WHEREAS by Section 2, Subsection 2, of "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act Amendment Act, 1922," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to declare that the expenditure after the first day of January, 1918, under Section 5 of "The Land Act, 1898," or other statutory authority relating to the acquisition of land for closer settlement shall be dealt with in like manner as expenditure under the principal Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor's Deputy, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act Amendment Act, 1922," doth hereby declare that the expenditure after the first day of January, 1918, under Section 5 of "The Land Act, 1898," or other statutory authority relating to the acquisition of land for closer settlement, amounting to the sum of £30, shall be dealt with in like manner as expenditure under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1909."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1618/25.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

*Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—Midland Junction Municipality.*

Proposed 6-inch diameter cast-iron water main along East side of Mathoura Street from York Road to Boundary Road (length 36 chains), and 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main along North side of Boundary Road from Wroxton Road to Wellarton Street, and along East side of Ferguson Street from Boundary Road to Henry Street (length 27 chains), together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4509.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the second day of July, 1926.

WYALKATCHEM ROAD BOARD.

*By-law for regulating and licensing of Hawkers and Stall-holders.*

1. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, vegetables, or merchandise within the Wyalkatchem Road Board District without first having obtained a license from the Board.

2. Any person who trades or travels on foot with any vehicle or animal, or otherwise carrying to sell or expose or offer for sale within the said district, or any article or things aforesaid, shall be deemed to hawk the same: Provided always, that nothing contained in this section shall apply to any person or persons paying rates, or liable to pay rates, for any shop or store carrying on the usual business trade, and delivery trade, or delivery of goods therefrom.

3. No person shall keep, manage, or conduct any moveable or temporary fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of clothing or merchandise without having obtained a license from the Board and payment of the license fee as set forth in this By-law.

4. Any place, tent, or other temporary structure wherein goods are exposed or offered for sale shall be deemed a stall within the meaning of this By-law.

5. License for "Hawkers" shall be in the Form "G" in the Schedule, and for stalls in the Form "H" in the Schedule hereto attached.

6. Every hawker whilst employed in hawking must produce his license upon being required by any constable or officer of the Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket or vehicle a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly written thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.

7. No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that allowed by the Board and endorsed on such license.

8. No person to whom a Hawker's License or Stall-holder's License shall have been granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of such license granted to a person other than himself.

9. The following fees shall be paid for licenses issued to hawkers and stall-holders, and shall be paid in advance, and if any payment be not made when due the license shall be void:—

10. Hawker's License: For every hawker with hand basket or tray, 12s. per half-year; (b) For every

hawker with wheelbarrow or hand-cart, 15s. per year; (c) For every hawker with motor vehicle or with vehicle drawn by horse or other animal power, 15s. for every three months.

11. Stall-holder's License: For every stall the license fee shall be fixed from time to time by the Board, but in no case shall the fee be less than 10s. per week, payable in advance.

Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit or pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding (£10) Ten pounds.

ENGINEERS—STATE IMPLEMENT WORKS.  
(Registered 3rd June, 1926.)

No. 19 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 21st day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between the Minister for Trading Concerns (in his capacity as Minister in charge of the State Implement and Engineering Works), in and for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister"), of the first part, and The Australasian Society of Engineers (hereinafter referred to as "the Society") of the second part:

Whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, provisions, and arrangements set out herein shall in all cases be binding upon and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out, observed, and performed and complied with, according to the true intent and meaning thereof by all the parties hereto.

And it is also mutually agreed that this Agreement shall remain in force until the 26th day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

Clause 1.—Definitions.

(a) "Minister" shall mean the Minister who for the time being is administering the State Implement and Engineering Works, North Fremantle.

(b) "Society" shall mean the Australian Society of Engineers.

(c) "Employee" shall mean any person embraced by and included in this Agreement who is now employed in or by the State Implement and Engineering Works, or who may hereafter be employed in or by such works during the currency of this Agreement, and who is a member of the Society.

(d) A "motor mechanic" means a worker engaged in making, repairing, altering, assembling, or testing the metal parts of motor cars or other motor vehicles.

(e) Oxy-acetylene or electrical welding plants shall be operated by tradesmen only.

(f) "Electrical fitter" means a worker engaged making, repairing, altering, assembling, or testing (with or without wiring) electrical machines, instruments or apparatus.

(g) "Electrical wirer" means a worker engaged in installing electric light, meters, bells, or telephones, or running or repairing the wires used for power or heating purposes.

(h) "Electrical lineman" means a worker engaged (with or without labourers assisting) in erecting poles for electric wires, or erecting wire or cables on poles or over buildings, or tying it to insulators, or joining or insulating it, or doing any work on electric poles off the ground.

(i) A lineman shall not be allowed to work on live overhead wires carrying a current of 440 volts without an assistant.

