APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.  
=====

THE COURT OF ARBITRATION, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," hereby makes the following Regulations.

## APPRENTICESHIPS.

1. These Regulations shall apply to the skilled industries, crafts, occupations, and callings mentioned in Schedule I. hereto, and to such other skilled industries, crafts, occupations, and callings as the Court may from time to time by order direct, and to all awards of the Court and industrial agreements unless therein or thereby modified or amended.

2. These Regulations shall apply to the Metropolitan District of Perth, which for this purpose shall be deemed an area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth. The Court may by order direct that the whole or part only of these Regulations shall apply to any other specified area.

3. No minor shall, after the date of these Regulations, be employed or engaged in any of the industries, crafts, occupations, or callings to which these Regulations apply, except subject to the conditions of apprenticeship or probationership herein contained:

Provided that the Court may exempt from the provisions of this Regulation any class or classes of minors employed or engaged in any of such industries, crafts, occupations, or callings, whose employment is not, in the opinion of the Court, of such a nature as will permit or require them to become skilled craftsmen.

For the purposes of these Regulations a minor means a person not less than fourteen years of age and not more than eighteen years of age who is employed or engaged in any industry, craft, occupation, or calling, and who customarily works under the direction of or in association with an employer, master, or journeyman in such industry, craft, occupation, or calling upon the material and with the tools or implements used in such industry, craft, occupation, or calling.

4. (1.) Any person desirous of becoming an apprentice shall notify the Registrar, who shall keep a register of such persons.

(2.) Every employer desirous of obtaining an apprentice shall take as an apprentice only a person whose name is so registered.

(3.) Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for such hours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by any award or industrial agreement applicable or as may be approved by the Court. In the event of his becoming an apprentice such probationary period shall be counted as part of the term of apprenticeship.

5. Whenever the Court considers it so desirable, it may in respect of any specified trade prescribe a public examination, which shall be passed by every person before he or she may become apprenticed to any such trade. It may also determine what certificate of education may be regarded as entitling the holder to exemption from such examination.

6. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under an Award of the Court.

7. Boards to be called "Advisory Committees" may be appointed by the Court in such districts and for such trades as it may consider desirable, to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter in that area. Such committees shall consist of the following:—

- (a) Some person appointed by the Court who shall act as Chairman.
- (b) Two representatives appointed by the employers in the trade or group of trades.
- (c) Two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of employees in the trade or group of trades:

Provided that when any matter affecting any trade which is not directly represented on any committee is being considered, two representatives, appointed one each by the employers and the union or unions of employees, respectively, in such trade, shall be associate members for the determination of such matter.

The Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine.

8. (i.) No employer shall refuse employment to any person, or dismiss any employee from his employment, or injure him in his employment or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the employee is a member of any Advisory Committee, or by reason merely of anything said or done or omitted to be done by any such person or employee in the course of his duty as such member.

(ii.) In any proceeding for any contravention of this Regulation it shall lie upon the employer to show that any person proved to have been refused employment, or any employee proved to have been dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced whilst acting as such member, was refused employment or dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced for some reason other than that mentioned in this Regulation.

9. (a) Any employer taking an apprentice on probation shall within 14 days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed form. If at the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations an employer is employing any apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(b) At the end of the period of probation of each apprentice, if mutually agreed upon by the employer and the legal guardian of the boy, but not otherwise, he may become an apprentice under an agreement.

(c) The Court may in any case where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

(d) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within one month of the termination of the probationary period.

(e) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on a form approved by the Court, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, and the Registrar. No employer, guardian or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court.

(f) There shall be three copies of each agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one copy shall be retained by the Registrar.

(g) The Court shall have power to transfer an apprentice from one employer to another either temporarily or permanently—

(i.) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or

(ii.) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice for good cause shown.

(h) The transfer of every agreement shall be on a form approved by the Court, and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, the Registrar, and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within two months of the date on which the transfer is effected.

(i) There shall be four copies of the form of transfer, of which one copy shall be held by the late employer, one shall be held by the new employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

(j) All existing agreements of apprenticeship made or entered into prior to these Regulations coming into force shall continue to have full effect, subject to any modifications imposed by these Regulations, and shall be deemed to have the same effect as if they had been entered into in accordance with these Regulations.

10. (i.) An apprentice may, for the purpose of these Regulations, be indentured to an industrial union or to industrial unions functioning in a trade, industry, occupation or calling, and arrangements may be made by such union or unions for the employment of such apprentice or apprentices.

