WHEREAS it is provided by Section 213 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," that a Road Board may adopt in any area defined for that purpose by Proclamation the system of valuation on the annual value: And whereas it is desirable to enable the Sussex Road Board to adopt the system of valuation on the annual value in the area defined hereto: Now, therefore I, the said Governor's Deputy, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Sussex Road Board may adopt the system of valuation on the annual value in all that territory comprised in the Schedule hereto, in the Sussex Road District, and may impose rates on the rateable land within such area, on the annual value thereof, in accordance with the relative provisions of the said Act, and any Proclamation heretofore or hereafter issued thereunder and for the time being in force.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Government Electric Works Act, 1914," that, subject to "The Electric Light and Power Agreement Act, 1913," the Commissioner of Railways may, within such areas as may be from time to time defined by Proclamation, establish and maintain electric works: And whereas it is necessary to define an area for the purpose of the said Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor's Deputy, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the area described in the Schedule hereto as an area within which the Commissioner of Railways may, subject to "The Electric Light and Power Agreement Act, 1913," establish and maintain electric works and otherwise exercise the powers conferred by "The Government Electric Works Act, 1914":—

Schedule.

An area within the following boundaries, namely:—From Rous Head, Fremantle, to a point 25 miles North on the coast line, then due East to a point 32 miles inland; from this point due South 42 miles, then due West about 33½ miles to the coast; and from that point due North to Rous Head.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 412/24.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor's Deputy, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.—Fremantle Municipality.

Improvements to Water Supply for Shipping.

Proposed 6-inch diameter wrought-iron water main along Victoria Quay from Cliff Street Westerly to Arthur Head (length about 14½ chains), together with valves, supply cocks, fire services, and all necessary connections and apparatus, including lifting the existing 4-inch diameter water main, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4535.

Plantagenet Road District—Redivision into Wards.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, redivide the Plantagenet Road District into six Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor's Deputy, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby redivide the Plantagenet Road District into six Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in the Schedule hereto.

To come into force on the 1st day of July, 1926.

Plantagenet Road District—Description of Ward Boundaries.

Town Ward.—West and North Boundaries: Bounded on the Westward and Northward by lines commencing at the North-East corner of Plantagenet Location 2063 and extending Northward and Eastward to and along the East boundary of Location B21 to the South-West corner of Mount Barker Lot 298 and along the South and East boundaries of said Lot 298, part of the East boundary of Location 675, a South, an East, a South and an East boundary of Location 148, the North boundary of Lot 52, the South-Eastern boundary of Reserve 12229, the South and East boundaries of Location 275, part of the South, the East, and part of the North boundary of Location 419, the North-Western, an East and the Northernmost boundary of Reserve 5306 to its North-East corner.

East Boundary: On the Eastward by lines commencing at the said North-East corner and extending Southward along part of the East boundary of said

Reserve 5306, part of the West boundary of Location 18 and the West boundaries of Locations 1785, 522, and 2207 to intersect the North boundary of Location 752.

South Boundary: On the Southward by lines commencing at the said intersection and extending Westward along part of the North boundary of Location 752 and North boundaries of Reserve 5172 and Locations 1963, 1330, 1067, 476, and 921 and continuing to the starting point. (One Member.)

West Ward.—Bounded on the Southward, Westward, and Northward by parts of the district boundaries from West boundary of Hay Location 89 to the North-West corner of Location 995.

East Boundary: On the Eastward by lines commencing at the last mentioned North-West corner and extending along the West, South, and Easternmost boundary of said Location 995, part of the South boundary of Location 745, the South, West, and the Southernmost boundary of Location 746 and the South boundary of Location 752; the East boundary of Location 10 and the Eastern boundary of Reserve 6716B; part of the North boundary of Location 759; the West boundaries of Plantagenet Locations 2800, 2806, 2807, 2343, 1184, 2812, 2813, 2814, and 1186; part of the North, the East and the South boundary of Hay Location 27; West and part of the South boundary of Location 1866; the East and South boundaries of Location 188; part of the East boundary of Location 189 and the East boundary of Location 186; part of the South boundary of Location 2718 to the production North of the East boundary of Location 331 and South along the said production and East boundary and the East boundary of Location 732 and its production Southward to intersect the production East of the North boundary of Location 802; thence along the last mentioned production and the North, West and part of the South boundary of Location 802; the West and part of the South boundaries of Locations 849 and 501 and part of the West boundary of Location 89 to the starting point. (One Member.)

North Ward.—North Boundary: Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to intersect the production North of the East boundary of Plantagenet Location 2867.

East Boundary: On the Eastward by the production Northward of the East boundary of said Location 2867 to its intersection with the production East of the North boundary of Location 4012.

South Boundary: On the Southward by lines commencing at the last mentioned intersection and extending Westward along the production of and North boundary of Location 4012 and the North boundaries of Locations 4051, 3774, and 4052; the Northern boundaries of Reserve 16480, a North, a West, a North and the Westernmost boundary of Location 3900; part of the North and the West boundary of Location 12; the West boundary of Location 5358 and part of the West boundary of Location 1805 to the production East of the North boundary of Location 1359; thence along the said production and North boundary and North boundary of Location 1360; continuing to the Eastern side of the Perth-Albany Road and Southward along the said side of the Perth-Albany Road to the Southern side of Road No. 5744 and Westward along the said side of Road No. 5744; part of the East boundary of Location 2802; the East and North boundaries of Hay Location 757; part of the East and the North boundary of Location 756; the North boundaries of Locations 491, 755, and 754; part of the East, the North, and part of the Western boundary of Location 1211; thence by part of the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to the starting point. (One Member.)

Middle Ward.—North Boundary: Bounded on the Northward by part of the Southern boundary of the North Ward from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to the West boundary of Plantagenet Location 1805.

East Boundary: On the Eastward by lines commencing on the West boundary of said Location 1805 and extending Southward along part of the said West boundary and West boundaries of Locations 881, 1084, 1910, 1909, 1153, 2413, 1505, and 1103; part of the South boundary of Location 17; an East, a North and an East boundary of Location 722 and East boundary

of Location 645 to the Northern boundary of the Town Ward; thence by part of the Northern, Western, and part of the Southern boundaries of the Town Ward to the Eastern side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve and Southward along the said side of the Railway Reserve to intersect the production East of the North boundary of Location 2477.

South Boundary: On the Southward by lines commencing at the said intersection and extending along the said production and North boundary and part of the West boundary of Location 1540; North boundaries of Locations 2096, 2993, 4315, 4316, and Reserve 14493 and part of the West boundary of the lattermost to the production East of the South boundary of Location 2600; thence along the said production and South boundary and to and along the South boundary of Location 1111; and part of the West boundary of the last mentioned location to the production East of the Northern boundary of Hay Location 330, and along the last mentioned production and said Northern boundary and its production West to the East boundary of Location 933, and along part of the East and the North boundary of said Location 933 and the latter's production West to intersect the production South of the East boundary of Location 732; thence Northward along the last mentioned production to intersect the Eastern boundary of the West Ward; on the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to the starting point. (One Member.)

