BUILDERS' LABOURERS (VARIATION OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT No. 22 of 1924).

(Registered 16th September, 1926.)

No. 30 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 14th day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between The Master Builders and Contractors' Association of Employers (hereinafter called "The Employers"), of the one part, and The Builders Labourers' Union of Workers, of Perth, Western Australia (hereinafter called "The Union"), of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Employers and the Union have mutually agreed to vary the Agreement made on the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and numbered No. 22/24 in the Industrial Register; and, further, it is witnesseth, that for the consideration hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

- 1. Hours.—The working hours shall be forty-four per week, to be worked from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and from 7.45 a.m. to 11.45 a.m. on Saturdays.
- 2. Wages.—The minimum rates of wages payable shall be:—
 - (a) Leading labourers, i.e., scaffolders, riggers, dogmen, concretors, gear hands, hod carriers, mortar mixers, men wheeling to the lift, serving and attending bricklayers, masons, plasterers, rubble wallers, men engaged on the lifting of steel stanchions, girders, and principals when such work is a part of the Contractor's contract and under his direct control—Two shillings and twopence per hour.
 - (b) General labourers, comprising men engaged as builders' labourers not included under Subclause (a) above—One shilling and elevenpence half-penny per hour.
 - (c) Workers mentioned in (a) of Clause 2 above not to be reduced to the lower wage when required
 - to do any other class of work.

 (d) Gear Hand.—This shall mean an employee who is engaged in the rigging of gear ropes and tackle, or cranes, winches, derricks, and the repairing of splicing of slings or necessary gear in cennection with buildings.
- 3. Overtime.—(a) Any tradesman or labourer referred to in paragraph (2) "Wages" who is required to work before the commencing time or after the finishing time mentioned in paragraph (3) "Hours" shall receive as follows: for the first hour time and a quarter, for the next two hours time and a half; double time thereafter until the ordinary commencing time.
- (b) Any tradesman or labourer who is required to work on a Saturday after 11.45 a.m. or Sunday, or any of the following days—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Auniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, and Union Picnic Day, shall be entitled to receive payment at the rate of double time for all time worked on those days.
- 4. Area.—This schedule of wages, hours, and working conditions shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office, in the City of Perth.
- 5. Payments.—All wages shall be paid weekly, either on the job or at the Employer's place of business, but wherever paid they shall be paid to the workmen not later than fifteen minutes after leaving off work.

This clause for payment shall also apply to workmen who perform less than a week's work, and shall be paid to the worker not later than fifteen minutes after leaving off work.

- 6. Notice.—For the purpose of terminating employment one hour's notice shall be given on either side, except only that the Employers may summarily dismiss a worker who is guilty of misconduct.
- 7. Country Work Award.—When any worker is sent by his Employer or is engaged by his Employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night unless the Employer shall provide board and lodging, he shall be paid, in addition to his regular wages, 6s. per day for the first seven days and 30s. per week thereafter. The Employer shall pay all fares and travelling time. Provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight hours in any one day. The Employer shall also provide free transport for the employee's tools
- 8. Record Book.—The Employer shall make and keep a record, showing the name of each worker and the hours worked by him and the amount paid to each worker. Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection by the representative of the Union during working hours.
- 9. General.—(a) Proper sanitary arrangements shall be made on each job by each Employer for the convenience of the workmen.
- (b) The Employer shall provide on each job hot water for the purpose of making tea at meal times.
- (c) The Employer shall provide a place on each job for the safe keeping of the tools of the worker when not in use.
- (d) The Employer shall provide a shelter for the convenience of the workmen from inclement weather.
- (e) Any workman engaged on sewer work or furnace work or underpinning shall be entitled to receive payment of 10 per cent. over the rates hereinbefore mentioned.
- (f) Any workman employed on a job who is definitely requested or ordered by the Employer or his authorised foreman or agent to wait on or report at a given hour or time for the purpose of commencing or resuming work, shall be entitled to receive payment at full current rates for all time lost, if he cannot be started, providing that he fully complies with such request or order.
- (h) Definition of Sewer Work.—Where a worker is engaged on man-holes and shafts: Provided that the depth of same is over 20 feet in the case of an open cut and 10 feet in the case of tunnel work.
- (i) Wet Ground.—When working in any place where water is continually dripping so that the clothing becomes wet with soakage, or where there is water under foot so that the feet of the workmen become wet.

This subclause shall not apply to natural ground surface made wet by rain.

10. Term.—The term of this Agreement shall be for one year from the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six: Provided, however, that any party hereof may, after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Agreement, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months therefrom, make application to the Court of Arbitration for a variation hereof.
