WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edward VII., No. 20), and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1905" (5 Edward VII., No. 22), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: And whereas the road hereinafter described has been shown as a road on plan of Perth as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: And it is desirable to close

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during a specified portion of every year: And whereas it is desirable to revoke the Proclamation under the said Act dated the 3rd day of October, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th October, 1917, prohibiting the taking of fish by means of fishing nets in the waters described in the said Proclamation during a specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, revoke the said Proclamation: And proclaim and declare as follows:—

- (1) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the First Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this Proclamation until the 31st day of December, 1928, inclusive.
- (2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets from the 1st day of October to the 30th day of April, inclusive, in every year.

First Schedule.

The waters of the channel entrance to Hardy's Inlet (Augusta) situated between a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction from Duke's Head (on the Western side of the Inlet) to Point Frederick (on the Eastern side of the Inlet) and a line drawn in a Westerly direction from Point Irwin (on the Eastern side of the Inlet) to a point where the Southern boundary of Harford Street touches the foreshore on the Western side of the Inlet.

Second Schedule.

The waters of Hardy's Inlet North of a line drawn in a Westerly direction from Point Irwin (on the Eastern side of the Inlet) to a point where the Southern boundary of Harford Street touches the foreshore on the Western side of the Inlet: And the whole of the waters of the Blackwood River and its tributaries.

*The Traffic Act, 1919.**Municipality of Geraldton.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a local authority to exercise within its district any power of making regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4, of Part IV., of the said Act: And whereas it is advisable to empower the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton to regulate the direction of vehicular traffic through Post Office Lane, Geraldton: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton, by the By-law in Schedule hereto, to regulate the direction of vehicular traffic through Post Office Lane, Geraldton, and also to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

*The Traffic Act, 1919.**Albany Road Board.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 248/26.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a local authority to exercise within its district any power of making regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4, of Part IV., of the said Act: And whereas it is advisable to empower the Albany Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over that portion of the Perth-Albany Road within its district during the months of June, July, August, and September in 1926 and 1927, and that heavy traffic for such purpose shall be as set out in Nos. 149 and 150 of the Traffic Regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* dated 5th of September, 1924: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Albany Road Board, by the By-law in Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over that portion of the Perth-Albany Road within its district and to direct that during the months of June, July, August, and September for years 1926 and 1927 heavy traffic is prohibited over that portion of the Perth-Albany Road within the Albany Road District accordingly, and also that any person acting in contravention of this Order shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding twenty pounds, as set forth in No. 150 of the Traffic Regulations gazetted on the fifth of September, 1924.

Under the provisions of Section 42 of Traffic Act, 1919, the following By-law was passed by the Albany Road Board on the 22nd day of April, 1926:—

(1.) The passage of any vehicle engaged in "heavy traffic" over any of the roads specified hereunder is hereby prohibited during the months of June, July, August, and September in 1926 and 1927.

(2.) The road referred to above is Perth-Albany Road from boundary of Albany Municipality to the Road Board's boundary at Cherkerup.

(3.) Any person infringing this By-law or being a party or privy to any such infringement shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

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OFFICIAL TRUSTEE RULES, 1926.

The Honourable Sir ROBERT FURSE McMILLAN, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, The Honourable ROBERT BRUCE BURNSIDE, The Honourable JOHN ALFRED NORTHMORE, and The Honourable THOMAS PERCY DRAPER, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia.

In pursuance of the powers vested in us by section 3 of the "Official Trustee Act, 1921," do make and enact the following Rules of Court:—

1. All the powers of the Master under Division (2) of Part XI. of the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920, except section 146, are hereby vested in the Official Trustee, and while in no way limiting the powers conferred upon him by the Act and these Rules, the Official Trustee is empowered in the name and on behalf of any insane patient to execute and sign deeds and instruments, including instruments under the Transfer of Land Act, 1893, or any Act amending the same, transfers of shares, stock, receipts, releases and other documents, which shall be as effectual as if executed and signed by the patient himself while sane, and shall be acted upon accordingly by the Registrar of Titles and all other persons without any obligation to inquire whether the person upon whose behalf the Official Trustee purports to act be a patient or not.

Official Trustees to have powers of Master under Div. (2) of Pt. XI. of the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920 (except Sec. 146.)

2. (1) Except as in this rule otherwise provided the Official Trustee shall have the custody, care, collection, protection, administration and management of the property and estates of insane and incapable persons.

Official Trustee to have powers of committee over certain estates.

(2) The Official Trustee shall have and may exercise in respect of such estates of insane and incapable persons the same powers, duties and functions as if such persons had been duly declared insane and he had been appointed the committee of such estates under the provisions of the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920.

(3) This Rule shall not apply in the case of a person—

- (a) Of whose estate a committee has been appointed under the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920, or for the management of whose property a person has been appointed under section 111 of the said Act; or
- (b) Whose property is vested in a curator or curators under or by virtue of Chapter LXVIII., Section 684, of the Criminal Code Act, 1913.

Authority of the Official Trustee to act without special order.