East Ward.—Bounded on the Northward and South-Eastward by part of the district boundary from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the North Ward to intersect the production South of the East boundary of Plantagenet Location 2987.

West Boundary: On the Westward by the said production and East boundary of Location 2987 and the West boundary of Location 5413; part of the North-West boundary of Location 3866; the North boundary of Location 5427 and Westward to and along the North boundary of Location 3597 to the Eastern side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve and Northward along the said side of the Railway Reserve to the South boundary of the Town Ward; thence along part of the South, the East, and part of the North boundaries of the Town Ward and part of the East boundary of Middle Ward and part of the boundaries of the North Ward to the starting point. (Two Members.)

South Ward.—North Boundary: Bounded on the Northward by part of the East boundary of the West Ward, the South boundary of the Middle Ward and part of the Western boundary of the East Ward from the North-West corner of Location 802 to the Northern corner of Location 3866; on the Eastward, Southward and Westward by part of the Western boundary of the East Ward and by part of the district boundaries and part of the Eastern boundary of the West Ward from the North corner of Location 3866 to the starting point. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE PERTH HOSPITAL.

Proceedings of the Board.

1. The Board of Management shall meet at least once a month from time to time as agreed upon, or at such other day or hour as may be fixed at any meeting of the Board, five members to form a quorum.

2. If a quorum be not present at fifteen minutes after the hour appointed for the meeting, those present may fix a day and hour to which the meeting shall stand adjourned.

3. A Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be elected annually by the Board at the first meeting of the Board after their appointment. In the absence of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman, any other member may be chosen to act as Chairman by a majority of the members present. The Chairman shall have a deliberate vote only.

4. The Chairman shall be empowered to explain any resolution arrived at by the Board, and to give advice and instructions to the officials of the Hospital between the meetings of the Board.

5. A vacancy occurring in the office of Chairman or Vice-Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Board after such vacancy has been declared, previous notice being given in the notices convening the meeting.

6. At every meeting the minutes of the previous meeting shall be read, and, if approved, confirmed, and the business proceeded with in the following order:—

1. Business arising from the minutes read.
2. Business arising out of reports and correspondence.

3. Business of which notice has been given, and such other business as may require immediate attention.

7. At all meetings voting shall be by a show of hands, provided that the election of Chairman and Vice-Chairman, and the appointments of the Honorary Medical Staff, and all important appointments shall be by ballot only.

8. Special meetings shall be convened by the Secretary on forty-eight (48) hours' written notice, either at the request of the Chairman or of any three members of the Board in writing.

9. Notice of motion on all important matters shall be given in writing, and no resolution arrived at, or act, matter or thing done or authorised by or at any meeting shall be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting unless notice of such motion, intended rescission, or amendment be given in writing to the Secretary and sent to each member at least two days before the meeting at which such motion, rescission, or amendment is to be proposed.

10. The conduct of every meeting shall be in the hands of the Chairman, whose decision on all points of order or as to procedure shall be final.

11. The Board may from time to time appoint a sub-committee or sub-committees of any number, with such powers, and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Board may at such appointment or thereafter determine.

General Rules.

12. The General Rules shall be held to apply to all Officers, Nurses, and Employees of the Hospital, and shall be read in conjunction with, but subordinate to, any Industrial Award or Agreement.

13. A copy of the following Rules, so far as they relate to his or her office, shall be furnished to each officer on appointment, and such officer shall in all respects conform to the Rules of the Institution and obey the directions of the head of his department, subject to the general supervision of the Chief Resident Medical Officer,

the Secretary, or the Matron, and shall sign an acknowledgment of having received such copy.

14. No officer, servant, or other person employed in the Institution shall take directly or indirectly a fee or reward from any patient, visitor, or tradesman, or other person supplying or who is desirous of supplying the Institution, and no officer, servant, or employee shall remove or permit to be removed any stores, clothing, or other articles the property of the Institution without the sanction of the Secretary. Any person infringing this Rule shall be liable to instant dismissal.

15. No officer, servant, or any person employed in the Institution shall absent himself from duty without the permission of the Chief Resident Medical Officer, the Secretary, or the Matron.

16. Smoking while on duty is strictly prohibited, and no officer, employee, or other person shall bring any intoxicating liquor into the Institution or allow it to be brought in, except with the special permission of the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

17. No employee or other person shall be permitted to have any article made or repaired on the premises by tradesmen employed in the Institution.

18. No person excepting a member of the Medical Staff, the Secretary or the Matron shall admit any stranger into any part of the Institution.

19. All bags, parcels, and packages removed from the Hospital shall be liable to inspection by the Secretary or some person deputed by him.

20. No officer or employee shall purchase or obtain for the Institution any goods without a written order, signed by the Secretary.

21. No entertainments or social gatherings shall be held within the Hospital precincts without the permission of the Chairman of the Board.

22. None but patients and resident staff shall sleep on the Hospital premises without the permission of the Chairman.

23. No member of the Resident Medical Staff shall entertain any visitor at the Hospital after 12 midnight.

24. Members of the staff in need of medical advice shall make application for same through their respective heads, and in all cases of sickness occurring outside the Hospital, members of the staff shall place themselves under the care of the Chief Resident Medical Officer as early as possible.

25. Officers in charge of Departments shall see that there is no extravagance or waste of stores or of property in their respective Departments, and shall co-operate with the Secretary in the general prevention of extravagance and waste.

26. Members of the staff shall submit themselves to such prophylactic inoculation as the Board may from time to time decide.

26a. No officer, member of the nursing staff, or any other employee shall supply to any person, other than his superior officer, information relating to any patient which comes to his knowledge in the course of his duties or through his employment in the hospital.

Admission and discharge of Patients.

27. No person shall be recommended or received for treatment who is able to pay for treatment outside the Hospital, except accident or emergency cases, such accident or emergency case may be charged fees on a reasonable scale.

28. In-patients shall be liable to pay towards the cost of such treatment, but the amount chargeable shall be 8s. per day. If any patient cannot pay any hospital fee or can pay only portion of the fee above specified and satisfies the Secretary accordingly, then that officer shall report to the Board with a view to the remission of the whole or portion of the Hospital fee as the case may be. Except in cases of emergency the hours of admission of patients shall be between 11 a.m. and 12 noon and 2 and 3 p.m.

