WHEREAS by Section 101 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," the Governor may constitute any defined portion of the State to be a shop district, and specify the boundaries of such district, and may abolish any district so constituted: And whereas it is desired to abolish the Kellerberrin Shop District as constituted by Proclamation dated the 9th day of February, 1921, and to create a new shop district, to be known as the Kellerberrin Shop District: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council, do hereby abolish the Kellerberrin Shop District as constituted by Proclamation dated 9th day of February, 1921, and do hereby declare that all that area bounded by a line starting from a point situate at the East corner of Kwollyinn Lot 70; thence in a general Easterly direction for approximately 10 miles to the South-West corner of Location 8680; thence in a general Northerly direction for approximately 25 miles to the South-West corner of Location 18370; thence in a general Westerly direction for approximately 11½ miles to the South-West corner of Location 11479; thence in a general Southerly direction for approximately 25½ miles to the starting point, to be a shop district, and to be known as the Kellerberrin Shop District, for the purpose of the said Act.

The Land Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 12414/98.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 6547, for Water and Camping Ground, at Mt. Willoughby,

should be placed under the control of the Northampton Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Northampton Road Board, as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

PUBLIC CEMETERY, DWELLINGUP.

By-laws.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Dwellingup, the said Trustees make the following By-laws.

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-digger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
(c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

POLICE—STATE OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

(Registered 23rd July, 1926.)

No. 25 of 1926.

THIS Agreement made, in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 12th day of July, 1926, between the Hon. John Collings Willecock, M.L.A., Minister for Police for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the Minister), acting on behalf of the State, of the one part, and the Western Australian Police Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1. *Term of Agreement.*—This Agreement shall remain in force until the 8th day of April, 1928, subject to either party having the right to apply to the Court of Arbitration for a review of its provisions, and to such variations as the Court may think fit to order on such review; and subject also to the right of either party after the expiration of any period of 12 months from the date of an order by the Court, pursuant to a previous review, to apply again to the Court for a review of its provisions and to such variations as the Court may think fit to order on such subsequent review.

2. *Area and Scope of Agreement.*—This Agreement shall apply to all members of the Western Australian Police Force (hereinafter referred to as "Employees") and shall be binding upon the abovenamed parties, and shall operate over the whole State.

3. *Definitions.*—The definitions referred to hereunder shall apply only for the purpose of this Agreement, and shall not be taken to conflict in any manner whatsoever with the law and regulations and General Orders dealing with the control and management of the Police Force of Western Australia, provided that such regulations and General Orders shall not be in conflict with any of the provisions of this Agreement.

"Probationary" shall mean a man not permanently appointed, but undergoing instruction and proving his suitability for permanent appointment as a member of the Western Australian Police Force.

"Employees" means any person permanently appointed to the Western Australian Police Force and includes, except where the context otherwise shows, any commissioned officer, sergeant, detective-sergeant, constable, probationary detective, detective constable, or woman police.

"Plain Clothes Constable" means a constable performing police duties in plain clothes for 28 consecutive days or over, and who does not wear uniform while so employed.

"Detective Constable" means a constable attached to the Criminal Investigation Branch of the Police Department, who has been favourably reported on by the Officer-in-Charge of that Branch, but who shall not be deemed permanently appointed to the C.I.D. until he passes the examination for the rank of non-commissioned officer.

"Probationary Detective" means a member of the Force attached to the C.I.D. on probation for a period of 12 months. If he is not reported on favourably at the end of that period he may have such period of probation extended for a further 12 months. If reported on favourably by the Inspector in charge of the C.I.D. at the end of 12 months, he shall be designated detective constable.

"Plain Clothes Duty" means duty carried out in plain clothes for 28 consecutive days or over by members of the Force specially selected for the purpose of making inquiries and performing such duties as may be required, but shall not include members of the Force temporarily performing in plain clothes ordinary patrol duties of the same nature as are carried out by uniform constables on beat duty.

"Centre" means any station from which continuous beat duty is performed or any district headquarters, except the depot, but shall not include the Criminal Investigation Branch.

"Practicable" means practicable in the fair and reasonable opinion of the Commissioner of Police: Provided that if any dispute arise as to whether in any case such opinion is fair and reasonable, the matter in dispute shall be referred to the Court of Arbitration.

