Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

Proposed 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing from the intersection of Railway Avenue and Fourth Avenue; thence North-Westerly along Fourth Avenue to Ninth Avenue, and continuing along Ninth Avenue in a South-Westerly direction to Sixth Avenue (length 33 chains), together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, including lifting of existing 114 in. G.W.I. tubing, as indicated in red on M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., Plan No. 4508.


Tr is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following Regulations, numbered 1 to 9, under the provisions of "The Dog Act, 1903," as amended by "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1922," to come into operation in every Municipal and Road District throughout the State on and from the 1st day of July, 1926:—

The Dog Act (as amended by "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1922").

(1.) All Regulations previously made under the Act shall be and are hereby repealed as from the 30th day of June, 1926.

(2.) These Regulations shall come into operation and have the force of law, in every district throughout the State on and from the 1st day of July 1926

State, on and from the 1st day of July, 1926.
(3.) The registration label for the financial year ending the 30th June, 1927, required by Section 9 of "The Dog Act, 1903," as amended by "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1922," is hereby prescribed to be a flat piece of brass, of the size and shape depicted hereunder, inscribed with the name of the district, the year of registration, and the registration number on the obverse side and the emblem of the State flag upon the reverse side:



- (4.) The registration label, as prescribed to these Regulations, shall be securely affixed to a collar and continually worn round the dog's neck.
- (5.) Registration shall be effected on the 1st day of July, 1926.
- (6.) The registration fees for dogs shall be as set forth in the Third Schedule to the principal Act, as amended by Sections 5 and 16 of the amending Act of 1922, namely:—
  - (a) Dogs, 7s. 6d.; bitches, 10s. (Except those used for tending cattle and sheep.)
  - (h) When any person makes use of any dog or dogs in or about the droving or tending of not less than five head of great cattle or twenty head of small cattle, he shall, on making application in the prescribed form, he entitled to register any such dog at half the prescribed rate, namely:—Dogs, 3s. 9d.: bitches, 5s.
- (7.) The description of cattle shall be as set out in the Second Schedule of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," namely:—Horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, cow, heifer, calf, camel, deer, and foal—"Great Cattle." Ram, ewe, sheep, wether, and lamb, goat, kid, and pig—"Small Cattle."
- (8.) The form for application is hereby prescribed as Form 'A,' in the Fourth Schedule to 'The Dog Act, 1903,' as issued by the Department of Works and Labour. It must be stated definitely in the last column of the form the number of cattle or sheep for which the dog is used for tending.

(9.) Any person or persons who contravene any provisions of these Regulations, whether by act or omission, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

# W.A. FIRE BRIGADES BOARD—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Election of Members of the Board.

Returning Officer.

1. The Under Secretary, Chief Secretary's Department, Perth, shall be the Returning Officer.

Election of Two Members by the Insurance Companies.

2. The members to be elected by the Insurance Companies shall be elected at a meeting held for that purpose during the month of November, 1926, and every alternate year thereafter.

- 3. At such meeting, which shall be held at a time and place to be stated in the notice convening the same, the representatives of the insurance companies shall elect a chairman, and the election of two members of the Board shall be decided by a majority of votes of the representatives present, and the votes to be allotted to each representative shall be according to the following scale, namely:—Where the insurance company's fire premium income in the State of Western Australia does not exceed two thousand pounds, the representative shall be entitled to one vote; where such income is above two thousand pounds and does not exceed five thousand pounds, the representative shall have two votes; where such income is above five thousand pounds, such representative shall have three votes, and the chairman of such meeting shall have, in addition to his own vote or votes, a casting vote.
- 4. Such meeting may regulate its own procedure.
  5. The names of the persons elected shall be forthwith communicated to the Returning Officer who shall, by notice in the "Government Gazette," declare such persons duly elected.

Election of One Member by the Council of the City of Perth.

6. The member to be elected by the Council of the City of Perth shall be elected at a meeting of the Council to be held during the month of November.

The name of the person elected shall forthwith be communicated by the Town Clerk to the Returning Officer, who shall, by notice in the "Government Gazette," declare such person duly elected.

Election of Members of Local Authorities.

7. Before the 31st day of October, 1926, and every alternate year thereafter, the Board shall furnish to the Returning Officer a list of the names of the Local Authorities included in Parts II., III., and IV. of the Second Schedule of the Act.

of the Second Schedule of the Act.

The Council of each Municipality and the Board of each Road District mentioned in Parts II., III., and IV., respectively, of the Second Schedule of the Act, or as may be added thereto or excised therefrom under Section 4, may nominate a candidate for election as a member of the Board to represent each of such groups of Municipalities and Road Districts.

In the case of a united Fire District, the Board shall acquaint the Returning Officer not later than October of each year of the names of Local Authorities constituting united Fire Districts.

Every Local Authority whose district or portion

Every Local Authority whose district or portion of district forms part of a united Fire District shall have the right to nominate a candidate for election, and to vote at the election.

