WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of twelve months as from the 1st day of September, 1926.

Moore River (the whole), situate about 45 miles North of Fremantle.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

Amendments.

Add to Rule 18 a proviso, as follows:—

Provided further that any sale of land may be conducted by any auctioneer selected by the Bailiff with the approval of the Magistrate.

Insert after Rule 18 a new rule, as follows:—

18A. (1) Before the Bailiff shall take any land under a warrant of execution the execution creditor by whom such warrant has been issued shall deliver to the Bailiff a statement in writing verified by the Registrar of Titles or Registrar of Deeds, as the case may be, containing particulars of the land proposed to be taken, the date of service of the warrant of execution upon the Registrar of Titles or the Registrar of Deeds, as the case may be, and particulars of all encumbrances registered against the said land at the date of such service of the warrant of execution. The Bailiff shall not take any land under a warrant of execution until the requirements of this subsection have been complied with.

(2) The sale of land shall be made subject to such conditions as the Bailiff shall deem suitable. Such conditions may be according to Form 110A set out in the Appendix hereto, with such modifications as the circumstances of the case may require.

(3) The Magistrate may on the request of the execution creditor settle the conditions of sale.

(4) The purchase money shall be lodged by the Bailiff with the Clerk of Court until the transfer or conveyance of the property sold shall have been delivered to the purchaser, unless the Magistrate shall otherwise order.

(5) If for any reason the sale shall be rescinded the Bailiff shall have authority under the warrant of execution to cause the land to be again offered for sale.
