# WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the inclusion, as a By-law under Section 19 of "The Government Electric Works Act, 1914," of the following Rules and Regulations for the guidance of all employees of the Government Electricity Supply; to be known as By-law 82:—

# WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

The Commissioner of Railways of Western Australia, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by "The Government Electric Works Act, 1914" (No. 29 of 1915) and Amendment Act (No. 42 of 1915), does hereby make the following By-law, to come into operation on the third day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and all previous By-laws, Rules and Regulations conflicting therewith are hereby repealed.

## BY-LAW No. 82.

The Rules and Regulations for the guidance of the officers and men employed on the Government Electricity Supply System of Western Australia shall be those set forth in the schedule hereto.

## W.A. GOVERNMENT ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Every Employee supplied with this Book must make himself thoroughly acquainted with, and will be held responsible, for a knowledge of and compliance with the whole of the following Rules and Regulations.

#### Telephone Messages in case of emergency.

1. In the event of a total interruption of the system, the following to be advised immediately by telephone:—General Manager, Electrical Engineer, Station Superintendent.

## Employee.

2. "Employee" shall mean any person employed by the Commissioner who has been supplied with a copy of these Rules and Regulations, whether employed in a permanent capacity or as a supernumerary.

## Conditions of Service.

3. All persons employed by the Commissioner must devote themselves exclusively to his service, and conform to all the Rules and Regulations of the Commissioner; they must reside at whatever place may be appointed, attend at such hours as may be required, and pay prompt obedience to all persons placed in authority over them.

#### Names and Addresses of Employees.

4. The name and address of every employee must be registered at the Station or Depot to which he is attached, or at which he is paid, so that, if required in cases of emergency, the employee may be readily found. Any change of address must be at once notified, in order that the record may be kept perfect.

#### Absence from, and Exchange of, Duty.

5. No employee is allowed to absent himself from duty, to alter his appointed hours of attendance, or to exchange duty with any other employee, without the special permission of his superior officer. In case of illness or accident he must immediately report the circumstances to his superior officer. If prevented by illness from attending his duty, he must promptly furnish a medical certificate from a qualified medical man, or such other evidence as the Head of his Branch may consider satisfactory.

## Gambling.

6. Gambling on any of the works or premises is strictly forbidden.

#### Conduct of Employees.

7. Employees must be prompt, civil, and obliging. They must afford every proper facility for the business to be performed; be careful to give correct information, and, when asked, give their names or numbers without hesitation. Employees shall not use improper language, or enter into an altercation with the public or their fellow employees, whatever provocation may be given.

## Safety of Public of first importance.

S. The safety of the public shall be the first and most important duty of every employee.

Book of Rules and Regulations, to whom supplied.

9. Every employee—except casual men employed on special or additional work—must be supplied by his superior officer with, and have with him when on duty, and produce when required, a copy of these Rules and Regulations.

# Lost Copies of Rules and Regulations, etc., must be replaced.

10. If any employee of the Commissioner lose his copy of the Rules and Regulations, Time Table, Appendix, or other document of which the Rules require that he should be in possession, he must immediately obtain another copy from his superior officer.

# All Employees must assist in carrying out the Rules and Regulations.

- 11. (a) Every employee must assist in carrying out the Rules and Regulations, and immediately report to his superior officer any infringement thereof, or any occurrence which may come under his notice affecting the safe and proper working of the service.
- (b) In any case where an employee does not understand his duty, or is in doubt as to his duty, he must immediately apply to his immediate superior for instructions.

## Giving security.

12. Employees holding situations of trust may be required to find security for their fidelity of such kind and in such a manner as the Commissioner may determine.

#### Unfitness for Duty.

- 13. (a) If any employee in charge shall consider at any time that any employee under his direction or supervision is under the influence of intoxicants, or from any other cause is unfit to perform his duties, he shall suspend him from duty and immediately report the matter to the Head of the Branch through his immediate superior.
- (b) No employee while on duty is allowed to enter any place for the purpose of obtaining intoxicating liquor, except by permission of a superior officer. Employees on duty must not accept intoxicating liquor from any person.

Fees or Gratuities must not be accepted.

14. No gratuity is allowed to be taken by employees from any person.

## Trading forbidden.

15. No employee shall trade, either directly or indirectly, for himself or others.

Not to leave the Service without giving the required Notice.

16. No employee, unless temporarily employed, will be allowed to leave the service without giving the following notice in writing of his intention to do so, under pain of forfeiting any wages or salary which may be due:—

Officers paid by yearly salary—One (1) month. Employees paid by daily wages—Fourteen (14) days.

### Leaving without Notice.

17. An employee shall be held liable for any loss, damage, inconvenience, or expense which may be occasioned by his leaving without giving such notice, unless permission to leave the service has been obtained from the Head of his Branch.

