosen to preside at such meeting, shall, in addition to his own vote, have a second or casting vote.

Digression from Subject.—Personal Reflections.

38. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion nor impute improper motives to any other Councillor, and all personal reflections upon any Councillor shall be considered highly disorderly.

Record of Words used by a Councillor.

39. Any Councillor may require the Town Clerk to take down any particular words used by a Councillor immediately upon the same being used.

Mayor's Ruling.

40. The Mayor when called upon to decide a point of order or practice shall give his decision, and no argument or comment shall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

Withdrawal of Offensive Expressions.

41. Any Councillor who shall use any expression which in the opinion of the Mayor reflects offensively on any member of the Council shall, when required by the Mayor, unreservedly withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the chair, and if he decline or neglect to do so, the Mayor may refuse to hear such Councillor further upon the matter then under discussion and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the Council, or may direct the offending Councillor to withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

Disturbance.—Conversing aloud.

42. No Councillor shall make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud or interrupt whilst any other Councillor is speaking, or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

Continued Irrelevance.

43. The Mayor may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Councillor, and may direct such Councillor, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon such Councillor shall cease speaking and resume his seat.

Crossing Council Chamber.

44. When the Mayor is putting any question, no Councillor shall walk out of or across the Chamber, nor shall any Councillor, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the chair.

Mayor may call to order.

45. The Mayor shall preserve order, and may on his own motion call any Councillor to order whenever, in his opinion, there shall be cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

46. Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Mayor to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other Councillor.

Definition of Order.

47. Any Councillor who shall do anything or behave in any manner which is forbidden by any section of this By-law shall be deemed to be out of order.

Decision of the Mayor on Point of Order—Councillor to apologise when called upon.

48. Whenever it shall have been decided by the Mayor that any motion, amendment, or other matter before the Council is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as the case may require.

Councillor to withdraw from the Council Chamber.

49. Any Councillor who shall persist in any line of conduct which the Mayor shall have decided, or which by any section of this By-law is declared to be out of order, or who shall refuse to make any explanation, retraction, or apology required by the Mayor as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the Mayor, withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

Removal of Councillor from Council.

50. In the event of any Councillor refusing or neglecting to withdraw from the Council Chamber when requested or directed by the Mayor so to do, the Mayor may order such Councillor to be removed from the said Chamber and to be excluded therefrom during the remainder of the then sitting of the Council, and such Councillor may be arrested and removed from the Council Chamber forthwith by any officers of or other persons authorised by the Council, or by members of the police force.

Disorder.

51. If disorder shall arise at any meeting of the Council, the Mayor, acting in his discretion, may as a matter of right quit the chair, and announce the adjournment of the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes, when the Council shall re-assemble and decide the question whether the business shall be proceeded with or otherwise, which question shall be put from the chair and decided without debate by a majority of the members present.

Order in Debate.

Motions and Amendments.

52. When a motion is under debate at any meeting of the Council, no further motion shall be received, except the following:—

1. That the motion be amended.
2. That the Council do now adjourn.
3. That the debate be adjourned.
4. That the question be now put.
5. That the Council do proceed with the next business.
6. That the Council do resolve into Committee of the whole.

1. *That the motion be amended.*

Relevancy of Amendment.

53. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

To be read.

54. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a time.

55. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any Councillor to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

Substantive Motion.

56. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original

motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as an original motion.

2. *The Council do now adjourn.*

Time to move.

57. A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council do now adjourn, provided that the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak beyond formally seconding, and the mover of the question (if any) under debate, on the motion for adjournment being made, may be heard in reply for five minutes, but no further debate shall be allowed.

No Discussion. Procedure before further Motion.

58. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

Question adjourned to next Meeting.

59. On a resolution for adjournment, the question (if any) under debate when motion for adjournment was made shall stand adjourned to next meeting.

One Motion only.

60. At the same sitting no Councillor may move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

3. *That the Debate be adjourned.*

Time to move.

61. Any Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, move without previous notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.

No Discussion.

62. No discussion shall be allowed upon a motion for the adjournment of a debate.

Mover to speak first.

