Constitution of Health District at Rockingham under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19."

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.P.H. 2751/23; Ex. Co. No. 3347.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District with the boundaries and under the name hereinafter specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the undermentioned

### MENTAL HOSPITAL EMPLOYEES.

(Registered 12th November, 1926.)

No. 35 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 21st day of October, 1926, between the Honourable Chief Secretary for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister"), and the Metropolitan Mental Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workstein Christian (1918). ers (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"): Whereby it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as fol-

- 1. Term.—The currency of this Agreement shall be twelve months from the first day of July, 1926.
- Area and Scope.—This Agreement shall apply to workers specified who are employed by the Minister at the Hospital for Insane, Claremont, the Reception Ward for Mental Cases, Whitby Falls Hospital for the Insane, and Greenplace Hospital for Insane, and Inebriates' Home.
- 3. Definitions .- (a) "Attendant" means any son engaged in nursing, caring for, and working with insane patients, but he or she shall not be called upon to perform any duty which is at ordinary times performed by other than a mental attendant, except in a case of sickness or emergency, or when, in the opinion of the Medical Superintendent, it is reasonably impracticable to provide other relief.

  (b) "Charge Attendant" means the one attendant

who is appointed by the Inspector General to be a charge attendant in charge of any ward in the Hospital for the Insane at Claremont, except Wards 1, 2, 3,

and 4, X Block.
(c) "Head Attendant" means the worker appointed to the position of head attendant at the Claremont Hospital for the Insane.

(d) "Deputy Head Attendant" means a worker ap-

pointed to the position of a deputy head attendant.

(e) "Cook" means any person appointed as cook at

any of the Hospitals referred to in Clause 2.

(f) "Head Laundress" means the worker in charge

of the laundry at the Claremont Hospital.
(g) "Laundress" means a worker employed in the

laundry at Claremont Hospital.

(h) "Lodgekeeper" means the worker in charge of

- the lodge gates at Claremont Hospital.

  (i) "Gardeners" means workers employed as gardeners in the grounds of the Claremont Hospital.
- 4. Hours.—There shall be no fixed hours of duty for dairy farm hands, head attendant, deputy head attendant, housekeeper, or deputy matron, whose existing hours of working shall continue. For all other workers, ex-cepting the quarryman and tradesmen's assistant, the ordinary hours of duty shall be forty-eight (48) per week of seven days, to be worked in six shifts of eight hours each. The ordinary working hours for the quarryman and tradesmen's assistant shall be forty-four per week.
- 5. Overtime.—Except in regard to dairy farm hands, head attendant, deputy head attendant, housekeeper, or deputy matron, all time worked in excess of eight house in any one shift shall be classed as overtime and paid

First two hours: Time and a quarter; thereafter: time and a half. Provided, that where the overtime is necessitated through the attendance of the staff at concerts, picture shows, or other amusements for the patients, or where the overtime is necessitated through the failure of another member of the staff to report for duty when rostered, the above conditions shall not apnly, and equivalent time off shall be allowed in lieu thereof.

Holidays.—(a) All male and female attendants, including head attendant, charge attendants, and deputy matron shall be granted four weeks' leave on full pay on completion of each year of service; other workers, except farm hands, quarryman, tradesmen's assistant, and gardeners, shall be granted two weeks on full pay (together with board and lodging allowance, if the worker is living in) on completion of each year of service.

vice.

Farm hands, quarryman, and gardeners shall be granted nine days' leave on full pay (together with board and lodging allowance, if the worker is living in) on completion of each year of service.

In addition to the above, workers (excepting the tradesmen's assistant) shall be granted the following five public holidays, viz.: Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, New Year's Day, and Labour Day, or a day off in lieu thereof. Any worker entitled to public

holidays shall, except at the request of the worker, receive at least twenty-four (24) hours' notice when such worker shall take the holiday due.

Twelve paid holidays per annum shall be granted to the tradesmen's assistant; provided always, that Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday. Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be taken as they come as portion of the holidays. The balance of six days shall be granted as annual leave, at the convenience of the Inspector General. When service is less than twelve mouths, holiday pay shall be, after one month's continuous service, in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months. This subclause relates only to the tradesmen's assistant.

(b) Annual leave may, at the request of the worker, and with the approval of the Inspector General, be allowed to accumulate for two years, but no longer.

- (c) Any worker, after six months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months. Provided that any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service shall be entitled to payment for any holiday which may be due under this clause at the time of resignation or dismissal: Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.
- General Conditions.—(a) Provided that existing conditions as to number and class of patients continue. there shall be two attendants on night duty in the following wards:

No. 1 Hospital, Male Ward 3, Claremont; No. 2 Male Ward, Claremont Hospital; No. 4 Male Ward, Claremont Hospital; Observation Wards, Perth Public Hospital.