- 8. Nomination papers in the form prescribed by the Returning Officer, to be addressed to the Under Secretary, Chief Secretary's Department, Perth, and must be received not later than the 1st day of November
- 9. If not more than one candidate is nominated to represent any one of the said groups of Municipalities and Road Board Districts, as set out in Parts II., III., and IV: of the Second Schedule to the Act, or as may be added thereto or excised therefrom under Section 4, the Returning Officer shall, by notice published in the "Government Gazette," declare such candidate duly elected.
- 10. If more candidates than one are nominated by any of the said groups of Municipalities and Road Boards, the Returning Officer shall cause a list of the candidates to be prepared, and shall forward a copy of such list to each Municipal Council and Road Board concerned, and each such Municipal Council and Road Board of the several groups shall, on the occasion of any ordinary or special meeting, strike out of such list the names of all candidates except the name of the candidate for whom the Council or Board votes, and shall return the list, addressed to the Under Secretary, at the Chief Secretary's Office, Perth, so that the same may be received not later than the 30th day of November.
- 11. The Returning Officer shall forthwith, after receipt of the voting papers for each of such groups of Municipalities and Road Districts, by notice in the Government Gazette, declare the candidate receiving the largest number of votes for each such groups of Municipalities and Road Districts. to be duly elected.
- 12. In the case of an equality of votes, the Returning Officer shall have a casting vote.

Election of a Member by the Volunteer Fire Brigades. 13. In the month of October, 1926, and every alternate year thereafter, the Board shall furnish the Returning Officer with a list of all registered volunteer fire brigades in the Fire Districts, and such list shall be published by the Returning Officer in the Government Gazette.

The name of any registered volunteer fire brigade omitted from the list may be inserted in the list (on application by the Board to the Returning Officer within seven days from the publication thereof.

Such list, when published, shall be the roll of registered volunteer fire brigades within the meaning of Section 6 of the Act.

On or before the 1st day of November, 1926, and every alternate year thereafter, each registered brigade so enrolled may, by notice in writing, addressed to the Returning Officer, nominate one or more candidates.

- 14. If no more than one candidate is nominated the Returning Officer shall, by notice published in the Government Gazette, declare such candidate duly elected.
- 15. If more candidates than one are nominated, the Returning Officer shall cause a list of the candidates to be prepared, and shall forward a copy of such list to each brigade, and such brigade shall, on the occasion of any ordinary or special meeting,

strike out of such list the names of all candidates except the name of the candidate for whom the brigade votes, and shall return the list to the Under Secretary, at the Chief Secretary's Department, Pertin,

not later than the 30th day or November.

16. The Returning Officer shall forthwith, after the receipt of the voting papers, count the votes, and by notice in the Government Gazette deciare the candidate receiving the largest number of votes to be duly elected.

17. In the case of an equality of votes, the Returning Officer shall have a casting vote.

#### Telegraphic Communications.

18. In all cases where it is impracticable to communicate any matter by post without occasioning undue delay, any telegraphic advice communicated in the ordinary course shall suffice for the purpose of these regulations.

19. Every extraordinary vacancy in the office of a member of the Board shall be filled by appointment or election, as the case may require, under and subject to the provisions of Section 14 of the Act, and the procedure for periodical elections shall apply. Provided that the time within which such vacancy shall be filled up shall be eight weeks from the occurrence of the

vacancy.

20. The names of all persons appointed or elected by members of the Board shall forthwith be notified by the Returning Officer in the Government Gazette, and such notification shall be deemed a declaration by the Returning Officer of the result of the election.

## Conduct of Proceedings of the Board.

21. The Board shall meet for the transaction of ordinary business on such days and at such time and place as the Board shall from time to time determine.

22. The President may, or on the written requisition of three members of the Board the Secretary shall, call special meetings of which each member shall receive at least seven days' notice.

23. The Board may delegate any of its powers to committees duly appointed by the Board, but any committee so formed shall in the exercise of its powers so delegated conform to any direction that may be imposed upon it by the Board. Each such committee shall report to the Board. The President shall be ex officio a member of all committees.

24. Any member may, on giving seven clear days' notice, submit to the Board at its ordinary meeting or at a special meeting any motion for the purpose of altering, amending, rescinding, or extending any regula-tion authorised under the existing Fire Brigades Act.

25. Entries of all proceedings of the Board and of every committee, with the names of the members who attend each meeting, shall be made in books kept for the purpose under the direction of the Board and committees, and shall be signed at the next or some subsequent meeting of the Board or committee.

26. The common seal shall be placed in the custody of the Secretary, who shall keep it securely locked up in the office or have same deposited with the bankers of the Board for safe keeping. The seal shall not be affixed to any document except by the order of the Board as recorded in the minutes, and when affixed must be witnessed by at least two members of the Board, and by the Secretary or any other officer authorised by the Board in that behalf.
27. The fees allowed to the Board shall be divided

amongst the members by resolution of the Board.

The following travelling allowances shall be payable to members of the Board when travelling: in cases of journeys occupying one day or more, 30s. per diem. The cost of conveyance may be allowed. In the case of a member resident in the country, the Board may provide such member with a seasonal ticket.

29. All payments of £1 and over shall be made by cheque upon the bankers of the Board, and shall be signed by two members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary or other officer authorised by the Board.

30. The financial year of the Board shall commence on the 1st day of October and end on the 30th day of September each year. The dates prescribed by Section 3 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," for the doing of or performance of the duties in the said section referred to shall be altered as follows:-

Where the date the 31st day of December appears in the said section, the same shall be altered to and the 30th day of September substituted.