63. On resuming an adjourned debate, the Councillor who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

One Motion only.

64. At the same sitting no member shall move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the same debate.

Resumption of Debate after Count-out.

65. If a debate on any motion, moved and seconded, be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

4. *That the Question be now put.*

Time to move. Put without Debate.

66. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of another Councillor, move without notice that the question be now put, and upon such motion being seconded, the same shall be immediately put without debate.

Two-thirds Majority.

67. A motion that the question under consideration be now put shall not be decided in the affirmative or take effect without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the Councillors present.

Speaking in reply.

68. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued, and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put.

Motion to be put at once.

69. Should the motion be carried, the motion or amendment under debate shall be at once put.

Question includes Amendment.

70. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the chair shall be construed and taken to mean and include the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

5. *That the Council do proceed to the next Business.*

Time to move.

71. It shall be competent for any Councillor at the close of the speech of any other Councillor to move, without notice, that the Council do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith.

Question to be dropped.

72. When a motion be carried that the Council do proceed to the next business, the question under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

Further Motion.

73. During the same debate a second motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one hour.

6. *That the Council resolves into Committee.*

Decision of Council.

74. The Council may determine that any question shall be considered in Committee of the whole, and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice.

Matters to be considered by Committee.

75. Such Committee shall consider such matters only as shall have been referred to it by the Council.

Conduct of Committee.

76. In Committee of the whole the Standing Orders of the Council shall apply, except that Councillors may speak more than once to the same question.

Adoption of Committee's Resolutions.

77. The Mayor shall report the resolutions arrived at in Committee of the whole to the Council at its next ordinary meeting or upon the resumption of the Council, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Council may think fit.

Confidential Business.

78. All matters dealt with or brought before the Council in Committee or before any Committee of the Council shall be treated as strictly confidential. No information whatever in relation to the proceedings thereat shall be disclosed to any person outside the Council prior to the decision of full Council.

Rescission of Resolutions.

Rescission.

79. No resolution of any meeting of the Council shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered, except in manner provided in Section 165 of the Act.

Repetition of Negated Motion.

80. No motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negated by the Council shall again be entertained within a period of three months, unless with the consent of at least six members of the Council.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

How moved.

81. In cases of urgent necessity, any standing order or orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of the majority of the Councillors present; provided also that such majority be not less than four.

Object of Suspension to be stated.

82. Any Councillor moving the suspension of any standing order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

Voting.

Method of taking Votes.

83. The Mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

Division.

84. The Council shall vote by a show of hands, but any Councillor may call for a division upon any question, in which case the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the negative retain their seats; all division lists shall be entered on the minutes.

Committees.

Standing Committees.

85. In addition to such special Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be three standing Committees appointed from among the Councillors, namely, a Finance Committee, a Works and General Purposes Committee, and a Health and Sea Beach Committee, each of which shall consist of not less than three members; and if possible of one Councillor from each ward of the municipality. Such committees shall be appointed each year at the first meeting of the Council which shall be held after the 30th November.

Election of Committees.

86. The members of the said Committees shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot, and in the event of an equality of votes for two or more Councillors the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

Powers and Duties of Committees.

87. The powers and duties of Committees shall be as under:—

Finance:

- (1) To examine and check all accounts and generally supervise the collection and expenditure of Municipal revenue.
- (2) To inquire into and report to the Council from time to time upon all matters which they may consider to affect, or be likely to affect the finances of the municipality, or which the Council may, by resolution, direct them to inquire into and report upon.
- (3) To have control of all matters affecting the staff of the Council.
- (4) To exercise all powers conferred on the Council in respect to expenditure under Section 476 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906."
- (5) To arrange civic functions, draft addresses, etc.
- (6) To have the direction of all matters in respect to which the Council is empowered by law, relating to the supply of electricity for public or private purposes.

