WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at Middle Creek, near Tableland: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of about 640 acres at Middle Creek, Tableland, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

Reserve No. 3305, area 640 acres. A square block of land, having its boundaries in the meridian and at right angles thereto, with the Police Station in its centre, said Police Station being situated on or near Middle Creek (Fortescue River).

CLAREMONT ROAD BOARD.

By-law No. 112 (amendment).

BY-LAW No. 112, as published in the Government Gazette, No. 60, of the 14th November, 1919, page 2006, is hereby amended by the addition of the following areas of the Claremont Road District in which no building plan shall be approved and no building erected the materials of the walls and party walls of which are deemed by the Board to be inferior to brick, stone, concrete, or reinforced concrete:—