3. The Official Trustee may be authorised by order of the Court (made with regard to the estate of any insane or incapable person over which the Official Trustee has authority to exercise the powers of a committee) to do and suffer (without special order) all or any of such things with reference to the estate as a committee might be ordered, authorised or directed to do or suffer under the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920.

Official Trustee may apply for directions.

4. The Official Trustee may apply to the Court for directions as to the exercise of any power vested in him under or pursuant to any of these rules.

Notice of application for appointment of committee to be given to Official Trustee.

5. When any application is made to the Court or a Judge to appoint any other person than the Official Trustee as the committee of an estate of any person, notice of the application shall be given to the Official Trustee by the person making the same.

Official Trustee's powers exclusive.

6. The powers and authorities conferred by these rules on the Official Trustee shall be exclusive of any similar power or authority vested in the Master under the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920, or the rules made thereunder.

Investments.

7. In dealing with the investments and moneys under his control pursuant to these rules, the Official Trustee shall be subject to the conditions of Order XXII., Rule 14, of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909.

Auditor General to have access to books, etc.

8. The Auditor General and any officer of his Department authorised by him shall have at all times access to all books, accounts, documents and papers in the Official Trustee's office, and the Official Trustee shall at all times furnish to the Auditor General all such information as he requires.

Audit.

9. The accounts of the Official Trustee shall be audited by the Department of the Auditor General once at least in every year.

Protection to Official Trustee.

10. Neither the Official Trustee nor any officer or agent or other person acting under this authority shall be personally liable for any omission or act *bona fide*, made or performed in discharging their respective duties in pursuance of the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920, or the Official Trustee Act, 1921.

Banking of moneys.

11. (1) All moneys coming into the hands of the Official Trustee by virtue of his office and relating to the estates of lunatics shall be paid to the credit of the Treasurer at the Commonwealth Bank of Australia or other such Bank as the Treasurer may direct, and credited in the books of the Treasury to an account to be styled "The Official Trustee."

Operating on banking account.

(2) The Official Trustee may as circumstances require in the performance of his administration, operate on the account without any order of the Court and may, with the consent of the Treasurer, authorise his officers to sign on his behalf.

12. The powers, duties, and functions of the Official Trustee under these rules in respect of the estate of any person shall cease—

Cessation of powers of Official Trustee.

- (a) When such person dies and the Master receives notice thereof, as provided by section 183, subsection (1), paragraph (b) of the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920, or the Official Trustee receives notice thereof under Rule 17 ; or
- (b) Upon receiving proper notice from the Inspector General for the Insane that the person, being a patient, has been discharged ; or
- (c) Upon the appointment of a committee of the estate of such person or of a person to undertake the care and management of his property under the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920.

13. Any person in whose custody or control any testamentary paper of the insane or incapable person or insane patient is, may deposit the same in the offices of the Official Trustee upon oath as he may direct, there to remain for safe custody.

Liberty to deposit will with the Official Trustee.

14. On the death of any insane or incapable person whose estate is subject to the control of the Official Trustee, or on the supersession or rescission of the relative declaration or order made under section 110 or 111 of the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920, or on the cessation of the Official Trustee's powers over the estate of any such person, the Official Trustee may direct and authorise the payment, transfer or delivery of any funds in his custody or under his control belonging to the insane or incapable person, or any documents or effects relating to or forming part of his estate deposited in the office of the Official Trustee for safe custody, to the person entitled thereto.

Delivery out of funds, document and effects.

15. The Official Trustee may, on being satisfied of the death of an insane or incapable person, open and read any document deposited with him purporting or alleged to contain any testamentary disposition made by such person, or for the purpose of ascertaining who is therein nominated executor thereof, and whether any direction is contained therein concerning the funeral or place of interment of such person, and shall then deliver the document to the executor or one of the executors therein named or some other person, to be dealt with according to law.

The Official Trustee may open and deliver out will.

16. All personal effects now or hereafter to come to the hands of the Official Trustee belonging to any patient which are not claimed within the space of two years from the date of the discharge of such patient may, after public notice, be sold by order of the Official Trustee, and the proceeds thereof paid by him into the consolidated revenue.

Personal effects of patients, if unclaimed within two years from date of his discharge, may be sold.

Notice of certain matters to be given to Official Trustee.

17. Whenever an insane or incapable person is received into any hospital for the insane, reception house, licensed house, or other place appointed under the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920, the superintendent of such hospital for the insane, reception house or other place, or the proprietor of such licensed house shall forthwith send or cause to be sent to the Official Trustee notice in writing of the reception, removal, absence on trial or for other cause, return, escape, recapture, discharge or death of any patient in such institution.

Recovery of estate or damages.

18. Proceedings by the Official Trustee with respect to any property of an insane or incapable person, or any property in which he is interested, or for the recovery of damages for the conversion or injury thereof, shall be taken in the name of such person by the Official Trustee as his next friend.

Application for advice.

19. Applications by the Official Trustee for the advice of the Court shall be made personally or upon his report setting out the facts upon which the question on which advice is sought arises. Applications by the Official Trustee to the Court may be made personally, and without notice or other formality; but the Court may in any case order that an application be renewed in a formal manner, and that such notice thereof be given to any person likely to be affected thereby as the Court may direct.