29. The Chief Resident Medical Officer shall not admit as an in-patient, except cases of emergency, unless reported to the Board:—

(1) Any pregnant female for the purpose of confinement.

(2) Children under the age of thirteen.

30. All patients shall be discharged from the Hospital on the written authority of the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board or in case of misconduct; but those wishing to leave the Hospital otherwise than provided for above shall be discharged at their own request. All discharges shall be signed by the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

Discharges of patients from Hospital shall be made daily at an hour to be decided by resolution of the Board from time to time; except in any special case, when the time of discharge may be arranged with the officer dealing with the final discharge of patients.

Out-Patients.

31. No person shall receive treatment as an out-patient who is able to pay for treatment outside the Hospital, or is a member of a benefit society, except cases of accident or emergency. Such accident or emergency case may be charged on a reasonable scale.

32. Out-patients, when able to pay, shall pay as follows:—

In-Patients.

33. On the admission of any patient into the Hospital, his address and that of his immediate relatives or friends, together with telephone number (if any) and the name of the professed religion of the patient, together with the name of his or her employer, shall be taken by the nurse and sent to the office.

34. The effects of the patient shall be taken, in the case of male patients by the orderly and in the case of female patients by the nurse, and recorded in the Property Book and signed by the patient; in the case of unconscious patients, a second orderly or nurse shall check the patient's property and sign the book recording the fact.

35. All valuables received in accordance with the rule immediately preceding shall be handed by the orderly or nurse, as the case may be, to the Secretary, or to the Officer appointed by him for the purpose, for safe-keeping. Every care shall be taken of all such valuables, but the Board will not be responsible for any loss or deficiency.

36. Deceased patients' clothing unclaimed three months after decease will be destroyed or disposed of.

37. On no account shall any officer, servant, patient or visitor be allowed to keep a dog within the precincts of the Hospital.

38. Any patient found gambling or using profane language, or being intoxicated, or committing any breach of any rule or any order of the Board or any Medical Officer shall be liable to instant dismissal by the Chief Resident Medical Officer, who may exercise that power, report the case to the Board, and inform the patient of the day of the next meeting of the Board.

39. Patients are not allowed to leave the precincts of the Hospital without the special permission of the Chief Resident Medical Officer, given by "pass," which must be left with the hall porter.

40. Patients shall take their meals at the ward table, except in cases of necessity. They shall keep their beds neat and tidy, the bedclothes properly arranged, and attend scrupulously to personal cleanliness. They shall also observe a quiet and respectful demeanour towards the Officers of the Hospital, the nurses, and each other.

41. Any complaint for the consideration of the Board shall be made in writing to the Chief Resident Medical Officer before or at the time the patient leaves the Hospital. Such complaints shall be inquired into by the Chief Resident Medical Officer and reported to the Chairman.

Moral and Religious Instruction.

42. Ministers of religion visiting the Hospital for the purpose of administering religious instruction to the patients shall visit the patients of their respective denominations only, and shall conduct their ministrations so as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients.

43. The time for visits to patients by clergymen or religious workers is limited to the hours between 2 and 4 p.m., except in special or urgent cases, which they may attend at any time with the sanction of the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

44. Ministers will not be allowed to remain in the wards during the professional visits of the medical officers except under special circumstances.

45. It is not allowable to conduct public religious service in the sick wards of the Hospital.

Visitors.

46. Children in arms may not be admitted. Any friends, not exceeding two at any one time, may, unless prohibited by the Chief Resident Medical Officer, be admitted to the wards to visit patients on Wednesdays and Sundays between the hours of 2 and 4 p.m. (A bell will be rung five minutes before the hour for departure.)

47. Visitors at any other time will only be allowed by special permission of the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

48. Visitors shall not bring stimulants of any kind into the Hospital. All parcels intended for the patients, howsoever introduced, shall be delivered to the nurse in charge of the ward, who will write the name of the patient on the parcel and take charge of the same until passed by the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

49. Visitors shall not interfere with the members of the staff, nor disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise. They shall remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting.

50. No person may perform any legal ceremony or act in connection with a patient, such as marriage, making of a will, signing a document, etc., in the Hospital without first having obtained permission from the Chief Resident Medical Officer, and these must be witnessed by the Chief Resident Medical Officer or Secretary.

51. Visitors shall not loiter in halls or offices or on stairways, and shall leave the Hospital promptly at the end of visiting hours.

Honorary Medical Staff.

52. The Honorary Medical Staff shall be appointed by the Board, and shall consist of the following officers: Two or more Consultants, two Anaesthetists, four Surgeons, four Assistant Surgeons, four Physicians, four Assistant Physicians, two Gynaecologists, two Assistant Gynaecologists, two Ophthalmic Surgeons, two Assistant Ophthalmic Surgeons, two Ear and Throat Surgeons, one Orthopaedic Surgeon, one Physician for Infectious Diseases, one Physician for Skin Diseases, one Pathologist and Bacteriologist, one Tuberculosis Officer, two Dentists, two Radiologists, one Medical Registrar, one Surgical Registrar. These Officers shall be appointed for a term not exceeding three years. They shall be eligible for re-appointment, but liable to removal at any time by the Board. Vacancies in the positions of Surgeon to in-patients or of Physician to in-patients occurring during their currency shall be filled for the unexpired term of the office by the Senior Assistant being appointed by the Board to the vacancy, and the vacant Assistant post filled after advertising. They shall hold office until their successors are appointed.

53. The Board may appoint as Honorary Consultant Surgeon or Physician any Honorary Medical Officer who has held office as an Honorary Medical Officer for a period of ten years, or who has heretofore held, or may hereafter hold, office as an Honorary Medical Officer to the Hospital for a period of ten years. Such Surgeons or Physicians shall attend at the Hospital when summoned for consultations.

54. The hours and days of attendance and duties, etc., of these Honorary Medical Officers shall be controlled by rules made from time to time by the Board of Management.

55. Members of the Honorary Medical Staff shall attend and prescribe for the in-patients allotted to them.

56. They shall visit their wards at least twice a week, and shall, as far as possible, adhere to the appointed days and hours.

57. Patients shall be admitted to the beds of the physicians and surgeons as uniformly as possible. When the beds of the physicians and surgeons (for in-patients) are all full, any vacant beds belonging to the assistant or out-patient physicians or surgeons shall be filled in order of their seniority. Honorary medical officers may recommend cases suitable for admission to the beds allotted to them if vacant.

58. No patient who has been in the Hospital under treatment of one honorary medical officer shall be placed in the bed of another for treatment for the same disease within a period of three months, except by mutual arrangement.

