WHEREAS by "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893, Amendment Act, 1896" (60 Vict., No. 22), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to vest in His Majesty, as of his former estate, all or any lands whereof His Majesty may become the registered proprietor: And whereas His Majesty is now the registered proprietor of Plantagenet Locations 854, 855, 856, 887 to 890 inclusive, 910 to 914 inclusive, 936 and 1081, registered in the Office of Titles in Volume 911, Folios 90, 91, 92, and 93, and Volume 334, Folio 92: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation vest in His Majesty, his heirs and successors, Plantagenet Locations 854, 855, 856, 887 to 890 inclusive, 910 to 914 inclusive, 936 and 1081 aforesaid, as of his former estate.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 27th day of October, 1926, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1501/26.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that,

subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—Cottesloe Municipality.

Proposed 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main along the East side of Mann Street commencing from existing 10-inch main in Eric Street, proceeding Northerly to Grant Street and connecting with existing 3-inch main, together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and including lifting existing 1½-inch tubing (length about 18 chains), as indicated in red on M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., Plan No. 4585.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 5th day of November, 1926.

PARKS AND RESERVES ACT, 1895.

By-laws for the control of Reserves on the River Foreshore, Perth and Crawley.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Reserves set out hereunder:—

Reserve	17615—Park and Recreation (Mount's Bay Road).
"	5957—Recreation (Carnival Square).
"	A1150—Botanical Gardens (Stirling Square), Perth Lot B6.
"	A10887—Botanical Gardens.
"	A13012—Botanical Gardens.
"	A18391—Supreme Court Gardens.
"	12510—Park Gardens and Recreation.
"	A17826—Parks and Gardens.
"	A17827—Parks and Gardens.
"	3595—Government Requirements.
"	A17375—Recreation (Crawley).
"	A17391—South Nedlands.

The term "Board" in these By-laws, shall mean the Board appointed under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," to control these Reserves.

The term "Reserves" shall mean and include the whole of the areas above enumerated, including the "Gardens" mentioned herein.

The term "Gardens," shall mean and include only those Reserves or portions thereof, which have been enclosed by a fence for the purpose of utilising the land for gardens, parks, or recreation.

"Permission" shall mean the permission of the Board first obtained and expressed in writing.

Control of Vehicles.

1. No person shall drive, ride, convey, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, carriage, cart, boat, aeroplane, or other vehicle within these Reserves except upon a declared public highway or road.

Class of Vehicles.

2. No passenger vehicle plying as an omnibus, or which plies for hire, nor any vehicle, team, cart, or wagon used for carrying any goods, bricks, stone, wood, iron, or merchandise of any kind (whether laden or not), nor any hearse, mourning coach, camel, packhorse, or other beast of burden shall enter or pass through the Reserves.

Damaging Growth.

3. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy, any tree, shrub, plant, flower, or grass growing on the Reserves, or remove or damage stakes or labels therein, nor hang, nor attach clothing or other articles thereto.

Soil, Fences and Grass.

4. No person shall cut up, damage, disfigure, or interfere with the soil, turf, or surface of any part of the Reserves, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or with any part of the fences, buildings, electrical equipment, rockwork, watercocks, or seats around or upon the same, or pollute or interfere with any ornamental water therein, or interfere with or destroy any birds, animals, or fish therein in any manner whatsoever.

Rubbish.

5. No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind whatsoever within the Reserves except in the receptacles provided, nor break bottles, china, or other similar substances therein.

Behaviour.

6. No person shall misconduct himself, or indulge in any riotous or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards dress on the Reserves.

Intoxicating Liquor.

7. No person shall bring into, or consume within the Reserves any intoxicating liquor, nor enter thereon when visibly under the influence of liquor.

Expectoration.

8. No person shall spit or expectorate upon any path, grass, structure or erection in these Reserves.

Camping.

9. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent the Reserves for the purpose of camping, lodging or tarrying overnight, nor lie or sleep during the day on the Reserves.

Seats for Ladies.

10. No man shall occupy a seat which is set apart for the use of ladies.

Bill Sticking.

11. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix, distribute, or give out any placard, handbill notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road, path, or any place whatever on the reserves, and no person shall cause to be done any of the acts herein prohibited.

Fires and Shooting.

12. No person or persons shall carry or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire on any portion of the Reserves without permission.

Trading.

