WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edward VII., No. 20), and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1905" (5 Edward VII., No. 22), the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality and has not been declared a Government road or a road under the Roads Act or any Act amending the same: And whereas the road hereinafter described has been shown as a road on plan of Perth as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys; and it is desirable to close such road; and whereas it is not within the boundaries of any Municipality or Road Board District: Now therefore I, Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said road to be closed.

Description above referred to.

The road lying between the South-Eastern boundary of Perth Lot 462 (Reserve A10887) and the North-Western boundary of Perth Lot 478 (Reserve A13012) on the River Foreshore at Perth. (Plan, Perth East.)

Kent Road District—Alteration of Boundaries with the Dumbleyung and Lake Grace Road Districts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 16/25.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District: And whereas it is desirable to sever portion of the Lake Grace and Dumbleyung Road Districts and annex them to the Kent Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf doth hereby:—

- (1) Sever that portion of the Dumbleyung Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto and annex it to the Kent Road District;
- (2) Sever that portion of the Lake Grace Road District as described in Schedule "B" hereto and annex it to the Kent Road District.

KENT ROAD DISTRICT.

Transfer of Territory from the Dumbleyung Road District.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at the South-West corner of Williams Location 9108 and extending along the Southernmost and part of the East boundary of the said location to the production West of the North boundary of Location 11100 and along said production to the present district boundary; thence along said district boundary to the North-West corner of Location 11297; thence Northward to the South-East corner of Location 8774 and along the East boundaries of Locations 8774 and 13098 to the latter's North-East corner; thence Northward to the starting point.

Transfer of Territory from the Lake Grace Road District.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 19180, for Water Supply, at Gurann Estate (Lot 13), should be placed under the control of Messrs. George D. Ferrier and George W. Cain as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of Messrs. George D. Ferrier and George W. Inspection and Examination of Persons likely to be infected with Transmissible Diseases.

6a. No person shall enter any mine, in which he is not employed at the commencement of this regulation, for the purpose of working therein unless he shall have submitted himself to a medical practitioner for examination and shall have obtained from the medical practitioner a certificate that he is free from ankylostomiasis, tuberculosis, or other transmissible diseases.

6b. No owner or manager shall employ any person in any capacity whatever in a mine unless such person has been examined by a medical practitioner and has obtained from such practitioner a certificate that he is not infected with ankylostomiasis, tuberculosis, or other transmissible diseases: Provided that this regulation shall not apply in the case of a person employed at the commencement of this regulation in the mine of the owner or manager.

6c. Any person who neglects or refuses to observe and comply with, or commits a breach of either of these regulations, numbered 6a or 6b, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 12 of 1920.

Between the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tea Room and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant,
and

The Commercial Travellers' Club (W.A.), Limited, the West Australian Club, Limited, and others, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:

AWARD.

1. *Scope*.—This award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and shall apply only to incorporated residential clubs, and to all incorporated clubs which regularly supply meals, but it shall not apply to any club which does not regularly employ at its club house more than two workers to whom this award applies.

2. *Hours*.—Forty-eight hours to be worked on six days shall constitute a week's work for male workers over the age of eighteen years.

Forty-four hours to be worked on five and a-half days shall constitute a week's work for female workers.

3. *Spread of Shifts*.—(a) Daily spread of shifts shall mean the period that elapses from the time the worker first starts work and the time he or she finishes for the day.

Weekly spread of shifts shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week.

(b.) The daily spread of shifts shall not exceed twelve hours.

(c.) The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed sixty-six hours.

(d.) Except for meals there shall not be more than one break in any one shift, and such break shall be not less than two hours.

(e.) Workers other than night-porters shall not be rostered to work later than eight o'clock p.m. on more than three nights in any one week; or alternatively on more than six nights in any one fortnight.

4. *Wages*.—The following shall be the minimum rates of wages per week:—

Provided always that no person under the age of twenty-one years shall be employed to serve in the bar of a club.