#### Misconduct punishable.

18. (a) The Commissioner may at any time, without notice, dismiss, or his officers may suspend from duty, any employee for intoxication, disobedience of orders, negligence, or misconduct, or for being absent from duty without leave, and no wages or salary from the date of his suspension can be claimed from the Commissioner by any employee after his dismissal, or during the period of his suspension from duty, or during his absence from duty from any cause.

#### Fines.

(b) The Commissioner or his officers may impose fines not exceeding Five pounds in respect of disobedience to orders, neglect of duty, or any other offence, and deduct such sums from the wages or salaries of employees.

## Right of Appeal.

- (c) (i) Should any employee think himself aggrieved at any time, he may appeal to the Head of his Branch, and finally to the Commissioner, but in such case the appeal must be sent through the Head of his Branch.
- (ii) Any employee who has been continuously employed for one year, and who has been fined, or reduced to a lower class or grade, or dismissed, may appeal to the Appeal Board in the manner laid down in the Appeal Board Regulations.

Offences recorded on personal History Cards.

19. A period of two years—void of recorded offence—will be taken as obliterating previous detrimental records from the personal history cards of employees; excepting that in any particular case where it may be so deemed necessary, the Commissioner may direct that the record of any offence shall remain. Record of cases heard before the Appeal Board will not be obliterated.

Employees to perform such other Duties as may be required.

20. All employees will be expected to perform such other duties in addition to, or in place of, their regular duties, as their superior officers may direct.

Discretion required in performance of Duties.

21. In all matters not fully covered by these Regulations, employees are expected to use judgment and discretion in performing their duties.

Property of the Commissioner not to be converted to Employee's use.

22. Every employee shall be held responsible for the careful use and preservation of all articles belonging to the Commissioner in their custody or care, and no employee will be allowed to convert to his own use any such articles.

#### Rent.

23. The Commissioner may deduct from the salary or pay of any employee, who is a tenant of any premises vested in the Commissioner, any sums that may be due by him for rent in respect of such premises.

Reckless exposure to Danger to be prevented.

24. Every employee must prevent, as far as possible, reckless exposure to danger on the part of any other employee.

## Trespassing.

- 25. (a) No person, other than an employee in the execution of his duty, must allow to be or walk on the premises, unless provided with written or printed permission to do so, signed by a properly authorised officer.
- (b) Unless instructions are issued to the contrary, any person trespassing must be requested to leave the premises, and, on complying, must be warned not to go or pass thereon again. If such person refuse to quit he must be requested to give his name and address, which must be handed to the nearest superior officer, with a report of the circumstances. In the event of the offender refusing his name and address, he must be detained and given in charge of the Police.

Legal proceedings not to be taken without authority.

26. No employee shall undertake any legal proceedings on behalf of the Commissioner, or on behalf of any other employee, nor shall show or produce any document or book or instruction or copy thereof to any person not connected with the Department, nor shall directly or indirectly make any communication to any person not officially entitled thereto upon any matter affecting the Department or the business or employees thereof, or relating to the service or his own official position, or acts upon any political question or subject whatsoever, without having first obtained authority or instructions from the Head of the Branch or from the Commissioner.

Responsible Officers to see that proper Books and Accounts are kept.

27. Every officer is responsible for each person under his control keeping the proper records, books, and accounts applicable to his duties. Any employee failing to report an irregularity which may come to his knowledge will incur the same responsibility as if he were the person in fault.

Employees to forward Communications only through their Superior Officers—Not to solicit outside influence.

28. Employees must not address communications in connection with their public duties or positions in the service other than through their immediate superior officers, or use or obtain outside influence, either directly or indirectly, to represent their requirements.

# Reports against Employees to be made within Seven Days.

29. Any employee who has cause to complain of or make a report against any other employee shall make the complaint through his immediate superior to the Head of his Branch within seven days of the occurrence.

Employees not to leave Duty until relieved.

30. (a) In any case in which one employee is appointed to relieve another, the person about to be relieved shall not, under any pretext, leave duty until the employee appointed to relieve him arrived.

# Full information must be given when Employees change Duty.

(b) On the change of duty between employees all circumstances which may have occurred out of the ordinary course of working must be communicated to the employee coming on duty before he takes charge, and the log or report book noted.

#### Sobriety of person relieving.

(c) No person employed in any capacity shall give up charge to any other person whose duty it may be to relieve him unless the person being relieved shall be satisfied of the sobriety of the person whose duty it may be to relieve him.

# Employees not to borrow money from other Employees.

31. Employees are strictly forbidden to borrow money from or to place themselves under any pecuniary obligation to other employees.