The dates prescribed by Section 40, Subsection 1, of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," for the doing or performance of the duties in the said section referred to shall be altered as follows:-

Where the date the thirty-first day of October appears in the said section, the same shall be altered to and the

31st day of July substituted.

Where the dates prescribed by Section 41, Subsection 3 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," for the doing or the performance of the duties in the said section referred to, shall be altered as follows:-

Where the dates the 1st day of January, April, July, and October appear in Subsection 3 of the said Section 41, the same shall be altered, and the following dates respectively substituted, that is to say, the first day of

October, January, April, and July.

31. In all cases the debate on all questions shall be governed by the rules, forms, and usages of the State Parliament, and shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Board.

## Control of the Proceedings of Local Committees.

- 32. Where two or more municipal or road districts or one or more municipal districts together with one or more road districts are united, the local committee of such united fire district shall consist of representatives from each municipal or road district within the united fire district, the number of such representatives to be mutually agreed upon by the council or road board concerned. Provided that in case of disagreement the number of representatives shall be determined by the Board.
- When the local authorities within a united fire district have mutually agreed upon the proportion which each shall pay of the total annual contribution due to the Board, such sums shall be levied and payable to the Board as mutually agreed upon.

## Control of Permanent Firemen. Appointments and Promotions.

A candidate for appointment to the W.A. Fire Brigade must be a British subject, free from disease or defect in limb, hearing or sight, and not subject to fits. He must be not less than 5ft. 7in. in height, 37in. natural chest measurement, and not under 21 nor over 30 years of age, unless he possesses special qualifications, in which case the age limit may be extended to 32 years. A candidate must be generally intelligent and capable of acquiring instruction. He must produce satisfactory testimonials as to character. He may be required to produce a birth certificate or other satisfactory proof of age. Any portion of above may be waived at the discretion of the Board.

35. Applications for appointment must be made in person. Each applicant must write his own application, and state his occupation, age, height, chest measurement,

and whether married or single.

36. Every approved candidate will be required to undergo a strict medical examination by the Fire Brigades Board's medical officer as to physical fitness before being appointed to the service.

37. All candidates for appointment before signing on are required to read the Rules and Regulations of the W.A. Fire Brigades Board, and to sign the declaration hereunder: "I hereby state that I have read the rules and regulations of the W.A. Fire Brigades Board, and undertake to serve under same." A.B.

38. Eligible candidates when finally approved will be accepted as members of the Brigade on probation only for two months. At the end of such probation the probationer, if he has proved satisfactory to the Chief Officer, may be appointed by the Board as a permanent fireman. The two months' probation will be reckoned as portion of the first twelve months' service.

At the expiration of twelve months as third class fireman, firemen who have served to the satisfaction of the Chief Officer will be promoted to the rank of second class, and on the expiration of twelve months' service as second class, firemen shall be promoted to the rank of first class, provided that service and conduct have been to the satisfaction of the Chief Officer.

39. Above the rank of first class, promotion shall

not necessarily be by seniority.

When a vacancy occurs in a rank higher than first class, applications will be invited by the Chief Officer from qualified men in the class immediately below that in which the vacancy occurs, and a selection made from the applicants for the vacancy.

41. All engagements or appointments made by the Board may be cancelled or annulled without any reason being assigned, one week's pay to be granted in lieu of notice.

#### Ranks and Classes.

42. The ranks and classes of the Brigade shall be as may be designated from time to time at the discretion of the W.A. Fire Brigades Board.

43. Unless the Board in pursuance of Clause 42 of these regulations otherwise determines firemen shall be divided into three classes and ranks, viz., 1st, 2nd, and 3rd class firemen.

44. Second-class firemen are required to be conversant with the details of a fireman's ordinary duties, and to be proficient in drills.

45. First-class firemen to be competent to describe the various apparatus in the Brigade, to have a knowledge of internal combustion engines, and able to instruct a class in elementary drills.

46. No first-class fireman shall be promoted to a higher grade unless he shall have served at least two years as first class and has passed an examination in the practical working of fire brigade appliances, and must satisfy examiners appointed by the Board that he is qualified to take charge at fires and drills, and be able to instruct firemen in the practical working of fire appliances.

#### Wages, Leave, etc.

47. Wages shall be as from time to time determined by the W.A. Fire Brigades Board, or as determined by an industrial award.

48. When a fireman is off duty by reason of illness, he shall be entitled to leave of absence not exceeding six days on full pay during any one calendar year. Medical certificates are to be furnished as to the fireman's fitness or otherwise for duty on application for sick leave and before resuming duty.

49. The Chief Officer and other officers of the Board shall receive such leave as may be determined from time

to time by the Board. 50. In the case of other ranks, leave of absence other than defined by an industrial agreement or award

may be granted by the Board in special circumstances.
51. The Chief Officer may for sufficient reason defer any or all leave.

## Uniforms.

52. The uniform of the Brigade shall consist of a tunic undress jacket, woollen sweater for winter, and a light coat for summer, trousers, peak cap, flat cap, boots, helmet, axe, hose and nozzle spanner, belt and two

53. Uniform to be worn at all times when on duty. Members of the Brigade wearing uniform when off duty unless when proceeding to or from duty will be suspended. No member of the Brigade is permitted to attend theatres or other places of amusement in uniform unless on duty.