Application by summons.

20. All applications under these rules which concern the administration and management of the estates of insane and incapable persons shall, unless the Court in any particular case otherwise directs, or unless these rules otherwise provide, be made by summons in Chambers before the Master, and the Master may make such orders in respect thereof, as to the costs of any such proceeding, as he may deem fit.

Application of Lunacy Rules.

21. Subject to the Act and these rules, the provisions of the Lunacy Act, 1903-1920, and of the rules made thereunder applicable to committees of the estates of insane persons or to persons appointed to undertake the care and management of the property of incapable persons, shall apply to the Official Trustee when acting in reference to any such estate or property as if he had been appointed committee or charged with the care and management thereof as the case may be: Provided that the Official Trustee shall not be required to give security or to pass his accounts and that the Court may modify or negative the application of any of the said rules in any particular case.

Procedure in case of doubt.

22. In case of doubt as to the mode of procedure to be adopted in any particular case, the procedure to be adopted shall be such as the Court directs.

Rescission and variance of orders.

23. Any order made under these rules may be rescinded or varied by a subsequent order.

24. In these rules—

Interpretation.

“ Court ” means the Supreme Court or a judge thereof, and includes the Master acting in the exercise of the jurisdiction and powers of the Court under section 123 of the Lunacy Act, 1903–1920 ;

“ The Act ” means the Official Trustee Act, 1921.

25. These rules may be cited as the *Official Trustee Rules*, 1926. Citation.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT, 1926.

Whereas by the Supreme Court Act, 1880; it is enacted, among other things, that the Court may at any time alter or annul any Rules of Court for the time being in force, or make any new Rules of Court, for the purpose of regulating all such matters of practice and proceeding in the said Court or relating to the officers of the said Court or otherwise as, under the provisions of the said Act, are or may be regulated by Rules of Court.

Now therefore we, the Honourable Sir Robert Furse McMillan, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, and the Honourable Robert Bruce Burnside and John Alfred Northmore and Thomas Percy Draper, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia (in pursuance of the powers given by the said Act and of all other powers us hereunto enabling), do hereby make the following Rules of Court, which shall come into operation one month after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT, 1926.

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Rules of the Supreme Court, 1926.*
2. There are hereby added to Order 22 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, two rules as follows :—
 17. The manner of payment of money into Court and out of Court, and the manner in which money in Court shall be dealt with, shall be subject to the regulations set out in Appendix M.
 18. The investments of moneys under the control or subject to any order of the Supreme Court of Western Australia shall be made by the Official Trustee.
3. Appendix M of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, is annulled, and an appendix is substituted therefor as follows :—

APPENDIX M.

Payment into and out of Court.

1. Any party who intends to pay money into Court will on request at the Supreme Court Office be furnished with a form of request which must be filled up as hereinafter provided, and signed by such party or his solicitor. The money will then be received by the Official Trustee, and an official receipt for the money, setting out the particulars, will be given. Where the money is paid in upon a notice or pleading, such notice or pleading must be produced at the Official Trustee and Supreme Court Offices at the time the money is paid in, and an official receipt will be given setting out the particulars.
2. Money paid into Court shall be paid by the Official Trustee to the Treasurer.
3. In filling up the request mentioned in the first preceding regulation, the party paying the money into Court shall enter thereon such one of the following statements as may be applicable to the circumstances under which the money is paid in, viz. :—
 - (a.) Where the money is paid in, under the provisions of Rule 5 of Order XXII., an entry in the following form :—
 - A. Paid in in satisfaction of claim of abovenamed (name of party).
 - (b.) Where the money is paid in under the provisions of Rule 6 of Order XXII., an entry in the following form :—
 - B. Paid in against claim of abovenamed (name of party), with defence, denying liability.
 - (c.) Where the money is paid in under the provisions of Rule 29 of Order XXX., an entry in the following form :—
 - C. Paid into "Security for Costs Account."
 - (d.) Where the money is paid in under an order or certificate, an entry in the following form :—
 - D. Paid in under order (or certificate) dated the day of

Upon the money being paid in, an entry corresponding with the entry in the request shall be made in the books of the Official Trustee, and in the receipt given by the Official Trustee for the money, whether such receipt be endorsed on a notice or pleading, or be a separate document.

4. Where a defendant has paid money into Court under an order, and desires to appropriate the whole or any part of such money to the whole or any specified portion of the plaintiff's claim, pursuant to Rule 11 of Order XXII., he or his solicitor shall lodge with the Master the original receipted order and a notice, entitled with the letter, number, and short title of the action, and in such one of the following forms as may be applicable to the case, viz. :—
 - A. Take notice that £ of the money in Court herein, is appropriated by the abovenamed (name of party) to the satisfaction or claim of the abovenamed (name of party).
 - B. Take notice that £ of the money in Court herein, is placed by the abovenamed (name of party) against the claim of the abovenamed (name of party) with a defence, denying liability.

8. On bespeaking payment out of Court of money paid in on a notice or pleading, an office copy of the original receipted notice or pleading must be lodged at the office of the Official Trustee.