(ii.) An apprentice may, for the purpose of these Regulations, be indentured to an association of employers functioning in a trade, industry, occupation or calling, and arrangements may be made by such association of employers for the employment of such apprentice.

11. Such union or unions or association shall sign and seal the indenture of apprenticeship and shall also appoint a person or persons, being an officer or officers of the union or unions or association, who shall be deemed to be an employer for the purpose of these Regulations, and shall be responsible for the observance thereof, and shall also sign and seal such indenture.

12. The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice or cause him to be taught the industries, crafts, occupations, or callings in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the period of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be prescribed or as may be directed. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship, faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be prescribed or directed as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

13. Every agreement entered into by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice shall be for such period as may be specified by the industrial award for the trade or calling in which the apprentice is engaged, but shall not in any case exceed five years, unless otherwise determined by the Court.

14. Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain in addition to such other conditions as may be prescribed—

- (a) The names and addresses of the parties to the agreement.
- (b) The date of birth of the apprentice.
- (c) A description of the industry, craft, occupation or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound.
- (d) The date at which the apprenticeship is to commence and the period of apprenticeship.
- (e) A condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and apprentice to comply with the terms of the relative industrial award or agreement so far as they concern the apprentice.
- (f) A condition that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense, and shall be in the employer's time, except in places where such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.
- (g) A condition that in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.
- (h) The general conditions of apprenticeship.

15. Where in any case it is reported to the Court that any employer or group of employers has not in his or their employ the number of apprentices in proportion to the journeymen employed equal to the proportion allowed or required by the industrial award or awards relating to the callings concerned, the Court may make such investigation and order as it may deem necessary to ensure that each employer or group of employers shall employ and train a specified minimum number of apprentices.

16. The earliest age at which apprenticeship may begin may be determined in relation to any particular trade, calling, occupation, or industry by the Court on application by any party interested.

17. Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may with the consent of the apprentice and guardian transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed

by the Court in its award or otherwise according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

18. Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, subject to the Court's approval, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

19. On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship, from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the clerk of the Court, and the cause thereof.

20. No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court on the application of the employer.

Provided, however, that an apprentice may be suspended for misconduct by the employer, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and in the event of the Court refusing same the wages of the apprentice shall be paid as from the date of such suspension, and, in the event of the application for cancellation being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

21. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

22. Subject to Regulation 28, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever may, with the consent of the Court on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement.

23. In the event of an employer being unable to provide work for the apprentice or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement or to arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

24. Where in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice for such lesser time per week or per month, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine, being not less than the proportionate amount of the rate of wages prescribed by the industrial award for the trade, calling, or industry.

25. Where in any case the Court is of opinion that the number of apprentices being trained in any trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling is insufficient to meet the requirements of the particular trade, industry, craft, occupation or calling in the matter of skilled artisans, the Court may make such investigation and order as it may be deemed necessary to permit or require any employer to employ such further number of apprentices as may be directed. Notice of such order shall be given to the industrial union and to the employers' association concerned.

26. (a) Every apprentice shall attend a Government technical school vocational classes or classes of instruction, for instruction in such subjects as are provided for his trade or as may be determined by the Court: Provided, however, that attendances shall not be compulsory when the apprentice is resident outside a radius of 12 miles from the place where instruction is given. Provided also that if technical instruction is not available in the locality in which the apprentice is employed and is available by correspondence, at reasonable cost to be approved by the Court, the Court in its award may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.

(b) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

(c) The Court may also determine the total period during which apprentices to any particular trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling are to attend such technical school or classes.

(d) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times prescribed by the Court.

(e) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to examination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per centum of attendances at the technical school or other place of instruction unless he is exempted from such attendance under the provisions of these Regulations or for other good cause.

(f) The clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(g) The employer shall provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required by the examiners, and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(h) The Board of Examiners shall consist of persons skilled in the particular trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling. It shall comprise equal numbers (to be determined by the Court) of representatives nominated by the employers and workers in the particular trade. Failing such nomination or nominations the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President at the request of either examiner, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.

(i) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one month from the date of holding the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court.

(j) Such examination shall, where possible, include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(k) The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate shall be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the secretary of the Union, each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody, and produce the same for inspection by the Industrial Inspector whenever demanded by the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed the certificate shall also be signed by the examiners.