59. The transfer of patients from the medical to the surgical side of the Hospital, or to a Special Department, or *vice versa*, shall be made when necessary, and the name of the Honorary Medical Officer to whom such transfer is to be made shall be endorsed on the treatment sheet by the Chief Resident Medical Officer and the

Honorary Medical Officer concerned, and the patient so ordered to be removed shall be transferred with the least possible delay.

60. The Honorary Medical Officers, or subject to their control, the Resident Medical Officer shall from time to time, order in writing on the treatment sheet, the particular diet to be supplied to each patient, and no diet except what is ordered on the treatment sheet shall be issued.

61. No important operation shall be performed without the previous consent of the patient or his or her responsible relation or guardian where the consent can possibly be obtained, but the life of a patient is not to be endangered by delay for this purpose.

62. In any consultation which may be held opinions shall be recorded on the patient's head-sheet.

63. There shall be a book called the "Honorary Medical Officers' Attendance Book," which shall show the actual attendance of each Honorary Medical Officer and be signed by them on each visit.

64. In the absence of a physician or surgeon, his work shall be done by the corresponding Assistant Physician or Assistant Surgeon, as the case may be. In the absence of the Assistant Physician or Assistant Surgeon, the work shall be done by the corresponding Registrar. In the absence of Ophthalmic Surgeons, the Ear, Nose, and Throat Surgeons, their work shall be done by the Assistant Ophthalmic Surgeon or the Assistant Ear, Nose, and Throat Surgeon, as the case may be, if such exist. In the absence of any other member of the Honorary Medical Staff, the Chief Resident Medical Officer shall arrange for the performance of the duty.

65. If any member of the Honorary Medical Staff absents himself from duty for more than 14 consecutive days, he shall apply for leave; if for a lesser period he shall notify the Chief Resident Medical Officer. Absence without leave may render an Officer liable to have his position declared vacant, except under special circumstances.

66. The Assistant Honorary Medical Officers shall attend twice a week to see and prescribe for the out-patients allotted to them.

67. In the event of any Physician or Surgeon to out-patients failing to attend within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for his attendance, the Chief Resident Medical Officer may arrange for the examination and treatment of his patients.

The Chief Resident Medical Officer.

68. The Chief Resident Medical Officer shall be appointed by the Board, and be a duly qualified medical practitioner, residing in the Hospital.

69. He shall be the executive Medical Officer of the Board, and shall be responsible to the Board in all matters of a professional nature.

70. He shall have the entire control of patients, and shall be responsible to the Board for the conduct of officers and servants placed under his supervision.

71. He shall have power to dismiss any servant under his control not appointed by the Board and to suspend any officer under his control and report immediately to the Chairman.

72. He shall be responsible for the classification of patients on their admission, and in the absence of the Honorary Medical Officers shall have full power to arrange the treatment of patients in cases in which urgent circumstances appear to him to render it necessary.

73. He shall see that accurate records of all cases treated in the Hospital are kept.

74. He shall have charge of, and be responsible for, the surgical instruments and apparatus, and may cause ordinary repairs to be effected thereto, and on taking office shall sign the inventory in proof of the correctness thereof. No new instrument shall be ordered, and no alterations or additions to any instrument or apparatus shall be made except on his written direction.

75. He shall summon the police to take charge of any case of attempted suicide or criminal violence, and after such time shall not be responsible for the detention of the patient.

76. He shall not undertake any medical or surgical work in the wards except in cases of emergency or in the absence of the Honorary Medical Officers. By general supervision he shall see that all members of the staff under his control strictly perform their respective duties and carry out the instructions given them.

77. He shall keep an inventory of all instruments and apparatus the property of the Hospital.

78. He shall have full power to admit or refuse to admit the friends of any patient, as he may think fit, and may, at his discretion, forbid admission of visitors to a ward at any time.

79. He shall cause the Honorary Medical Officer to be informed of the death of any patient under his care.

80. He shall visit the wards at least once a day; he shall see that the orders of the Honorary Medical Officers are carried out; that the medicines are of a proper quality and properly administered, and shall give particular attention to the temperature and ventilation of the wards.

81. He shall deliver a course of lectures to the Nursing Staff.

82. He shall devote his entire time to the services of the Hospital, and shall not engage in private practice.

83. He shall afford the Board every information, and furnish them with reports on all important matters within his control.

84. He shall not lend patients' registers, books, documents, or property belonging to the Hospital or permit them to be removed without permission of the Chairman.

85. He shall be the nominal representative of the Board in cases in which the Hospital may sue or is sued in Court on a professional matter, and in all official communications or documents pertaining thereto, he shall sign as representing the Board, unless otherwise directed by the Board.

86. He shall direct all correspondence with the outside public in reference to the treatment or condition of patients, and no communications shall be made except with his consent or by his directions.

87. He shall make arrangements for all necessary communications to the Press touching cases of accident or assault admitted to the Hospital.

88. He shall furnish the Board with the information required for the medical portion of the annual report.

89. He shall always be available on the days of the Board meetings, and shall furnish a Monthly Report.

90. He shall obtain the approval of the Chairman for leave of absence for more than twenty-four hours.

91. He shall report to the Chairman if unable to carry out his duties through illness.

92. He shall direct the Resident Medical Officers in all matters relating to their duties.

93. He shall have under his care all patients admitted until seen by the Honorary Medical Officer under whose care they have been admitted.

94. He shall, on admission of all patients into the wards have recorded their previous history, and in severe cases frequent notes of their progress and treatment shall be made by the Resident Medical Officers.

95. He shall preserve secrecy in regard to all matters that may come to his knowledge in the course of his professional duties, and shall not furnish any information, except with the consent of the patients concerned, in writing.

96. He shall be responsible for the efficiency of the Operating Theatres.

97. He shall not perform any operation without the consent of the Honorary Medical Officer having charge of the case, except in cases of special emergency.

98. On the admission of a serious case he shall forthwith cause the Honorary Medical Officer into whose bed the case has been admitted, to be communicated with. In the case of his inability to attend, the Assistant Honorary Medical Officer shall be communicated with, and in the case of his inability to attend a corresponding Registrar shall be communicated with. Should none of those officers be available the Chief Resident Medical Officer shall immediately take such steps as he may deem advisable in the interest of the patient.

99. He shall submit to the Chairman all matters he may consider desirable to bring under the notice of the Board.

100. He may at his discretion examine the articles delivered by contractors and tradesmen, and should he deem it necessary, confer with the Secretary or Matron as to the quality of goods and the conditions of contract.

101. He shall inspect the wards, buildings, kitchen, laundry, and other portions of the Hospital as he may deem necessary, and, when necessary, report on their condition of the Board.

102. He shall confer with the Secretary in matters affecting the general administration of the Hospital as a whole, and shall endeavour to mutually agree with him before submitting to the Board proposals affecting any radical alterations in administration or large expenditure of money.