4. *Salaries.*—The following shall be the minimum rate of salaries payable to the several grades or ranks of the Police Force hereunder enumerated, less any de-

late the Police Benefit Fund, 30 Vict., No. 10, and the regulations made thereunder:—

(a) *Commissioned Officers*—

Chief Inspector—£622 per annum (includes lodging, uniform, and boot allowances).

First-class Inspector—£486 per annum.

Second-class Inspector—£457 per annum.

Third-class Inspector—£440 per annum.

Note.—Provided that in the event of the position of Chief Inspector becoming vacant during the currency of this Agreement, the salary for the position shall be £550 per annum, exclusive of lodging, uniform, and boot allowances.

(b) *Uniform Sergeants and Detective Sergeants*—

First-class—19s. per day.

Second-class—18s. per day.

Third-class—17s. per day.

(c) *Constables, Plain Clothes Police, Detective Constables, Probationary Detectives, and Probationary Constables*—

20 years' service and over—16s. per day.

15 to 20 years—15s. 6d. per day.

10 to 15 years—15s. per day.

5 to 10 years—14s. 6d. per day.

3 to 5 years—14s. per day.

Under 3 years—13s. 6d. per day.

Probationary Constables—10s. 6d. per day.

(d) *Detective Sergeants and Detective Constables* shall be paid 3s. per day in excess of the salaries paid to the corresponding grades of non-commissioned officers and constables of the general police.

ALLOWANCES.

5. *Lodging Allowance.*—The following lodging allowance shall be payable where quarters are not provided:—

Commissioned Officers—£50 per annum.

Non-Commissioned Officers and Constables—

2s. 6d. per diem for married men.

1s. 8d. per diem for single men.

6. *District Allowances.*—(a) District allowances shall be paid in accordance with scale in force in the Public Service of Western Australia.

(b) For the purpose of arriving at the rate of salary for determining the amount of allowance to be paid, the salary (as per Clause 4) plus the lodging allowance (as per Clause 5) shall be taken as the deciding factor.

(c) Employees occupying quarters shall have the lodging allowance taken into account in fixing their rate of district allowance.

7. *Travelling Allowances.*—(a) The State shall, for the purpose of computing travelling allowances to members of the Force, be divided into two divisions, to be known as No. 1 and No. 2 divisions, as defined in C.O. 14/20.

(b) When absent overnight on duty from the home station, or travelling, except by boat, the following allowances shall be payable:—

Commissioned Officers—3s. 9d. per meal; 3s. 9d. per bed.

Detectives, Uniform Sergeants, and Plain Clothes Police—3s. 1d. per meal; 3s. 1d. per bed.

General Police—2s. 6d. per meal; 2s. 6d. per bed.

(c) When able to return to home or temporary station at night an allowance for meals actually purchased at the following rates, with the exceptions hereunder provided regarding an area within 12 miles radius of the G.P.O., Perth:—

Detectives, Uniform Sergeants, and Plain Clothes Police—3s. 1d. per meal.

General Police—2s. 6d. per meal.

(d) Within the radius of 12 miles from the G.P.O., Perth, the rates payable for meals actually purchased shall be:—

Detectives, Uniform Sergeants, and Plain Clothes Police—2s. 6d. per meal.

General Police—2s. per meal.

(e) *The recognised meal hours shall be:—*

Breakfast—7 a.m. to 9 a.m.

Dinner—12 noon to 2 p.m.

Tea—5 p.m. to 7 p.m.

(f) A married employee shall, when transferred from one station to another, in addition to the said travelling allowance for the other days of the journey, to be paid at the same rates for the day he must vacate his quarters, and also be paid in respect of the day of his arrival and the day following in the completion of his transfer.

(g) Refreshment allowance, at the above-mentioned rates, plus 25 per cent., shall be paid to police employed on duty at races, sports meetings, and similar gatherings.

(h) An additional allowance of 25 per cent. shall be granted all members of the Force stationed in No. 1

(i) An employee stationed at a place in No. 2 Division which carries no district allowance doing special, relief, or temporary duty at a station which carries a district allowance, shall draw, in addition to the travelling allowance, the district allowance payable at the station where the duties are carried out.

(j) Provided that while on duty outside the boundaries of the State employees shall receive an allowance equal to the scale paid for Division No. 2.

(k) Employees when travelling on duty by steamer or boat shall be paid an allowance computed at the rate of 15 per cent. of the fare paid by the Department.

(l) Subject to regulation, members of the Force travelling on patrol or other duty in the Western Roebourne, Kimberley, or other districts, where means of free transport or provisions are provided by the Department, will not be entitled to travelling allowance if in receipt of district allowances. This will not apply to district officers, and constables attending them, when travelling on duty in the districts named.