9. Where money is to be paid out under an order or authority, on bespeaking the payment out the order or authority must be lodged at the Supreme Court, and after having been examined by the Master must be filed in the Supreme Court. An office copy of the order or authority shall also be lodged with the Official Trustee.

10. Every authority for the payment of money out of Court must be attested by a witness, whose residence and description must be added to his attestation.

11. Each sum paid into Court shall, as regards its payment out of Court, be deemed (when the time for payment out arrives) to be money standing to the credit of the Supreme Court.

12. All payments out shall be made by the Official Trustee in favour of the party claiming to receive the money, on the production by him of a form of request signed by the party entitled to receive the money or his solicitor and duly marked by the Master as approved as set out in regulation 18 hereof.

13. Whenever the order is required to be drawn in favour of any person, not a solicitor of the Supreme Court, the Official Trustee may require him to be identified by a solicitor. If such person shall be represented in the cause or matter by a solicitor, the identifying solicitor must be such solicitor.

14. Where an order directs that money paid into Court is to be invested, the Official Trustee shall make the investment.

15. The Official Trustee, on receipt of a direction to invest, shall cause the securities mentioned therein to be purchased in his name, or of the other persons mentioned in the direction, and shall receive and retain the certificate issued by the body corporate or company, in whose books the securities purchased are registered, and all other evidences of the said securities, and the said certificate shall be sufficient evidence for all purposes that the purchase of such securities has been actually made; and the securities so purchased shall be placed in the books of the Official Trustee to the same credit as that to which the money was paid in, unless the order of the Court or a Judge otherwise directs.

16. The dividends and interest on the securities purchased shall, as and when the same respectively are received, or become due, be entered in the books to the same credit as that to which the money was originally paid in.

17. When securities are realised, the Official Trustee shall receive the proceeds of the sale.

18. In all cases in which it is desired to pay money into Court or to receive money out of Court a form of request signed by the party so desiring, or his solicitor, shall be presented to the Master and be by him examined, and if he shall be of opinion that such request may be legally complied with he shall mark his approval thereof. The request so marked shall then be presented by such party or his solicitor to the Official Trustee by whom the money mentioned in such request shall be received or paid as the case may be. The Official Trustee shall then endorse on the request a short note to the effect that the said money has been received or paid by him, as the case may be, and hand such request so endorsed to the party presenting same, who shall forthwith file it in the Central Office of the Supreme Court.

19. The Master shall furnish to the Official Trustee, free of charge, an official copy of any document filed with the Master which the Official Trustee may reasonably require for the purpose of carrying out his duties under these regulations.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 90 of 1926.

In the matter of an Award made on the 26th day of September, 1923, between the Minister for Works, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, the Minister for Trading Concerns, the Colonial Secretary, the Minister controlling State Steamships, and the Minister for the North-West, and the Perth Plumbers' Union (now known as the West Australian Plumbers and Sheet Metal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers), and in the matter of an application by the above-named Union for the Court to amend the said Award.

UPON hearing the application of Mr. P. J. Trainer on behalf of the applicant Union, and by consent, and in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 90 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and of Clause 9 of Award No. 33 of 1922, the Court doth hereby order that the said Award be and the same is hereby amended in the terms of the annexed Schedule.

PLUMBERS AND SHEET METAL WORKERS.

AN Agreement made this sixth day of March, 1926, between the Minister for Works, Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, Minister for Trading Concerns (in his capacity as Administrator of the State Implement and Engineering Works), the Chief Secretary, The Minister controlling State Steamships, Minister for Lands, Minister for Agriculture, and the Minister for the North-West, of the one part, and The West Australian Plumbers and Sheet Metal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers of the other part.

Whereas an Award of the Arbitration Court of Western Australia was made on the 26th day of September, 1923, and numbered 33 of 1922, and it has been mutually agreed to vary the terms of the said Award as hereinafter expressed, that is to say: IT IS HEREBY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES:—

(The dates shown in parentheses are the dates from which it is agreed such variations shall operate.)

Ministers Bound by Award.

It is agreed that the following Ministers be added to those specified in the Award:—

"The Minister for Lands, and the Minister for Agriculture. The words 'in his capacity as Administrator of the State Implement and Engineering Works' are inserted after the words 'Minister for Trading Concerns' mentioned in the Award."

Clause 1. Scope of Award.

Add at the end of the Clause the words "in his capacity as Administrator of the State Implement and Engineering Works, the Minister for Lands and the Minister for Agriculture."

Clause 2. Hours.

44 hours shall represent a week's work in lieu of 48 hours as prescribed by Clause 2 of the said Award on the following condition: "Such ordinary working hours shall not exceed 8 hours on the first 5 days of the week and 4 hours on Saturdays."

(2nd July, 1924.)

Clause 3. Wages.

It is agreed that the minimum rate of pay shall, in lieu of the rate prescribed by Clause 3 (a) of the Award, be 107/4d. per week of 44 hours.

(1st October, 1925).

"It is also agreed—

(a) that the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis subject to the following condition, namely: That if in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week no work is available or performed, the employees will only be paid for the time actually worked at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of 44 hours) apportioned to the time actually worked during the week; and

(b) that notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis there shall be no obligation on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the employee were employed at an hourly wage.