If juniors are required to wear uniforms they shall be supplied by and remain the property of the employer.

5. *Board and Lodging*.—If board is provided by the employer he may deduct £1 per week, and if lodging is provided 7s. 6d. per week, from the wages hereinbefore prescribed.

Board shall mean three meals per day.

6. *Barmen and Night Porters*.—The term "barman" means a person who is employed and actually engaged for more than two hours in any day in the sale and dispensing of liquor from the bar in a club. "Employed in the sale" as used in the above definition shall be considered in one of two ways:—

(a) Where the worker is definitely detailed for the service;

(b) Where the worker is employed on an indefinite number of occasions totalling two hours or upwards in any one day.

Where the employer is willing to provide board and/or lodging barmen and night-porters shall have the option of choice whether they board and/or lodge on the club premises. Provided that where a night-porter or barman is supplied by agreement with the employer with individual meals an amount not exceeding 1s. 3d. for each such meal may be deducted from the wage specified.

7. *Part Time Worker*.—The term "part time worker" means one who is employed daily during at least six days per week but for not longer than thirty-three hours in any one week. Such worker shall be paid at a rate per hour equivalent to time and a-quarter of that prescribed for a full-time worker of the same class.

Any worker employed daily during at least six days per week for longer than thirty-three hours in the week shall be deemed a full-time worker.

8. *Miscellaneous Functions*.—Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum wage than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum rate than his ordinary rate he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

9. *No Reduction*.—No worker who at the date of this award is in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed shall suffer by reason of this award any reduction in the pay which such worker was receiving.

10. *Casuals*.—A casual worker means a worker employed for less than twelve consecutive days. The minimum engagement shall be one day.

The daily wage shall be one-sixth of the prescribed wage plus ten per centum.

If a casual worker is supplied with board and/or lodging for less than seven days the employer may deduct one-seventh of the prescribed allowance for each day.

Provided that where a club engages workers other than its own employees for a special function, payment shall be made to such workers at the rate of 5s. per hour, with a minimum of three hours.

The wage due to a casual worker shall be paid immediately upon completion of the engagement.

11. *Overtime*.—(a) Work done by workers in excess of the rostered hours in any one day, or after the completion of forty-four hours in any one week in the case of females, or forty-eight hours in any one week in the case of males, shall be deemed overtime and be paid for at the rate of time and a-half at the prescribed rate.

(b) Work done by a part-time worker in excess of his or her rostered hours in any one day or after the completion of his or her rostered hours in any week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half at the prescribed rate for the full-time worker.

Should the overtime actually worked be sufficient to make a part-time worker a full-time worker within the meaning of Clause 7 hereof then no overtime rate shall apply unless the hours worked exceed forty-four per week in the case of females or forty-eight per week in the case of males, in either of which cases the overtime rate prescribed for a full-time worker shall apply.

12. *Weekly Holiday*.—Night-porters shall be allowed one night off in each week of seven days. Such night off shall mean from the usual time of commencing duty until the same time next day.

Other workers shall be allowed one full day off each week.

No worker shall be required to work on two consecutive Sundays.

13. *Roster*.—a roster of the working hours of all workers shall be prepared and exhibited by the employer in each club.

It shall denote the hours to be worked by each worker for the ensuing week.

It shall, together with a copy of this award, be kept exhibited where it can be conveniently seen by all workers while on duty.

A correct copy of the roster shall be kept available at the office during office hours for inspection by an accredited representative of the union who may make extracts therefrom.

14. *Record*.—A time book shall be kept in the office of each club premises in which book the employer shall enter the name of each worker, and in the case of juniors the age of each on his or her last birthday, the nature of the work he or she is doing, the hours worked each day, any departure from the rostered hours and the amount of wage received by him or her each week.

The said book shall be entered up weekly and shall, if correct, be initiated by each worker concerned on pay day, and shall be open to inspection at the office during office hours by an accredited representative of the union who shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

15. *Weekly Wage*.—Wages shall be paid weekly. In the absence of a written agreement providing for a longer period, twenty-four hours' notice on either side shall be sufficient for the termination of employment.