(j) A "leading hand" means any tradesman placed in charge of three or more other tradesmen or of six other workers, and shall be paid as leading hand tradesman. Leading tradesman shall receive 2s. 6d. per day above the minimum rates specified above for their respective trades.

Clause 2.—Hours.

Forty-four hours shall represent a week's work, on the following conditions: Such ordinary working hours shall not exceed eight hours on the first five days of the week and four hours on Saturdays.

Clause 3.—Overtime and Holidays.

(a) All time worked in excess of or outside the usual hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for the first four hours after usual stopping time, and double time thereafter; provided that employees called to start work within an hour and a-half of the usual starting time shall be paid at time and a-half until the usual starting time.

(b) Systematic overtime shall not be worked. Overtime shall be considered systematic when two weeks' continuous overtime has been worked: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases where, after application to the Society has been made, extra labour is not forthwith available. No worker shall be required or permitted to work more than 24 hours' overtime in

(c) For all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day double time rates shall be paid.

(d) When an employee is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid at least two hours' overtime for such call-out.

(e) When an employee is required for overtime exceeding one hour without being notified the previous day, he shall be supplied with any meal required or be paid 1s. 6d. for such meal.

(f) When an employee is required for duty during any meal time he shall be paid at overtime rate until he be allowed the usual length of time for a meal.

(g) Twelve paid holidays per annum shall be granted to each employee; provided always that Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be taken as they come as portion of the holidays. The balance of six days shall be granted as annual leave, at the convenience of the department. Payment for holidays shall be made in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(h) All employees employed for a period of less than 12 months' continuous service shall receive holiday pay as follows:—After one month's continuous service, holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the 12 months.

(i) "Holiday pay shall be at the rate the worker is in receipt of at or immediately prior to the holiday being taken."

Clause 4.—Dirt Money.

Employees engaged on dirty work shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra as dirt money. Present practice as to what is dirty work to continue.

Boiler-makers' assistants shall be paid dirt money under the same conditions as applying to boiler-makers.

Fuelmen and men tarring pipes shall be paid 1s. per day extra as dirt money.

Foremen shall be paid at least five shillings per day above the minimum rates provided for tradesmen in their respective trades.

(d) It is also agreed—

1. That the rates of pay are fixed on a weekly basis, subject to the following condition, namely: that if in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week no work is available or performed, the employee will only be paid for the time actually worked at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of 44 hours), apportioned to the time actually worked during the week; and

2. that notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the employee were employed at an hourly wage.

3. Paragraphs (d) 1 and (d) 2 above are in conformity with existing practice, which will continue and be observed.

(e) "Casual Employees."—A casual worker shall mean one for whom work over a period of twelve consecutive working days, not counting holidays, is not provided by the employer. Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. over the rate provided by this Agreement for the particular worker's occupation.

(f) "Payment of Wages."—When an employee is discharged before the usual pay day, he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work, or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after by registered post at the employer's risk.

(g) The wages referred to herein shall operate until the 26th September, 1926, subject to the proviso that, should the Arbitration Court issue a statutory basic wage declaration in the meantime, the wages set out in this Agreement shall be automatically adjusted in accordance with such declaration.

#### Clause 6.—Apprentices.

(a) The conditions and wages prescribed for apprentices in Award Nos. 22 and 31 of 1922, and any variations thereto, shall be deemed to be incorporated in and to form part of this Agreement.

(b) Two apprentice machinists may be employed. They shall be instructed in the use of shaping, drilling, planning, slotting and milling machines. Wages and conditions shall be the same as those in the said Award applying to apprentices.

#### Clause 7.—Country Work.

(a) When an employee is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or is usually employed, the employer shall pay all fares, including sleeper, and a proper allowance at current rates for all necessary meals, or board and lodging. Fares shall be second class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid, and shall include return fare on completion of job or after twelve months on job.

(b) Travelling time shall be paid at ordinary rates at place of departure, with a maximum of a day's pay when travelling by boat or in a sleeper. When travelling by night without a sleeper the worker shall be entitled to receive an extra day's pay for such travelling. No time to be lost through travelling.

#### Clause 8.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed in writing between the employer and the Society.

#### Clause 9.—Right of entry to Works.

On notifying the Officer in charge any officer of the Society authorised in writing by the president and secretary of such Society shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours where in members of such Union covered by this Agreement are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the employees in such place or premises.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the employees in the carrying out of their work. The Officer in charge shall determine whether employees are being hampered or hindered in their work.

#### Clause 10.—Shop Stewards.

Subject to the recognition of properly constituted authority, shop stewards to be appointed by the Society shall be recognised by the management.

#### Clause 11.—Higher Duties.

(a) Any employee called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular rate of pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time actually engaged upon such higher work; provided that acting time less than twenty minutes in any one shift shall not be counted.