(c) Paragraphs (a) and (b) are in conformity with existing practice which will continue and be observed."

(26th September, 1924.)

Add a new Sub-Clause to stand as 3 (d) :—

"Casual Worker:—Casual worker shall mean one for whom work over a period of twelve consecutive working days, not counting holidays, is not provided by the employer. Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. over the rate provided by the Agreement or Award for the particular worker's occupation."

(26th September, 1924.)

Add a new Subclause to stand as 3 (e) :—

"Foreman.—A foreman means an employee who is in charge of one or more leading hands or who is directly responsible to the supervisor for preparing estimates of work or for carrying out of work by other tradesmen.

Foremen shall be paid not less than five shillings per day above the minimum rates provided for tradesmen in their respective trades, in the district in which they may be employed."

(26th September, 1924.)

Courts Basic Wage Determination.

Add a new Subclause to stand as 3 (f) :—

"It is further agreed—

That the wages referred to herein shall operate until the 26th September, 1926, subject to the proviso that should the Arbitration Court issue a statutory basic wage declaration in the meantime, the wages set out in this agreement shall be automatically adjusted in accordance with such declaration."

Clause 4. Overtime and Holidays.

Delete Subclause (a) and substitute in lieu thereof :—

"All time worked in excess of or outside the usual hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours after the usual stopping time, and double time thereafter, provided that employees called to start work within one hour and a half of the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until the usual starting time."

(26th September, 1924.)

Delete Subclause (h) and substitute in lieu thereof :—

"All employees employed for a period of less than twelve months' continuous service shall receive holiday pay as follows: After one month's continuous service holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the 12 months."

(26th September, 1924.)

Provision of Tickets.

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 12 :—

"Wherever practicable all workers employed at work outside the employer's place of business shall be provided with a ticket or warrant."

(From date Agreement is signed.)

Preference of Employment.

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 13 :—

"Preference of employment under this Award shall be given to members of the West Australian Plumbers and Sheet Metal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers."

Piece Workers.

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 14 :—

"A worker employed on piece work shall be paid at least the minimum rate of pay prescribed in this Award."

(From date Agreement is signed.)

Right of Entry to Works.

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 15 :—

“ On notifying the Officer in Charge any officer of the union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of such union shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such union covered by this Award are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the employees in such place or premises :

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the employees in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether employees are being hampered or hindered in their work.”

(From date this Agreement is signed)

Notice Boards.

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 16, as follows :—

“ A notice board shall be provided by the employer on all jobs where in the opinion of the officer in charge it is considered essential for the convenience of the union concerned to have a notice board.”

(From date Agreement is signed.)

Broken Shifts.

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 17 :—

“ Should any employee not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required on the next day he shall be paid for that day if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time ; unless he cannot be employed on account of causes beyond the control of the management, in which case, he shall be notified forthwith of the cause why he cannot be employed, and shall be entitled to two hours' pay.”

(26th September, 1924.)

Application to Court.

It is hereby further agreed between the parties hereto that as soon as practicable application will be made by the union to the Court to vary the aforementioned Award in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, and the parties hereto will consent to such variation.

Term.

This Agreement shall operate from the date hereof until the 26th day of September, 1926.

BOOTMAKING (BESPOKE)—METROPOLITAN.
(Registered 24th May, 1926.)

No. 16 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 5th day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between the Boot Trade of Western Australia Union of Workers, Perth, of the one part, and the Metropolitan Bespoke Bootmakers and Repairers' Industrial Union of Employers, Perth, of the other part, witnesseth, that for the consideration hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

Award.

1. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wages to be paid to male employees on time work shall be two shillings and fourpence per hour.

2. *Piecework.*—Piecework is permissible provided that the rates paid therefor shall be such as to enable an adult worker to earn not less than two shillings and sixpence halfpenny per hour.

3. *Apprentices.*—(i.) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court according to the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause. Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(ii.) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving to the Clerk of the Court notice in the prescribed form (Form 1 in the appendix hereto).

(iii.) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(iv.) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by him. Provided that the fraction of three shall not be less than one.

(v.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed. An employer who is himself a competent worker may, for the purpose of estimating the number of apprentices, be deemed a journeyman. Provided that before this provision is used the Clerk of the Court shall notify the secretaries of the employers and workers' unions, who may object to the apprentice being taken, and proof to the satisfaction of the Clerk of the Court of competence to teach the trade may be required. Provided that this award shall not operate to render unlawful or to vary the terms or provisions of any apprenticeship existing at the date of its commencement.

(vi.) Apprentices shall be taught the trade of boot and shoe repairing by hand and/or machining method, according to the practice of the shop in which the apprenticeship is served.

(vii.) The term of apprenticeship shall be four years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(viii.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced.

(ix.) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

(1.) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (xv.), pay the apprentice at the rate of wages herein provided.

(2.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate of the time actually served.

(3.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(4.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).