54. At fires every member must appear in full uniform. Undress uniform is to be worn when on station duty.

55. At drills members shall wear such uniform as may be directed.

56. All articles of uniform issued are and remain the

property of the W.A. Fire Brigades Board. 57. If a member leaving the service fails to return any of the Board's property in proper order, allowing for fair wear and tear, the Board may deduct from any moneys due to him such sum as will indemnify the Board against loss.

## Duties of Officers and Members.

58. Roll call shall be at 7 a.m., 8 a.m., 1 p.m., and 6 p.m.

59. All members of the Brigade shall render immediate obedience to all lawful orders from their superior officers, and must conform to all rules and regulations which have been made or may be made from time to time in the Brigade orders.

60. Every member must serve wherever the Chief Officer may direct, and attend all fire calls while on

61. Firemen will be held responsible to the Officer-in-Charge of the Station that the apartments, bedding, and furniture are kept clean and in good order at all times, and ready for inspection at 10 a.m. each day, and will be held responsible for any wilful damage during occupancy of such quarters.

62. The Electrical Engineer shall-

(a) under the Chief Officer have charge of the Electrical Department of the Brigade, and be responsible for the proper working of the telephones, electric motors, electric light, and other electrical appliances and material;
(b) keep an account of the time occupied on any

work by the men under him, and the cost of

the material used in its execution;

(c) be responsible that the material supplied to him be used economically, and for the purpose for which it was issued;

(d) furnish requisitions for materials, stating for what purpose they are required, and the probable cost;

(e) instruct men attending the workshops for electrical work in the care and management of telephones, fire alarm, batteries, and other electrical appliances;

(f) at a fire, as far as possible, attend to the safety of the firemen from electric tramway trolly wires and electric light cables or wires, or any other electrical installations which may appear to him to imperil the safety of the firemen, or hinder them in their work;
(g) at a fire require the electric current to be shut

off from any source, or cut any wires, if necessary, without awaiting orders.

63. The Mechanical Engineer shall-

(a) under the Chief Officer have charge of the workshops of the Brigade, and be responsi-ble that the machinery and tools be kept in good order;

(b) keep an account of the time occupied by the men under him on any work, and the cost of

the material used in its execution;
(c) be responsible that the material supplied is used economically, and for the purpose for which it was issued;

(d) furnish requisitions for materials, stating for what purpose they are required, and the probable cost:

(e) instruct men attending the workshop in the use of the various tools, and in the care and management of motor fire engines;

(f) at fires see that the engines are working satisfactorily, and that they are duly supplied with fuel, and, as far as possible, sufficient water:

64. A District Officer shall-

(a) reside as may be directed by the Chief Officer, and have charge of such district as may be assigned to him;

(b) attend fires and take control until the arrival of a senior officer;

(c) check and pass reports and requisitions for repairs to gear, and for supplies in his district, and transmit them to headquarters;

(d) be responsible for the proper working of his district, and the maintenance of strict discipline.

A Foreman, or any other officer in charge of a Station, shall generally carry out such duties as may from time to time be passed by resolution of the Board, but more particularly he shall-

(a) reside, when required, at any Station to which he may be appointed, and take charge of the Station, or any other property therein belonging to the Board, or under its care;

(b) attend fires and take control until the arrival of a Sonior Officer.

of a Senior Officer;
(c) see that all calls for chimneys on fire are immediately attended to, and that stops for the same are sent to the other stations to save any unnecessary turning out of engines, and that a record of them be kept;

(d) report himself immediately upon arrival at a fire to the Senior Officer present. He shall not work independently of any officer of the

Brigade:

(e) ascertain as soon as possible, if he be the first officer to arrive at a fire, the nature and extent of the fire. Send intelligence to headquarters or the nearest Fire Station that it may be communicated to the Chief Officer, and take command until the arrival of a Senior Officer;
(f) requisition for all stores, repairs, etc.,
may be required at his Station;

that

(g) make himself conversant with any dangers of a special nature such as timber yards, large buildings, and buildings in which especiany hazardous goods are stored, and make note of the locality of powder magazines, stores of inflammable liquid, etc.;

(h) be solely responsible for the control and management of his station. His judgment and

discretion will be left practically unfettered in order that there may be no limit to his responsibility in the execution of the duties entrusted to him.

66. The general duties of members shall be as defined from time to time by resolution of the Board.

Charges, Enquiries, Punishments, and Appeals.

- 67. The Chief Officer shall be empowered to enquire into all offences contrary to the good order and discipline of the Brigade, and take such action as he may consider necessary to meet the case.
- 68. Every member of the Brigade shall be liable to dismissal, suspension, reduction in rank, fine or other punishment for any offence or conduct whereby the discipline or good order or reputation of the Bri gade may be imperilled.

69. The Chief Officer may at any time, for sufficient cause, reduce any member of the Brigade to a

- lower grade with corresponding reduction in pay.
  70. The Chief Officer shall report all offences and awards for same to the Board at its next meeting after the offence has been dealt with.
- 71. When an employee is summoned to appear before his superior officer, or the Chief Officer, to answer any charge, he shall be informed in the notification summoning him of the particulars of the charge alleged against him, and shall be entitled at the hearing to give and call evidence on his own behalf.
- 72. Any member having a charge to make against another, or a complaint of any kind, must do so in writing, through the Officer-in-Charge of the Station, and addressed to the Chief Officer.
- 73. Any member found in an intoxicated state while on duty shall be suspended, and will be liable to summary dismissal.
- 74. Any member who in any way assaults an officer shall be dismissed forthwith.