Works and General Purposes Committee:

- (1) To have the general direction of all works ordered or sanctioned by the Council, and of all streets, roads, ways, drains, bridges, and other public places under the care and management of the Council.
- (2) To have the management and general direction of sweeping and watering, the resumption of land for the formation of new streets, and widening of existing streets.
- (3) To inquire into and report to the Council from time to time upon such improvements and repairs as they may think necessary, or which the Council may, by resolution, direct them to inquire into and report upon.
- (4) To have the control of all Parks, Reserves, and Tree Planting, Municipal Chambers, and other Municipal Buildings.
- (5) To have the administration of matters relating to traffic, tramways, motors, licensed vehicles.

Health and Sea Beach:

- (1) To supervise the carrying out of the provisions of any Act of Parliament or Municipal By-laws affecting public health.
- (2) To deal with petitions and complaints from persons affected by those Acts or By-laws.
- (3) To deal with all matters relating to the collection of nightsoil and refuse, the supervision of places of amusement, the sale of food and drugs, the licensing of noxious trades, private hospitals, lodging-houses, milk purveyors, morgues, etc., and generally control all matters affecting the health of the citizens.

- (4) To have the administration of all matters relating to markets, hawkers, dogs, goats, weights and measures, and pounds.
- (5) General administration of Building By-laws.
- (6) All matters pertaining to Sea Beach Reserve and jetty.

Special Committees.

88. Special Committees may consist of any number of members, and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a Committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Council, a special committee ought to be appointed. No standing committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to any Special Committee. The appointment of a Special Committee shall be made by resolution of the Council, which shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Special Committee, and may either state the number of Councillors to be elected by ballot or shall name the Councillors whom it is proposed shall constitute such committee. In the event of a ballot being taken and an equality of votes being recorded in favour or any two or more Councillors, the Mayor shall have a casting vote. Every standing Committee shall hold office until the thirtieth day of November following its appointment.

Convening Committee Meetings.

89. The Town Clerk shall call a meeting of any Committee when requested to do so by the Mayor, the chairman, or any two members of such Committee.

Standing Orders.

90. The Standing Orders of the Council shall be observed and apply in Committees, except the order limiting the number of times of speaking, and except as to committees being conducted with open doors.

Quorum.

91. At a meeting of a committee a quorum shall consist of not less than two members. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated, or there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Minutes.

92. Each standing committee shall keep a book, to be called the Minute Book, in which shall be entered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the following meeting, and signed by the chairman thereof.

Miscellaneous.

Penalty.

93. Any Councillor who shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, or who shall be guilty of any misfeasance or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this By-law, shall be liable, on conviction before a court of summary jurisdiction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Enforcement of By-laws.

94. Whenever a Councillor shall have committed an offence under this By-law, the Mayor may forthwith lay or cause to be laid an information before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending Councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

SOUTH PERTH ROAD BOARD.

By-laws relating to Beaches, Reserves, River Bathing and Camping.

Whereas by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the South Perth Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

1. "Public bathing reserve" means any public park, sea beach, public reserve, river or lake shore, and the waters adjacent thereto, wherein public bathing is permitted by the Board, By-law, or by custom, and includes any dressing enclosure or building thereon.

Costume.

2. All persons over seven years of age bathing in any waters exposed to public view shall be clad in a suitable bathing costume covering the body so as to secure the observance of decency; and any Inspector or Police Officer may require any person contravening this provision to resume at once his ordinary dress.

In any case where an Inspector is of opinion that any person's bathing costume is indecent or inadequate, or that the material thereof is too thin, or is not in a proper state of repair, or is unsuitable, may direct such person to resume at once his ordinary dress.

If any person fail to resume immediately his ordinary dress when directed so to do by an Inspector, he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and may, with any necessary force, be removed to the dressing enclosure or shed by the Inspector.

Dressing in Public view.

3. A person shall not dress or undress or remove or disarrange any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view: Provided that this shall not prevent any person already clad in proper bathing costume from doffing or donning at any public bathing reserve any dressing-gown or outer robe.

Separation of the Sexes.

4. A male above the age of 12 years shall not trespass upon any part of a public bathing reserve which is set apart for women.

A woman shall not trespass upon any part of a public bathing reserve which is set apart for men.

Sun-basking.