## Witnesses in Court Cases.

32. Any employee attending in his official capacity under a subpœna or order to give evidence or to produce papers in any court shall attend such court in performance of and as part of his official duty. He must, as early as possible after the receipt of such subpœna, acquaint his superior officer with the fact, and obtain his permission for absenting himself. He shall remit or cause to be remitted to the Head of the Branch, or other employee authorised to receive such, all fees received by him for the performance of such duty, together with a statement of account and vouchers of the necessary expenses (if any) incurred by him in the performance of such duty.

## Violence not to be used.

33. In the event of any employee finding himself in the position where the use of force or violence is

necessary and incumbent upon him in the proper execution of his duty, he should bear in mind that the use of force or violence should only be resorted to when all other means of persuasion are futile. Only that degree of force or violence should even then be used which may be necessary for the execution of the duty in hand.

#### Witnesses' Names to be obtained.

34. In all cases where there have been any violation of "The Government Electric Works Act, 1914" (No. 29 of 1915), and Amendment Act (No. 42 of 1915), or of the By-laws of the Commissioner, it is desirable that the names and addresses of two or more persons present on the occasion be obtained, and reported with the name and address of the offending person.

In case of detention immediate Report to be made.

35. (a) Whenever any person is detained, or taken into custody, a telegraph or telephone message, stating his name, address and occupation, and the nature of the charge, is to be forwarded to the Head of the Branch instantly, and a written report is also to be sent to superior officer stating, with the particulars of the case, when and where the charge is to be heard.

Person detained to be taken before a Magistrate.

(b) Anyone taken into custody should be taken before a magistrate as soon as practicable.

#### Responsibilities.

36. The Shift Engineer at the East Perth Power House, the responsible officer of the watch, will be responsible for the proper conduct of operations carried out during his shift, and he shall also be responsible for the proper direction to the sub-station operators, and all switching movements that are given under his directions on the system.

# Relief.

37. Each employee reporting on duty shall read the log sheet for the previous shifts, and make a general examination of the plant before taking over the shift, i.e., before the employee to be relieved leaves the power station or sub-station. The employee being relieved is to direct his relief's attention to any special conditions or new notices. The employee being relieved shall sign the log in the presence of his relieve, who shall also sign the log in the presence of the employee being relieved.

## Unfit for Duty.

38. If any employee from illness or other cause is unable to take his usual shift, he should arrange to advise his superior officer in time to enable the latter to make the necessary arrangements for his relief. If unable to advise his superior officer, notice should be given to the Electrical Engineer.

## Rosters.

39. No departure from the standard arrangement of shifts shall be made without previous permission from the superior officer.

## Admission to Stations.

40. No persons are allowed to enter the Power Station or any substation, or enter upon any other works without a permit signed by the General Manager or his duly authorised officer, and no permit will be issued at periods when plant is being overhauled or during the night running of the plant.

#### Accidents.

41. When any accident occurs to any of the Staff the Shift Engineer at East Perth and the Electrical Engineer are to be informed thereof as soon as possible per telephone. Full particulars of the occurrence must subsequently be furnished in writing to the Electrical Engineer. Each employee must make himself acquainted with the suggested treatment of cases relating to apparent death from electric shock as attached herewith, but no time must be lost in summoning a doctor.

## Ambulance Box.

42. The key for the Ambulance Box is kept in the place provided for it. The contents of the box are for First Aid purposes only, and must not be interfered with. After the Ambulance Box has been used any material used must be replaced, and the Officer-in-charge of the Station concerned shall requisition for the necessary replacements at the first opportunity, and in the event of such material not being received in reasonable time he shall so advise the Electrical Engineer. Every care must be taken with the Ambulance Box contents, as it being complete may be the means of saving a life.

#### Fire.

43. Each employee, at his particular Substation or the Power Station, must familiarise himself with the various instructions issued and with the fire-extinguishing appliances installed.

## Log Entries.

44. All switching carried out and plant or system irregularities occurring shall be entered on the log sheet showing the accurate times of their occurrence, and remarks thereon, as soon as possible after their occurrence. Entries relating to switching or other operations carried out on instructions from the Electrical Engineer or other proper source shall be followed by bracketed entry showing origin of such instructions. Entries relating to operations or occurrences which have been reported—other than those on shift in this station—shall be followed by bracketed entry to show that they have been reported to such officers. All record of H.T. and L.T. Feeder currents and pressure, machine currents and bus-bar pressures, for which columns are provided, shall be logged half-hourly, or as otherwise provided, and actual instrument readings are to be entered. It is important that each group of these readings be taken as nearly as possible simultaneously. switchboard attendant shall enter the maximum observed load on the system during his shift.

