WHEREAS by Section 161 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is provided that in any area specified by the Governor by Proclamation in the Government Gazette one moiety of the expense incurred in paving footways shall be repaid to the Board by the owners of all rateable lands abutting on any such footway or part thereof, apportioned according to the frontage of such lands abutting on the footway or part thereof, and may be recovered from such owners by the Board in any Court of competent jurisdiction: And whereas it is desirable to specify an area in the Harvey Road District as an area for the purpose of the said Section 161: Now. therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby specify the area situated within the Harvey Road District, and set forth hereunder, as an area within the meaning and for the purpose of Section 161 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Description of the area referred to above: On the North by the Northern side of Clifton Road, including Lots 1 and 2 on the North-West corner of Ommaney Road and Clifton Road; on the East by the Eastern side of Brunswick Road; on the South by Rose Road and the Southern boundary of Lot 123, and on the West by Somers Road.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, acting under the powers contained in the said Act and every other power me in this behalf enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, June the 7th, 1926, shall be a public holiday throughout the State, for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation de-clare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters of the Capel River should be declared closed against the taking of English Perch: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

That the waters of the Capel River shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture whatever from the 1st day of June, 1926, until the 30th day of September, 1926.

## The Land Act, 1898. PROCLAMATION

## (Resumption)

Corr. No. 1783/26.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Grazing Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Grazing Lease 15595/68 (Avon Location 22645), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 12 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for Quarry (Gravel): Now, therefore I, Sir William Robert Campion, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of Grazing Lease 15595/68 (Avon Location 22645) for the purpose aforesaid.

#### The Traffic Act, 1919.

#### Williams Road Board.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 248/26.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a local authority to exercise within its district any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is advisable to empower the Williams Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over

those portions of the Collie-Williams and the Williams-Quindaning roads within its district during the months of May, June, July and August, 1926, and that heavy traffic for such purpose shall be as set out in Nos. 149 and 150 of the Traffic Regulations as published in the Government Gazette dated 5th of September, 1924: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Williams Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over those portions of the Collie-Williams and the Williams-Quindaning roads within its district, and to direct that during the months of May, June, July, and August for year 1926 heavy traffic is prohibited over those portions of the Collie-Williams and Williams-Quindaning roads within the Williams Road District accordingly, and also, that any person acting in contra-vention of this Order shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds, as set forth in No. 150 of the Traffic Regulations gazetted on the fifth of September, 1924.

#### The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 240/26. WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Exceeutive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Extension.—Gosnells Road Board District.

(a) Proposed 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main along Dorothy Street from the 36-inch diameter Hills Main in Albany Road South-Westerly to right of way between Wheatley Street and Hicks Street (length 10 chains).

(b) Proposed 3-inch diameter cast-iron water main North-Westerly along right of way between Wheatley and Hicks Streets from Evelyn Street to Southern River Road (length 29 chains).

(c) Proposed 1½-inch diameter galvanised iron water main along Southern River Road from said right of way North-Easterly to Wheatley Street; thence North-Westerly along Wheatley Street to Fremantle Road (length 21 chains).

(d) Proposed 1½-inch diameter galvanised iron water main along said right of way from Evelyn Street South-Easterly to Lot 166, Wheatley Street (length 16½ chains).

(e) Proposed 1½-inch diameter galvanised iron water main along Evelyn Street from said right of way North-Easterly to and across Wheatley Street (length 3½ chains).

(f) Proposed  $1\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter galvanised iron water main along Clara Street from said right of way South-Westerly to and across Hicks Street (length  $3\frac{1}{2}$  chains).

The above mains to be complete with valves, hydrants and all necessary apparatus as indicated in red on M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4513.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 21st day of May, 1926.

IT is hereby published, for general informaticn, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations, under which Gold may be received and coined at the Perth Branch of the Royal Mint, to operate as from the 1st May, 1926:—

1. Gold in deposits of not less than one ounce will be received at the Mint daily (Saturdays and holidays excepted) between the hours of 11 a.m. and 3 p.m.

2. Each parcel requiring a separate assay will be treated as a separate deposit.

3. The value of each deposit will be determined upon the report of the Assay Department, which report shall be final.

The proportion of silver paid for will be as follows:--In depsits under 1,000 ozs. gross-all silver in excess of 8 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

In deposits from 1,000 ozs. to 5,000 ozs.—all silver in excess of 6 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

In deposits from 5,000 ozs. to 10,000 ozs.—all silver in excess of 5 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

In deposits from 10,000 ozs. and upwards-all silver in excess of 4 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

5. Charges.—For assaying, refining, and coinage.—The charges for assaying and refining will be those shown in the Schedule attached to these regulations.