13. No person shall, without permission, sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, refreshments, fruits, nuts, confectionery, fish or other merchandise or things, or solicit or offer to purchase bottles on any portion of the Reserves.

Games and Animals.

14. No person shall, upon the said Reserves without permission, play, practise, or indulge in any game, sport, or gymnastic exercise, or exercise horses, dogs or other animals for racing.

Straying Stock.

15. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, dog, goat, camel, donkey, mule, pig, or other animal; or fowl or other bird to enter, stray, or feed upon the said Reserves without permission, nor cause, allow, or suffer any dog to enter any swimming area, nor throw sticks or other missiles therein.

Meetings.

16. No person shall organise, arrange, advertise, or take part in any fete, picnic, or concert, or engage in public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or any meeting of like character on the Reserve without permission.

Betting.

17. No person shall bet or offer to bet publicly on any part of the Reserves.

Gardens open.

18. The gardens shall be open to the public from 8 a.m. to sunset, free of charge, except during entertainments or on other special occasions, when, permission being first obtained, an admission fee not exceeding 1s. may be charged.

Improper Entry.

19. No person shall be nor remain in the gardens after the gates have been closed, nor be nor remain in any portion of the gardens which may be closed to the public for the time being, or enter the gardens by any manner than through the gates rightfully open by an authorised person, nor shall climb or jump over or through the gates or fences in or around the gardens.

Closing hours of Crawley Reserve.

20. The hours during which Reserve No. A17375 shall be open to vehicles shall be from eight o'clock a.m. to eleven o'clock p.m. daily. Except between these hours, no person shall bring into or suffer to remain upon or within the reserve any vehicle or boat whether horse-drawn or propelled mechanically by wind or otherwise. For the enforcement of this By-law gates may be established across the road at or near its junction with the Perth-Fremantle road, and the fact that the gates are closed shall be conclusive evidence of the closure of the Reserve under this By-law, notwithstanding that the times stated may have passed or have not arrived, and no

redress, by way of damages or otherwise shall accrue to any person against the Board or its servants by reason of the wrongful closure of the gates at times other than those specified.

Children.

21. No children under five years of age shall be allowed in the gardens unless in charge of an adult person.

Trespass.

22. No person, except workmen employed in the reserves, shall enter any place enclosed for trees, flowers, or shrubs, or plantations of young trees, nor step, or walk upon, or jump across any plot therein which may be set apart for shrubs, plants or flowers.

Obstructing Employees.

23. No person shall in any part of the reserves wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use or enjoyment of the gardens, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of, or refuse or neglect to give his name and address to any officer, gardener, keeper, labourer, workman, or other person employed in any connection therewith.

Sails.

24. No person shall spread or dry sails or other similar material upon the reserves.

Traffic.

25. The Traffic requirements in force for the time being under the Traffic Act, 1919, and its amendments, shall be observed on the said Reserves, but always with the limitation that no person shall at any time drive, ride, or impel any carriage, motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, tricycle, or other vehicle at a speed exceeding 6 miles an hour.

Mooring Boats.

26. No boat shall be moored or anchored, or kept or left moored or anchored or unattended opposite or near that part of the Crawley Beach which extends from Pelican Point to the Perth City Baths, unless such boat is and remains at least one chain below low water mark, except as hereinafter provided.

Landing Passengers.

27. If it is necessary to bring any boat nearer to the said beach than is mentioned in the preceding regulation, for the purpose of passengers or any of the crew embarking or disembarking, the purpose shall be effected as speedily as possible, and the boat shall be then immediately removed to and kept at a distance of at least one chain below low water mark.

Beaching Boats.

28. No person shall beach a boat upon the Reserves at any place other than that set apart for the purpose; and no boat thus beached shall be moved, handled, or interfered with in any way by any unauthorised person, but the Board or its employees at the discretion of the Board may remove or require the owner to remove at any time any boat wherever placed. The Board shall not accept any responsibility for the care of nor liability for damage to any boat wherever beached.

Destruction of abandoned Boats.

29. Any boat which may be beached at a place not set apart for the purpose, or which may be drifting, or sunk, or in the opinion of the Board or its employees has been abandoned, may be taken into the possession of the Board and/or removed to such place as it may think fit, and forthwith sold or otherwise disposed of at the discretion of the Board, without redress to the owner for any loss or inconvenience to which he may be subjected thereby.

