THE BUSH FIRES ACT, 1902 (AMENDMENT ACT, 1925).

Regulations for the Control of Fire-protected Areas. Department of Lands and Surveys,

Corres. 665/16. Perth, 18th August, 1926.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following By-laws, under the provisions of the above Act.

> C. G. MORRIS, Under Secretary for Lands.

1. These Regulations may be eited as "The Bush Fires Regulations, 1926."

2. No person shall set fire to the bush at any time on land within any portion of the State that has been acclared to be a fire-protected area, without first ob-taining a ''Permit to Burn'' from the Minister for Lands or a person acting with his authority. 3. For the purpose of these Regulations any officer

of the Forests Department shall be deemed to be an officer acting with the authority of the Minister for 'authorised officers.''

4. An application for a "Permit to Burn" shall be in writing, in the Form No. 1 of the First Schedule, and shall be lodged with an authorised officer for the fire-protected area in which it is desired to burn. An application may be accepted in the form of a letter, provided the full information required in Form No. 1 is supplied in such letter.

5. A "Permit to Burn" shall be issued by an authorised officer, provided he is satisfied that proper precautions will be taken by the applicant to confine the fire within the boundaries of his own land or land occupied by him, and that there is no undue risk of the fire getting out of control. Such permit shall contain such conditions relating to the precautionary measures to be taken by the permit holder as may be considered necessary at the time by such authorised officer.

6. A "Permit to Burn," in the Form No. 2 in the First Schedule, shall be issued to every person obtain-ing permission to burn off within a fire-protected area. 7. The holder of a "Permit to Burn" shall produce

such permit to any officer of the Forests Department or other authorised person on demand.

8. Any person acting under instruction from an authorised officer may enter upon any land over which application has been made for a "Permit to Burn" for the purpose of-

- (a) investigating the dangers likely to arise by burning;
- (b) being present at burning operations;

(c) investigating steps taken to prevent the spread of fire subsequent to the main burning. 9. The holder of a ''Permit to Burn'' shall not burn any part of the bush at any time during the months of October to April, both inclusive, unless

(a) he has delivered, or caused to be delivered, personally to each owner or occupier of all adjoining land, four days' previous notice in writing of such intention;

nor unless-

(b) he keeps at least three men in attendance until all grass, stubble, or scrub has been burnt, to prevent such fire extending be-yond the limits of his own land, or land occupied by him. The holder of a "Permit to Burn" shall take

such precautions as may be prescribed by any officer of the Forests Department, for the purpose of preventing the spread of fire from his own land, or land occupied by him, on to any State Forest, Timber Re serve, or other Crown land.

11. If any fire escape beyond the boundaries of the area over which a "Permit to Burn" is held, the holder of the permit shall, if possible, immediately notify the nearest Forest Officer, and, furthermore, shall, within twenty-four hours of the suppression of such fire, report the full circumstances to the authorised officer by whom the "Permit to Burn" was granted.

12. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations, or shall contravene or fail to comply with any provision or condition con-tained in any "Permit to Burn" issued in pursuance of these Regulations shall, for every such offence for which a penalty is not specially provided by the "Bush Fires Act, 1902," and the amendments thereof be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

By-laws for the Management and Use of the Road Board Hall and other Buildings under the Control of the Bcard.

P W 1373/26

- 1. Interpretation Clause.-In the construction of these By-laws
 - (a) The word "Board" shall mean the Carnamah Road Board :
 - (b) The word "Building" shall mean and include any hall, room, or corridor, or stairway annexe of any such hall or room under the control of the Board.

Applications for the hire of any building or furniture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board not less than 24 hours' before the time such building or furniture is required, and shall state the purpose for which the building or furniture is required.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual and respon sible person or persons hiring any building or furniture shall be given in application for the use of such building or furniture.

The rent of the building or furniture, inclusive of the 4. use of the crockeryware, shall be paid with each application, and shall be as set out in Schedule hereunder.

5. The hours for which any building or furniture may be hired shall bc—(a) Day: 9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m. (b) Evening: 7 o'clock p.m. to 11 o'clock p.m. (c) Exten-sion of time may be granted upon payment of prescribed fees.

6 The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building or furniture.

The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of the same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any such building or furniture for the same date or hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such building or furniture shall be granted.

10. The hirer of any building shall comply with the pro-visions of the Health Act, Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such birings and use of any building. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts above-mentioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement. forbid and prevent the use of such building.

11. In the event of the use of any building being for-bidden or prevented under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

12. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, eider, or perry shall be brought into or consumed in any building during the term of engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

13. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any building during any ball or public entertainments, or at any gatherings of persons, in the said building, whether such persons have been admitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

- 14. No person shall, in any part of any building-

 - (a) use profane or improper language; (b) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;

 - (b) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
 (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
 (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or any other part of the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers such damage shall be liable to pay the cost, in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws;
 - (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage-ways of any building. Any per-son so doing shall immediately disperse, ou being requested so to do by the Secretary or other duly authorised Officer of the Board, or Police Constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.

15. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, nor anything calculated to produce a dis-turbance, riot, or breach of the peace, shall be permitted in any building.