- (b) Rosters shall be for fortnightly periods.
- (c) Every attendant shall be given the opportunity of acquiring by experience a thorough knowledge of hospital duties.
- 8. Sick Leave. In the case of illness contracted on duty, provided a medical certificate is supplied, full pay shall be allowed for the first fourteen days of such illness in each financial year. Should a longer period of sick leave be required, the question of extending full pay will be at the discretion of the Inspector General; subject to the limitation that such pay shall not exceed the amount provided for in Public Service Regulations. This clause shall not apply to the quarrymen or tradesmen's assistant.
- 9. Travelling Time.—A worker, when travelling on duty away from his or her home station or headquarters, shall not by reason of such travelling suffer any interruption of the continuity of his or her pay for ordinary working hours in each day, but no overtime shall be allowed for time occupied in travelling. Workers detailed for duty at Perth Mental Ward will travel to and from duty in their own time.
- 10. Travelling Allowance.—Workers when travelling on duty outside the Metropolitan Area shall be paid a travelling allowance of ten shillings (10s.) per twenty-four hours: Provided there shall be a deduction of one-fourth of the said allowance for each item of expense of breakfast, lunch, dinner, or bed not necessarily from the time of leaving the worker's headquarters. The items of breakfast, lunch, dinner or bed will not be allowed if the worker leaves headquarters after or returns before 8 a.m., 1 p.m., 6 p.m., and midnight. An additional allowance of 20 per cent. shall be allowed a worker for time spent in the area East of Merredin.
- 11. Prior to going on night duty an attendant shall, wherever practicable, come off duty at 4 p.m. and go on at 11.30 p.m. the same night.
- An allowance of two shillings and sixpence shall be made and stimulant provided, when required, for any attendant carrying out mortuary duties in connection with post mortem examinations.
- 13. If a worker is formally charged under Section 187 (a) of "The Lunacy Act, 1903-20," with an offence, he shall be given at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing, prior to the hearing, in which to prepare his defence, but this shall not prejudice the power under the Act of immediate suspension.
- While existing conditions continue in regard to the number and class of patients in Ward 2 (Female side), an additional nurse shall be employed there from 4 p.m. to 9 p.m.

15. Uniforms.—Uniforms shall be supplied in accordance with the present practice. These will be supordance with the present practice. These will be supplied to the female staff either as completed garments or as material. If supplied as material, a sun of five shillings shall be allowed for the complete making up of each uniform. Caps and aprons will be supplied as completed articles. Gardeners: An oilskin coat shall be carefulated to gardeners are true years. be supplied to gardeners every two years.

Emergency Clause .- The Inspector General and the Medical Superintendent, or whoever for the time being may be in charge of any Mental Hospital in Western Australia may, at his or her discretion, take such measures as may in his or her opinion be necessary for the protection, safety, or welfare of the patients, the staff, or the Institution, and all instructions issued in pursuance of such special measures shall promptly and faithfully be carried out by all members of the staff to whom such instructions may be issued, and this shall be done without regard to whether or not such instructions may be in accordance with this Agreement.

17. Higher Duties .-- Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall, subject to the hereinafter mentioned provisions be paid such higher minimum for the time engaged upon such higher work: Provided that the higher rate shall not apply to members of the nursing staff, unless a full shift is worked in the higher capacity, and shall not apply to other workers unless more than a full shift is worked in the higher capacity. In cases where the higher duties are caused owing to a worker being absent through sickness, if the absent worker is in receipt of full pay, the higher rate shall not be paid for the first four weeks.

18. Old and Infirm Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the wages prescribed herein, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon between the Union and the Inspector General or his representative, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the Secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said Secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the Secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date therewage shall be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and, after the expiration of the said period, until the rate shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said Secretary in the manner prescribed. The Secretary of the Union may, in writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

### TAILORING (GERALDTON). (Registered 11th November, 1926.)

No. 34 of 1926. THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 1st day of November, 1926, between the Western Australian Clothing and Allied Trades' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and Joseph Johnston, M. Gershen, F. Jeffery (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other part: Witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

and agree, the one with the other, as follows:—

1. Scope of Agreement.—This Agreement shall apply to employers and workers engaged in the Tailoring Industry in order work, which, without limiting its meaning, shall include amongst other items the following work:-

(a) Bespoke work;(b) Garments cut to individual measure;

(e) Garments that are fitted on; (d) Garments cut to chart measure.

Provided, that in the case of all uniforms tendered for by contract, where they are not less than twenty-five garments of one particular kind and description, not-withstanding they be cut to single measure, they may be made according to Ready-made Clothing rates and conditions (plain jackets to rank as sacs, and plain tunies to rank as pagets), but must be given to each individual worker in quantities of not less than three garments of one particular kind and description at a

- 2. Hours.—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked within the following hours:—On five days of the week, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; on Saturday, or such other day on which the half-holiday is usually observed, between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m.
- 3. Mid-day Meal.—In no circumstances shall less than three-quarters of an hour be fixed for the time of the mid-day meal.

