Close Seasons for Native Game. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Section 6 of "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare the close season for any par-State or in any one or more districts thereof to be defined in any such Proclamation: And whereas the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operation of any such declaration any defined locality: And whereas it is desirable to exercise the powers hereinbefore mentioned in the manner hereinafter set out: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting

with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the close season throughout the State for each kind of native game mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be as set out in the second column thereof opposite the name of such kind of game: And I do further, with the advice aforesaid, proclaim and declare that the portions of the State defined in the third column of the Schedule hereto shall be districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that the close season for each kind of native game mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule shall be as set out in the second column of such Schedule opposite the name of such kind of game, and that such close season shall be operative in the district mentioned in the third column of such Schedule opposite the statement of such close season and not elsewhere.

The Proclamation dated 23rd November, 1921, and appearing in the Government Gazette of 25th November, 1921, is hereby revoked.

Wild Ducks of all species	From the beginning of June, to 5 o'clock in the morning of the 23rd December in every year. Seals	From the beginning of November to the end of March in every year	District C:—The whole of the State.

## MINES REGULATION ACT, 1906.

Department of Mines, 2933/16. Perth, 14th April, 1926. IN accordance with Section 63 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to cancel Clause 4, under Division 2, of Regulation 15, under Section VIII. of The Regulations made under the said Act (published in the Government Gazette of the 5th day of February, 1926), and substitute the following:—

4. The powers of every Workmen's Inspector, as provided under Section 7 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," shall apply to all mines within

the district, mining centre, mines, or groups of mines, specified by the Minister in accordance with the foregoing Clause 3, as those for which the said Workmen's Inspector shall be appointed, and subject always to the control of the District Inspector, it shall be such Workmen's Inspector's duty from time to time to inspect and exercise his powers in all the mines therein which employ men underground as wages men, contractors, or tributers, together with such other mines as may be from time to time arranged and directed by the District Inspector.