75. Any member found pilfering at fires will be im-

mediately dismissed.

- 76. Any member tampering with the brigade books, or causing wilful damage to the buildings, fire extinguishing appliances, or other material or goods, the property of the Board, will be liable to punishment, and further, the value of the damage so done may be deducted from any moneys which may be due to the said member then or thereafter.
- 77. Any member heard to speak slanderously, contemptuously, disparagingly, or insubordinately of any officer or in any manner uttering words calculated to cause a breach of the rules or disorder in the brigade shall be suspended.
- 78. Any member desiring to leave the Brigade (unless under special circumstances), must give at least seven (7) clear days' notice in writing, addressed to the Chief Officer. Any member resigning or discontinuing his duties without such notice, or without special permission, shall be liable to forfeit all pay due to him. and to be formally dismissed.
- 79. Any member may appeal to the Board against any reduction in Rank or dismissal inflicted by the Chief Officer, and the Board may annul or vary such penalty.
- 80. No member shall absent himself from the Station to which he is attached, while on duty, without permission of the Officer-in-Charge.
- 81. Married men having quarters in a Fire Station will be held responsible for any wilful damage during the occupancy of such quarters. The quarters will be subject to inspection by the Chief Officer, and by the Officer-in-Charge of the Station, and when vacated must be left clean and in good order.
- 82. Any change in a member's marital condition shall be notified in writing to the Chief Officer.
- 83. When an employee is ordered to remove from one station to another, the Board shall pay all reasonable expenses of removal, except when such removal be ordered by way of punishment, or is granted at the request of the employee.

- 54. No member of the brigade shall upon any occasion or under any pretence whatever accept any money, guts or addresses from any person for services rendered at a fire without permission of the Chief omeer or the Board.
- so. No member while on duty shall engage in any other occupation.
- so. Gambling of any kind is strictly prohibited in or about the Station or Quarters occupied by the mem-Lers of the Brigade.
- 81. Intoxicating liquors are not to be brought on to fire stations, except by permission of the Chief Officer.
- 88. No member of the Brigade is to supply information to the Press excepting through the Chief Officer.
- 89. No member of the Brigade is to take orders at fires from citizens.
- 90. Any communication which a member may desire to place before the Board must be sent in writing through the Chief Officer.
- 91. Long Service Medals will be issued to all ranks on the completion of 15 years' service with good conduct, and will not be liable to forfeiture.
- 92. Applications for appointment as firemen in the auxiliary force must be made in candidates' handwriting to the Chief Officer.
- 93. Candidates must be physically strong men, free from defect in limb, or sight, and not subject to fits.

94. Candidates must be of suitable age and be approved by the Chief Officer.

95. Candidates will be required to furnish testimony from at least two reputable persons as to their character, and, if necessary, to produce satisfactory proof of age.

96. Candidates will be required to serve at least one mouth on probation, and, if found suitable, will be appointed to the auxiliary force.

97. The engagement of every member will be for one month, and thereafter from month to month.

98. Auxiliary firemen will receive pay in accordance with the following scale, viz.:—
A retaining fee of 12s. 6d. a month.

In addition to the retaining fee pay will be allowed for attendance at fires in accordance with the following schedule:-

For first hour-5s.

For each subsequent hour-2s. 6d.

No pay will be granted for attendance at drills, false alarms, fires with but trifling damage or chimney fires, unless under special circumstances, and no fireman will be entitled to receive pay under this schedule for services at any fire unless he shall have received orders to attend such fire from his superiors.

99. Should the Chief Officer deem it necessary to obtain assistance at any fire, he may engage special firemen at the following rates:-

For the first hour-3s. For each subsequent hour-2s.

Control and Management of Volunteer Fire Brigades. Classification of Brigades.

100. For the efficient working of fire brigades, the Board may register brigades and place them under classification as it may from time to time determine.

The classification for the present shall be as follows:-

Class A .- A complement of 20 effective registered members graded as follows:-Captain, foreman, apparatus officer, secretary, and 16 firemen. Class B.—A complement of 15 effective registered members graded as follows:-Captain, foreman, secretary, and 12 firemen.

In addition to the complement of registered mem-In addition to the complement or registered members as provided for above, brigades may elect reserve members, subject to the approval and registration by the Board, who will be required to attend fires, practices, and drills, and to render themselves efficient in the use of fire extinguishing apparatus. As vacancies in the ranks of registered members occur, the places should be filled, as far as practicable, from the reserve. Reserve members will not be granted uniforms.

#### Registration may be Suspended.

101. Whenever any brigade by reason of deaths, resignations, or expulsions shall have reduced its roll to less than a minimum effective strength to be determined by the Board, the registration of the said brigade may be suspended, and any allowances payable to any members thereof may be reduced or forfeited to the Board as the Board may determine. It through dissensions or other cause the efficiency of any brigade is, in the opinion of the Board, impaired, registration may be suspended or the brigade may be disbanded by the Board.

## Brigade District.

102. The district within which each registered brigade shall be liable to do duty shall be that portion that is within the boundary of the fire district in which the brigade is established.

Such fire district shall be known and designated as the brigade district under the name of the said fire district.