## Emergency Lights.

45. In any station where there are not two sources of lighting supply, at least one hurricane kerosene lamp shall be kept alight during the hours of darkness. It is the duty of the switchboard attendant on day shift to replenish the kerosene, trim and clean such lamp or lamps every day.

#### Oral Messages.

46. When receiving any telephone or verbal message, the substance thereof is to be repeated to insure that both parties are quite clear as to its purpose. In eases where switching or other operations are required, the operator shall orally advise the sender of the message immediately such operations have been carried out.

#### Alarm Bells.

47. These are connected with telephone, automatic switches, and circuit breakers, etc. The switchboard attendant on coming on shift shall ascertain that all bells and indicating devices are in working order.

#### Caution and Danger Notices.

48. These will be provided for use as follows:—
"Caution" notices are for affixing to switch control
gear or other apparatus to draw attention to the
condition of such apparatus and connections, either
when it is made dead, or as may be necessary to guard
against it being disturbed by inadvertence or accident,

"Danger" notices are for affixing in conspicuous positions near any live apparatus that may be temporarily installed or temporarily exposed, and with which it might be possible to come in dangerous proximity, or contact, by inadvertence or accident. An entry must be made in the log whenever any such notice is affixed, stating the time of and reason for its use; an entry must also be made when the notice is detached.

## Making Apparatus alive.

49. Before making alive any gear which has been out of service, the following points should be observed:—

That all oil switches, circuit-breakers, or fuses, and that relay where used, are properly set for current values and time limits.

That all apparatus is clear, and that no tools or other loose materials are lying around.

It must always be remembered that apparatus should be considered "alive" and no risks taken once switches are closed on any part of the circuit.

## Starting up Rotary Converters.

50. Before starting up a rotary converter insure:—

That all gear in connection with it is clear and in starting position.

That the brush position is correct.

That the "making alive" points have been observed and found O.K.

After starting, and where necessary, see that the oil rings are running and carrying sufficiency of oil.

#### Inspection.

51. Immediately after shutting down any part of the plant the same is to be examined, and if signs are observed of any undue heating having occurred, or repairs being necessary, the fact should be immediately reported to the Shift Engineer, East Perth Power Station.

## Running up Generators.

52. Until the generator is running at approximately normal speed the field rheostat should be kept in the full lower volts position, and where possible the field circuit shall be kept open or short circuited.

#### Synchronising.

53. Always arrange to have the incoming generator running very slightly faster than the on-load generators. Adjust the incoming generator's pressure to about one per cent, higher than that of the on-load generator.

Observe at least one complete cycle of the synchronising devise to check indication of lamps and pointer, and close main oil switch at the correct instant as gauged by the position of the pointer.

Note.—The synchroscopes, used with the main generators, have the lamps arranged to show bright when phases are in synchronism.

## Shutting down Generator.

54. Under normal conditions reduce load on outgoing generator by means of its governor, and adjust excitation to keep its power factor at approximately unity, so that on opening its oil switch the minimum possible current will be interrupted. This insures minimum arcing at switch contacts, and minimum disturbance to voltage of on load machines on which the governors and excitation should be adjudged as will be necessary.

The utmost care must be exercised in putting on and taking off generators, and unless in cases of emergency ample time shall be taken so that the switchboard attendant in the control room is able to divide the load and adjust for good operating conditions.

## Transformer Switching.

55. Normally transformers will be made alive and dead always on the primary side, *i.e.*, the side electrically nearest the source of supply.

In other words the correct order of closing transformer switches is:—

- 1. Primary Switch.
- 2. Secondary Switch.

And the correct order of opening transformer switches:—

- 1. Secondary Switch.
- 2. Primary Switch.

## Neutral Earth Switches.

56. These will be operated as set out in special instructions.

## Low Tension Circuit Breakers.

57. When a knite switch has a direct operated or fixed handle circuit breaker in series with it, the circuit breaker shall be closed first and the knife switch last.

To open any such circuits the circuit breaker in every case must be opened first.

## Oil Switches and Isolators.

58. When isolators have an oil switch in series with them, and it is desired to close the circuit, the isolators shall be closed first and the oil switch last. To open any such circuit the oil switch in every case must be opened before any attempt is made to open the isolator. Before proceeding to open any isolator or knife switch the responsible officer shall insure that the corresponding oil switch or circuit breaker is open. He shall also take proper steps to insure that the oil switch or circuit breaker cannot be closed by inadvertence or accident.

#### Isolators.

#### 59. On draw-out type of switch-gear-

"Isolators closed" means that the isolating contacts, fixed to the switch carriage, are in proper engagement with those on bus and cable terminals—in other words that the switch carriage is pushed home.