5. The Board may erect notices prohibiting sun-basking, except within any special enclosure provided for that purpose.

No person shall loiter or lie about the public bathing reserve clad only in bathing costume, except within any such enclosure.

Bathing in dangerous places.

6. No person shall bathe at any place after being warned by an Inspector that such place is dangerous, or if such place be indicated as dangerous by a "Danger" signal or notice.

Use of Dressing Enclosures or Sheds.

7. A dressing enclosure or dressing shed shall be used for dressing and undressing only. A person shall not play games, or, without reasonable excuse, loiter in or in the vicinity of any such enclosure or shed.

A person shall not bring or deposit any filth or rubbish in any such enclosure or shed.

A person shall not damage, disfigure, or write in or upon any such enclosure or shed.

Women's Reserves.

8. The Board may mark off an area adjacent to any dressing enclosure or shed for the use of women, and may, by notice conspicuously exhibited thereon, forbid males above the age of eight years to go upon any such area.

Erection of Temporary Screens, Awnings, etc.

9. Where a dressing enclosure or shed has been provided on or near any public bathing reserve the Board may, by notice exhibited in some conspicuous position on any such public bathing reserve, prohibit the erection by the public on any such public bathing reserve of temporary screens, awnings, enclosures, or structures of a like kind for the purpose of dressing and undressing, or for any other purpose.

Dogs and Horses.

10. Any Inspector may, when in his opinion inconvenience may be caused to the public by the bathing of dogs or horses, order any person in charge of any dog or horse not to send or drive such dog or horse into the water, or permit such dog or horse to enter the water at any place where the public are bathing.

Any person may order any person in charge of any dog or horse to remove such animal from a public bathing reserve, if such animal's presence on the public bathing reserve causes inconvenience or danger to the public.

Regulation and Protection of Public—Preservation of Order.

11. A person shall not in a public bathing reserve or public bath do any act which would be likely to injure, endanger, obstruct, inconvenience or annoy any person.

A person shall not in a public bathing reserve or public bath do any act which would be likely to injure, displace, pollute, foul, litter, deface or disorder such reserve or bath, or anything appertaining thereto, or to cause waste, loss, or inconvenience to the Board or its servants.

If any person break any bottle or any article of glass or earthenware in any public bathing reserve or public bath, he shall collect and remove all portions of such bottle or article either to a receptacle (if any) provided by the Board therefor, or to some place beyond the public bathing reserve or bath.

Regulation—Notices.

12. The Board may, by notices exhibited in a public bathing reserve or public bath, regulate the lighting of fires, require animals and vehicles to be kept off places indicated, mark places where bathing shall be prohibited, regulate vehicular and pedestrian traffic, regulate the conduct of persons, and generally regulate the use of the reserve or bath by the public.

Life-saving Clubs.

13. The Board may at its discretion authorise any volunteer life-saving club, whether subsidised or not—(a) to provide and use life-saving appliances and boats; (b) to use any such appliances and boats provided by the Board; and (c) to erect, and, as may from time to time be necessary, remove from place to place danger signals or notices: Provided that, where a life-saving attendant or Inspector employed by the Board is in attendance, danger signals or notices shall not be placed or removed except by him or with his approval.

Life-saving.

14. Where life-saving appliances are in use, any Inspector may direct any person to cease assisting, or to stand back from the field of operations.

Appliances—Danger Notices.

15. A person shall not, unless authorised by the Board, use, displace, play with, injure, or destroy any life-saving appliances or signal bells.

Inspectors.

16. The Board may appoint any servant of the Board an Inspector under this By-law.

The Board may appoint any member of a volunteer life-saving club (whether subsidised or not) an Inspector under this By-law: Provided that a member so appointed shall not prosecute any person for a breach of any provision of this By-law, but shall report such breach to the Board for action by it.

Every Constable or Officer of Police shall have the powers of an Inspector under this By-law.

Every Inspector may demand the name and address of any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, and such person shall comply with such demand.

A person shall not obstruct or hinder any Inspector or life-saving attendant in the performance of his duties or in the exercise of his powers.

