## Claremont Road Board.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4, of Part IV., of the said Act: And whereas it is advisable to empower the Claremont Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its district and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Claremout Road Board by a By-law to prohibit the pas-sage of heavy traffic over any specified roads within the District, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for that purpose, and to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

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#### HEALTH ACT, 1911-1919.

#### Municipality of Fremantle.

#### M.P.H. 3359/17; Ex. Co. No. 1029.

WILEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, i911-1919," a Local Health Authority may make Bylaws: Now, therefore, the Fremantle Municipal Council, being the Local Health Authority for the Municipal District of Fremantle, do hereby make the following By-law:—

#### Keeping of Poultry or Pigeons.

(a.) The occupier of any premises shall not keep any poultry or pigeons, except for the purpose of immediate sale, within that portion of the district embraced within the following boundaries:--

Bounded by lines starting from the left bank of the Swan River and extending South-East along Edward Street to the intersection of Parry Street; thence South along Parry Street to Holdsworth Street; thence West along Holdsworth Street to the intersection of Queen Street; thence North-West along Queen Street to the intersection of Henderson Street; thence West along Henderson Street to the intersection of South Terrace; thence South along South Terrace to the centre of Essex Street; thence West along Essex Street to the intersection of Marine Terrace; thence along the sea coast Northwards, and East along the said bank of the Swan River to the starting point.

(b.) The occupier of any premises shall not keep any pigeons or fowls or turkeys within 25 feet of any dwelling-house, and where pigeons are kept they shall be continually confined.

(c.) The occupier of any premises shall not keep any ducks or geese within 40 (forty) feet of any dwelling-house.

(d.) All enclosures or cages within which birds of any description are kept shall be maintained at all times in a clean condition, and shall at any time be cleaned, disinfected, or otherwise dealt with as an Inspector may direct.

Penalty.—Every person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable for every such offence, besides any cost or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds ( $\pm 20$ ) for every breach of any such By-law, or to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and in addition to such penalty shall be liable to pay to the Local Authority any expense incurred by such Authority in consequence of any breach or non-observance of any By-law, or in the execution of any work directed to be executed and not so executed.

All previous By-laws of the Fremantle Municipal Council, being the Local Health Authority, in force within the said Municipality dealing with matters mentioned in this By-law are hereby repealed.