"Isolators open" means that the above contacts are out of engagement—in other words, that the switch carriage is pulled out.

#### Relays.

60. When opening switches fitted with automatic trip (e.g., E.H.T. switches) this operation should be done by means of the control switch, and also from time to time by closing the relay trip contacts in regular sequence to insure that the mechanism and trip circuits are in order.

#### E.H.T. Disturbance.

61. In the event of any exceptional H.T. disturbance, all switches, instruments, and running machines should be immediately examined, and any abnormality noted and reported to the Electrical Engineer.

## Interruptions.

62. In the event of pressure on the E.H.T. bus bars at a Traction Substation falling below 4,000 volts, the following operations should be carried out by the Substation operator on his own initiative, *i.e.*, without reference to the Shift Engineer:—

Open all 600-volt D.C. Feeders.

Open all E.H.T. oil switches, noting whether any had tripped automatically.

If the failure of pressure appears to have been caused by failure of any of the gear in the Substation, notify the Shift Engineer as soon as possible; if not, stand by handy to telephone.

In the event of a stoppage of, or abnormal supply to, any portion of the system supplied from this station, a detailed written report must be sent to the superior officer before the shift is completed.

#### Flash over.

62a. In the event of a rotary converter flashing over it must be shut down immediately. If another converter is available start up same and put it on to the bus-bars as soon as possible, and report to the Shift Engineer. Connections, e.g., circuit breaker, rheostat, shunt field and equaliser switch should be examined for any apparent cause of flash over which, if found, must be rectified.

Where a second machine is not available for running up, and the only available one had flashed over, it must be shut down immediately, and the Shift Engineer at East Perth Power Station advised forthwith. Then proceed with rectification as above, running up, putting on the bus-bars, and again advising the Shift Engineer.

The restoring of the service is your first consideration, and operators must use every means possible to maintain continuity of supply, and not shut down while it is possible to carry the load; the Shift Engineer at East Perth Power Station will direct, and close touch must be maintained with him.

#### Minor Troubles.

63. When starting up or putting a machine on load, if there is any trouble, e.g., with reversed polarity, or getting circuit breaker to remain closed, and this cannot readily be put right, run up another set and attend to the trouble on the first machine later. Report the occurrence to the Shift Engineer at East Perth Power Station.

#### D.C. Switching.

64. In the event of a feeder circuit breaker opening on overload or short circuit outside the Substation, the breaker is to be closed after an interval

of 15 seconds, and should the breaker trip immediately it is to be closed a second time after a lapse of 15 seconds. If the cause is apparently overload or other than short circuit, the breaker should be closed a third time if necessary. Should the breaker again trip it is to be left open, and the Shift Engineer is to be advised.

## Electrical Fires.

65. All fire-fighting appliances must be kept in good condition, and fire buckets filled with clean dry sand.

In the event of a fire breaking out amongst the cables, or in any of the apparatus in the Station, as a rule the following procedure must be adopted:—

- (a) If necessary, "deaden" all machines, busbars, and cables.
- (b) Apply sand.
- (e) Then apply contents of Pyrene Fire Extinguishers.

Sand must be used with discretion; for instance, it would be of little use to throw sand into oil insulated transformers, nor would it be of use to apply Pyrene to a running machine. Pyrene should be effective for a burning transformer, as far as oil inside is concerned, whilst sand and Pyrene should be applied to burning oil which has run out of the tank. Sand should be kept away from the machine bearings as far as possible. Care should be taken when Pyrene Fire Extinguishers are used in confined positions, as the resultant gases in such circumstances are injurious to health.

#### Feeder Diagrams.

66. The feeder diagrams are an important part of the equipment, and must be checked immediately after taking up shift; any alterations noticed which have not been entered on the log sheet must be reported at once. All alterations must be logged, and a note left for the relieving Shift Engineer.

## Line Faults.

67. In the event of a transmission line switch opening, it may be closed three times to endeavour to clear the fault unless it is a severe short circuit, when the switch must be kept open. The Electrical Engineer and Electric Mains Foreman are to be notified immediately a fault occurs. As soon as a line is made alive after a fault, the Shift Engineer is to instruct all District Fitters who may be affected to see that any district switches which could have opened as a result of the fault are closed.

## Key Boxes.

68. The keys of the high tension cubicles are to be kept on the key-board in the control room, and are not to be removed by anyone but the Shift Engineer, who will be held responsible for the locking of all doors leading to the E.H.T. apparatus. Any key removed from its normal position is to be replaced as soon as possible.