(b) No employee shall be reduced in his grade when temporarily engaged at work for which a lower rate is paid.

#### Clause 12.—Broken Shifts.

Should any employee not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required on the next day he shall be paid for that day, if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time; unless he cannot be employed on account of causes beyond the control of the management, in which case he shall be notified forthwith of the cause why he cannot be employed, and shall be entitled to two hours' pay.

#### Clause 13.—Notice Boards.

A notice board shall be provided by the employer on all jobs where in the opinion of the Officer in charge it is considered that notices are essential to meet the convenience of the Society concerned.

#### Clause 14.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the State Implement and Engineering Works situated at North Fremantle.

#### SHOP ASSISTANTS (FRUIT AND PRODUCE)—METROPOLITAN.

(Registered 14th June, 1926.)

No. 20 of 1926.  
THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912," this first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between The Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and Berryman Brothers, Central Gardeners' Fruit and Produce Markets (Joseph Prisk Rogers and Thomas Newby, Proprietors), F. W. Lantzke, Nelson & Company, Producers' Market, Limited, W.A. Fruit and Produce Markets, Pearce & Lee, B. Mercer, F. W. Dawson, being persons, firms, or companies carrying on marketing businesses in the State of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other part; witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. *Area*.—This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, in the city of Perth.

2. *Term*.—The term of this Agreement shall be one year from the first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

3. *Definitions*.—In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise indicates:—

“Weekly Hand” shall mean an employee engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminated by not less than one week’s notice on either side and which shall expire on the usual pay day. Such notice cannot be continued from week to week.

“Head Storeman” shall mean a person performing the duties of a storeman and who is in charge of two or more men.

“Casual Hand” shall mean an employee engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer’s service at any moment without notice: Provided that a casual hand shall be employed for not less than two hours in any one day, or, if told to report for work on any day, he shall be then employed not less than four hours.

4. *Hours*.—Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week’s work, and shall be worked as follows:—

1. *Fruit and Produce Merchants*.—Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 5.30 a.m. to 5 p.m., one half hour for lunch shall be allowed between the 12 noon and 1 p.m.; Tuesday and Thursday, first shift, 7.30 a.m. to 12.45 p.m. second shift, 12 noon to 5 p.m. Shifts to be worked alternately, Saturday, 7.30 a.m. to 12 noon.

2. *Wholesale and Vegetable Packers*.—Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 7 a.m. to 12 noon, 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.; Tuesday and Thursday, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.; Saturday, 7 a.m. to noon.

3. *Poultry Markets*.—Monday 8 a.m. to 12 noon, 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.; Tuesday and Thursday 8 a.m. to 12 noon, 1 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.; Wednesday and Friday 7 a.m. to 12 noon, 12.30 to 6 p.m.; Saturdays 8 a.m. to 12 noon.

5. *Overtime*.—For all time worked by weekly employees after the usual finishing time on Saturdays and for all time worked on Sundays and holidays double time shall be paid. All other overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

6. *Holidays*.—The following days shall be observed as holidays, and, so far as weekly employees are concerned, paid for, namely:—Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Labour Day, Christmas Day. Provided that if any employee is required to work on any other gazetted public holiday he shall be allowed time off on some other day, to be mutually agreed upon.

(a) *Annual Holidays*.—One week’s holiday on full pay shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of service. An employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in the same proportion to the length of his service: Provided, and it is hereby expressly declared and agreed, that the proportion of holiday pay shall only apply after the completion of the first year of service, excepting to those who may be in their present employment at the date of this Agreement.

7. *Wages*.—The minimum rate of weekly wages shall be as follows:—

(b) All work performed in the refrigerator, 1s. per hour extra.

(c) Casuals, 2s. 3d. per hour.

8. *Proportion of Juniors*.—One junior only shall be allowed to every three senior weekly hands or fraction thereof.

9. *Higher Duties*.—A worker required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at a higher rate whilst so employed.

10. Nothing herein contained shall entitle the employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement is being paid a higher rate than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

11. *Time and Wages Book*.—A book shall be kept containing the names of each of the workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which he has been employed. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting up of the Record Book, which shall be produced to the Inspector of the Union on demand.

12. *Under-rate Workers*.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Agreement may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the Secretary of the applicant union. If within twenty-four hours after the worker has notified the Secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum the Secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said Secretary at least twenty-four hours’ notice of his or her intention to make application to the said Magistrate, and the Secretary or his agent shall be entitled to attend before the said Magistrate, and, pending the decision thereon, in either case the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by an employer at the proposed lesser rate. The Magistrate may grant to such worker a permit to work at such wage and such period not exceeding six calendar months as he thinks fit, and his decision shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned and for such period as may be therein stated until the wage shall be again settled by the Magistrate on the application of the said Secretary.