103. He shall perform such other professional duties as may from time to time be determined by the Board.

104. He shall control and supervise the Massage Staff and Nurses employed on other work than purely nursing.

The Senior Resident Medical Officer.

105. The Senior Resident Medical Officer shall assist the Chief Resident Medical Officer generally in the medical administration of the Hospital.

106. He shall be responsible to the Chief Resident Medical Officer for the writing up of the history of each new patient by the Junior Medical Officer within 24 hours of admission.

107. He shall do such post mortems, public or hospital as shall be determined by the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

108. He shall, subject to the Chief Resident Medical Officer and the Honorary Medical Officer, have charge of the Tuberculosis Clinic.

109. In temporary absence or non-arrival at due time of O.P. Physicians or Surgeons he shall carry out his duties.

110. He shall, in the absence of the Chief Resident Medical Officer, act for him in all matters requiring the attention of the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

111. He shall as far as possible supervise the administration of anæsthetic by new Junior Resident Medical Officers for their first month of duty.

112. In the absence of the Chief Resident Medical Officer he shall carry out the regular admission of patients, morning and afternoon.

Junior Resident Medical Officers.

113. Junior Resident Medical Officers shall be legally qualified medical practitioners registered in Western Australia.

114. They shall reside on the Hospital premises and shall not engage in private practice, and shall devote the whole of their time to the service of the Hospital.

115. They shall have charge of wards and carry out such duties as may be determined by the Chief Resident Medical Officer, and shall carry out the instructions of the Honorary Staff and accompany them on their visits to their patients.

116. They shall record the previous history and the present condition of patients under their charge within 24 hours of admission and keep a carefully written record of their progress and treatment.

117. They shall commence their duties not later than 9 a.m., and shall visit the wards every night. They shall undertake any investigation calculated to elucidate the history and symptoms of any case.

118. They shall carefully instruct the Nurse-in-charge of the ward as to diet, and the administration of all remedies prescribed.

119. They shall preserve secrecy in regard to all matters that may come to their knowledge in the course of their professional duties.

120. They shall cause the Honorary Medical Officers to be informed of any serious change in the condition of patients under their care.

121. They shall notify the Chief Resident Medical Officer of all operations about to be performed, or when a consultation is to be called.

122. They shall obtain the permission of the patient or of the responsible relation or guardian of a patient about to be operated on, and so report to the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

123. They shall consult with the Chief Resident Medical Officer in all serious cases.

124. They shall assist in the administration of anæsthetics and all operations when required by the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

125. They shall be considered to be on duty when within the Hospital precincts.

126. They shall report immediately to the Chief Resident Medical Officer if unable to discharge their duties through illness.

127. They shall not be absent from the Hospital during their hours of duty unless they have obtained leave from the Chief Resident Medical Officer, and an arrangement sanctioned for the performance of their

duties during their absence. They shall not be absent from the Hospital later than 12 p.m. without obtaining leave from the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

128. The Casualty Officers shall enter all casualty cases in the Register. They shall be held responsible for prompt attendance on all casualty cases and cases of emergency, and shall report all serious cases without delay to the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

129. If a patient who is detained for observation leaves the Hospital without permission they shall at once notify the police in order that the police should take action, if necessary.

130. There shall always be in the Hospital at least three Junior Resident Medical Officers.

131. When the Chief Resident Medical Officer is absent from the Hospital the Senior Resident Medical Officer, or an officer appointed by the Chief Resident Medical Officer, shall act as his deputy and shall report to him all cases of admissions, etc., on his return.

132. Junior Resident Medical Officers shall perform such other duties as the Board may from time to time determine.

Pathologist and Bacteriologist.

133. The Pathologist and Bacteriologist shall be appointed by the Board, and be responsible to the Chief Resident Medical Officer for the efficient carrying out of such duties as he may from time to time direct.

Radiographer.

134. The Radiographer shall be appointed by the Board and shall be subject to the control of the Chief Resident Medical Officer. He shall be responsible for the due efficiency and maintenance of the plant under his care.

Dispensary.

135. The Dispenser shall be a legally qualified Pharmaceutical Chemist, registered in Western Australia.

136. He shall obey the directions of the Chief Resident Medical Officer in all matters, and shall be responsible to him for the efficiency and cleanliness of the Dispensary.

137. He shall be responsible for the correct dispensing of the prescriptions of the Medical Staff.

138. He shall report to the Chief Resident Medical Officer any apparent mistake in the prescriptions.

139. He shall be responsible that all prescriptions made up, other than those entered on the Hospital Treatment Sheets, are entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, with date and record number inserted on the label.

140. He shall label every medicine dispensed with the name of the patient for whom it is prescribed, and with the time and manner of using it, taking care to renew the label when necessary.

141. He shall take care that all preparations for external use only shall be so labelled, and if they be of a poisonous nature must attach a "POISON" label. Every bottle containing powerful drugs prescribed for patients shall have a "CAUTION" label affixed to it.

142. He shall have charge of the dispensary and shall be responsible for extravagance or waste of material, and so far as practicable prepare all pills and infusions, plasters, or other medicine on the premises.

143. The Dispensary storekeeper shall enter in a drugs requisition book such drugs and sundries as may be required, and after consultation with the Dispenser shall submit the requisition to the Chief Resident Medical Officer and Secretary. He shall maintain such records as shall be required by these officers.

144. The Dispenser shall requisition to the dispensary storekeeper by chit for requirements from the dispensary store.

145. The Assistant Dispensers shall be under the control of the Dispenser.

The Secretary.

146. The Secretary shall be appointed by the Board and shall devote the whole of his time to the service of the Hospital.

147. He shall be the executive officer of the Board in all matters of a non-professional character.

148. He shall be responsible to the Board for the conduct of officers and servants under his control and for the safe-keeping of property and stores placed by the Board in his charge.

149. He shall summon and attend all meetings of the Board and of Committees.

150. He shall prepare necessary agenda papers for all meetings of the Board or Committees and shall report to each meeting of the Board.

151. He shall see, as far as practicable, that all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are carried into effect.

152. He shall be responsible for the office administration and for the keeping of proper books of account and the maintenance of records and correspondence.

153. He shall sign all orders for supplies of stores and provisions, and see that all such supplies are of the proper quality and description and according to the requisition issued, and in case they do not correspond, he shall have power to return the same, provided that in all supplies of a medical or surgical nature the Chief Resident Medical Officer shall be the judge of quality and suitability. No goods shall be obtained for the Hospital without an order.

154. He shall obtain quotations in respect to all purchases exceeding two pounds in value, except where approved contracts exist.

155. He shall frequently examine the articles delivered by contractors and tradesmen, and if necessary report to the Board any serious defect.