(x.) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

(xi.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(xii.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination. The Clerk of the Court shall notify each apprentice due for examination and require him to pay an examination fee in accordance with the following scale:—

The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the union and employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or failing such nomination, or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(xiv.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(xv.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (x.) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners or fails to pay the fee prescribed by subclause (xii.) to the Clerk of the Court.

(xvi.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(xvii.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

4. *Overtime.*—Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first two hours and time and a-half thereafter for time workers. Overtime shall commence at the usual time for knocking off for each day at each establishment.

5. *Hours.*—The regular week's work shall be forty-four hours, to be worked in six days if required.

6. *Grindery, etc.*—The employer shall find all grindery, workshops, and light, and shall serve out all colours and materials used in connection with the trade.

7. *Weekly Payments.*—Each employee shall be paid at least once a week moneys due to him up to the night previous to pay day. Any employee working only a portion of the week must be paid before ceasing work for that week, and all payment must be made in working hours.

8. *Posting of Notices.*—Every employer shall allow shop and union notices to be posted in an accessible place.

9. *Hot Water.*—Employers shall provide hot water free of charge at lunch time.

10. *Sub-letting.*—No sub-letting of piecework shall be allowed.

11. *Record Book.*—Each employer shall make and keep a record showing the name of each worker, ordinary time worked each day, overtime worked each day, the amount paid for piecework and details of piecework, together with the worker's signature for the same. Such record shall be open for inspection by the secretary or other duly authorised officer of the union during working hours.

12. *Under-rate Workers.*—(a) A worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the worker's union. If within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give to the secretary two days' notice of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final.

(b) Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause: Provided always that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.

13. *Term of Award.*—This award shall be for a term of three years from the date hereof: Provided that after the expiration of twelve months application may be made for alteration, by any party affected thereby.

14. *Application of Award.*—This award shall apply to the bespoke bootmaking and repairing industry carried on within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912," this 21st day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tearoom and Restaurant Employers' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and the persons, firms, and companies whose signatures appear in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the consideration hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

Definitions.

1. Tearooms may serve beef tea and bœuf or such soups as are supplied from bottles or tins, meat pies and pasties such as are supplied by wholesale pastry-cooks, ham and eggs, eggs cooked in any form, and cold meats of any description (cold roast meats must not be cooked on the premises).
2. If any hot dishes other than those mentioned in Clause 1 hereof are served it will constitute the establishment a restaurant.

Hours.

3. 48 hours to be worked in six days shall constitute a week's work for male workers over the age of 18 years. 44 hours, to be worked in five and a half days, shall constitute a week's work for all females and for junior workers. Any employee, except casual workers, who work a lesser number of hours per week, shall be paid the full week's wage. For the purpose of this agreement the time during which the employee is on the premises of the employer shall be deemed working time. If the employee has permission to leave the premises for any time not less than one hour but prefers to remain thereon, such time shall not be counted in the working hours.

Spread of Shifts.

5. Daily spread of shifts shall mean the time which elapses from the time when the worker first starts work and the time when he or she finishes work for the day. Weekly spread of shifts shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week. The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed sixty-six hours in restaurants, sixty hours in tea rooms, and seventy-two hours in hotels and coffee palaces. The longest spread of shifts in any one day shall be not more than 12 hours.

7. In addition to one break for meal hours there shall be not more than one break in any shift, such break to be not less than two hours, with the exception of one day in the week, either Friday or Saturday, when a ten-hour working day is permissible, with two breaks of at least one hour each for meals. The exception shall not apply to hotels and coffee palaces.

8. Night-shift shall mean where the employee finishes for the day after 8 p.m. Not more than three late nights shall be worked in any one week, or, as an alternative day and night shift, alternate weeks. This shall not apply to male workers engaged exclusively for night work.

Wages.

9. The following shall be the minimum rate of wages per week:—
Hotels, Coffee Palaces, Restaurants, Tea-rooms, Cafes, Boarding-houses, Hostels, and other similar places.

Board and Lodgings.

10. If board is provided by the employer he may deduct £1 per week, and if lodging is provided 7s. 6d. per week, from the wages hereinbefore prescribed.

Board shall mean three meals per day, as per menu in such establishment.

Casuals.

11. Casual workers shall be engaged by the day and shall be paid at the rate of time and a half during the first three consecutive days of employment, and thereafter shall receive the full weekly wage.

12. Casual male workers engaged in work done in connection with racecourses, show, or sports grounds and the like shall be paid 3s. 1½d. per hour, with a minimum of eight hours' pay per day, also travelling expenses to and from employment.

13. For casual female workers engaged in such work the rate shall be a minimum of 15s. for the hours computed from 10 a.m. to 5.30 p.m., with one hour off for meals; all hours in excess at 2s. 6d. per hour; and if the meal hour be not given it be paid for at the rate of 3s. 6d. per hour; also travelling expenses to and from employment.

14. A casual female hand may be employed from 1 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. at a minimum of 12s. for the period.

15. The time for casual workers on outside jobs shall count from the time appointed for their attendance on the job until they are discharged.

16. Female casual workers engaged upon special suppers, etc., after 7.30 p.m. shall receive 3s. 6d. per hour with a minimum of two hours' work, with train or tram fare added.