This clause shall not apply to casual workers.

16. *Meal Time*.—All workers shall be allowed three-quarters of an hour off for each meal.

An interval of not more than five and a-half hours shall elapse between breakfast and lunch, and between lunch and tea.

17. *Holidays*.—Each worker other than a casual worker shall be entitled to twelve working days annual leave on full pay after each year of service, or should the period of continuous employment be less than one year the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

Annual leave shall be taken at a time convenient to the employer, provided that such annual leave shall be granted to each worker within three months after such leave has become due.

A worker is not entitled under this award to more than twelve working days' holiday per annum on full pay.

Work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day shall be paid for at double time rate.

18. *Accommodation*.—Any worker required to sleep on the premises shall be provided with suitable accommodation.

Where workers sleep on the premises they shall be provided with a common sitting room.

All workers shall have access to a bathroom.

A suitable efficiently lighted and ventilated change room shall be provided by employers for the use of workers of each sex who do not sleep upon the premises. Such change room shall be furnished with suitable toilet conveniences.

Suitable accommodation for meals shall be provided for the workers.

If any worker considers the accommodation provided for him or her by his or her employer unsuitable, complaint may be made in writing by the secretary of the union to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration. Upon receipt of such complaint the Clerk may request an Industrial Inspector under the Industrial Arbitration Act to inspect the accommodation and report thereon. The inspector's report shall be filed by the Clerk and be open to inspection by any person without fee. The report may be used as *prima facie* evidence in proceedings for the enforcement of this clause.

19. *Uniforms*.—The employer shall provide and pay for the laundering of white aprons, coats, collars and cuffs, where such are required to be worn.

For female workers only a plain black and white, or black or white uniform will be recognised as such. The cost of any alteration in colour or design demanded by the employer must be defrayed by that employer.

The wearing of any uniform head gear shall be optional with the worker.

20. *Under-rate Workers*.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the prescribed minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer. In default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be

agreed upon, the wage shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application.

After giving notice to the secretary and after lodging the application mentioned and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed in the manner aforesaid at the instance of the said secretary.

The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

21. *Term of Award*.—The currency of this award shall be three years from midnight of the 6th March, 1926. Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof the Court may alter or amend the award on the application of any person or party affected by its provisions.

ENGINE-DRIVERS AND FIREMEN—GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS.

(Registered 1st March, 1926.)

No. 9 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912," this twenty-seventh day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between the Commissioner of Railways (hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioner"), of the one part, and The Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia (West Australian Branch) Association of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), of the other part: Whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1. *Definitions*.

"Casual Hand" in this Agreement means any worker other than the regular operating staff and who is employed for not more than six months continuously.

"Turbine-driver" shall mean and include any worker who starts, stops, or operates turbo-alternators or feed pumps, and attends generally to the duties attached to same.

"Auxiliary Plant Attendant" shall mean and include any worker who starts, stops, and operates the circulating and air pump motors in turbine basement; attends to condensing plant, also high pressure pumps, compressors, and seepage pumps, rotary screens, etc., and attends to the bearings of the machinery in connection with the above.

"Greaser" shall mean and include any worker employed in lubricating or oiling any engine, machinery or shafting.

"Fuelman" shall mean and include any worker employed in connection with the unloading of coal.

2. *Scope of Agreement*.—This Agreement shall operate over the Western Australian Government Generating Station at East Perth.

3. *Term of Agreement*.—This Agreement shall operate from the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and shall remain in force for three years from that date: Provided that the rates of pay will be subject to amendment in accordance with the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act Amendment Act, 1925," and provided also that at any time after the expiration of twelve months either party shall have the right to approach the Court of Arbitration for amendment to the margins only which are herein provided over and above the basic wage.

4. *Rates of Pay.*

Basic wage—£4 3s. 4d. per week.

Dirty work: One shilling per day additional shall be paid to workers while on boiler-cleaning work and when working in coal bunkers and ash receivers.