# Work being performed on Electrical Apparatus in Power Station.

69. When work of any nature is being performed on electrical equipment above 110 volts pressure the Shift Engineer must in every case personally see that the switches are opened, and if possible the apparatus earthed before permitting the man to enter. The man employed on the work is to obtain the oil switch key and retain it till finished. He will sign the "Live Line receipt" before starting work,

and on completion after handing the key back. In all cases the work is to be made clear and the key returned to the Shift Engineer by 4.55 p.m., or if not, the Electrical Engineer or Station Superintendent must be immediately notified the reasons. equipment is made "dead" in order to allow of work being performed on a certain part thereof, in no case shall the Shitt Engineer permit any person other than the one holding switch key, or who has signed the receipt, to visit or work on any other part of the same equipment, or of any other which may be made "dead" incidental to the first operation, unless special written permission is obtained from the Electrical Engineer or Station Superintendent, before starting to work and also before switching in after the completion of same.

The Shift Engineer only is authorised to issue and receive "Live Line" orders.

## Lines not to be made dead without authority.

Under no circumstances are the lines to be made dead by linesmen or others without first obtaining the necessary authority from the Power Station, and then full reasons must be given why the supply is required to be cut off.

#### Working on E.H.T. Transmission Lines.

70. When it is necessary to carry out any work on the extra high tension lines the Electric Mains Foreman will advise the Shift Engineer, giving full particulars of work to be performed and the time estimated that the line will be out of service. The Shift Engineer will see that the line switch is opened and locked at the Power Station, and a "Caution" tablet affixed. He will also refer to the diagram board, and arrange for any district switches which may feed into the line to be worked on to be opened. Before commencing work the leading hand in charge of the section is to telephone to the Shift Engineer, and satisfy himself that all necessary switches are opened.

Where section switches are provided on the line he will, for greater security, open them on each side of the work himself. He will then earth each line on both sides of the work with the apparatus provided before allowing any men on the line.

After the work is completed he will see that all men are off the line and ladders taken down, remove the earth, close any section switch he has opened, and advise the Shift Engineer that the line may be made alive. The Engineer at the Power Station is to accept clearance only from the man who asked for the line to be made dead. All telephone messages, with the correct times and names of persons concerned, are to be entered in the "Telephone Report Book."

## Interconnected Sections.

71. Where sections of transmission line are connected through district transformers in such a way that lines may be alive when sectionalising switches are open the man in charge of the work must himself open high and low tension switches on each transformer affecting the section. These sections will be indicated in the appended diagram.

## Underground Cable Failures.

72. In the event of a failure on a cable the Power Station and Substation switches on the faulty section are to be opened and locked. It is to be reported immediately and no further action taken pending definite special instructions from a responsible officer.

#### Overhead 600-volt Trolley Lines.

73. In the event of any defect in or damage to the overhead wires, the car starter at the Car Barn must be advised, who will notify the linesmen on duty. In the meantime the damaged part must be protected until repaired by the linesmen or a responsible officer arrives. If a trolley or feeder wire should break or fall to the ground, employees must endeavour to draw the wire from contact with the rails and secure it, and must warn all foot-passengers or persons in charge of vehicles to keep clear of the wire until the section is switched out. The wire must only be handled by the trolley tongs, a dry coat, hat, rope, or other non-conductive material to avoid shocks.

#### Control Room, East Perth Power Station.

74. No person shall under any circumstances be permitted to enter the control room at the East Pertin Power Station without special permission excepting the Shift Engineer and switchboard attendant of the watch.

#### Telephones.

75. Telephones must not be used for private conversations, and must be kept clear as far as condition will permit.

## Insulating Apparatus.

76. For working on low-tension apparatus, rubber gloves and insulating switch sticks are provided, and must be maintained in the Power Station and Substations and periodically examined and tested. Before using such apparatus for the purpose of above, the operator will ascertain carefully the exact position of all earthed apparatus within reach, and note the motions of his body liable to bring him or his clothes into contact with such earthed apparatus, and will carefully avoid such motions.

When carrying any tool, stick, bar, ladder, or any material whatever in proximity to high-tension conductors, extreme care must be used to avoid accidental contact. The whole length of such tool or ladder must be kept constantly in view while it is being moved.

#### Touching Live Parts.

77. No employee shall at the same time touch two parts of different potential, or any current-carrying part. When this is necessary the insulating gloves or other protection shall be used. Under no circumstances shall high-tension apparatus be touched. No employee shall touch any exposed ungrounded live parts unless he is insulated from other conducting surfaces. Concrete, masonary, earth, and the damp surfaces of wood poles, platforms, floors, and other structures are conducting surfaces. Employees shall not place dependence for their safety on the insulating covering of wires.

All precautions for handling live parts in this section should be observed in handling insulated wires. Insulation on a wire may look perfect, but it frequently cannot be relied on to prevent shock. Every employee working on or about equipment or lines exposed in overhead construction to higher voltages should assure himself that they are free from dangerous leakage or induction, or that they have been effectively grounded.