17. The wage payable to casual workers on outside jobs shall be handed to the worker immediately on completion of employment.

18. Any workers engaged at special dinners or suppers after 8 p.m. shall be paid at double time rates after they have worked their usual time for the day.

19. Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

Overtime.

20. All overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

Goldfields' Allowance.

21. In addition to the wages hereinbefore prescribed a Goldfields' allowance shall be paid.

Holidays.

22. All workers employed shall be entitled to and shall receive a full day off duty in each week in establishments which open seven days, and a half a day per week in establishments which open six days per week.

23. In lieu of one full day in hotels where one cook is employed two half days may be given, and in addition the wages paid by such hotel to all employees shall be increased by one-twelfth the rates herein provided.

24. The half holiday shall commence at 2 o'clock in the afternoon and terminate at the usual starting time next day.

25. The night porter in all establishments shall be allowed off duty one night per week.

26. Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, and one Union picnic day per year shall be holidays in all establishments, except those that cater for boarders.

All work done on any of the foregoing days shall be paid for at double time rates.

On these days, except in establishments which cater for boarders, workers shall be free to work or not as he or she desires, and the employers to open their places of business if they so desire.

27. After the completion of twelve month's service annual holidays shall be granted as follows:—Three weeks on full pay, together with the prescribed board and lodging allowance to those workers working in establishments which open seven days per week; and two weeks on full pay to those workers working in establishments which open six days per week, together with the prescribed board and lodging allowance.

Such holiday shall be granted within two months of its becoming due, failing which the employer shall pay double time for all work done after that date. This penalty shall not apply where it can be shown, after consultation with the Union Secretary, that it was impossible to find a substitute during that time. Provided also, that any worker who shall have served one month or over and whose services shall have been terminated before the annual holidays shall have become due, shall be entitled to a proportionate allowance for the time served.

Preference of Employment.

28. Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, and preference of employment shall be given to members of the white races.

Meal Hours.

29. At least one clear hour (or as provided in Section 124 of "The Factories Act, 1920"), in every six hours shall be allowed off for each worker for meal time, and in tea-rooms, notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 7, the time may be divided by taking half an hour for morning tea before noon and another half hour before 2.30 o'clock p.m. for dinner.

Roster.

30. A roster of the working hours of all workers shall be exhibited in each establishment in such a place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker, such roster to be compiled weekly, and shall denote the hours to be worked by each worker for the week ahead, and shall be open for inspection by Union officials during all working hours. A copy of this Agreement shall be available at all times in a place where all may peruse it.

Weekly Wage.

31. Wages shall be paid weekly. When no agreement in writing is made determining the period of notice, then a notice of not less than twenty-four (24) hours' notice shall be given by either party of intention to terminate the service.

Uniforms.

32. Employers shall pay one shilling per week for the laundering of all stiff white cuffs and collars where same are demanded to be worn, and also pay one shilling per week extra to all workers who wear white aprons or coats.

Only a plain black and white or black or white uniform will be recognised as such by the various parties to this Agreement. The cost of any alteration in colour or design demanded by the employer must be provided by that employer.

The wearing of all head-bands in any establishment is hereby prohibited.

Accommodation.

33. Any worker required to sleep on the premises shall be provided with suitable accommodation.

Where workers sleep on the premises they shall be provided with a common sitting room.

All workers shall have access to a bath room.

A suitable efficiently lighted and ventilated change room shall be provided by employers for the use of workers of each sex who do not sleep upon the premises. Such change room shall be furnished with suitable toilet conveniences.

Suitable accommodation for meals shall be provided for all workers.

If any worker considers the accommodation provided for him or her by his employer unsuitable, complaint may be made in writing by the Secretary of the Union to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration. Upon receipt of such complaint the Clerk may request an Industrial Inspector under the Industrial Arbitration Act to inspect the accommodation and report thereon. The Inspector's report shall be filed by the Clerk and be open to inspection by any person without fee. The report may be used as *prima facie* evidence in proceedings for the enforcement of this clause.

Record.

34. The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, at his business premises, or at each one of them if more than one, a time and wages book, wherein shall be entered the name, occupation, and, in the case of juniors, the age on his or her last birthday, the time he or she commences and finishes work for the day, the hours worked on each day, and the wages paid to each worker each week. Such book shall be entered up from day to day, and shall be initialed daily, if correct, by each worker. The employer and the worker shall be held severally responsible for the proper daily posting up of the book, which shall be open to inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union, who shall be permitted to visit the employer's premises and take extracts therefrom on a portion of the employer's premises during all working hours.

Under-rate Workers.

35. Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and, in default of such agreement, within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wages

shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, and, after lodging the application shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and to be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent him at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

Juniors in Tearoom Kitchens.

36. Juniors in tearooms' kitchens shall mean girls under eighteen years of age, and they shall not be in a greater proportion than those of one junior to two or part of two seniors. Juniors shall only be permitted to work while a senior is working.

37. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained in paragraph 4 hereof, an employer shall be at liberty to employ half-time or three-quarter time waitresses in the proportion of one half-time or one three-quarter time waitress to four full-time waitresses, of part thereof, and who shall be entitled to wages at the rate of time and one-eighth and allowances as specified herein.