Provided, in the case of gold required to be coined, that of these charges 11/2d. per ounce standard, where the amount brought at one time does not exceed five hundred ounces, and a penny in any other case, shall be considered to be the coinage charges fixed by the Royal Proclamation of the 13th October, 1897; and provided that, where deposits of British gold coin are refined, the charge for refining will be 21/2 d. an ounce standard. 6. Additional charges, to be fixed by the Deputy Master, will also be made when-

(a) a deposit contains base metal in excess of two per cent. of its weight after melting; (b) it is necessary to subject the metal to any special treatment.

(b) it is necessary to subject the metal to any special treatment.
7. The value of the deposit, less the Mint charges, will be paid to the depositor—

(a) by cheque, in the case of deposits of less than 1,000 ozs. gross weight;
(b) in all other cases in coin for the even thousands of pounds, and by cheque for the balance;
or wholly by cheque if desired by the depositor.

Payments will be made on Tuesdays and Fridays next after the expiration of three weeks from the date of the deposit.

Cheques will be transmitted by post when required.

Note.—These arrangements for the payment of depositors will be adhered to as far as possible, but the Deputy Master cannot be held responsible for any delay arising from accidents to machinery, great pressure of work, or other unavoidable cause.

8. All deposits will be dealt with strictly in the order in which they are received.

The Deputy Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable. 9.

10. Fine or standard gold in the form of fillets, scrap or ingots may, when practicable, be prepared for issue on conditions which may be ascertained at the Mint. In addition to the price of £3 17s. 10½d. an ounce standard, the purchasers shall pay such charge for the cost of preparation as may from time to time be fixed by the Deputy Master.

11. It shall be in the discretion of the Deputy Master to make exceptional arrangements in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the public service.

Regulations 5 and 9 of previous Regulations are hereby cancelled.

## LIME OPERATIVES (PERTH AND DISTRICT). (Registered 10/5/1926.)

No. 15 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act. 1912-1925," this first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between the persons, firms, and companies whose names and signatures appear in the Schedule hereto (hereafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the Fremantle and District Lime Operatives' Union of Workers (hereafter called "the Union"), of the other part: Witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:

1. The award dated the eleventh day of October. One thousand nine hundred and eleven, number eight of One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and any agreements for amendment or variation thereof shall cease to be binding upon the parties hereto, all of whom shall retire from the same as from the date of the making of this agreement,

2. This agreement shall be for a term of one year from the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

This agreement shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

4. Definition.—In the construction of this agreement "Day Workers" shall mean any person including horsedrivers working in daytime in or about lime kilns or on any necessary work in connection with the quarrying of limestone and sandstone and the production and distribution of lime or stone.

5. Day workers working on or about kilns, sandstone cutters, loaders, and horsedrivers shall be paid at the rate of one shilling and eleven pence half-penny per hour, but horsedrivers in charge of more than one horse shall be paid at the rate of two shillings per hour.

6. Quarrymen shall be paid at the rate of one shilling and eleven pence halfpenny per hour if engaged in day work, and if engaged on piece work shall be paid two shillings and fourpence per cubic yard for ordinary limestone. If a quarryman be not satisfied with dray measurement he shall have the option of stacking the stone quarried and the measurement shall be ascertained on the ground.

7. Night firing shall be in one shift, namely, from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Half shifts may by mutual agreement between employer and employee be worked from 6 p.m. until 12 p.m. and 12 p.m. to 6 a.m. Night firers' wages shall be one shilling and eleven pence per hour.

8. That if an employee who has been employd in the day time is requested to continue and fire a kiln at night time, during the time he shall be employed at night he shall be paid time and one-quarter rates.

9. Lime Baggers .- Piece workers shall be paid at the rate of fifteen shillings per one hundred bags. Day workers shall be paid at the rate of two shillings and one penny per hour.

10. Hours of Cooling .- No kiln shall be broken into until twenty-four hours after the last fire in winter and thirty hours after the last fire in summer. The winter months shall be from the fifteenth day of March to the fifteenth day of October (both inclusive). The summer months shall be from the sixteenth day of October to the fourteenth day of March (both inclusive).

Finishing off Kilns .--- Employees engaged in finishing off kilns owing to the greater responsibility undertaken shall be paid one shilling per kiln extra.