The Board shall supply each Inspector with a written appointment, under the seal of the Board, and with a badge.

Piers and Jetties.

17. No person in bathing costume shall be allowed upon any pier or jetty, nor shall bathe from any pier or jetty between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 p.m.

No person shall swim dogs from any pier or jetty.

No person shall cut or mutilate any part of any pier or jetty.

Camping.

18. No person shall camp on any beach, reserve, or foreshore without a license from the Board, which shall be produced on demand by an officer of the Board or a Police Constable. Camping is strictly prohibited in all parts of the district, excepting on those parts of any reserve, beach, or foreshore which is set apart for that purpose by the Board. Licenses for camping must be first obtained from the Secretary's office, or such other place as may be appointed by the Board, and must be renewed there. The Board reserves the right to refuse, without assigning reason, to issue a license to any person or persons. The Board may prescribe fees for the granting of camping licenses from time to time.

Shelter Sheds.

19. No person shall use any shelter shed to the exclusion of any other person or persons. Camping in shelter sheds will not be permitted, and any person shall vacate any shed upon being so ordered by an Inspector or Police Officer. Shelter sheds shall not be used as dressing sheds or for the stabling or parking of vehicles.

Reserves.

20. (a) No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in any Reserve or Reserves, and no person shall commit therein any act of indecency.

(b) No person shall interfere with, damage or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers or any property in any Reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or light fires therein, or leave in any Reserve any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

(c) No person shall climb or jump over any fence in or around any Reserve or Reserves, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on any fences, gate, or seat, or tree, or cut names, letters or marks on any tree, seat, gate, post or fence, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.

(d) No person shall bring into any Reserve any dog unless held by a cord or chain, and all goats and poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed by the Caretaker or Constable.

(e) No person, except workmen employed in any Reserve, shall enter any plot therein which may be lawfully enclosed for plantations or other purposes.

(f) No assemblage of persons for any fete, picnic, or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or any meeting of a like character, shall take place in any reserve without the permission in writing of the Board first had and obtained.

(g) No person, unless authorised in writing by the Board, shall offer for sale in any Reserve any article of fruit or merchandise.

(h) Any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds or other property from any Reserve, or injuring any property therein, shall be liable to be removed from such Reserve and prosecuted.

(i) No delivery cart, tradesman's cart, dray, lorry, waggon, van, truck, or barrow shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through any Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Board first had and obtained.

(j) No vehicle, motor car, or motor cycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through any Reserve, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.

(k) No horse with a rider will be allowed to enter or pass over or through any Reserve, except on the portion thereof specially provided for equestrians.

(l) No horse shall be broken-in or trained in any Reserve.

(m) No bicycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through any Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for bicyclists.

(n) No person on foot shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the portions of any Reserve specially set apart for bicyclists or equestrians, except to cross such portions of such Reserve through the opening provided for access from one part of such Reserve to another part thereof, and indicated by notices in such Reserve.

(o) No horse uncontrolled by rein or hand, and no cattle, sheep, or pigs shall be allowed or suffered to enter or pass over or through any portion of any Reserve.

(p) No person shall be allowed to conduct a dressing-room or shed, bathing shed, platform, bathing box, merry-go-round, circus or any form of entertainment without having first obtained the Board's written permission therefor, and paid an annual licensing fee of 10s. The Board's approval may be withdrawn or withheld if in its opinion such shed, etc., is not properly, decently, and cleanly conducted. No shed, etc., shall be eligible for license unless solidly built of stone, or brick and iron, or wood and iron, properly roofed in. Hessian structures not allowable.

Penalties.

21. Any person not complying with or offending against any of the provisions of this By-law or the terms of any notice, order, or direction exhibited, issued, or given thereunder shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Any person guilty of an offence may be forthwith removed from the bathing reserve or bath by a servant of the Board, or the Lessee or Caretaker of the bath or dressing sheds (as the case may be), or by an Inspector, or by a Constable or Officer of Police, without affecting his liability to be subsequently prosecuted for such offence.

