WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under the said Act as may be deemed necessary for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke Regulation 9 of Division 1 of the Regulations made by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1921, and published on page 1727 of the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921, as amended by Order in Council dated the 2nd day of May, 1924, and in lieu thereof substitutes the following:—

1. The term "Board" in these By-laws shall mean the State Gardens Board appointed under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," to control this reserve.

2. The term "permission" throughout these By-laws means permission in writing from the Board or its agent first obtained.

3. Except as provided hereafter no person shall fell, cut, injure, or destroy any tree, shrub, or plant on this Reserve, or cut or remove without permission any dead wood or timber lying on this Reserve.

4. No person shall set fire to the bush on this Reserve, nor light any fire without clearing, or seeing that there is already cleared, a sufficient break of at least 10 feet radius to prevent the fire spreading.

5. No person shall post, stiek, stamp or affix in any way any notices or advertisements of any kind on the trees on this Reserve without permission.

6. No person shall in any way damage or injure or cut names or initials upon any buildings, gates, fences or trees, within this Reserve.

7. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, thereon.

8. No person shall camp within this Reserve without permission.

9. No person shall erect within this Reserve any building, booth, nor any structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, nor offer or expose for sale or sell therein any fruit, drinks, or other article without permission.

10. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use and enjoyment of the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer, gardener, keeper or labourer, workman, or other person employed in any connection therewith.

11. No person shall enter or remain on this Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who is in a state of intoxication.

12. No person shall have or place on this Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals or birds without permission.

13. The Board reserves the right to close any part of the Reserve by posting notices, and no person, except workmen employed on this Reserve, shall enter any such place.

14. No person shall carry, use, or discharge firearms on this Reserve without permission.

15. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay on conviction such penalty as may be imposed not exceeding £20.

KOJONUP ROAD BOARD.

By-laws for the Management and the Use of the Kojonup Local Government Memorial Buildings, Kojonup.

1. Application for the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Kojonup Road Board not less than 24 hours before the time that such hall, room or furniture is required.
2. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring any hall, room, or furniture shall be given in the application for the use of any hall, room, or furniture.

3. The rent of the hall, room, or furniture (inclusive of the use of crockeryware) shall be paid with each application, and shall be as follows:—

Church or hospital charities, 50 per cent. reduction on the above charges, at the discretion of the Board, but written application must be made for such reduction.

The above charges include the use of electric light and the use of such crockery as the Board possesses.

Skating will not be permitted under any consideration.

4. The hours for which any hall, room, or furniture shall be hired shall be: Day—from 9 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.; Night—from 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight, after which 10s. shall be paid in addition to ordinary payment.

5. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

6. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any hall, room, or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

7. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any hall, room, or furniture.

8. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any hall, room, or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such hall, room, or furniture shall be granted.

9. The hirer of any hall, room, or furniture shall comply with the provisions of The Health Act, The Entertainment Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and using of any hall or room. If, in the opinion of the Board, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts mentioned above, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such hall or room.

10. In the event of the use of any hall or room being stopped under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such hall or room as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer by reason of such stoppage.

11. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, sherry or any other intoxicating liquor shall be brought into or consumed in any hall or room except when expressly permitted by the Board.

12. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any hall or room during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said hall or rooms, whether such persons have been admitted by payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

13. No person shall in any part of the building—

- (a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (b) use profane or improper language;
- (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these by-laws;
- (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage-way or any part of the building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.

14. No offensive personalities or representations of living persons, nor any thing calculated to produce riot or a breach of the peace, shall be permitted in any hall or any part thereof, or in any room.

15. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in any hall or room.

16. The Secretary of the Board, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, if permitted as such to the hirer or his servant, shall be known to have free ingress to the hall or any part thereof at all times during the term of engagement, and shall be given every facility for seeing that these By-laws are duly carried out.

17. The hirer of any hall or room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws, and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture or crockeryware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockeryware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.

18. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

19. Children under 10 years of age must be under responsible supervision when in the building or any part thereof.

20. Rooms shall be open on week-days from 9 o'clock a.m. to 9 o'clock p.m., and on Sundays by arrangement with the Secretary.