8. *Relief Allowances.*—(a) When relieving or on temporary duty at a station or elsewhere, employees shall be paid for the first ten days from time of arrival the rate as per scale in Clause 7.

After ten days from time of arrival until time of departure—married men will be paid 1s. 6d. per bed; 1s. 6d. per meal.

After ten days from time of arrival and for the succeeding eleven days—single men will be paid 1s. 6d. per bed; 1s. 6d. per meal.

(b) At the expiration of twenty-one days from time of arrival single men will be paid only lodging allowance applicable to such employee, and in the event of it being a station to which a district allowance is payable, such district allowance as is applicable to a single man for such station.

(c) When relieving or on temporary duty at a station or elsewhere and required to be absent therefrom on duty (except at the home station), an employee shall be paid the difference between the travelling allowance being paid for the time for such relief or temporary duty and the travelling allowance scale for the district.

(d) This clause does not apply to an employee who, when relieving or on temporary duty, is not required to reside away from his home or home station, or who is able to obtain his meals from his home or home station.

(e) An employee who has his headquarters in District No. 1, when relieving in District No. 2, shall receive 25 per cent. above the foregoing rates.

(f) When the actual and necessary expenses incurred by an employee engaged in relieving duties exceed the rates allowed, such allowance as may be deemed fair and reasonable may be granted by the Commissioner.

(g) Where an employee residing at a station where a district allowance is payable does relieving or temporary duty at a station where a higher district allowance is payable, he shall draw the difference between the two district allowances, in addition to the travelling and relieving allowances payable, and an employee stationed at a place in No. 2 Division which carries no district allowance, doing special, relief, or temporary duty at a station which carries a district allowance, shall draw, in addition to the relief allowance, the district allowance at the station where the duties are carried out.

9. *Plain Clothes Duty Allowance.*—Probationary detectives and plain clothes constables engaged on plain clothes duty for a period exceeding 28 days shall be paid an allowance of 1s. 6d. per day. This will not apply to members of the Force temporarily performing, in plain clothes, ordinary patrol duties of the same nature as are carried out by uniform constables on beat duty.

10. *Clothing Allowance.*—(a) Commissioned officers shall receive an uniform and boot allowance of £22 12s. per annum.

(b) Every member of the Detective Force and Non-Commissioned Officer and Constable of the General Police Force doing continuous duty for 28 consecutive days or over in plain clothes shall receive an allowance at the rate of £20 per annum during the period so employed for clothing, boots, and mackintosh: Provided that such *pro rata* clothing allowance will be paid to employees engaged on night patrol for 14 consecutive days or over.

(c) Members of the Pillaging Staff shall receive an additional special clothing allowance of £3 10s. per annum.

(d) Members of the uniform police who are supplied with uniform and mackintosh shall receive an allowance of £2 12s. per annum as boot allowance.

11. *Prisoners' Rations.*—Where employees are called upon to ration prisoners they shall be allowed 1s. per meal for every meal supplied at all stations except Perth, Fremantle, Northam, and Kalgoorlie (where the contract system is in force) and (for aboriginals) in the Northern Police District.

12. *Trackers' Allowance.*—Where employees are obliged to supply rations to native trackers they shall be paid 4s. per day at all stations with the exception of Hall's Creek, where the allowance shall be 5s.

13. *Clerks.*—(a) Every employee engaged as District Office Clerk shall receive an allowance of 1s. per diem.

(b) Clerk in Liquor Inspection Branch and the Staff Clerk at Head Office shall receive an allowance of 1s. per diem.

14. *Traffic and Pointsmen.*—(a) There shall be paid to employees permanently engaged in the Traffic Office and who on an evening, in addition, are called out for traffic work, an allowance of 1s. 6d. per diem for constables and 2s. per diem for sergeants, but these allowances shall be paid only whilst the present conditions continue.

(b) Pointsmen shall receive an allowance of 1s. per diem.

15. *Chauffeurs.*—Motor-driver employees in plain clothes shall receive the recognised clothing allowance, and a special allowance of 1s. per diem shall be paid to chauffeur in charge of motor garage.

16. *Engineer of Launch.*—There shall be paid to the engineer of police launch 1s. 6d. per diem over grade rate, and this allowance shall remain in force whilst the present conditions exist.