#### Notice before Disbandment.

103. If, after one month's notice from the Board, any registered brigade remains below the minimum effective strength determined by the Board, the Board may cancel the registration of such brigade.

#### Qualification of Membership.

104. No person shall be registered on the roll of any brigade unless-

1st—He is in good health, and sound in body and mind.

2nd—He is of good moral character and habits.

3rd—He is over the age of 18 years, and not over the age of 40 years. (For exceptions see Regulations 105 and 106.)

Maximum of Age of New Members.

105. No person who is over the age of 40 years shall be enrolled without the consent of the Board.

#### Retiring Age of Members.

106. No member over the age of 55 years shall be allowed to remain on the registered roll of any brigade unless under special circumstances and with the approval of the Board.

#### New Members.

107. In each case of persons desiring to join, after a brigade has been registered by the Board, if the candidate complies with the requirements set forth in Regulation 104, and the Brigade approves of him, the name and particulars of such candidate shall be submitted to the Board in such form as the Board may from time to time direct for approval or otherwise, and no person shall be recognised as a member of any brigade until his name has been approved by the Board, and registered on the roll of such brigade by the Board. The Board may require a certificate from the captain of the brigade that due regard has been paid to the distribution of the membership over the area in which the property has to be protected. Members shall reside within easy sound of the alarm bell. Their services must be reasonably available as required.

## Persons not eligible for Membership.

108. No person shall, unless with the consent of the Board, be eligible for re-election to any brigade who has been dismissed or struck off the roll of any brigade for misconduct, or for persistent neglect to attend fires or practices, or for want of interest generally in his duty as a fireman, or for any cause which, in the opinion of the Board, would disqualify him for membership.

## Transfer of Members.

109. Members may be transferred from one brigade to another, provided the complement of the latter permits of such transfer, on production of a certificate of good character and discharge from their former brigade, and with the approval of the Board.

## Leave of Absence and Regulations.

110. Members desirous of obtaining leave of absence must apply for same in writing to their brigade, and in the event of such leave being sought for a longer period than one month, the applications must be forwarded to the Board with the brigade's recommendation.

Members desiring to retire from the membership of their brigade will be required to send in their resignations in writing to the Board through the brigade.

#### Annual Election of Officers.

111. Every brigade shall meet during the first week in December in each year, and elect by ballot the complement of officers allotted to it under its classification. All officers elected shall be effective registered members of their respective brigades, and shall hold office for the term of one year from and including the first day of January next ensuing, unless during the year they are removed from office or cease to be members of the brigade. The Chief Officer may suspend any member of any brigade, and shall within 24 hours report any such suspension and the reasons for it to the Board, in writing, for its inquiry and decision. The member suspended shall be entitled to receive a copy of the Chief Officer's report to the Board, and be entitled to be heard at the inquiry. Brigades may make their own rules or resolutions with regard to the date and method of nominating for the positions of officers.

## Duties of Officers.

112. The duties of the respective officers of every brigade shall be as follows, viz.:—

#### The Captain.

(a) The Captain of the Brigade shall see that all apparatus and buildings belonging to the Board or in charge of the Brigade are kept in good condition and repair; shall in the absence of any permanent officer of the Board (where such exist at a Volunteer Station) take command of the Brigade at fires. He shall also have command at all practices, drills and parades; shall see that the members or persons employed do their duty faithfully, and shall enforce the regulations of the Board. He shall have power to suspend any officer or member for disobedience of orders, or for delinquency in the performance of their duties, and shall forthwith report such suspension to the Chief Officer. In the absence of any senior officer of the Board, the Captain shall act.

#### The Foreman.

(b) The Foreman shall act with and be under the direction of the Captain, and in his absence perform his duties. Where a station-keeper is not provided, he shall take charge of all appliances, and shall be responsible for their cleanliness and the good order of the fire station. In the event of there being any defect, he must immediately report same to the Captain.

#### Apparatus Officer.

(c) The Apparatus Officer shall be subject to the senior officers of the Brigade, and shall assist the Foreman in his duties.

## The Secretary.

(d) The Secretary of the Brigade shall attend all meetings of the Brigade, and shall enter in ink the minutes of resolutions and proceedings in a minute-book to be kept for that purpose. He shall perform, to the satisfaction of the Board and of the Brigade, all such duties as may be imposed upon him, and shall, subject to the control of the Board, have charge of all books, papers, and other documents of the Board that may be in the custody of the Brigade, and he shall be held responsible for all moneys of the Board which may be remitted to the Brigade. He shall attend promptly to all communications received from the Chief Officer or Secretary of the Board, and shall use despatch in forwarding reports and returns, etc., and shall keep a copy of all official correspondence. He shall forward to the Secretary of the Board reports of fires within seven days of their occurrence. He shall forward a return of the roll of attendances at all fires and practices of his Brigade, countersigned by the Captain, on the proper forms, within the first week of each quarter, to the Secretary of the Board. He shall keep a register of the names of all persons who are or who may hereafter become members of the Brigade. He shall promptly send to the Secretary of the Board a notification of the election or resignation of a member of the Brigade. He shall send to the Secretary of the Board a notification of the election of officers within seven days after such election, stating the names of the persons elected, and the office to which they have been elected. He shall do such other things as the Board or the regulations may require. He shall be under the general direction of the Secretary of the Board in all matters relating to office routine and management. He shall be liable to suspension, removal, or dismissal by the Board. Secretaries retiring from office shall furnish to the Board all returns to the end of the term for which they held office, and shall hand over to their sucessors all moneys, books, correspondence, or other document

