250/26.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may by proclamation declare from that the Governor may by proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to West-ern Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operation of any such declara-tion under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a proclamation dated the 16th day of April, 1920, it is (*inter alia*) provided that Emus shall at all times be strictly preserved in that portion of the State defined in the schedule hereto: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operation of the said procla-mation a defined locality: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare that so much of the Perenjori-Morowa Vermin District as is comprised within the portion of the State defined in the schedule aforesaid shall be and is hereby exempted from the operation of the said proclamation and the declaration contained therein.

Eastern Railway Additions and Improvements-Beechina-Wooroloo Deviation.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work, subject as to Railways to Section 96, and such authorisation shall be deemed an Section 30, and such Anthorsation shar be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Excentive Council and in ex-ercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable the Minister for Works to undertake and construct additions and improvements to the Eastern Railway by means of a deviation thereof from Beechina of Woorloo along the land shown coloured red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 24683, which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act. 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 392/26.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sew-erage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certhe Governor may exempt reticulation works from eer-tain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excel-lency the Governor, with the advice of the Exceutive Council, hereby approves of the construction and exemp-tion by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 22 of the mail Act. Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Metropolitan Water Supply-Extension to Subjaco Treatment Works, Location 714, Subiaco Municipality, and Perth Road Board District.

Proposed 6in. diameter cast-iron water main from existing 6in, main in Railway Road, Subiaco, to Stubbs Terrace, Daglish townsite (length, about 4 chains); thence 4in, cast iron main to site for Subiaco Treatment Works on Location 714 (length, about 70½ chains), to-gether with valves, hydrants, and all necessary appar-atus, and including lifting of existing 3in. tubing, as indicated in red on M.W.S., S., and D.D., W.A., Plan No. 4542,

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 9th day of July, 1926.
