ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 39/22.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—Fremantle Municipality.

Proposed 18-inch and 12-inch diameter reinforced concrete water mains along West side of Carrington Street from Stephen Street Southerly to South Street; thence Westerly along South side of South Street to Robinson Street (length about 47 chains), together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S. & D.D., W.A., No. 4533.

Wyndham Road Board.

ern and Northern boundaries of said reserve; thence Northerly and Westerly along the Eastern and Northern boundaries of Location 1939 and the Northern boundary of Location 1616; thence Northerly to the East corner of Location 3116; thence Westerly and Southerly along the Northern boundary of said location and the Northern and part of the Western boundary of Location 1555 to a point Southerly 2,399.5 links from its North-Western corner; thence 270 degrees 7 minutes to an Eastern boundary of Location 51; thence Northerly, North-Easterly, and again Northerly along boundaries of said location, and onwards to the right bank of the Ernest River; thence North-Westerly along said bank to a point in the Southerly prolongation of the Eastern boundary of Location 2176; thence Northerly to and along said boundary; thence East and North along the Southern and Eastern boundaries of Location 2764, and onwards to the Northern side of a one-chain road passing along the Northern boundaries of said location; thence North-Westerly and South-Westerly along said side to the South-East corner of Location 2762; thence Northerly along the Eastern boundary of said location, that of Location 3688, and onwards to the Northern side of Road No. 1896 aforesaid; thence Westerly along said side to a point in the North prolongation of the Western boundary of Location 3688 aforesaid; thence South to and along said boundary and that of Location 2762 aforesaid to the North-Western side of a one-chain road passing along the North-Western boundaries of Location 2577; thence South-Westerly along said side, and North-Westerly along the North-Eastern side of another one-chain road passing along the North-Eastern boundaries of Location 2760; thence East, North, and West along the Southern, the Eastern, and the Northern boundaries of Location 2761; thence North-Westerly along the North-Eastern side of a one-chain road passing along the North-Eastern boundaries of Location 2759; thence 242 degrees 43 minutes, 100.2 links to the North corner of aforesaid location, and Westerly and Southerly along its Northern boundaries and part of its Western boundary; thence West, South, and East along the Northern, the Western, and the Southern boundaries of Location 2758, and onwards along part of the Southern boundary of Location 2759 aforesaid; thence South along the Western boundary of Location 2760 aforesaid to the North-Eastern side of a one-chain road passing along the North-Eastern boundaries of Locations 2757 and 3905; thence North-Westerly along said side; thence South-Easterly along the South-Western side of a one-chain road passing along the South-Western boundaries of the last-mentioned location, and one of those of Location 2756; thence Westerly, South-Westerly, and Southerly along boundaries of Location 3058; thence Westerly in the Western prolongation of a Southern boundary of said location to the Western boundary of Location 1; thence Northerly along said boundary to the South-Western corner of Location 1192; thence East, Northerly, and Westerly along the Southern and Eastern boundaries of said location, the Eastern boundary of Location 1190, and the Eastern and Northern boundaries of Location 1185 to rejoin the Western boundary of Location 1 aforesaid; thence Northerly along said boundary to a point in the prolongation West of the Southern boundary of Location 2747; thence East and North to and along said boundary and part of the Eastern boundary of said location; thence East along part of the Southern boundary of Location 2748; thence South and East along the Western and Southern boundaries of Location 1981; thence South and East along parts of a Western and Southern boundaries of Location 579 to the North-Western corner of Location 3110; thence Southerly, Easterly, and again Southerly and Easterly, and Northerly along boundaries of said location to its North-Eastern corner; thence East, North, and North-Westerly again along part of the Southern and the Eastern boundary of Location 579 aforesaid, and the Eastern and part of the North-Eastern boundary of Location 50; thence Northerly and Westerly along the Eastern and Northern boundaries of Location 2258 and the Northern boundary of Location 3930; thence Northerly along part of the Eastern boundary of Location 1578; thence Northerly, Westerly, Southerly, and again Westerly and Southerly along boundaries of Location 3920; thence Westerly, Southerly, and again Westerly along boundaries of Location 3922; thence Northerly, Westerly, Southerly, and West along boundaries of Location 3923; thence North and West along part of the Eastern and the Northern boundary of Location 2093; thence North along part of the Eastern boundary of Location 3162; thence Easterly, Northerly, and Westerly along the Southern, the Eastern, and a part of the

Northern boundary of Location 3991 to a point in the Southerly prolongation of the Eastern boundary of Location 3034; thence Northerly to and along said boundary; thence Easterly, Northerly, and Westerly along the Southern and Eastern and a part of the Northern boundary of Location 717; thence Northerly along an Eastern boundary of Reserve No. 4210; thence Easterly along the Southern boundary of Reserve No. 3169 to its South-East corner; thence South to a point in the West prolongation of the Southern boundary of Location 2412; thence East to and along said boundary, and onwards to the Western boundary of Location 1250; thence South and East along part of a Western and the Southern boundary of said location; thence South, 16,938 links and East 1,373 links; thence South 13,319 links, and East 40,680 links, along a Western and part of the Southern boundary of Location 1398; thence South along the Eastern boundary of late 8/194, and onwards to a Northern boundary of Location 3170; thence Westerly, Southerly, and again Westerly along boundaries of said location to the North-Eastern side of Road No. 58; thence 308 degrees 0 minutes, 1,112.2 links, and 227 degrees 0 minutes, 101.2 links to the North-East corner of Location 2700; thence Westerly along North boundary of said location to its North-West corner; thence 359 degrees 59 minutes, 16,030 links; thence 270 degrees 0 minutes, about 67,850 links to a surveyed line shown on original Plan, Perth, 1867 (Department of Lands and Surveys); thence South to a point in the prolongation Easterly of the Northern boundary of Location 935; thence Westerly and Southerly to and along said boundary and its Western boundary, and onwards to the North-Eastern corner of Location 1371; thence Westerly along part of the Northern boundary of said location; thence Northerly and Westerly along the Eastern and Northern boundaries of Location 1985; thence again Westerly, Southerly, and Easterly along the Northern, the Western, and the Southern boundaries of Location 2339, and part of the Southern boundary of Location 1985 aforesaid; thence Southerly and Easterly along the Western and Southern boundaries of Location 1770, and the Southern boundary of Location 1371 aforesaid; thence Southerly along part of the Western boundary of Location 1984 and that of 1771, and continuing onwards for a distance of about 1,390 links to a surveyed line shown on original Plan, Perth 1972 (in aforesaid department); thence Easterly along said line to the South-Western side of a one-chain road passing along the South-Western boundaries of Location 2573; thence South-Easterly along said side; thence South-Westerly along the Western side of another one-chain road to and along a South-Eastern boundary of Location 2802, and onwards along said side to a post at the intersection of a surveyed line (as shown on original Plan, Perth, 2126, Department of Lands and Surveys); thence 285 degrees 3 minutes, 3,310.6 links, and 270 degrees 0 minutes, 6,805 links to the North-West corner of Location 1176; thence South and East along the Western and part of the Southern boundary of said location to the starting point.

Public Cemetery, Wyndham—By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Wyndham, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.
4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be opened when required.
5. Before any interment is allowed the Order for Burial shall be handed to and retained by the grave-digger.
6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
7. No burial shall take place in the Cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.
8. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—Week-days, 8 to 6 p.m.; 2 to 6 p.m., Sundays.

9. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