BY-LAW OF THE MURRAY ROAD BOARD.

Advertising Hoardings, Sign-boards, Placards, or any Structure erected of this nature.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in Section 196 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Murray Road Board doth hereby make the following By-law:—

1. *Repeal.*—All by-laws hitherto made by the Murray Road Board with reference to the matters herein contained are hereby repealed.

2. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the construction of this by-law:—

- (a) The word "occupier" shall mean the person having the use or control of a hoarding, sign-board, or placard;
- (b) The words "hoarding," "sign-board," or "placard," or any structure erected of this nature, shall mean a hoarding, sign-board, placard, or structure erected on private property invested in the Board for the purpose of advertising;
- (c) The word "owner" shall mean the owner of the land on which the sign-board, hoarding, or placard is erected;
- (d) The word "advertisement" shall mean and include any bills, posters, and all other advertisements of any nature stencilled, painted or embossed and affixed or placed in any way on walls, fences, bridges, or approaches, or windows.
- (e) The word "Board" shall mean the Murray District Road Board;
- (f) The word "Supervisor" shall mean any officer empowered by the Board for the carrying out of this By-law.

3. No person shall erect or cause to be erected a hoarding, sign-board, or placard unless and until a plan and specifications, showing clearly the position and size and method of and the materials to be used in the construction of and the manner of fixing same shall have been deposited with and approved by the Board.

4. No person shall make any alterations or additions to any hoarding, sign-board, or placard unless or until the proposed alteration or addition has been approved by the supervisor.

5. If any hoarding, sign-board, or placard is at any time in the opinion of the Board or Supervisor in a dangerous or neglected condition, the owner or occupier shall, on the receipt of a written notice to that effect, fail to forthwith remove or repair the same to the satisfaction of the Supervisor, the Board may remove the same and recover the cost of doing so from the owner or occupier.

6. If in the opinion of the Board the hoarding, sign-board, or placard shall become objectionable, the owner or occupier shall, upon receipt of a written notice to that effect, fail to at once remove or cause to be removed such hoardings, sign board, or placard, the Supervisor or other person authorised by the Board shall remove same and recover cost of the removal from the owner or occupier.

7. The Board may permit the display of advertisements at theatres or other places of amusement, and may permit the advertisement of meetings or objects of national or general importance, under such terms and conditions as the Board may in each case decide.

8. All notices required by this By-law to be served on the owner or occupier shall, in the first place, be given to the occupier, but if he cannot be found, then such notice may be served on the owner.

9. If the owner or occupier of any hoarding, sign-board, or placard fail to comply with the written order of the Board within the time named, then the Supervisor may carry out the requirements of the order, and recover such costs as are incurred in the carrying out of the order.

10. Every license issued by the Board for the erection of sign-boards, hoardings, or placards, or any ad-

vertisements, shall terminate on the 30th day of June of each year.

11. The fee for a license under paragraph 10 shall be 5s. per annum, and shall be payable for each and every part of the twelve months.

12. No person shall post, paint, stencil, place or affix any hoarding, sign-board, placard or advertisement on any fence, wall, footpath, bridge, or approach to bridge, or in or on any window or any other portion of any building facing or abutting on any street or way or public place within the Murray Road Board District without the sanction of the Board.

13. The use of any advertisement within the Murray Road Board District otherwise than in accordance with this By-law is hereby prohibited.

14. *Penalties.*—Where anything in this By-law is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act forbidden to be done is done, in every case the person making default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this By-law, and every person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of the proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

In order to qualify for promotion the following periods of service and efficiency marks will be required:—

From C2 to C1: Two years' good service, with an efficiency mark of not less than 70 in the final year.

From C1 to B2: Two years' good service, with an average efficiency mark of not less than 75, and a mark of not less than 75 in the final year.

From B2 to B1: Three years' good service, with an average efficiency mark of not less than 75, and a mark of not less than 75 in the final year.