Swimming Area.

30. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other By-law, the area described hereunder shall be reserved for bathing and swimming, and no boat of any description shall be permitted to enter or remain within such area:—That portion of "A" 17375 bounded by lines starting from a point situated at low water mark on a line bearing about 78 deg. from the most Easterly corner of the building known as the Crawley Bay Tea Rooms, and extending on said bearing of 78 deg. to a point situated North of the most Northerly of a line of posts situated approximately 150 links below low water mark; thence South to said post and South-Easterly, passing along said line of posts for a distance of 1,300 links; thence bearing about 205 deg. about 150 links to low water mark, and thence by said low water mark North-Westerly about 1,700 links to the starting point.

Boating Area.

31. Subject to the provisions of By-laws 26, 27, 28, 29, the area described hereunder shall be reserved for the use of boats, and no person shall bathe or swim therein:—That portion of "A" 17375 bounded by lines starting from a point situated at low water mark on a line bearing about 78 deg. from the North-East corner of the building known as the Crawley Bay Tea Rooms and extending on said bearing of 78 deg. for a distance of about 150 links; thence Northerly about 800 links parallel to and approximately 150 links below low water mark; thence Westerly about 150 links to said low water mark, and along the latter Southerly about 800 links to the starting point.

Permits for Camping.

32. Notwithstanding the provisions of By-law No. 9 camping may be permitted in areas set apart for the purpose, but not elsewhere, at Reserve A17375 (Crawley) and Reserve No. 17391 (South Nedlands), upon the issue of a permit from the Camp Controller and subject to the following conditions:—

- (a.) for the purposes of this by-law the term "Camp Controller" shall mean the person appointed by the Board from time to time to control and supervise the Camping Areas, and shall particularly apply to the Master of the Old Men's Home, for Reserve No. 17391, and to the Caretaker, Crawley Recreation Reserve, for Reserve A17375.
- (b.) the permit will indicate the site to be occupied, and the Controller's decision in any dispute shall be final.

Fees are payable prior to the issue of permits, on the following scale:—

- For permits to camp for a period not exceeding 24 hours, 2s. 6d.
- For permits to camp for a period not exceeding 3 days, 5s.
- For permits to camp for a period not exceeding 7 days, 10s.

Extensions of the permit may be secured upon the payment of a further fee upon the above scale.

- (c.) No person shall sub-let any camp, or sell, give or otherwise dispose of any permit to any person.
- (d.) Except by the permission of the Camp Controller, no person shall bring into or keep within the Camping Area any animals or birds whatever.
- (e.) No person shall misconduct himself or indulge in any riotous or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards dress in the Camping Area.
- (f.) No person shall bring into or keep or consume in the Camping Area any intoxicating liquor, nor enter nor remain thereon when visibly under the influence of liquor.
- (g.) Campers must keep the Area, covered by their permit, in a clean and sanitary condition at all times. All rubbish capable of destruction by fire shall be burned by the occupier in the approved fire place.
- (h.) All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided, and in no circumstances will improvised conveniences or individual camping sites be permitted.
- (i.) No person shall cause or permit any damage to trees, shrubs, or grass, whether naturally or artificially planted within or surrounding the Camping Area. The presence of green timber or foliage on the Area covered by any camping permit shall be *prima facie* evidence that the holder of the permit has caused or permitted damage, unless the permit holder has pointed out the damage before taking over the camping site.
- (j.) Camping permits may at any time be withdrawn by the Camp Controller, if in his opinion a breach of these By-laws has been committed, or if, in his opinion, it is desirable that the permit shall be terminated. In the event of termination hereunder, the rental paid shall be forfeited to the Board, and no compensation shall be claimed or paid for loss, damage or inconvenience suffered through the withdrawal of the permit.
- (k.) Subject to the right of the Camp Controller, and the officers and employees of the Board, or any person acting under their instructions, or any Police Constable, to enter any Camping Site at any time, no person shall enter into or remain within such Camping Site except with the permission of the holder of the permit.

(l.) No fires shall be lighted on any Camping Area, except in places approved by the Camp Controller.

(m.) Except so far as they may be inconsistent with this By-law, the whole of the By-laws now or hereafter made by the Executive Council to apply to Areas under control of the Board shall apply to Camping Areas.

Penalty.

33. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to being immediately removed from the Reserve.