(l) Where in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Court that any apprentice, by reason of his engagement on country work or other good cause, cannot conveniently attend a technical school or other prescribed classes, the Court may direct that such of these Regulations as relate to attendance at a technical school or other prescribed classes, and to examinations, shall not apply to such apprentice, but subject to such conditions as the Court may direct.

(m) The examiners shall each be entitled to the following fees, namely:—

For every five, or fraction of five, apprentices examined—One guinea, with a minimum fee of two guineas.

In addition to the foregoing fees, where examiners, in the performance of their duties as such, are required to travel, they will be entitled to reimbursement of all fares and necessary expenses actually incurred.

(n) Whenever it is possible so to do, the examiners, before entering upon the examination following the issue of these Regulations, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their opinion, is the stage of proficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The



syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the clerk of the Court and a copy handed to the examiners before each examination. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the clerk of the Court thereof.

27. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or statutory holidays: Provided—

- (a) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one month in each year;
- (b) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost of any of such certificate or certificates not exceeding 5s. to be borne by the employer;
- (c) An apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

28. The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount by which the wages prescribed by the industrial award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso, shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

29. When an apprentice attends a technical school, vocational classes, or other class or classes of instruction during his ordinary working hours, where such is prescribed, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

30. If the examiners for any particular trade or calling, or the industrial union or employer concerned, make representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the Technical School, or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices, are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such Technical School, or such other place, as it deems necessary.

31. (1.) The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original agreement, except as to rates of wages which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

(2.) Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or such other remedial measures (*i.e.*, increased time for technical instruction) as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such other order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

32. When an apprentice is absent from work for any cause other than sickness or in pursuance of the provisions of these Regulations, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time so lost.

33. Upon the completion of the period of training prescribed for apprenticeship, each apprentice shall be required to pass the final examination test to the satisfaction of the examiners, and upon passing this test shall be provided with a certificate to that effect.

34. The Registrar shall prepare and keep a roll of apprentices containing—

- (a) a complete record of all applications to become apprentices;
- (b) a record of all apprentices and probationers placed with employers;
- (c) a record of all employers with whom apprentices are placed;
- (d) a record of the progress of each apprentice, recording the result of the examiners' reports;
- (e) any other particulars the Court may direct.

35. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed. Where the employer is himself a journeyman regularly and usually working at the trade he shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices allowed.

36. Every industrial inspector appointed in pursuance of the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," shall have the power to enter any premises, make such inspection of the premises, plant, machinery, or work upon which any apprentice is employed or could be employed, interview any apprentice or employee, examine any books or documents of the business relating to the wages and conditions of apprentices, interrogate the employer in regard to any of the above-mentioned matters, and generally do any act relating to matters covered by these Regulations, in the same manner as if all matters covered by these Regulations were embodied in an award of the Court, and subject to the same restrictions.

37. With a view to determining whether the number of apprentices being trained in any particular trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry is sufficient to meet the future requirements of the said trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Registrar may require any employer to furnish him with any specified information relating to the said trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry, or relating to the employees engaged therein.

38. Non-compliance by any person with the provisions of these Regulations shall be deemed to be a breach of these Regulations. Any person convicted of a breach of these Regulations shall, except where otherwise expressly provided, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds. For the purpose of this Regulation, the term "person" shall also include any firm, company, industrial union, association, group of persons, or corporation.

39. The Court may by its award in or relating to any particular industry, craft, occupation or calling, modify, alter, or extend the provisions of these Regulations and provide for matters not contained therein.

40. Proceedings in respect of breaches of these Regulations shall, except where otherwise provided, be instituted and conducted, and fines and penalties recovered, in the same manner as proceedings in respect of enforcement of an award or agreement, and the forms prescribed for such enforcement proceedings modified or altered where necessary may be used in these proceedings.

41. The "Court" wherever herein used means the Court of Arbitration; "Registrar" means the Registrar of the Court; "Act" or "the Act" means "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925"; "Apprentice" means any person of either sex of any age who is apprenticed to learn or to be taught any industry, trade, craft, or calling to which these Regulations apply, and includes an apprentice on probation.