Three shillings per day additional shall be paid to workers while cleaning condensers and suction pipes.

5. *Hours of Duty.*

(a) The ordinary working hours (exclusive of Sunday time) shall be eight hours per day on five days of the week and four hours on one day of the week: Provided that where workers are employed on shifts the working hours may be forty hours worked on five days in one week and forty-eight hours worked on six days in the following week.

(b) Workers other than casuals shall, so far as the business of the Department will permit, be entitled to a full fortnight's work.

6. *Overtime Rates.*

(a) All time worked in excess of the usual working hours in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first four hours and thereafter at time and a-half.

(b) All work performed on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday and Eight Hours' Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half, and a worker working and paid at such rate on either of those days shall not thereby lose his claim to a paid holiday under Clause 8 hereof.

(c) Any worker brought on duty for any purpose outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a minimum of two hours, provided such work exclusive of meal times is not continuous with his shift, and provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work for the two hours if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.

(d) Should the conditions regarding overtime rates as set forth in Clause 4 of Engineers' Award Nos. 4 and 6 of 1921 be altered by the Court of Arbitration during the currency of this Agreement, similar alterations shall be made to this clause.

7. *Retirement.*

(a) No worker, other than casual hands, after six months' continuous service, shall leave the Department until the expiration of fourteen days' written notice of his intention to do so without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b) Fourteen days' written notice shall be given by the Commissioner to any such worker, other than casual hands, whose services are no longer required, and the reason for dismissal shall be given: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct or to workers or casual hands for whom the Commissioner is unable to find work by reason of any action on the part of any of his employees, or for any other cause beyond his control.

8. *Holidays.*

(a) Every worker shall, after twelve months' continuous service, be granted twelve days' leave on full pay in each year. Should any worker be booked off

and paid or granted leave with pay on any public holiday, such holiday shall be deducted from the twelve days. Three days additional holidays shall be granted to workers who work twelve Sundays or more in any one year. Annual holidays to be allowed to accumulate for two years if desired. The pay for each day's leave shall be one-sixth of the pay for forty-four hours' work.

(b) Workers shall be paid for annual holidays at the rate of pay they are drawing at or immediately before the time when such holidays are taken.

(c) Every worker, after six months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

(d) No deduction shall be made from annual holidays for the period any worker is off duty through sickness, unless the absence exceeds three calendar months.

(e) Subject to the proviso hereto, any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays which may be due to him up to the time of leaving the service: Provided that if a worker be dismissed for disobedience of lawful orders, for being under the influence of liquor, or for drunkenness, he shall be entitled to be paid only for such leave (if any) as has accumulated from a previous year, and if dismissed for speculation he shall not be entitled to any payment for leave or holidays accumulated or otherwise.

(f) Each employee after twelve months' service shall be granted a station to station railway pass during the period of his holidays.

9. *Workers performing Higher Duties.*

(a) Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum.

(b) Should a vacancy or temporary vacancy occur in any of the higher grades, the senior employee shall be entitled to promotion to the vacancy, providing he is considered competent to fill the higher grade.

10. *Under-rate Workers.*—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the Commissioner, and in default of such an agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied to the Secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said Secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the Secretary and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have again been fixed at the instance of the said Secretary in the manner prescribed. The Secretary of the Union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

11. *Preference.*—Preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement shall be given to members of the Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Workers of Western Australia.

3. Coppersmithing.
4. Blacksmithing.
5. Brass Finishing.
6. Turning.
7. Fitting.
8. Electrical fitting.
9. Universal milling machining.
10. Machining (including milling machining other than universal milling machining).

(b) The term of apprenticeship shall be for a period of five years, and no person shall commence his apprenticeship before attaining the age of fifteen years nor shall he commence his apprenticeship after he shall attain the age of seventeen years.

(c) No premium shall be paid to or accepted by any employer for taking apprentices.

(d) The minimum rate of wage payable to apprentices shall be:—
