WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which has been acquired for a street or way within the Municipality of City of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

The Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. L. & S. 4832/20; Forests 1113/20.
WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may by an Order in Council dedicate any Crown Lands as a State Forest, within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby dedicate the Crown Lands described in Schedule hereto as additions to State Forest No. 4.

*The Traffic Act, 1919.**Bunbury Road Board.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1094/26.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is advisable to empower the Bunbury Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over those portions of the Australind Road, Picton-Dardanup Road, and Vasse Road within its District, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Bunbury Road Board, by the By-law in Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over those portions of the Australind Road, Picton-Dardanup Road, and the Vasse Road within its District, and to define that during such period or periods as the Board may deem necessary heavy traffic for that purpose shall be as set forth in the said By-law; also to impose a penalty of not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

THE TRAFFIC ACT 1919.

Bunbury Road Board.

The Bunbury Road Board pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 42 of "The Traffic Act, 1919," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Bunbury Road District:—

The passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic over those portions of the Australind Road, Picton-Dardanup Road, and the Vasse Road within the Bunbury Road Board's District may be prohibited by resolution of the Board during such period or periods as the Board may deem necessary.

For the purposes of this By-law "heavy traffic" means—All vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers or timber as expressed and under conditions laid down in Regulation 149 of "The Traffic Act, 1919."

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

The Land Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 3075/26.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 240,

at Erinderino Well, should be placed under the control of the Moora Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Moora Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

The term "Permission" shall mean the permission of the Board first obtained and expressed in writing.

2. Subject to the provisions of these By-laws the Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge, except during entertainments, or on other special occasions, when permission first being obtained, the following fees for admission, namely, adults 2s., children 6d., may be charged.

3. No person shall play, practise, or indulge in any sport, game, or entertainment upon the Reserve without permission, and such permission may be given upon such conditions as the Board may think fit.

4. Any person found committing any breach of these By-laws may be removed from the Reserve by a Police Constable or any Officer of the Board.

5. No person shall sell or expose for sale goods, wares, or merchandise on the Reserve without permission.

6. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any stock to enter, stray, or feed upon the Reserve without permission.

7. No person shall damage, remove, or cause injury to or destruction of trees, shrubs, plants, and flowers or other property of the Board on the Reserve.

8. Notwithstanding the provisions of By-law 2 camping may be permitted in portions of the Reserve set apart by the Board for this purpose, but not elsewhere, upon the issue of a permit by the Board, and upon payment of such fee and subject to such conditions as the Board may from time to time make or charge or impose for regulating the manner in which such camping areas shall be used. Any person using such camping areas shall observe and comply with all such conditions.

9. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to being removed immediately from the Reserve.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 4 of 1926.

Between United Metropolitan Timber Yards, Saw-mills, and Woodworkers Employces' Union of Workers, Applicant, and the Timber Merchants' Association of W.A., Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the Industrial Dispute between the abovenamed parties.

AWARD.

1. *Area:* This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of 14 miles from the General Post Office, Perth, except such portions thereof as are comprised within premises occupied by or worked in conjunction with the Railway Department or the Midland Railway Company.

2. *Term:* The currency of this Award shall be three years from the date hereof.

3. *Hours:* The ordinary working hours of employees shall not exceed forty-four in any one week or eight in any one day, except on Saturdays, when the ordinary working hours shall not exceed four; provided that, at the option of the Respondent, the forty-four hours may be worked from Monday to Friday inclusive. Provided further that this shall not apply to Stablemen and Nightwatchmen, whose hours shall be as follows:—

(a) The hours of labour for Stablemen shall be 47 per week, including not more than 3 hours on Sunday.

(b) The hours of duty for Nightwatchmen shall not exceed 10 hours for six days per week and six hours for the seventh day.

Provided also that the hours at present being worked shall operate until the sixteenth day of October, 1926.

4. *Overtime:* Overtime at the rate of time and a half shall be paid for the first two hours worked outside the ordinary working hours and double time thereafter. All time worked on Sunday shall be paid at double time rates, except in the case of workers whose ordinary duties require them to work on Sundays, when double time rates shall begin after their ordinary working hours on that day.

5. *Holidays:* The following holidays shall be observed and paid for: Christmas Day to New Year's Day inclusive, seven (7) days, 26th January, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day: Provided also that where an employee's employment is terminated during the course of a calendar year his employer shall pay to him one day's wages for each calendar month of his service in lieu of the holidays to which he would be entitled under this clause and has not received. In the event of an employee being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other employees he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other employees of such employer are on holidays on full pay. Where any specified holiday falls on Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed in lieu thereof.

6. *Hire:* For the purpose of convenience the wages hereinafter set forth are stated on a weekly basis, but this Award doth hereby order and declare that the contract of employment shall be a daily one, terminable on either side by one day's notice, and the worker shall, in the event of notice, be entitled to payment up to the date when such notice terminates: Provided also that the employer may dismiss an employee without notice for good cause, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time and on the day of dismissal. Provided further, that this clause shall not apply to apprentices.