## Opening Circuits and Working from below.

78. Manual switches and disconnectors should always be closed by a single unhesitating motion, and, if possible, with one hand.

Employees should avoid working on equipment or lines from any position by reason of which a shock or slip will tend to bring the body toward exposed live parts. Work should be done from below rather than above.

## Connecting Wires and Grounds.

79. In connecting dead equipment or lines to a live circuit by means of a connecting wire or device, employees should first apply the wire to the dead part before attaching it to the circuit.

When disconnecting the live end should be removed first. Loose conductors should be kept away from exposed live parts. Metal measuring tapes, or those having metal threads woven in the fabric should be avoided.

#### Never open Series Circuits.

So. Live series circuits, such as the secondaries of current transformers to meters or other devices, should never be opened until a jumper has been connected across the point of opening. Before working on any device in a series circuit, a jumper shall be connected around it.

#### Elevated Positions.

S1. When working in an elevated position, especially above live or moving parts, assure yourself of the security of your position and support, taking precautions to avoid dropping tools or materials.

#### Safety Supports and Safety Belts.

82. Employees should not support themselves on any portion of a tree, pole, structure, ladder, or other elevated structure without first making sure that the supports are strong enough, reinforcing them if necessary.

Portable ladders should be in a safe position before being climbed. The slipping of a ladder at either end should be carefully guarded against, especially where the surfaces are smooth or vibrating. Employees shall when working in elevated positions secure themselves from falling by wearing a leather safety belt, which is issued to linesmen and other employees requiring same.

## Stringing Wires.

83. In stringing wires near live lines the wires being handled should be treated as alive unless they are effectually grounded by approved means.

Hand lines used to pull wires over live circuits should not contain metal strands.

#### Protecting Traffic.

84. When working overhead keep tools and materials not in use in proper receptacles; tools or materials should not be thrown to or from the man on the pole, but should be raised or lowered by hand-line, in proper receptacles.

Workmen must not stand where they can be struck by materials dropped by men working overhead.

Pole-holes and obstructions shall be protected by watchmen or by suitable guards and danger signals or lights, in a location conspicuous to traffic. When working overhead, or hoisting or lowering materials above spaces where traffic occurs, a man should be stationed to warn passers-by.

Where traffic is light warning signs may be used in lieu of watchmen. Where traffic is congested, it may be necessary to rope off the space.

#### Stringing Lines.

85. Never string wires near live lines, except by means of suitable insulating hand-lines or other appliances.

Never change the strains on a pole by adding or removing wires until assured that the pole will stand the altered strains.

#### Report Defects.

86. Report promptly to your immediate superior any dangerous condition of your own or other utilities observed arising from defective insulators, pins, crossarms, sagging wires, etc.

Apparent Death from Electric Shock.

89. Each employee is to make himself familiar with the following instructions, which deal with resuscitation after apparent death from electric shock.

Instructions for rescuing Persons in Contact with "Live" Electrical Conductors.

- 90. (a) Procure a dry cap, coat, rope, stick, rubber gloves, or other dry non-conducting material to prevent the hands touching the wire, etc., or the patient's skin, where bare or thinly covered.
- (b) Remove the persons from contact with the live wire or surface immediately, as delay may cause loss of life, but without pressing his hands or body against the "live" metal.
- (c) If a person is caught by, or has hold of, a "live" wire carrying current at a low voltage, current may be cut off it by connecting it to the neutral wire or to ground, or by cutting it with pliers on the supply side of where contact is being made. Care must be exercised by the man cutting the wire to see that he is insulated from the ground or from any metal connected to ground.
- (d) Where voltages higher than 500 volts are concerned, the risk from handling the patient is very great, and a long dry stick or rope should be used to draw him away from contact with the wire, etc., taking care the wire is not allowed to touch his face or body while doing so.

A messenger should also be despatched immediately for the nearest doctor, and the telephone at-

tendant at the most convenient exchange must at once be instructed to ring up the nearest doctor.

## First-aid Treatment.

91. Lay the patient on his back in as comfortable a position as possible, and loosen all tight clothing. Remove him to the open air, if possible; otherwise throw open all windows and let him have plenty of air. If he is breathing, and has a pulse at the wrist, in a large majority of cases he will rapidly recover; if faint or nervous, let him sip two teaspoonsful of aromatic spirit of ammonia in a wineglassful of water—the ammonia is in the ambulance chests; apply hot stupes over the heart, hot-water bottle to feet, and dash cold water in the face if there is indication of collapse. When apparently dead or dying, perform artificial respiration.

Begin treatment immediately on the spot.

