The Pearling Act, 1912-24.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 1550/25,

WHEREAS by Subsection 5 of Section 33 of "The Pearling Act, 1912-24," it is provided that: When the remuneration to which a diver or other pearl-fisher employed in pearling in connection with any ship consists wholly or in part of an allowance or lay calculated with reference to the quantity of pearlshell or pearls fished by him or with his assistance, then the right to such allowance or lay shall be deemed to be a right to share in the result or proceeds of the pearling, within the meaning of this section, unless the allowance or lay is calculated on such basis as shall be prescribed, and at

a percentage not exceeding the prescribed percentage: And whereas His Excellency the Governor and the Exceutive Council of the State are of opinion that it is desirable to cancel the Order in Council dated the 20th day of January, 1926, prescribing such basis and percentage: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Exceutive Council, doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Pearling Act, 1912-24," and all other powers him in this behalf enabling, cancel the Order in Council aforementioned, and in lieu thereof doth make the following regulation and order, and prescribe that the basis and maximum percentages on and at which such allowances or lay as aforesaid shall be calculated with reference to the quantity of pearlshell fished. Where such allowance or lay as aforesaid is paid to more than one pearl-fisher on any pearling ship, the aggregate of such allowances or lays shall not exceed the amount which would be payable to one person in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule.

Provided that in case of-

- (a) Hand pump boats, where less than 5 tons fished;
- (b) Single connection engine boats, where less than 6 tons fished, and
- (c) Double connection engine boats, where less than 10 tons fished,

the maximum allowance or lay shall in all cases whatever be assessed as if the value of the shell were £150 per ton. Provided further, that the maximum allowance or lay shall—

(a) if the value of shell is less than £180 per ton, be the same amount as it would be if the value were £150 per ton;

- (b) if the value of shell is less than £200 but not less than £180 per ton, be the same amount as it would be if the value were £180 per ton;
- (c) if the value of shell is £200 or more per ton, be the same amount as it would be if the value were £200 per ton.

N.B.—The value of shell is to be deemed to be the average price at Broome (as determined by the Pearling Inspector at Broome) of loose shell during the period worked by the pearl-fisher.

The Pearling Act, 1912-24. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 2856/21.

WHEREAS by Section 45 of "The Pearling Act, 1912-24," it is made lawful for the Governor to close any portion of a pearl-shell area and to prohibit the gathering, collection, or removal of any pearls or pearl-shell within or from the portion so closed, for a specific period: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the whole of that portion of the Shark Bay Pearl-shell Area known as South Passage Section, other than those portions held under Exclusive License, shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from that portion so closed shall be prohibited: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Exceutive Council, hereby directs that the above-mentioned portion of the said Pearl-shell Area shall be closed and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from the portion so closed shall be prohibited for a period of twelve (12) months from the fourteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.