7. *Wages:* (a) The minimum rate of wages shall be:—

(b) In pusuance of Section 123 of the Act, the wages as above are apportioned as follows:—

- Adults:
- (1) Basic Wage—£4 5s. per week.
- (2) Other wages (margins), as above indicated on weekly basis.
- (3) Deductions—Nil.

8. *Casual Work:* Workers with less than a week's service shall be paid one shilling (1s.) in addition to the ordinary daily wage.

9. *Junior Labourers:* Youths under the age of 19 years may be employed to perform the ordinary duties of Tailers-out from Woodworking Machines. Provided always that the number of youths employed shall not be such as to exceed the proportion of one such youth to every four machinists other than Sawyers permanently

employed by the employer. Provided that the employer may employ unapprenticed Cadets who desire to learn the commercial and practical side of the Timber Trade in any position (except at a Saw or Woodworking Machine which might be properly operated by an apprentice) which they are capable of filling in order to further their training in the timber business. Every such Cadet shall deliver to the employer or his representative a letter from the Union intimating that the Union agrees to employment being given to such Cadet, whose name and age shall be stated. In no case shall the number of such Cadets exceed one to each eight adults employed who come within the ambit of this Award at any one Timber Yard or Sawmill.

Should any dispute arise between the employer and the Union under this clause, such dispute shall be settled by the Board of Reference. The wages of Cadets shall be in accordance with the provisions of the current Clerical Agreement or Award applicable to the Timber Business. Should there be no Clerical Award or Agreement, then the wages shall be not less than that for Junior Labourers of like ages, as provided in this Award, with the following additions:—

No person shall be employed as a Cadet under this clause for a total period exceeding two years.

10. *Record Book*: A time book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him. The said book shall be open to inspection by the accredited representative of the Union at any time during the working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

11. *Underrate Workers*: A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the Secretary of the Worker's Union. If within seven days after being notified of the worker's desire to work for a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said Secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest Resident or Police Magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such Secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the Magistrate, and the said Secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The Magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of such period until 14 days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the Secretary of the Union requiring his wage to again be fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause. Provided always that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.

12. *Apprentices*.—(a) The provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," relating to Apprentices, and the Regulations made in pursuance thereof, for the time being in force, are hereby embodied in and form part of this Award.

(b) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one to every four Machinists or fraction of the first four employed by each employer or firm of employers for the twelve months previous to engaging the apprentice.

(c) The term of apprenticeship to the Machining branch of the trade shall be four years.

13. *Board of Reference*.—(a) A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purpose of this Award, which shall consist of two representatives appointed by the applicant Union and two representatives appointed by the Respondent, with the addition of a Chairman agreed to or appointed by the Court. In the event of the Applicant or the Respondent not nominating representatives within a week of the request so to do, the Court may appoint any members of the Applicant Union or the Respondent organisation to act as such.

(b) Three members, one of whom must be the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum.

(c) The Board of Reference may sit at such times and places as the members may agree, or, failing agreement, as the Chairman may fix, and may adjourn from time to time and from place to place.

(d) The functions of the Board of Reference shall be:—

(i) The special matters left to the decision of the Board of Reference by this Award;

(ii) To settle any dispute arising out of this Award which may be referred to it by the Court.

(e) The decision of the Board of Reference may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of any party to this Award; provided that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days of such decision to the Chairman of the Board and the opposite party and an application be lodged with the Court asking for such review within fourteen days of such decision, but the Court may give extended time for such notice of application at any time.

14. *Stablemen and Nightwatchmen*.—Each Stableman shall be allowed one Sunday off duty in every four weeks, and each Nightwatchman shall be allowed one shift off duty in every three weeks without deduction of pay.

(a) If a stableman is required to live at the stables, the employer shall provide accommodation for him free of charge.

(b) Carters who, in addition to the hours of which the working week is composed, are required to feed horses, shall be paid the following rates in addition to the weekly wage, and the time taken up in feeding horses shall not be included in or reckoned as overtime:—

Three shillings (3s.) per week for one horse, and one shilling (1s.) per week for each additional horse.

(c) A Nightwatchman, if called upon in the nighttime to do work other than that of attending to boiler fires, shall be paid at the rate of sixpence per hour for the time so occupied, in addition to the Nightwatchman's wage.

15. *Blowers*.—In addition to the blowers already installed the employer shall attach blowers to all flooring machines, moulding machines, thicknessers and other sandpapering machines, and to any other machines injurious to health.

16. *Mixed Functions*.—Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any day shall be paid the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that day; provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he is employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole day.

17. *No Reduction*.—This Award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

In witness whereof this Award has been signed by the President of the Court, and the Seal of the Court has been hereto affixed this twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.