From B1 to A3: Three years' good service, with an average efficiency mark of not less than 80, and a mark of not less than 80 in the final year. An Assistant must have served for at least one year continuously as a First Assistant, or in teaching a class or classes higher than Class VI.

From A2 to A1: Three years' good service as Head Teacher of a school or schools not lower than Class IV., of which at least one year shall have been spent as permanent Head Teacher of a school not lower than Class II. The average efficiency mark must be over 80, and the mark for the final year not less than 81.

A teacher who has given thoroughly satisfactory evidence of his capacity to manage a large school, has held the A Certificate for eight years, and has served for at least four years as a Teachers' College Lecturer or as a First Assistant in a High School, may be raised from A2 to A1 after two years' service as Head Master, provided that for one year he has been Head of a school not lower than Class II.

LAND DIVISION.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912," this the fourth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between The Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, and The Premier Coal Mining Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and The Amalgamated Society of Engineers' Industrial Union of Workers, Collie Branch, and The Australasian Society of Engineers, Collie River District, Industrial Union of Workers, being Industrial Unions duly registered under the provisions of the said Act (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part.

Witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:—

1. *Area.*—This Agreement shall operate over the coal mining industry in the South-West Land Division of Western Australia.

2. *Term of Agreement.*—The currency of this Agreement shall be for three (3) years from the date hereof, providing that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, either party may open negotiations to alter or amend same.

3. *Rate of Wages.*—The minimum rate of wages which shall be paid by the employers to the classes of workers in their employment hereunder specified shall be as follows:—

Further, that present margins shall be maintained.

The foregoing rates are based on the existing price of coal, namely, nineteen shillings per ton at the pit's mouth, and for every penny increase or decrease in the said existing price, the said wages shall increase or may decrease one penny per shift. For the purpose of fixing the increase or decrease in the price of coal, as aforesaid, regard shall be had only to the maximum price paid by the Commissioner of the Western Australian Government Railways.

In addition to the above mentioned rates, sixpence per day extra shall be paid to employees working afternoon or night shift.

4. *Apprentices.*—The employer taking an apprentice or a probationer shall within fourteen days thereafter register such apprentice or probationer by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration on the prescribed form. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be allowed. Such probationary period to be deemed part of the apprenticeship.

(a) The number of apprentices allowed to the employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to three or part of three tradesmen employed by him on the particular branch of work. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. Apprenticeship shall not commence before the apprentice is fifteen years of age.

(b) Should the employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term to another employer, but it shall be incumbent on the former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of said transfer on the prescribed form. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike, the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship contract during the period of the strike.

(c) Slackness of work may form a proper ground of transferring an apprentice to an employer willing to take the responsibility of teaching him; when an apprentice is discharged, notice in the prescribed form shall be given to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration.

(d) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be for the first year 25s. per week; second year 35s. per week; third year 50s. per week; fourth year 70s. per week; fifth year 90s. per week.

(e) Every apprentice shall be bound to attend such classes at the technical school or continuation classes as are provided for his trade.

5. *Hours.*—Forty hours shall constitute a week's work on pay week and forty-two hours in the back week. No day's work shall exceed seven hours, but on Pay Saturday five hours shall be worked and paid for as seven hours. These hours are exclusive of crib time.

6. *Overtime Rates.*—For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day other than a holiday, payment shall be made at the rate of bare time for the first hour and time and a-half thereafter.

(a) For all work performed on Anniversary Day, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day double time rates shall be paid, and for all work performed on

Sundays, Anzac Day, Easter Monday, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, and contested State and Federal Election Days shall be paid for at time and a half rates.

(b) Any worker called upon to work on Sundays or holidays shall be paid a minimum of four hours at overtime rates.

(c) In the event of a worker who has been employed on day work being required to work during afternoon or night shift, such worker shall be paid at overtime rates.

7. Wet Work.—If any worker under this Agreement has to work in water, i.e., if he has to stand in water while working, or water drips on him while working, he shall be paid the sum of 2s. 3d. per shift extra.