42. (1.) The provisions of the foregoing Regulations (with the exception of Regulations 7, 18, and 23) shall extend and apply to apprenticeships entered into pursuant to Section 125 of the Act: Provided that in Regulations 5, 9, 13, 17, 22, 26, 30 and 31, where the word "Court" occurs, the words "Apprenticeship Board constituted under and in pursuance of the Act" shall be substituted therefor: Provided further that any party aggrieved by any finding or determination or

order made by the Apprenticeship Board so constituted as aforesaid which the board is by this Regulation empowered to make may appeal therefrom to the Court by lodging a notice of such appeal with the clerk of the Court within one month from the date of such finding, determination, or order.

(2.) The term "Building Trade," as used in Section 125 of the Act, shall mean the following trades, callings, or avocations, namely:—

- (a) Bricklaying (including tuck-pointing).
- (b) Stonemasonry (including all forms of stone cutting and fixing and monumental masonry).
- (c) Plastering (including modelling but excluding cement and plaster sheet making and the making of cement tubs, baths, and cisterns).
- (d) Carpentry.

(3.) The forms in Schedule II. annexed hereto are hereby prescribed as the forms to be used in connection with Apprenticeship in the Building Trade as defined herein.

(4.) Notwithstanding anything herein contained it shall be lawful for the Apprenticeship Board in the case of any person desirous of acquiring a general knowledge of the above trades or associated trades with a view to qualifying as a building contractor, architect, or engineer, to make such special arrangements as it may deem advisable or necessary.

43. The foregoing regulations (except Regulation 42) shall apply to the Commissioner of Railways and apprentices in his employment, subject to the following modifications, alterations, and additions:—

- (a) Applicants for appointment as apprentices who comply with the departmental regulations as regards age, height, and educational qualifications, shall be invited to appear before an Apprentices' Selection Board, free passes being issued for the purpose.
- (b) The Apprentices' Selection Board shall consist of:
  - (i) A Chairman appointed by the Commissioner of Railways.
  - (ii) The Workshops Foreman of the trade or calling concerned.
  - (iii) A representative tradesman from each trade to be appointed by the unions concerned to be selected from and by the tradesmen in each trade employed by the Commissioner of Railways in the metropolitan area.
- (c) The Board shall orally examine each applicant who appears before it, and select the required number from those whom it considers the most suitable, and place them in the order for engagement.
- (d) As vacancies for apprentices occur during the six months following the date of selection, the selected applicants shall be called up in the order in which they have been placed by the Board.
- (e) The employment of any selected applicant will be subject to his passing the departmental medical examination, the cost of which, not to exceed 5s., shall be borne by the applicant.

- (f) Selected applicants attaining the age of 17 years before engagement shall be written off the list.
- (g) An apprentice shall serve a probationary period of three months. At the end of the first and third months the Workshops Foreman of the trade concerned shall report as to the probationer's suitability or otherwise, and at the end of the probationary period, if mutually agreed upon by the employer and the legal guardian of the boy, he shall be indentured.
- (h) Each apprentice shall, during his apprenticeship, attend the Technical School Classes as arranged by the Railway Department.
- (i) Separate classes appropriate to his trade or calling shall be provided for, viz., Grade 1, Grade 2, Grade 3, and Advanced Classes.
- (j) When directed the apprentice shall report to the Technical School Instructor, who will decide in what class the apprentice shall be placed.
- (k) An apprentice joining after the third term has commenced shall not sit for that year's annual examination, but will commence the technical education when the school reopens after the Christmas vacation.
- (l) At the end of the first and second terms in each year the Director of Technical Education shall report on the attendance, conduct, attention, aptitude and progress of each apprentice, and upon any other matter specially calling for attention.
- (m) The apprentice shall be placed under the supervision of a leading hand tradesman who will teach and instruct or cause the apprentice to be taught and instructed in his trade or craft.
- (n) Such leading hand tradesman shall, once in every quarter, for each apprentice under his control, submit a report on the prescribed form regarding the skill, knowledge, aptitude and industry of the apprentice, and the progress made during the quarter.
- (o) A certificate shall be issued to each apprentice showing the percentage of marks obtained in each subject for which he sat at the annual technical examination, with remarks from the head of the branch as to the manner in which the apprentice has carried out his practical work during the preceding year.
- (p) The period of apprenticeship shall be for five years.
- (q) All time lost in any one year, except as hereinafter provided, shall be made up at the conclusion of each separate period of twelve months at the rate fixed for the period during which such time was lost, and the increased rate of wages shall not apply until such lost time (if any) has been fully made up.

Provided that this clause shall not apply to:—

- (i) Time off duty to attend compulsory military or naval training, other than time imposed through failure to become efficient or while undergoing confinement for an offence under the Defence Act.
- (ii) Time lost due to accidents on duty.
- (iii) Time lost by duly certified sickness not due to misconduct up to a maximum of four weeks in each year.

