To Archibald Edmund Burt, Esquire, Resident Magis-
trate, Albany:

Greeting:

KNOW ye that I, the said Governor, with the advice
of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you to be a
Commissioner to inquire into the circumstances leading
to the dismissal from the Police Force of Constable
Lambert, and particularly to ascertain—

- (a.) Whether Patrick Mooney who, on the 27th June,
1925, at the Court of Petty Sessions, Fremantle,
for the alleged offence of being found on
licensed premises on Sunday, the 3rd May, 1925,
was fined £2, and in default of payment was
arrested on a warrant of commitment and im-
prisoned for six days, is identical with the
actual offender, namely, the man who on the
3rd May, 1925, was found on the said licensed
premises (the Cleopatra Hotel, Fremantle) by
Constable Lambert, and who stated to the con-
stable that his name was Patrick Martin;
- (b.) Whether the said Patrick Mooney arrived in
Western Australia by the R.M.S. "Orsova" on
the 5th May, 1925;
- (c.) Whether, when on the 25th June, 1925, Constable
Lambert served the said Patrick Mooney with
a summons for the alleged offence, the said

Patrick Mooney asserted that he was not the
man referred to in the summons by the name
of Patrick Mooney *alias* Martin, and protested
then and subsequently when arrested on a war-
rant of commitment that he was not the man
wanted;

- (d.) Whether when or before the Magistrate was sat-
isfied that the said Patrick Mooney was the
man found by Constable Lambert on the
licensed premises on Sunday, 3rd May, and who
gave the name "Patrick Martin," Constable
Lambert informed the Magistrate that the said
Patrick Mooney when served with the summons
protested that he was not the man referred to
in the summons, and that it was a case of mis-
taken identity; and
- (e.) Whether in the circumstances Constable Lambert
took reasonable steps to satisfy himself and the
Magistrate as to the identity of the said Pat-
rick Mooney with the actual offender.

And I request you, with as little delay as possible, to
report to me in writing the result of your inquiries by
virtue hereof; and declare that this Commission is a
Royal Commission within the meaning of "The Royal
Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902."