8. Holidays.—The days to be observed as holidays are:—Anniversary Day (26th January), Anzac Day, Labour Day, Easter Monday, Good Friday, Boxing Day, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, and Contested State and Federal Election Days.

9. Annual Leave.—Every worker shall be entitled to an annual holiday of twelve days in addition to the above-mentioned holidays, such holidays to be taken at a time which will cause the least inconvenience to the employer.

10. Reduction of Hands.—In the event of the manager deeming it necessary to reduce hands, the last man employed in the particular class of work in which the reduction of hands is to be made shall be the first man to go, but in the event of such worker having been shifted from one class of work to another, then he shall be treated as if he were employed at his last job from the date that he signed on at the mine.

In the event of the management re-starting workers, the last man off shall be the first man to be put on if available.

11. Record Book.—A record or time book shall be kept by each employer in which record or time book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week; the said record or time book shall be open to the inspection of the accredited representative of the society at any time during the working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

12. Local Arbitration Clause.—Any matter in dispute of any kind whatever, in connection with the working conditions, discharge of workmen, or any other thing not provided for in this Agreement, shall forthwith be referred to a Board of Arbitration consisting of the employer or his manager, and the local secretary of the union or his representative for amicable settlement. Failing a settlement the arbitrators so appointed shall appoint an umpire to decide the matter in dispute. Should they fail to agree upon an umpire within forty-eight hours, the Inspector of Mines for the district shall act as umpire and the decision of such person shall be final. There shall be no cessation of work whilst a settlement is being arrived at. The persons appointed as a Board of Arbitration as herein provided may, when determining any dispute referred for their arbitration, direct that the costs (if any) occasioned by the proceedings shall be paid by one specified party or parties to the other or others, and the parties to this Agreement shall abide by and literally comply with any such direction.

13. Preference.—All workers under this Agreement must be members of one of the unions mentioned herein. Every worker engaged by the employer shall, within three weeks of his engagement, become a member provided that the right to be a member shall apply to the Chief Mechanical Engineer or Chief Electrical Engineer, where the positions are held by separate persons at each mine when this Agreement was made, and also to any person who may fill these positions in the future, and said engineers shall not be liable to be called upon to leave work when a strike or lock-out takes place, and the union herein agrees to accept him as a member.

14. Existing Customs and Conditions.—This Agreement is based on existing customs and conditions not inconsistent with this Agreement.

FEDERATED MOULDERS (METALS).

AN Agreement made this sixteenth day of February, 1926, between the Minister for Works and the Minister for Trading Concerns of the one part, and the Federated Moulders' (Metals) Industrial Union of Workers of the other part.

Whereas an Award of the Arbitration Court of Western Australia was made on the 26th day of September, 1923, and numbered 39 of 1922, and it has been mutually agreed to vary the terms of the said Award as hereinafter expressed, that is to say:—

IT IS HEREBY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES:

(The dates shown in parentheses are the dates from which it is agreed such alterations shall operate.)

Hours.

1. Forty-four hours shall represent a weeks' work in lieu of 48 hours as prescribed in Clause 1 of the Award on the following conditions:—Such ordinary working hours shall not exceed eight hours on the first five days of the week and four hours on Saturdays. (2nd July, 1924.)

Overtime and Holidays.

2. Delete Subclause (a) and substitute in lieu thereof:—"All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be paid for the first four hours after the usual stopping time, time and a-half, and thereafter double time, provided that employees called to start work within an hour and a-half of the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half until the usual starting time." (26th September, 1924.)

Delete Subclause (h) and substitute in lieu thereof.—"Employees having less than one year's continuous service shall, after one month's continuous service, be entitled to holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the 12 months." (26th September, 1924.)

Wages.

3. The minimum rate of pay shall, in lieu of the rate prescribed by Clause 3 of the Award, be 107s. 4d. per week of 44 hours.

It is also agreed—

(a) that the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis subject to the following condition, namely, that if in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week no work is available or performed, the employee will only be paid for the time actually worked at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of 44 hours) apportioned to the time actually worked during the week; and

(b) that notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the employee was employed at an hourly wage.