17. *Finger-print and Photographer.*—The following finger-print and photograph allowance shall be paid:—To Detective-Sergeant in charge of Office, C.I.D., 1s. 6d. per diem. Photographer, 7d. One detective-sergeant, 7d.

18. *Gold Stealing Staff.*—Members of the gold stealing staff shall receive an allowance of 2s. per diem.

19. *Prosecuting Sergeants.*—Prosecuting sergeants at Perth and Fremantle shall be first-class sergeants, and such sergeant at Perth shall receive a special allowance of 2s. per diem, and at Fremantle 1s. per diem.

20. *Hours.*—(a) The working hours at a centre shall be for beat and office duty, eight continuous hours per day, but not more than 112 hours per fortnight (of fourteen days): Provided that these hours shall apply to police work generally where circumstances permit; but where duties are light and intermittent, such as watchhouse duty, mounted duty, orderly work or escort, or any duty for which travelling allowance is paid, they need not be adhered to: Provided also that in each fortnight one day's leave shall be allowed on full pay consisting of a continuous period of 24 hours' leave, and, where practicable, such day shall be the alternate Sunday.

(b) The ordinary working hours at a centre shall consist of three shifts or reliefs as follows:—

First relief—7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Second relief—3 p.m. to 11 p.m.

Third relief—11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

At outside towns or at other places shifts of eight hours, as required according to local conditions, shall be worked. Where two foot constables are employed in addition to a mounted constable and the officer-in-charge of the station, alternate weekly shifts shall be worked.

(c) Each shift or relief shall be allowed 30 minutes for a meal, at a time to be arranged by the non-commissioned officer, except in the case of men on night duty, who shall be allowed 20 minutes for crib, but such refreshment must be taken on the beat.

(d) The ordinary working hours at a place not a centre shall be as far as is practicable the same as above mentioned.

(e) The Commissioner shall give his employees at least one clear day's notice of all Sunday duty and leave, and there shall be posted in the day-room at all police centres a return showing the particulars of such duty and leave.

(f) Employees due for Sunday leave, and having completed their ordinary tour of duty on the previous day, may then be granted leave: Provided that the circumstances are normal, and that they inform their immediate superior where they may be found if required before they are due to report for duty.

(g) The ordinary working hours of members of the Criminal Investigation Branch shall not exceed 112

hours per fortnight and shall, as far as practicable, be worked as follows:—

9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.
9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; 7 p.m. to 11 p.m.

Two-thirds to be on day shift and one-third on the late shift. On Sundays one detective shall do duty from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.; one detective from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., and two detectives from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m.

Office staff hours of the C.I. Branch shall commence at 8.30 a.m. to 1 p.m., and work 2 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. The other shift shall be 9 a.m. to 12 noon, and from 6 p.m. to 11 p.m.; 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., and 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday duty—9 a.m. to 12 noon, and 7 p.m. to 10 p.m.

(h) In case of any riots or disturbances, or for the preservation of peace, or the protection of human life, or the pursuit of criminals, or for any sufficient reason, the Commissioner or any officer or non-commissioned officer may call upon employees for duty at any hour of the day or night, or to remain continuously on duty.

(i) The Commissioner may suspend the eight hours' provision in this clause when circumstances in his discretion call for such action in the public interests.

21. *Overtime.*—(a) Subject to subclause (g) of Clause 20, every member attached to a centre or the Criminal Investigation Branch, or station where at least two men are employed on foot patrol or town duty (other than members of the Pillaging Staff), who perform more than 104 hours per fortnight, shall be given equivalent time off in lieu thereof as soon as practicable.

(b) Members of the Pillaging Staff who perform more than 56 hours in any one week shall be given the equivalent time off in lieu thereof as soon as practicable.

(c) Any employee who performs escort duty involving a continuous period of 16 hours shall be granted at least 24 hours' leave in lieu of every such period, and may, if practicable, be allowed to spend such leave at the city or town nearest the place where he relinquished charge of the prisoners or property escorted; provided that, if he takes his leave where he relinquished charge of the prisoners or property escorted, and he could begin his return to his station before the expiration of such leave, he shall only be paid travelling allowance up to the time at which he would ordinarily return to his station.

(d) At each centre a record shall be kept showing the amount of overtime worked by each employee working thereat. Such record shall be available at all reasonable times for inspection by any employee concerned.