4. Overtime.—Within the hours fixed and worked at

- the employers' request:—
  (a) Any worker (piece or weekly) who, within the hours fixed for beginning and ending work is employed in excess of the hours fixed for any one day, shall be paid for such excess time as follows:
  - (i) Weekly Hands, time and a-half; (ii) Piece Workers:—

Males: 11d. per hour on time worked, in ad-

- dition to ordinary piece-work rates.

  Females: 7½d. per hour on time vorked, in addition to ordinary piece-work rates.

  (b) No apprentice under the age of sixteen years shall be worked overtime.
- 5. Overtime.—Outside the hours fixed at the employers' request-
- (a) Any time worked outside the ordinary working hours shall be paid for as follows, with the addition of 1s. to provide a meal:—

  (i) Weekly Hands, time and a-half.

  (ii) Piece Workers:

Males: 11d. per hour on time worked, in addition to the piece-work rates.

Females: 7½d. per hour on time worked, in

addition to the piece-work rates.

(b) No apprentice under the age of 16 years of age may be worked overtime, but an apprentice over sixteen years of age may be worked overtime, with his or her consent

(c) No work shall be performed during the ordinary meal time.

- (d) When females or apprentices are employed for a period of more than four hours continuously they shall be allowed an interval of ten minutes for refreshments during such period without deduction of pay.
- 6. Holidays.-All weekly workers, including apprentices, whether in a city or elsewhere, shall be cutitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:— New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or such other days as by law or otherwise are observed in the State in licu of the said days respectively.
- Payment for work on Sundays or holidays worked at the Employer's request .- (a) Any worker who is employed on a Sunday or any holiday provided for herein shall be paid at the rate of ordinary time in addition to his weekly rate.
- (h) Piece-workers employed on Sundays or holidays shall be paid at log rates and, in addition, at the rate provided for weekly workers for the time worked.
- 8. Distribution of Work.—Employers shall in slack times observe turns for weekly and piece-workers (including out door workers) for coat, sac, trouser, and vest hands in the respective classes of garments: Proyided that journeymen and journeywomen having apprentices shall be allowed, in their turn, extra work equivalent to the wages of the apprentices during the time the turn system is in operation. The employer shall keep in the workroom a true record of every turn, which shall be open to the inspection of the workers.
- 9. Regulation of Out-work.—All work shall be done in the workshop provided and controlled by the employer, except where a permit shall be given by the Chief Inspector of Factories, which permit shall only be given after due notice of the application therefor

shall be served on the Union. Such notice shall be given by registered letter and only in the following eases:— (a) Where the person to whom it is proposed to give such work is unable to work on the employer's premises

by reason of infirmity, old age, or domestic ties.

(b) Lack of accommodation on the employer's pre-

mises; provided that in such case the employer shall not have more than one such outdoor worker to every ten indoor workers or fraction thereof.

(c) Persons doing outdoor work shall not employ labour except that of members of their own family resi-

dent with them.

(d) Persons doing outdoor work shall not work for more than one employer, except by the consent of the Chief Inspector of Factories.

(e) Such outdoor workers shall be paid for at the

- piece-work rates provided for by this Agreement.

  (f) Outdoor workers shall be provided, free of charge, with cotton, silk, thread, and all other sewings and trimmings used in manufacturing garments.
- 10. Term.-This Agreement shall continue in force for a period of three years from the date hereof: vided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from such date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.
- 11. Area.—This Agreement shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the Post Office, Geraldton.
- Wages.—The minimum rate of wage payable ander this Agreement to workers (other than duly registered apprentices and probationers working weekly wage) shall be ascertained according to the following schedule:-

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties.

# AWARD.

1. Term.—The currency of this Award shall be twelve months from the date hereof.

2. There is no custom or usage among platelaying gangs in Western Australia that half a mile only per

day should be done.

3. The Public Works Department are entitled upon adding sufficient workers to the 24 or 25 workers comprised in the platelaying gang usually accepted as being necessary where half a mile per day of platelaying is done with 45lb. rails and 24ft, lengths to increase the distance from half a mile to three-quarters of a mile. Of the increased gang a sufficient number should be employed as loaders, whose work would principally be the loading of the trolleys and the replacement of them on the line and assisting in the unloading of the rake, subject to the right of the Ganger in charge to make special arrangements, if necessary, as to the loading of one trolley so that the work of linking-in may not be delayed in the morning, and to arrange any other detail necessary for the efficient carrying out of the work in such a manner as to divide the whole of the work amongst the workers in an equitable and reasonable manner.

"On the completion of the prescribed term of service a Cadet will be required to apply to the Institution of Civil Engineers, the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, or the Institution of Electrical Engineers, London, Chemistry Institute, or any recognised Institution, for admission to the examination qualifying for candidature as an Associate Member. The Cadet's term of service shall be extended to cover the period between the completion of his service and the holding of the examination by the Institution, at the same remuneration as that received for his last year of service.