156. He shall be responsible for the issue of all stores under a proper system, and shall see that the provisions and other necessaries required for daily consumption are duly weighed or measured by the store-keeper.

157. He shall see that proper store-keeping systems are maintained in all departments, except as provided for in Rule 77, and shall cause stocktakings to be taken on the 30th June in each year, or as often as may be deemed necessary.

158. He shall keep a record of the quantities of alcoholic liquors received into the Hospital and distributed to the patients.

159. He shall carefully examine all claims for provisions and other articles and make up the accounts for presentation to the Finance Committee and Board.

160. He shall be responsible for the proper receipt and payment of all moneys in connection with the business of the Hospital.

161. He shall receive all properties and moneys from patients and enter particulars thereof in a book kept for the purpose, giving receipts therefor; and on the discharge of the owner he shall return the same, taking a proper receipt. He may at his discretion deduct any money therefrom as a contribution by the patient towards the cost of his or her maintenance in the Hospital. Provided that in the event of a patient dying in the Hospital, the Secretary shall hand over any properties and moneys received as aforesaid, taking a proper receipt after deducting from any money thus received the amount of the patient's contribution to—

(a) The legal representative of the deceased patient such properties and moneys after allowing for such deductions, as aforesaid, upon production of probate or letters of administration; or

(b) To the Curator of Intestate Estates.

162. He shall before entering upon his duties provide security in the sum of £500, to be approved by the Board, and the premiums thereon shall from time to time be paid by the Board.

163. He shall keep a Staff Register showing in relation to each member of the Staff of the Hospital, the periods of employment and of annual leave or sick leave granted, and by whom such sick leave was approved.

164. He shall immediately communicate with the relations or friends of a patient placed on the danger list, and in the event of death of such patient.

165. He shall be responsible for properly handing over all bodies to legally authorised persons.

166. He shall keep a "General Register," which shall show the name and address of every patient, the disease, date of admission and discharge, and such other particulars as may be decided from time to time.

167. This Rule was deleted by the Board of Management, May 13, 1926.

168. He shall see that the following monthly reports, with such others as may be ordered, are submitted to the Chairman and Board—

- (1) Return of all in and out patients.
- (2) Return of patients in Hospital for more than sixty days.
- (3) Return of attendance of Honorary Medical Staff.

169. He shall supervise the maintenance of grounds, buildings and plant, and shall cause such urgent repairs, as may be necessary, to be effected.

170. He shall have power to engage employees on a weekly wage working under an Arbitration Award or Agreement.

171. He shall have power to dismiss any person under his control not appointed by the Board and to suspend any officer under his control and report immediately to the Chairman.

172. He shall confer with the Chief Resident Medical Officer in matters affecting the general administration of the Hospital as a whole, and shall endeavour to mutually agree with him before submitting to the Board proposals affecting any radical alterations in administration or large expenditure of money.

173. He shall be the nominal representative of the institution in cases in which the Hospital may sue or be sued in any court for debt, and in all communications or documents he shall sign as representing the Board unless otherwise directed by the Board.

174. Where any of the foregoing Rules specify that any duty shall be performed by the Secretary personally it shall be interpreted to mean that the officer is responsible for that duty being performed, either by himself personally or by officers under his control and direction and for whose work he is responsible.

175. Male employees whose supervision and control by a senior officer is not otherwise provided for in these Rules shall be under the authority of the Secretary.

The Clerical Staff.

176. The Clerical Staff shall be under the direct control of the Secretary, and shall carry out such duties as he may from time to time specify.

177. Any clerk shall, when required by the Board, before entering upon his duties, provide security in a sum to be fixed by the Board, and the premiums thereon shall be from time to time paid by the Board.

The Storekeeper.

178. The Storekeeper shall, under the direction of the Secretary, keep a register of all stores and provisions, etc., received and issued by him.

179. He shall examine all stores supplied to the institution, and see that everything is carefully weighed, measured, and checked, and shall be responsible that all contractors deliver their goods in strict accordance with their contract.

180. He shall note any errors in their respective bills, and refuse to take delivery of or return articles which are of an inferior quality, reporting all deficiencies and defects to the Secretary, to whom he shall furnish a return of everything received.

181. He shall be present at and check the receipt of goods and articles delivered from the store under his charge, and shall not allow orderlies or other servants in the store, except under his immediate supervision, neither shall he entrust the keys of the store to anyone without being so authorised by the Secretary.

182. He shall issue all stores required in connection with the several departments of the Hospital at the appointed hour.

183. He shall keep a correct record of all articles in his department received and issued in the institution.

184. He shall not issue stores of any kind without the written authority of the Secretary or officer authorised by him or the Chief Resident Medical Officer, and shall be responsible that no portion of the property in his charge be wasted or removed from the Hospital.

185. He shall be careful to see that there is always on hand a good stock of all necessary stores, and that mattresses and pillows are ready for distribution to the wards when necessary.

186. He shall requisition for and receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors and tradesmen, and see that they correspond in description, quality, and quantity with the tenders and orders; and in case they do not correspond he shall immediately report to the Secretary.

Head Orderlies.

187. They shall be subject to the general control of the Secretary, and shall be responsible to him for the good conduct and discipline of the Orderlies under their charge.

188. They shall make themselves fully acquainted with the Rules and Regulations of the Hospital, and shall, under pain of dismissal, report all irregularities and breaches of discipline by the men under their charge.

189. They shall make daily inspections of the grounds of the Hospital and premises, for the cleanliness of which they are responsible, and shall report to the Secretary any articles for repair and other matters needing attention.

190. They shall not allow any patient or employee to go out without leave, in writing, from the Chief Resident Medical Officer, Secretary, or Matron.

The Matron.

191. The Matron shall be appointed by the Board and be responsible to the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

192. She shall be the Superintendent of Nursing and shall be responsible for the efficiency, welfare, discipline, and training of the Nursing Staff.

193. She shall control the work of the Housekeeper as provided for in Rule 259.

194. She shall submit to the Board the names and particulars of suitable candidates for the position of Probationers.

195. She shall visit and inspect the wards daily to see that instructions are carried out and that strict economy is observed in the use of fuel, light, etc.

196. She shall be responsible for the maintenance of all bedding and linen in the wards and Nursing Home, and see that these are kept up to proper standard.

197. She shall see that all infected bedding and linen is submitted for cleansing and disinfection.

198. She shall submit a report to the Board at each meeting after discussion with the Chief Resident Medical Officer on the general state of the Nursing Staff or any other matter which she may deem it her duty to bring under the notice of the Board.

199. She shall keep a register showing the various duties each Nurse has performed during her three years' training.

200. She shall be responsible for the general management of the Nurses' Home and for the discipline and conduct of all staff resident in the Home.