22. *Annual Leave.*—Annual leave for commissioned officers shall be in accordance with the Public Service Regulations made under "The Public Service Act, 1904." Non-commissioned officers and constables shall be granted annual leave for 21 days during each year of service, except in the case of men stationed in remote districts or localities, who will be allowed one calendar month's leave of absence. Those members of the Force stationed in the North-West and Kimberley districts, and who desire to spend their leave in the South, shall not commence such leave until after arrival at Fremantle.

23. *Long Service Leave.*—(a) Commissioned officers shall be granted similar long service leave as enjoyed by members of the Public Service under "The Public Service Act, 1904." Non-commissioned officers and constables who have served continuously for a period of ten years shall be granted long service leave not exceeding three months on full pay; those who have served continuously for a period of 20 years will be granted six months similar leave, and for the next ten years three months additionally, but the latter leave will not operate till 1931.

(b) Any employee who resigns or is retired from the service, except as provided for in Subclause (c), shall be paid for long service leave due at the time of resignation or retirement.

(c) Any employee who retires or is retired upon reaching the retiring age, or through ill-health, shall be paid for long service leave *pro rata* to date of retirement.

(d) An employee dismissed from the Force shall not be entitled to payment for long service leave.

(e) A female employee resigning from the Force for the purpose of getting married, and who has been continuously employed for three years and over, shall be granted payment *pro rata*, of her long service leave at the date of retirement.

24. *Fares while travelling.*—(a) All members of the Force, and their wives and families, when travelling on duty or on transfer by boat or train (except when actually escorting prisoners), shall be provided with saloon accommodation on boat and first-class accommo-

(b) When travelling over night by train, first-class sleeping accommodation shall be provided, if available: Provided that when a sleeping berth is provided the bed allowance will not apply.

25. *Strength of Commissioned and Non-Commissioned Officers.*—(a) Commissioned Officers: There shall be one Chief Inspector and such first, second, and third class inspectors as may be deemed necessary for the proper administration of the Force, while the strength of inspectors remains at present number, viz., 12, there shall be not less than four first, and four second class inspectors: Provided if the number of first-class inspectors exceeds the number mentioned, a corresponding reduction may be made in the number of second-class inspectors.

(b) Non-Commissioned Officers: The strength of non-commissioned officers shall be:—First-class sergeants, 9; second-class sergeants, 20; third-class sergeants, 35.

26. *Drill Instruction or Parades.*—Drill instruction or parades shall be given or held during working hours. If an employee is detailed to attend a drill or parade outside the ordinary working hours, he shall be allowed time off equivalent to the time occupied in and travelling to or from such drill or parade.

27. *Vacancies to be Advertised.*—When any station becomes vacant or when a vacancy occurs in the plain clothes section of the Uniform Branch, the clerks of District Offices or Water Police, or in the probationary section of the C.I.D., the Commissioner, before filling such vacancy, shall cause a notice to be published in the "Police Gazette," inviting applications from employees who are desirous of their claim being considered for such vacancy.

28. *Appointments to Criminal Investigation Branch.*—Appointments to the Criminal Investigation Branch shall be made from applicants who appear to be best qualified for the performance of detective duties. Men with police experience in Western Australia shall have the preference, if suitable.

29. *Compulsory Retiring Age.*—(a) An employee reaching the age of 60 years shall have the right to retire, or may be retired by the Commissioner: Provided that all employees upon reaching 65 years of age shall be retired from the service.

(b) Provided that nothing in this clause shall affect employees who at present come under the provisions of the Superannuation Act.

(c) Provided also, that this clause shall in no way prejudice the claims of any employee leaving the service prior to reaching the age of 60 years in so far as the Police Benefit Fund is concerned.

30. *Sanitary and Water Rates.*—(a) Water rates shall be borne by the Department where members of the Force are compelled to occupy quarters.

(b) Members of the Force shall pay sanitary rates when the sanitary conveniences are solely for the private use of employees and their families.

31. *Furnishing for Quarters.*—Quarters occupied by married employees shall be supplied with blinds.

32. *Harness Horses.*—The Commissioner may grant permission to employees to use police horses in harness for police duties in cases where he considers it advisable.

33. *Conditions.*—This Agreement is given without prejudice to any of the conditions and privileges at present existing where not specifically affected by this Agreement.

34. *Posting of Agreement.*—A copy of this Agreement shall be posted up at each station.

35. *Interpretation.*—When a dispute arises as to the interpretation of any clause hereof, the matter may be referred by the Minister or the Union to the Court of Arbitration.