- (a) Instantly loosen or cut apart all neck and waist bands, and then
  - (b) Perform artificial respiration as follows:-

Place the patient face downwards, with his head turned to one side, or with right forearm beneath forehead.

Kneel either across or by the side of the patient, facing his head.

Place your hands flat over the back, on the lowest ribs, one on each side, and gradually throw the weight of your body forward, so as to produce firm but not violent pressure on the patient's chest. (Fig. 1.)

Then raise your body slowly, so as to remove the pressure, but without lifting the hands from the patient's body. (Fig. 2.)

Repeat this forward and backward movement (pressure and relaxation of pressure) every four or five seconds, *i.e.*, twelve or fifteen times a minute.

Do not give up too soon. Any time within two hours you may be on the very threshold of success without there being any sign of it, Prevent unnecessary crowding round the body.

Other Measures, where there is Assistance.

92. Where there is assistance send for blankets, and hot water bottles. When natural breathing has been restored, wrap the patient in dry blankets or other covering, and rub the limbs energetically towards the heart. Promote warmth by applying hot flannels, hot water bottles, or hot bricks (wrapped in flannel). These should not be too hot, nor uncomfortably hot to one's own arm.

When the power of swallowing has returned.

93. Give a few teaspoonsful of spirits (brandy, whisky, gin, or rum) in an equal quantity of water, or some hot tea, coffee, or meat extract, whichever of these things is most handy. Put him to bed as soon as possible and encourage sleep. After an electric shock of sufficient severity to cause unconsciousness, even if the unconsciousness has lasted but a very short time, the patient should under no circumstances be permitted to walk about or return to his work at once, but must have absolute rest and quiet. Watch the patient for some time to see that the breathing does not cease again; if it should, resume artificial respiration.

## HANDLING WHEAT, ETC. (GERALDTON).

(Registered 29th October, 1926.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," the 21st day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between John Darling and Son; Louis Dreyfus and Company; Dalgety and Company, Limited; and the Westralian Farmers, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the Australian Workers' Union (Westralian Branch) Pastoral and Agricultural Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part: Witnesseth, that for the consideration hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

- 1. Area.—The Agreement shall apply to workers engaged in the handling, lumping, and stacking of wheat, including sewing, rebagging, and laying dunnage inside of the Railway Yards at Geraldton.
- 2. This Agreement shall take effect as from the 21st day of October, 1926, and shall continue in force for a period of three years; provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from this date either party may make application to the other party to amend or vary this Agreement; provided that thirty days' notice is given by one to the other parties to the Agreement.
- 3. Hours.—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, and any time worked in excess of these hours shall be classified as overtime and paid for at overtime rates. The hours of work shall be from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. on the first five days of the week, and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.
- 4. Wages.—(a) Basic Wage of £4 5s. per week. (b) The rate of pay for wheat lumping or Tally Clerks shall be 3s. 3½d. per hour; when engaged handling sleepers to be used as dunnage, or sewing of bags, the rate shall be 2s. 6d. per hour.
- 5 Overtime.—From 5 p.m. to 6 p.m., 4s/ per hour. From 6 p.m. to 7 p.m., 6s. 9d. per hour. From 7 p.m. to 8 p.m., 4s. per hour. Saturday, from 1 p.m., 4s. 9d. per hour.
- 6. Holidays, Ordinary.—New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Easter Monday, Boxing Day, and King's Birthday.
- 7. Holidays, Extraordinary.—Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, and Sunday.
- 8. Meal Hours.—Breakfast from 7 a.m. to 8 a.m.—6s. 9d. per hour. Dinner from 12 noon to 1 p.m.—5s. 11d. per hour. Tea from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.—6s. 9d. per hour. In cases where the work for the day commences at 7 a.m., the rate for the hour until 8 a.m. shall be ordinary overtime, viz., 4s. per hour; only in cases where the worker is employed prior to 7 a.m. in the forenoon shall the breakfast hour rate apply.
- 9. Holiday Rates.—The rates of pay for work done on holidays shall be, extraordinary holidays—6s. 6d. per hour; ordinary holidays—5s. per hour.
- 10. Conditions.—When engaged handling wheat five men and a Stacker shall constitute a gang; where an elevator is in use six men and a Stacker.

When men are ordered to work, a minimum rate of two hours shall be paid for.

All men employed to be members of the A.W.U., if available.

Employees shall not carry wheat more than 12 bags in height.

Richey's corner, opposite the Freemasons' Hotel, shall be considered the place to pick up, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 8.30 a.m. in the forenoon, and between the hours of 1 and 2 p.m. in the afternoon; all men engaged to commence work at the appointed hour.

11. The rates embodied in this Agreement are subject to variation as per the Waterside Workers' Federal Award.