201. She shall check the standard equipment of all departments under her charge at the 30th June in each year and report any discrepancy to the Secretary.

202. She shall arrange the annual leave of absence of the Nursing Staff and exercise her discretion in the issue of passes for special purposes.

203. She shall, on the illness of a member of the Nursing or Domestic Staff, cause her to be attended by the Chief Resident Medical Officer, until placed under the care of an Honorary Medical Officer.

204. She shall see that no waste of provisions or destruction of Hospital property shall occur in any department under her control. She shall exercise a close scrutiny over the expenditure in her department and shall confer with the Chief Resident Medical Officer and Secretary with a view to securing proper economy.

205. She shall daily check the diet sheets for patients, and shall be responsible for handing same over to the Housekeeper.

205a. She shall have power to dismiss any servant under her control not appointed by the Board, and to suspend any officer under her control and report immediately to the Chairman.

General Rules for the Nursing Staff.

206. The Nursing Staff shall be punctual in attending their respective wards at the appointed hours.

207. The Nursing Staff shall not enter any wards, departments or quarters in which they are not working unless by special permission. They shall not remain in their wards when off duty and shall not enter the wards otherwise than in the prescribed uniform.

208. The Nursing Staff shall exercise kindness and attention in the care of patients and observe due respect in the discharge of their duties, and obey without question the orders of their superior officers.

209. They shall regard as secret and confidential any information that may come to their knowledge in the course of their nursing duties, and shall not divulge to any other than one in authority the disease or treatment of any patient.

210. Any complaint of a member of the Nursing Staff shall be made direct to the Matron.

211. The Nursing Staff shall not receive friends in their bedrooms nor interview them in the entrance hall of the main building, or in passages, or verandahs or wards. The Matron may grant permission for friends to be received in the home sitting room.

212. Members of the Nursing Staff shall not enter each other's rooms after 10 p.m., and all lights are to be extinguished by 10.30 p.m.

213. Any member of the Nursing Staff disobeying the Rules of the Hospital, neglecting her work, or being insubordinate in her conduct, renders herself liable to be suspended from duty and to be reported to the Board.

214. Members of the Nursing Staff must be in Hospital by 10 p.m. unless a late pass has been granted by the Matron provided that Sisters may remain out until 11 p.m.

215. No Nurse may give medicine except on the written order of a Medical Officer.

216. No Pupil Nurse or Probationer shall administer medicines unless the Chief Resident Medical Officer and Matron are satisfied of her ability to do so.

217. No hypodermic injection shall be given to any patient except on a written order by a Medical Officer, and then only after the prescription, the preparation, and the dose have been checked by a Sister or Medical Officer.

218. No hypodermic injection shall be given by a Pupil Nurse of under one year's training.

219. When prevented by illness from attending duty, the Nursing Staff shall forthwith report to the Matron or the Sister of the ward or Home Sister. No member of the Nursing Staff shall seek medical advice within the Hospital on her own initiative.

Special Rules for Sisters.

220. They shall be responsible for the carrying out of all orders given by the Honorary and Resident Medical Officers in reference to the treatment and diet of patients.

221. They shall be responsible to the Matron for all linen, bedding, furniture and utensils of all kinds supplied for use in the wards and offices.

222. On the occurrence of any serious symptoms or decided change in the condition of a patient they shall immediately report in writing to the Resident Medical Officer concerned.

223. On the death of a patient, they shall immediately notify the fact in writing to the Resident Medical Officer, Secretary, and Matron, and shall send the head sheet to the Chief Resident Medical Officer within one hour after death.

224. On the admission of a patient, they shall cause an inventory to be taken of all clothes and effects, and otherwise see that Rule 34 is strictly complied with.

225. They are to carefully train the Probationers and Pupil Nurses under their charge in ward work and other duties, seeing that they treat the patients with kindness and attention, and that they are obedient to the Rules.

226. In the event of any patient requiring the presence of any Minister of Religion they shall see that notice is sent to the Head Orderly in order that there may be no delay in complying with the request.

227. They shall see that their wards are ready for the doctor's visit by 9 a.m.

228. They shall see that all lights are lowered punctually at 7.30 p.m.

229. They shall see that a full report of the condition of the patients under their care is left in writing for the Night Nurse, and shall send a report in writing to the Head Orderly daily at 9 a.m. showing the condition of each patient.

230. They shall see that Hospital clothing is removed and left in the ward before a discharged patient leaves the institution.

231. They shall report any misconduct on the part of any patient to the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

232. They shall notify the Junior Resident Medical Officer concerned of the admission of each patient, and must not cease duty until the patient has been seen by such Medical Officer and treatment been ordered.

233. They shall be responsible for the poison cupboard in their wards, and shall give or receive a written receipt at each handing over of the keys.

Superintendent of Night Nurses.

234. The Superintendent of Night Nurses shall every evening receive reports in writing from the Ward Sisters or Nurses in Charge regarding the symptoms and condition of each patient, with directions respecting the prescribed treatment in each case.

235. She shall visit each ward as often as possible during the night, and shall satisfy herself that each of the Night Nurses is satisfactorily performing her duties.

236. She shall enforce all Rules, Regulations, and orders relating to the patients, and shall, as far as possible, see to the administration of the medicines and nourishment by the Night Nursing Staff.

237. She shall be responsible for the Night Nurses' written reports.

238. She shall maintain a general supervision over the whole institution during her hours of duty, and promptly report to the Chief Resident Medical Officer or Matron any irregularities or deficiencies she may observe.

239. She shall see that Night Nurses go on and come off duty at the appointed time. She shall not allow any Night Nurse to be absent from her post without permission.

240. She shall submit a written report to the Matron every morning on the state of the nursing during the previous night, the condition of the patients, and any deaths which may have occurred.

241. In all other respects the Superintendent shall conform to the Rules and Regulations affecting Sisters generally.

Theatre Charge Nurse.

242. The Theatre Sister or Charge Nurse shall keep an inventory of all instruments under her charge, and allow no instrument or apparatus to be removed from the Theatre.

243. She shall see that the Theatres are thoroughly and regularly cleansed, always ready for immediate use, and when not in use kept locked.

244. She shall not enter the wards of the Hospital.

Out-patient Charge Nurse.

245. The Out-patient Sister or Charge Nurse shall keep an inventory of all instruments under her charge, and allow no instrument or apparatus to be removed from the Out-patient Department.

246. She shall see that the Out-patient Department is thoroughly, regularly, and completely cleansed.

247. She shall not enter the wards of the Hospital.

Admission and Training of Pupil Nurses.

248. Candidates for admission as Probationers of the Perth Hospital Training School shall not be under 21 nor over 30 years of age, and must be of average physique. Provided that where no applicant of the required age is available, the Board may, on recommendation of the Chief Resident Medical Officer and Matron, sanction the appointment at any age.