Douglas Jones and Company, Limited; Mount Lyell Chemical Works, and Cuming Smith and Company Proprietary, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the Perth City Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners of Australia Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part: Whereas by an agreement entered into in pursuance of the said Act between the employers of the one part and the union of the other part (the union in such agreement being referred to as "the Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners of Australasia Industrial Union of Workers (Perth Branch), bearing date the thirteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and registered in the Court of Arbitration number 15/1923, the rates of wages and other the terms and conditions of employment of certain workers employed by the employers were determined and agreed upon; and whereas certain differences have arisen between the employers and the union concerning certain of the terms of the said agreement; and whereas it has been mutually agreed between the parties that such differences shall be settled in manner hereinafter appearing: Now this agreement witnesseth that in consideration of the premises the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. From and after the date hereof the said recited agreement of the thirteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, shall be deemed to be amended in the respects following, that is to say:—

(a) All the words from the words "the minimum rate of wage," at the beginning of clause 1 to the words "Journeyman carpenters and journeymen joiners," at the ending of the second paragraph thereof inclusive, shall be deleted and the following words inserted in lieu thereof:—

"The minimum rate of wage payable to any carpenter or joiner shall be:—

1. (a) When employed in shops or mills—2s. 6d. per hour.
- (b) When sent out to fix or erect work in, on, or about buildings which has been made in such shops or mills—2s. 6d. per hour.
2. When employed on building construction other than the abovenamed—2s. 7½d. per hour."

The above rates shall be inclusive of the holiday and tool allowances hitherto provided for, and no claim shall be made by the union for such allowances.

(b) Clause 4 shall be deleted and the following clause inserted in lieu thereof:—

"Country Work.—When any worker is sent by his employer or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging, he shall be paid in addition to his regular wages 6s. per day for the first seven days and 30s. per week thereafter. The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time. Provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight hours in any one day. The employer shall also provide free transport for the employee's tools."

(c) Clause 5 shall be deleted and the following clause inserted in lieu thereof:—

"Hours.—4 hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked as follows:—On the first five days of the week between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. and on Saturdays between 8 a.m. and 11.45 a.m. Provided that the lunch interval on each Friday shall be restricted to 45 minutes."

(d) Clause 20, subclause (i) shall be deleted and the following clause shall be inserted in lieu thereof:—
"The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

- During the first year of his term—17s. 6d. per week.
- During the second year of his term—23s. per week.
- During the third year of his term—37s. per week.
- During the fourth year of his term—55s. per week.
- During the fifth year of his term—70s. per week.

Provided, however, that such rates shall not apply to apprentices employed by any of the employers at the date hereof."

2. Subject to these presents (which are intended to be supplemental to and read as one therewith) the said recited agreement and the provisions, conditions, and stipulations thereof shall continue and remain in full force and effect and be otherwise unaffected hereby, and nothing herein contained shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate herein prescribed.

THIS agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912," the fifth day of January, 1926, between John Darling & Son, Louis Dreyfus & Company, The Westralian Farmers, Limited, and Dalgety & Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral and Agricultural Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. *Area.*—This agreement shall cover and apply to all work of the nature hereinafter mentioned performed on or about the North Wharf, Fremantle.

2. *Scope.*—This agreement shall apply to workers engaged in the handling and bagging (including sewing and stencilling) of wheat other than lumping.

3. *Hours.*—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. Any work performed in excess of these hours shall be classified as overtime. The hours of work shall be 8 a.m. to noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. on the first five days of the week and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.

4. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wage payable to all workers shall be two shillings and sixpence per hour.

5. *Overtime.*—

Meal hours—Double time.

6.30 p.m. to 12 midnight—Time and a half.

Sundays and all stated port holidays—Double time.

Twelve midnight to 6.30 a.m.—Double time.

All work done on Saturday afternoons shall be paid for at time and a half up to midnight.

6. *Preference.*—Preference of employment, all things being equal and where practicable, shall be given to members of the union.

7. *Term.*—This agreement shall come into operation from the date hereof and shall remain in force for a period of two years from such date. Provided, however, that any party hereto may at the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof make application to the Court of Arbitration for a variation of any of the terms hereof.