## CARPENTERS AND JOINERS.

AN Agreement made this twenty-fourth day of February, 1926, between the Minister for Works, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, The Fremantle Harbour Trust, Minister for North-West, The Minister for Trading Concerns (in his capacity of Administrator of the State Implement and Engineering Works), The Minister for Agriculture, and the Minister for Lands (other than in connection with Sawmilling operations) of the one part and The Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners (Perth Branch) of the other part.

Whereas an Award of the Arbitration Court of Western Australia was made on the 26th day of September, 1923, and numbered 34 of 1922, and it has been mutually agreed to vary the terms of the said Award as hereinafter expressed, that is to say :

## IT IS HEREBY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES :

(The dates shown in parentheses are the dates from which it is agreed such alterations shall operate.)

*Minister's bound by Award.*

Add the following :—

Minister for Agriculture, Minister for Lands (other than in connection with the Sawmilling operations) and after the words "Minister for Trading Concerns," add "in his capacity as administrator of the State Implement and Engineering Works."

*Clause 3.—Rates of Pay.*

It is hereby agreed that the minimum rate of pay shall, in lieu of the rate prescribed by Clause 3 of the Award, be 107/4d. per week of 44 hours. (1st October, 1925.)

It is also agreed—

(a) that the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis subject to the following conditions, namely :—

That if in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week no work is available or performed, the employee will only be paid for the time actually worked at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of 44 hours) apportioned to the time actually worked during the week ; and

(b) that notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligations on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the employee were employed at an hourly wage ;

(c) Paragraphs (a) and (b) are in conformity with existing practice which will continue and be observed.

It is further agreed—

That the wages referred to herein shall operate until the 26th September, 1926, subject to the proviso that should the Arbitration Court issue a statutory basic wage declaration in the meantime, the wages set out in this agreement shall be automatically adjusted in accordance with such declaration.

*Clause 6.—Hours.*

44 Hours shall represent a week's work in lieu of 48 hours as prescribed by Clause 6 of the Award, on the following condition :—Such ordinary working hours shall not exceed 8 hours on the first 5 days of the week and 4 hours on Saturdays. (2nd July, 1924.)

*Clause 7.—Overtime and Holidays.*

Delete Sub-clause (a) and substitute in lieu thereof :—

"All time worked in excess of or outside the usual hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for the first four hours after the usual stopping time, and double time thereafter, provided that employees called to start work within an hour and a-half of the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half until the usual starting time." (26th September, 1924.)

Add the following to Sub-clause (c) :—

"Employees who are compelled by the employer to work on the Union's picnic day shall be paid at double time rates." (From date Agreement is signed.)

Add the following to Sub-clause (g) :—

"If the Union picnic day is taken as a paid holiday the balance of leave due shall be reduced accordingly." (From 26th September, 1924.)

Delete Sub-clause (h) and substitute in lieu thereof :—

"All employees employed for a period of less than 12 months' continuous service shall receive holiday pay as follows :—After one month's continuous service holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months. Casual workers are not entitled to holidays." (26th September, 1924.)

*Clause 13.—Interviewing Workers.*

Delete the Clause and substitute in lieu thereof :—

"On notifying the Officer-in-Charge any officer of the Union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of such Union shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such Union covered by this Award are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the employees in such place or premises:

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the employees in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether employees are being hampered or hindered in their work." (From date Agreement is signed.)



*Preference of Employment.*

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 18:—

"Preference of employment shall be given to financial members of the Union provided the Minister shall not be under any obligation to communicate with the Union office to ascertain whether a member is financial." (From date Agreement is signed.)

*Payment of Wages when services terminated.*

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 19:—

"When an employee is discharged before the usual pay day he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after by registered post at the employer's risk." (From date Agreement is signed.)

*Notice Boards.*

Add a new Clause to stand as Clause 20:—

"A notice board shall be provided by the employer on all jobs where, in the opinion of the officer in charge, it is considered essential for the convenience of the Union concerned to have a notice board." (From date Agreement is signed.)

*Application to Court.*

It is hereby further agreed between the parties hereto that as soon as practicable application will be made by the Union to the Court to vary the aforementioned Award in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, and the parties hereto will consent to such variation.

*Term.*

This Agreement shall operate from the date hereof until the 26th September, 1926.