(c) Paragraphs (a) and (b) are in conformity with existing practice, which will continue and be observed. (1st October, 1925.)

Add a new subclause to stand as 3 (a), as follows:—

"A leading hand means any tradesman placed in charge of three or more other tradesmen or of six other workers, and shall be paid as a leading hand. Leading hand tradesmen shall receive 2s. 6d. per day above the minimum rates specified in this Award for their respective trades." (26th September, 1924.)

Add a new subclause to stand as 3 (b):—

"Casual Hand: A casual worker shall mean one for whom work over a period of twelve consecutive working days, not counting holidays, is not provided by the employer.

"Casual Workers shall be paid 10 per cent. over the rate provided by the Agreement or Award for the particular workers' occupation." (26th September, 1924.)

Add a new subclause to stand as 3 (c):—

"Foreman: A foreman means an employee who is in charge of one or more leading hands, or who is directly responsible to the supervisor for preparing estimates of work or for the carrying out of work by other tradesmen.

Foremen shall be paid not less than five shillings per day above the minimum rates provided for tradesmen in the district in which they may be employed." (26th September, 1924.)

Add a new subclause to stand as 3 (d):—

"Arbitration Court's Basic Wage Determination. It is further agreed that the wages referred to herein shall operate until the 26th September, 1926, subject to the proviso that should the Arbitration Court issue a statutory basic wage declaration in the meantime, the wages set out in this Agreement shall be automatically adjusted in accordance with such declaration."

Right of Entry to Works.

Add a new clause to stand as Clause 9:—

"On notifying the officer-in-charge any officer of the Union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of such Union shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such Union covered by this Award are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the employees in such place or premises: Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the employees in the carrying out of their work. The officer-in-charge shall determine whether employees are being hampered or hindered in their work." (From date Agreement is signed.)

Shop Stewards.

Add a new clause to stand as Clause 10:—

"Subject to the recognition of properly constituted authority, shop stewards to be appointed by the Union shall be recognised by the management." (From date Agreement is signed.)

Preference of Employment.

Add a new clause to stand as Clause 11:—

"Preference of employment under this Award shall in all cases be given to members of the Federated Moulders' (Metals) Industrial Union of Workers." (From date Agreement is signed.)

Broken Shifts.

Add a new clause to stand as Clause 12:—

"Should any employee not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required on the next day he shall be paid for that day if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time; unless he cannot be employed on account of causes beyond the control of the management, in which case he shall be notified forthwith of the cause why he cannot be employed, and shall be entitled to two hours' pay." (26th September, 1924.)

Higher Duties.

Add a new clause to stand as Clause 13:—

"Any employee called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular rate of pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time actually engaged upon such higher work; provided that acting time less than twenty minutes in any one shift shall not be counted."

Application to Court.

It is hereby further agreed between the parties hereto that as soon as practicable application will be made by the Union to the Court to vary the aforementioned Award in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, and the parties hereto will consent to such variation.

Term.

This Agreement shall operate from the date hereof until the 26th day of September, 1926.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 207 of 1925.

In the matter of an Industrial Agreement dated the 2nd October, 1925, made between Metropolitan Brick Company, Limited, J. Hesketh, Lewis Whiteman, and Cardup Brick Company (hereinafter called "the Employers"), and the Westralian Brickyard, Pottery, and Porcelain Works Employees' Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"); and in the matter of an application by the above-named Union for a Declaration that the said Agreement be made a Common Rule.

UPON hearing Mr. Albert William Richardson for the applicant Union, there being no appearance on behalf of any party desiring to be heard in opposition, and upon being satisfied that the requirements of the Act and the Regulations have been complied with, the Court doth declare that the Industrial Agreement, dated the 2nd October, 1925, and registered No. 58 of 1925, made between the Employers and the Union, shall have the effect of an Award and be a Common Rule of the industry to which it relates, within an area comprised within a radius of eighty miles from the General Post Office, Perth: Provided that the Agreement be treated as made between the parties and be not regarded as expressing any actual determination of the Court as to the merits of the dispute, if any, or the propriety of the Agreement.