(f) List of books and records to be kept by the Secretary of each Brigade, and such books and records shall be and remain the property of the Board:—

- shall be and remain the property of the Board:—

  (i) A book in which shall be entered in ink the names of every registered member of the Brigade, together with his age, birthplace, occupation, residence, brigade rank, date of admission, date of leaving, and remarks, reports of fires with full details, attendances of members at fires, alarms of fire, and monthly practices, and quarterly statements of minor supplies expenditure.
  - (ii) A book containing the minutes of resolutions and proceedings of the Brigade, written in ink.
  - (iii) A book containing particulars of the horses (if any), and of all apparatus, showing in separate lists particulars of the apparatus belonging to the Board and to the Brigade.
  - (iv) A file of all regulations and general and special circulars issued by the Board, and all inward correspondence; also copies of all outward official correspondence.

(v) Forms for requisitions for supplies and repairs for the Brigade.

All entries made in the Brigade books are to be examined by the Captain of the Brigade, and must be produced at all meetings of the Brigade, and whenever required by any officer of the Board.

## Duties of Members.

113. The members of each brigade shall upon an alarm of fire, proceed promptly with the appliances to the fire. They shall immediately on arrival report themselves to the senior officer present, and shall perform such duty as may be required of them. They shall remain on duty until relieved by orders, which shall be given only by the officer in command. In Brigades where no station-keeper is provided, members are required to keep the appliances and buildings in good order without cost to the Board.

## The Station-keeper.

114. Where the Board provides a station-keeper, it shall be his duty to reside at the station wherever practicable. He shall attend to and be responsible for the cleanliness, good order, and condition of the fire station and the fire-extinguishing appliances belonging to the Board or in charge of the Brigade. He shall at all times be under the direction of the senior officer of the Brigade present for the time being. He shall receive such remuneration as the Board may determine, and shall be liable to suspension, removal, or dismissal by the Board.

## Conduct of Members.

- 115. Members of brigades are required in their intercourse with each other, official or social, to observe a courteous demeanour, and officers or men addressing each other will do so in a respectful manner. While on duty at fires, practices, drills, or parades, the greatest degree of silence compatible with a proper discharge of duty will be required, and members must address officers by their official titles.
- (a) Members of brigades are considered to be on duty at all times when in uniform; and at fires, alarms of fire, practices, drills, parades, or brigade meetings, whether in uniform or plain clothes. Any member of a brigade who may be deemed to be guilty of disobeduence of orders, insubordination, conduct subversive of discipline, intoxication, abusive or obscene language, or

other unseemly conduct when on duty shall within twenty-four hours be reported to the Board, in writing, by the senior officer of the brigade present, who may suspend such member from duty pending an inquiry by the Board. Officers below the rank of captain shall forward their reports in such cases to the captain for transmission to the Board for its decision.

(b) The Board shall have power to deal with members against whom a charge has, in the opinion of the Board, been proven, either by reprimanding them, suspending them, or by removing them from office or from the roll of registered members.

## Duties at Fires.

116. At fires the senior officer present shall take command until the arrival of his senior. The brigade's duties are not completed until the fire is properly and effectually extinguished. Members must turn out to fires or alarms of fire in the Board uniform when they can do so without causing undue delay in attending.

#### Roll Call at Fires.

117. On returning from a fire or an alarm of fire, the officer in command shall cause the roll to be called, and record the names of members present at such fire or alarm of fire, and a copy of such roll, together with a report of the fire, signed by the officer in command at the fire, and the Secretary of the brigade, shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Board within seven days after the occurrence of the fire. The officer in command may exempt members from returning to the fire station for roll-call, and he may call the roll at the place of the fire or alarm of fire.

#### Brigades to Requisition for Appliances, etc.

118. Plant and appliances and supplies required by any brigade shall be requisitioned for to the Board. Requisitions shall be sent in only on the authority of a properly constituted meeting of the brigade.

A receipt for all plant and appliances and supplies received shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Board and particulars of same entered in a book to be kept for that purpose by the Secretary of each brigade.

Urgent repairs to plant may be effected by the brigade without requisition, provided the cost does not exceed two pounds. Where the repairs involve a larger expenditure requisition must be made to the Board.

## Brigade Property and Trophics.

119. Any property belonging to a Brigade, and which has been acquired by subscription, or trophies won, shall vest in two trustees, one of whom shall be appointed by the Brigade, and the other by the Board. A Brigade may on application to and approval of the trustees dispose of any such property as may be determined.

## Brigade Rules.

120. Each Brigade may have its own rules of internal and general working, which must in all cases be subject to the approval of the Board. All proposed alterations or additions must be submitted to the Board for approval or otherwise. No rule shall be contrary to the Board's regulations. Every officer and member shall conform to the regulations made, or which may hereafter be made, for the management of the various fire brigades, and shall be subject to the duties, conditions, and penalties named therein. All allowances may, at the discretion of the Board, be subject to stoppage or absolute forfeiture in the event of wilful violation of the regulations.

