WHEREAS by Section 45 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," it is provided that a Local Authority, in the exercise of its powers conferred by Part 3 of the said Act, may make and levy Rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its districts defined for that purpose by proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation declare that the Katanning Road Board, being the Local Health Authority for the Katanning Health District, may levy Rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its District, defined as follows:—(a) within the boundaries of the Central Ward of the Road District; (b) the remaining portion of the said district.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 233 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," that Rates throughout a District shall be uniform, except in so far as a Board may fix Rates for any townsite or any area defined for that purpose by Proclamation at a higher figure within the limits in the said section set forth: And whereas it is desirable to approve of and define the area hereinafter described as an area within which the Sussex Road Board may Rate at such higher figure: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby approve of and define the following area, as described in Schedule hereunder, of the Sussex Road District as an area in which the Sussex Road Board may fix the Rate at such higher figure as aforesaid, within the limits mentioned in Section 233 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919."

## *Schedule.*

All that portion of Sussex Location 5 bounded on the Northward by the shores of Geographe Bay from their intersection with the production North of the West boundary of Lot 170 to intersect the production North of the Eastern side of Queen Street (Road No. 6181).

On the Eastward of lines commencing at the latter intersection and extending Southward along the said production and Eastern side of Queen Street and the Eastern side of Abbey Street and its prolongation to

the left bank of the New River. On the Southward by the said bank of the New River to intersect the production South of the West boundary of Lot 125.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the last mentioned intersection and extending Northwards along the production and West boundary of said Lot 125 and West boundaries of Lots 28, 29, 152, and 170, and their production North to the starting point.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 340/26.

WHEREAS by Section 12 of "The Land Drainage Act, 1925," the Governor may at any time by Order in Council replace, vary, or amend any of the provisions of any previous order relating to any district: And whereas it is desirable to amend the boundaries of the Torbay-Grassmere Drainage District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Torbay-Grassmere Drainage Area in accordance with the Schedule hereto attached.

*Schedule.*

Starting at a point on the South boundary of the Great Southern Railway at its intersection with the Northward prolongation of the East boundary of Location 549 (District of Plantagenet); thence Westward and North-Westward along the South boundary of the Great Southern Railway to its junction with the South boundary of the Torbay Railway; thence North-Westward, Westward, and South-Westward along the South boundary of the said Torbay Railway to the North-Eastern corner of Location 1, at or near the shore of Torbay Inlet; thence Southward along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 1 and 3, and Eastward and Southward along the North and East boundaries of Location 2 to the North-East corner of Location 28; thence South-Westward along the shore of Torbay Inlet to the Southern limit of the site of the flood gates; thence across the Inlet to its Eastern shore; thence North-Easterly to the South-West corner of Location 1148; thence along the South boundaries of Locations 1148, 472, 843, 487, and 506 to the South-East corner of Location 506; thence Northward along the East boundary of Location 506 to the South boundary of Location 2736; thence Eastward along the South boundary of Locations 2736 and 536 to the South-East corner of Location 536; thence Northward along the Eastern boundary of Location 536 to the South-West corner of Location 3103; thence Eastward along the South boundary of Location 3103 to its South-East corner; thence Northward along the East boundary of Location 3103 to the prolongation of the South boundary of Location 478; thence Eastward along the South boundary of Location 478 to its South-East corner; thence Northward along the East boundary of Location 478 to the South-West corner of Location 508; thence Eastward along the South boundaries of Locations 508, 525, 2419, and 493 to the South-East corner of Location 493; thence Northward along the East boundaries of Locations 493 and 549 to the starting point, all as shown in red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 24634.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1193/26.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is advisable to empower the Ashburton Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads in the townsite of Beaden, within its district, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Ashburton Road Board, by the By-law in Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads in the townsite of Beaden, within its district, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for that purpose, and to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

## THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919.

*Ashburton Road Board.*

The Ashburton Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 42 of "The Traffic Act, 1919," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Ashburton Road District:—

The passage of heavy traffic over the following roads, viz., First Avenue, Second Avenue, Third Avenue, Fourth Avenue, First Street, Second Street, Third Street, Fourth Street, and Fifth Street, within the townsite of Beadon, in the Ashburton Road District, during the months of July, August, September, October, November, and December of the year 1926, and the months of January, February, March, April, May, and June of year 1927, is prohibited.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy Traffic" shall be as set out in Regulation 149 of the Regulations to "The Traffic Act, 1919," as published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 5th September, 1924.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine of not exceeding £20.

The Regulations made by the Bunbury Harbour Board on the 1st October, 1909, are hereby amended by the addition of the following new Regulation, viz.:—

No. 133a.—*Water supplied to shipping.*

The following charges shall be payable for water supplied to any vessel and shall be payable by the owner, agent, or master of such vessel:—Per 1,000 gallons 6s.; minimum 6s.

Hot water supplied to waterside workers on duty at a vessel shall be payable by the owner, agent, or master of such vessel at the following rates:—For each exclusive service 5s.; for a two-ship service from the one heater, 2s. 6d. each service.