Area.

38. This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within twenty miles of the G.P.O., Merredin, W.A.

Duration of Agreement.

39. This Agreement shall come into force and be operative from the 29th day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and continue until the 29th day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

40. Provided always that either party shall have the liberty to apply to have the Agreement re-opened and reviewed after this Agreement has been in currency for twelve months from the 29th day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and after such request has been made both parties shall meet at a round table conference for the purpose of reviewing the wages and conditions set forth herein, and to make such changes in the Agreement as are necessary and agreed to in the course of discussion. In the event of an agreement not being arrived at between the parties no alteration shall be made in the Agreement.

WHEREAS Section 5 of "The Workers' Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1924," whereby a section numbered 6A and the Third Schedule relating to industrial diseases was inserted in "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912," was by Proclamation brought into operation throughout the State on the 1st day of March, 1925, except so far as the said section and Schedule extends to pneumoconiosis, miner's phthisis, ankylostomiasis, and nystagmus: And whereas it is desirable that, subject as hereinafter provided, the said section and Schedule should be brought into operation so as to extend to those diseases: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that Section 5 of "The Workers' Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1924," whereby Section 6A is inserted in the principal Act (such section being numbered 7 in the principal Act as reprinted with amendments as "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924"), and the section so inserted and the Third Schedule, inclusive of the diseases of pneumoconiosis, miner's phthisis, ankylostomiasis and nystagmus, shall come into operation on the 15th day of June, 1926; but the operation of that section and the Third Schedule, so far as the same extend to the diseases pneumoconiosis, miner's phthisis, ankylostomiasis and nystagmus, is hereby so limited as only to apply when the employment at the time of disablement was in some portion of the State as hereby defined, that is to say: those portions of the State comprised within the boundaries of the land demised by (a) Gold Mining Leases 750E, 1004E, 1621E, 6E, 131E, 245E, 269E, 739E, 743E, 969E, 73E, 410E, 448E, 532E, 578E, 698E, 944E, 22E, 34E, and Tailings Lease 3; Gold Mining Leases 4366E, 16E, 51E, 61E, 102E, 280E, 1109E, 5350E, 5351E, and Tailings Leases 1 and 12; Gold Mining Leases 1002E, 1001E, 351E, 1085E, 1113E, 1219E, 1326E, 1397E, and Tailings Leases 37 and 39; Gold Mining Leases 71E, 72E, 38E, and 49E; Gold Mining Leases 15E, 60E, 902E, 923E, 986E, 1116E, 1124E, 1196E, 4075E, 32E, 2325E, 2326E, 25E, 4493E, 4508E, 352E, 873E, 31E, 4334E, 1357E, 1413E, 1507E, 4399E, 4445E, 4476E, 4503E, and Tailings Leases 34, 35, 36; Gold Mining Leases 1208E, 3612E, 3643E, and Tailings Lease 16; Gold Mining Leases 66E, 5357E, 5345E, 5232E, 35E, and Tailings Leases 2, 17 and 32, all in the East Coolgardie Goldfield; (b) Gold Mining Leases 1019X, 1462X, 1463X, and 1466X, 12X, 13X, 1438X, 1443X, 1461X and 1389X, all in the North-East Coolgardie Goldfield; (c) the White Hope Gold Mine on Hampton Plains Location 48; (d) Gold Mining Leases 1399W and 1336W, Ora Banda, in the Broad Arrow Goldfield; (e) Gold Mining Leases 645S and 4600 Coolgardie, in the Kunnanalling and Coolgardie Districts respectively, Coolgardie Goldfield; and (f) Gold Mining Leases 1291, 1288 and 1290 in the Dundas Goldfield; as the said portions of the State are delineated on plans marked L9A/9, Kalgoorlie and Boulder (East Coolgardie G.F.); L13A/13, Kanowna (North-East Coolgardie G.F.); Hampton Plains Location 48, plan No. 1; L18, Ora Banda (Broad Arrow G.F.); L10, part of Kunnanalling (Coolgardie G.F.); L1A/1, Norseman (Dundas G.F.); and deposited at the Department of Mines in Perth.

1. It is obligatory under Section 10 for every employer (unless exemption has been obtained by Order in Council when the employer has established a fund and deposited securities at the Treasury) to insure against all liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him.

2. No insurance with any incorporated insurance office will be deemed a compliance with Section 10 unless the policy covers all liability of the employer under the Act, including the Third Schedule relating to industrial diseases, and the insurance office is approved by the Minister.

3. Every employer must obtain the approval of the Minister in writing of the office from which he proposes to obtain a policy of insurance, or the renewal of a current policy. Whenever it is intended to effect such insurance by the renewal of a current policy (which, if not covering all risks under the Act, including the Third Schedule, must be so extended as to cover all such risks), the approval in writing of the Minister to the insurance office must be obtained by the employer effecting such insurance by the renewal of a current policy.

4. The Minister charged with the administration of the Act is the Minister for Works, and all communications should be addressed to him at the Department of Public Works, Perth.

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