Lime crushing and/or lime sifting shall be paid 12. for at the rate of one shilling and eleven pence halfpenny per hour plus one shilling per day or part of a day on which the employee shall be so employed.

13. Hours.-Eight hours shall constitute a day's work. Overtime shall be calculated and paid for at the following rates :- Time and one-quarter for the first four hours after the usual time for ceasing work, time and one-half thereafter, provided that the employer and employee may agree to work such time in excess of eight hours on five days of the week as will enable one half day to be worked on Saturdays.

14. Sunday Work .- All work done on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half. Sunday work for nightburners shall be between 6 p.m. on Saturday and 6 a.m. on Sunday. Burners employed between 6 p.m. on Sunday and 6 a.m. on Monday shall be paid the ordinary rate, namely, one shilling and eleven pence per hour.

15. Holidays .- Workers shall be entitled to ten paid holidays per annum. They shall be taken in one stretch at Christmas time. If the worker has not completed twelve months' employment then he shall be entitled to one paid holiday for each thirty days he has been employed, and pro rata payment for less than thirty days' employment. The following days: Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Anzac Day, Union Picnic Day, and Anniversary Day, shall be taken as holidays without pay. If work is done on those days The above proit shall be paid for at double time. visions shall apply to all workers covered by this agreement except piece work quarrymen. Piece work lime baggers shall be paid for holidays at the rate of sixteen shillings and eight pence for eight hours.

16. In case an employee presents himself for em-ployment and is informed by his employer that his

services are not required, he shall receive a sum equal to half a day's wages unless his employer shall have notified him not later than the previous day at knock-off time of the fact that his services would not be required.

17. Paragraph 16 shall not apply to wet weather, and any employee who shall be absent from work owing to wet weather shall not receive any pay.

18. Horsedrivers.—Horsedrivers shall have their horses harnessed and hooked up to drays ready to commence work at the time appointed for all hands to commence, and shall finish at the usual knock-off time. Provided, however, that owing to the peculiar character of a driver's work no overtime shall be payable if employed not longer than fifteen minutes after knockoff time and no deduction shall be made from his wage if he ceases work not longer than fifteen minutes before knock-off time.

Lower Rate,-A worker who is unable to earn 19. the minimum rate of wage hereby agreed upon may be employed at a lesser rate of wage which shall be agreed upon between the employer and the secretary of the union. If within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wages than that hereby agreed upon the secretary of the union and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer at such less wage for a period of six calendar months thereafter and after the expiration of the said six calendar months until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in manner provided by this clause; provided always that the employer shall not employ more than one such lower paid worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.

20. Junior Workers .-- Junior workers may be ememployed but may not perform any of the following work, namely, fill or empty kilns, quarry limestone or sandstone, cart sandstone, cart lime in excess of fifteen bags to one load, cart wood, muck out, burn kilns, use or explode fracture, bag, crush or sift lime, and their wages shall be on the following scale:—

Pay Day.-Wages shall be paid on Friday of each week between the hours of 3 p.m. and 6 p.m., except when Friday shall be a holiday, in which case they shall be paid between the hours above mentioned on the next preceding working day; the wages shall be paid up to and inclusive of the day preceding pay day.

22. Foreign Subjects .- Foreign subjects may be emploved, but the number of foreign subjects emploved shall not exceed one foreign subject to every three British subjects employed.

23. Explosives .-- Where explosives are provided by the employer they shall be supplied at the usual retail rates charged in Fremantle.

Any employee working day work and employed in 94 the handling or using of explosives shall receive one shilling per day over and above his usual rate of pay.

25. Records .- Each employer shall keep at his office, or at each of the offices if more than one, a book containing a record of :-

- (a) The names of all workers employed by him and
- to whom this agreement applies.(b) The class of work performed and the wages paid to each such worker.

On the first day of each week the said book shall be entered up by the employer so as to show the foregoing particulars for the week then immediately preceding. The said book may be inspected at any time during the ordinar business hours by the secretary for the time being of the union and also by any person thereunto authorised by the President of the Court of Arbitration. 26. Should any person or persons be employed who at time of engagement are not members of the Lime Operatives' Union, unless he or they shall become a member of the said union, then the employer shall, cn receipt of notice from the secretary of the Lime Operatives' Union, dispense with the services of the person or persons so engaged, and shall not re-engage him or them until notified by the secretary of the union that such person or persons have become members of the union.