#### Practices.

121. The members of each Brigade shall be practised in the duties at engine, reel, or other drill at least once each calendar month, under the supervision of their officers, and at such other time as the Board, Chief Officer, or Captain may direct. During the winter months or in inclement weather Brigades may hold their monthly practice or drill indoors.

A recognised practice shall mean practical work in fire extinction, or other drill, for at least three-quarters of an hour. Brigades are required to inspect the fire plugs and report any defects to the Board immediately.

Each Brigade may appoint its own dates for practice, and moonlight nights should be selected when practicable.

#### Effective Members.

122. Every member of a Brigade must make himself effective by attending fires and practices. An effective member shall mean one who has, each half-year, attended at least two-thirds each of the fires, or alarms of fire, and also of the recognised monthly practices. Any member who has failed to keep himself effective in such attendances, without leave or sufficient excuse, shall be liable to be struck off the register by the Board. Members are expected to attend all Brigade meetings, but these meetings must not be counted towards the attendances required for effectiveness.

#### Allowance for Purchase of Minor Supplies.

123. An allowance will be provided for every Brigade for the purchase of such minor supplies, and for defraying cost of such repairs to plant as may be required for the ordinary maintenance of the Brigade. The total amount of such allowance must not exceed in any one year the amount provided for in the Board's estimates. Such allowance shall be available quarterly, and the vouchers for such expenditure, showing full particulars of the purchases made or repairs effected, duly certified by the Captain and Secretary of the Brigade, and receipted in proper form, must be forwarded to the Secretary of the Board for examination not later than the 21st day in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year. Such expenditure shall be subject to the approval of the Board, who may disallow any or all of it.

#### Demonstrations and Competitions.

124. Brigades shall at no time attend fire brigades' competitions or demonstrations outside a radius of five miles from their head station without leaving a sufficient number of effective registered members within their respective districts. Neither will any of the apparatus (with the exception of a competition reel and appliances) be permitted to be taken to a competition or demonstration without the written consent of the Board. Captains will be held responsible for the carrying out of this regulation.

#### Uniforms.

125. The uniforms for registered firemen will be provided by the Board, and shall consist of a coat with arm badge, cap, belt and spanner. Helmets will be supplied to brigades in cases where the Board considers they are required.

Members must provide their own trousers, which should be of dark blue cloth or serge with scarlet piping. All articles of uniform provided by the Board must at all times be kept clean, and Captains must inspect same at least twice a year, either at practice or at a monthly meeting, and report on condition of same to the Board. Long service medals and badges are to be worn on right breast of uniform coat and long service bars are to be worn three-quarters of an inch below the badge. The long service medal supersedes the badge and bars, in which case the badge and bar are not to be worn. Members qualified in ambulance work should wear their badges on left arm.

No member will be allowed to lend a uniform or any part of it to any person not in the service. Flowers are not to be worn in coats and tan boots must not be worn. Members must not at any time appear dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes, except in case of emergency at fires. At the Chief Officer's inspections full uniforms must be worn.

The uniform and equipment are the property of the Board, and they are only loaned to members. A receipt for same must be obtained by the Secretary of the brigade, who must retain and file it. Members must use reasonable care in keeping uniforms and equipment in good order, and must return same to the Captain of the brigade or to the Chief Officer on being requested in writing to do so. If a member fails to comply within seven days of the transmission to him of such request, his brigade shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and shall, in addition to the penalty named, be further liable for and shall pay the cost of any article not returned.

#### Recognition of Long Service.

126. Officers and members of volunteer brigades who shall have efficiently served for seven years in any one or more brigades in Western Australia shall be entitled to a long service badge. After 10 years' service a ten years' bar, and after 13 years a long service medal shall be awarded. Firemen with 20 years' service may wear a red clasp above the medal; with 25 years' service an additional white clasp; and with 30 years' service an additional blue clasp. Applications on prescribed form for awards must show all details of service, and be certified by the Captain and Secretary of the Brigade. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods mentioned in this regulation.

Control and Attendance of Firemen on Duty on Public Buildings.

127. On every occasion when at any public building any entertainment is given in connection with which scenery is used, or when an exhibition of animated pictures is given, a skilled fireman, approved by the Chief Officer of the Fire Brigades, shall be in attendance in such building during the whole time such building used as aforesaid is occupied by the public; and such fireman shall see that the fire prevention appliances and the exit doors are in proper working order, and perform such other duties for the prevention of fire, and of panic as he may deem necessary, or as the Chief Officer of Fire Brigades may direct.

Provided that in localities where volunteer fire brigades are established, the Chief Officer shall not, without the concurrence of the Board, approve of firemen other than members of volunteer fire brigades.

#### Fees.

128. For the services of each fireman in attendance under the preceding regulation, a fee of 5s. per performance for each fireman shall be payable by the owner or occupier of the premises on which such fireman shall have been in attendance.

129. In the event of any person failing to pay any fees due under Regulation 129, such fees may be recovered summarily by complaint made by the fireman to whom such fees are due before any Justice of the Peace, in manner provided by "The Justices Act, 1902."

130. The Chief Officer of Fire Brigades may, in writing, grant permission for the owner or occupier of any public building to dispense with the services of a fireman during any exhibition of animated pictures held between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

131. All firemen approved by the Chief Officer under these regulations shall be subject to the direction and control of the Chief Officer of Fire Brigades.

## Penalties.

132. Any person guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing, whether by act or omission, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.