249. They shall produce satisfactory evidence (in the form of two letters from responsible persons other than relatives) of good character, good health, intelligence, and general fitness of disposition and temperament for the duties of a nurse.

250. Application for admission as Probationer shall be made upon the proper form. A record of all such applications shall be kept by the Matron.

251. Every applicant shall submit to medical examination by the Chief Resident Medical Officer.

252. Candidates approved by the Board shall be received on trial for a period of three months. If at the end of that period the reports of the Chief Resident Medical Officer and Matron are favourable they shall then be accepted as Pupil Nurses. The probationary period shall be subject to seven days' notice on either side.

253. A Pupil Nurse shall engage to serve the Hospital for a term of three years, the probationary period of three months to be included in the three years.

254. Should it appear to the Chief Resident Medical Officer and Matron during the first year of training of any Pupil Nurse that she is unlikely to make an efficient Nurse, the Chief Resident Medical Officer shall report the fact to the Board, and on its approval she shall be allowed to resign or be discharged.

255. Probationers and Pupil Nurses shall wear the prescribed dress.

256. Pupil Nurses shall be examined at the end of each year, and upon the subjects on which they have received instruction during the year as set forth in the syllabus, and shall receive a certificate of training on the satisfactory completion of their training.

257. Pupil Nurses shall not be entitled to sit for examination unless they have attended the prescribed course of lectures.

258. Pupil Nurses of any year who fail to pass the annual examination may be permitted, at the discretion of the Board, on the recommendation of the Matron, to

remain for a further period not exceeding six months, and may be then afforded another opportunity of presenting themselves for examination. Should they then succeed in passing the examination, they will be allowed to proceed with the course; but, should they fail on this occasion the Board may further review their case.

The Housekeeper.

259. The Housekeeper shall be subject to the Matron under whose direction she shall act, provided that in all matters concerning the finances of the Hospital she shall be responsible to the Secretary.

260. She shall have control of, and be responsible for, the diligence and efficiency of all servants placed under her supervision.

261. She shall have power to engage servants, but shall not dismiss any servant without reference to the Matron.

262. She shall personally inspect the sleeping apartments of the female servants, and see that they are kept clean, well ventilated and tidy.

263. She shall check the correctness of weights and quantities of all articles of food delivered to her department and certify to the receipt thereof.

264. She shall make herself acquainted with the terms of contract for articles supplied to her department.

265. She shall be responsible for the economic, efficient, and careful management of the kitchen, which she shall personally supervise. She shall immediately report any defect or inefficiency to the Secretary.

266. She shall examine the household linen when returned from the laundry, and shall be responsible to the Matron for its being kept in an efficient state of repair.

267. She shall personally superintend the issue of all meals from the kitchen, and shall be responsible for the proper quantity of each article of diet being carefully issued to the wards and quarters.

268. She shall hand daily to the Storekeeper not later than 8.30 a.m. the diet roll for patients and the quantity.

269. She shall have delivered to the cook daily the proper quantity of provisions for the day's consumption, according to the diet scales for patients and staff.

270. She shall render such returns or information as may be required.

Cooks.

271. They shall be under the immediate control of the Housekeeper and reside on the premises. They shall attend to, and be responsible for, the efficiency of the cooking, and shall report any defect at once to the Housekeeper.

272. They shall be responsible for all utensils placed under their charge, and see that their department is kept in a thorough state of cleanliness.

273. They shall see that all meals are served punctually in accordance with the time table.

Annual Leave.

274. After the first year of service the following officers shall be entitled to holidays as under:—

(a.) The Chief Resident Medical Officer, Secretary, Matron, and the Nursing Staff, twenty-eight days per annum in two periods of fourteen days each on full salary.

(b.) The Pathologist, Charge Nurses and Nurses, Housekeeper, and Dispenser, twenty-one days per annum on full salary.

(c.) The Senior Resident Medical Officer, the Junior Resident Medical Officers, and all other employees, fourteen days on full salary.

275. Holidays exceeding twenty-four hours in duration shall be included in the above leave.

276. Officers and employees shall be required to take their holidays as the duties of their office will permit, but no accumulation of leave shall be allowed without the special permission of the Board.

Sick Leave.

277. (a.) Any member of the Nursing Staff, or any other employee who, through sickness or accident, in the opinion of the Chief Resident Medical Officer, needs hospital treatment, shall receive all such treatment as can be afforded at the Hospital.

(b.) Should sick leave be sought, the Chief Resident Medical Officer shall supply the necessary recommendation.

(c.) Sick leave with pay may be granted on the following scale:—

Under three years' service—one month on full pay and one month on half-pay.

Over three years' service—two months on full pay: Provided that all sick leave, within the periods named herein, granted to probationers or pupil nurses, shall be on full pay.

(d.) Sick leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of pay on leave shall not (except as hereinafter provided) in any one triennial period exceed the time provided for in the foregoing scale.

(e.) A triennial period shall be the three years preceding the date of application.

(f.) Periods of leave within the foregoing scale may be granted by the Board or, if not exceeding two weeks at any time, by the Chief Resident Medical Officer; any leave so granted by the Chief Resident Medical Officer shall be reported to the Board.

(g.) Where the maximum leave permitted under the foregoing scale is inadequate to meet the circumstances of any case, and where the Chief Resident Medical Officer considers that there are sufficient grounds for so doing, he may make a recommendation to the Board for such extension of sick leave as he deems necessary.

The above Rules and Regulations were duly made and passed by the Board of Management of the Perth Hospital this 13th day of May, 1926.

NOTICE is hereby given that every person liable under the abovenamed Act to make any return of income is required to make and furnish to me an Income Tax return, in the prescribed form, of his or her income for the year ended 30th June, 1926. Returns of income from wages or salaries (Form HA) must be lodged on or before the 31st day of July, 1926, and returns from businesses, professions, etc. (Form H), must be lodged on or before the 31st day of August, 1926.

State Land Tax.

Where land has been acquired for the first time during the year ended 30th June, 1926, and is still held at noon on that day, Form A must be furnished.

Penalty for not furnishing return, £20. Penalty for making false return, £100 and treble tax.

Note.—Taxpayers may obtain return forms at the Taxation Department, Forrest Place, Perth; at the principal Land Offices (except Perth); and at Post Offices in the suburbs of Perth, and at other places.

Forms will be posted to taxpayers if a stamped self addressed envelope is forwarded to the State Commissioner of Taxation, Perth.

All letters, packets, etc., must be addressed to the Taxation Department, Box A15, G.P.O., Perth, and must have full postage affixed. Short postage will be charged to taxpayers.
