WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proelama-tion prohibit (*inter alia*) all persons from—(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may by Proclamation deof the same Act the Governor may by Proclamation de-clare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used, or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now, therefore I, the said Gov-ernor, by and with the advice and consent of the Execu-tive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers afore-said and of every other power enabling me in this be-half, proclaim and declare as follows:—That those por-tions of Western Anstralian waters defined in the schetions of Western Australian waters defined in the schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the 1st day of January, 1927, until the 31st day of December, 1927, inclusive; and, further, that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the cap-ture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters; except those portions defined in the schedule hereto.

### REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION AND REGISTRATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 9th December, 1926.

Corres. L.S.B. 4/12.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve the Regulations for the Examination and Registration of Licensed Surveyors under Section 26 of "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909" (9 Edw. VII., No. 25), as set out hereunder. Such Regulations to come into force on the 1st January, 1927.

### THE LICENSED SURVEYORS ACT, 1909.

The Land Surveyors Licensing Board appointed under the above Act has, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, made the following Regulations for the examination and registration of Licensed Surveyors under the said Act, and revoked the Regulations gazetted on the 5th October, 1923, and the addition to Regulation No. 6, gazetted on the 31st October, 1924.

### Interpretations.

In the interpretation of these Regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall have the meaning set against each respectively :—

"The Acts."—The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909, and such other enactments with regard to land surveying as may be made by Parliament.

"Real Property Acts."—The Transfer of Land Act, 1893, and such other Acts relating to the subdivision of freehold lands as have been or may be passed by Parliament.

"Reciprocating State."—Any State, Colony, Dominion, or Commonwealth within His Majesty's Dominions which reciprocally recognises the status of Land Surveyors, in accordance with the conditions set forth in these Regulations.

"Board."—The Land Surveyors Licensing Board constituted under the "Acts."

"Reciprocating Board."—The duly constituted "Board" in a "Reciprocating State."

"Secretary."—The Secretary appointed by the "Board."

"Registered Surveyor."—Any person who is registered by a "Reciprocating Board" as a "Licensed," "Qualified," "Authorised" or

" Certificated " Land Surveyor.

"Articles."—An indenture or writing containing a contract, or an agreement for tuition in land surveying, made between a "Registered Surveyor" and a person seeking to qualify himself for registration as a Land Surveyor.

"University."—A University in a "Reciprocating State" or a University recognised by such University.

"Register."—The Register directed by the "Acts" to be kept.

### REGULATIONS.

### Examination of Candidates.

### Dates of Examinations.

1. Examination of candidates for Certificates of Competency as Land Surveyors will be held in Perth in the month of September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

### Candidates to apply.

2. Each candidate shall forward to the Secretary an application for permission to present himself for examination, together with the documentary evidence specified in Part I. hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least fourteen days before the date fixed for the commencement of the examination, due notice of which will be published in the *Government Gazette*.

NOTE.—The Examination Fee prescribed in Schedule VII. must be paid on or before the date of commencement of the examination.

Division of Examination.

3. The Examination shall be divided into three parts :---

Part I-Preliminary.

Part II.—Written.

Part III.—Oral and Practical.

Each candidate must fulfil the requirements of Part I. before admission to Part II., and must pass in Part II. before admission to Part III.

### PART I.

### Preliminary Conditions.

### Age Limit.

4. Each candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no candidate shall be registered or licensed as a Surveyor until he has attained the age of twenty-one years.

### Character.

5. Each candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

Educational Standard and Field Service.

6. Each candidate shall submit certificates to show :----

- (a) That he has passed the Matriculation Examination at a University or an Examination accepted by a University as being of Matriculation Standard, provided that such examination includes a pass at the Matriculation Standard in English and Mathematics.
- (b) That he has served professionally under articles with a registered surveyor or surveyors for a period of not less than four years, three of which must have been in the field, and that he is competent to effect surveys on his own responsibility (see Form I.).

### Registration of Articles.

7. All Articles of Indenture or other similar agreement, duly completed and accompanied by evidence that the applicant has attained the educational requirements prescribed in Rule 6 (a), shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration, within three months after the commencement of the terms of the articles. Similarly, notification of transfer of such articles shall be forwarded for registration within three months of the date of such transfer. In each case the application must be accompanied by the prescribed fee (see Schedule VII.) Original Field Notes and Plans to be submitted.

8. Each candidate shall submit :---

- (a) His original field notes and plan drawn by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road;
- (b) His original field notes, plan and technical description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the "Real Property Acts," and
- (c) His original field notes, plan and section of a proposed road, railway or drainage work the section to be not less than ten chains in length.

Norr.—Each plan shall bear the following certificate, signed and dated by the candidate :—

"I hereby certify that this survey was made by me personally, and that this plan and the accompanying field notes are entirely my own work."

### PART II.

### Written Examination. Appliances to be provided.

9. Each candidate shall provide himself with an approved book of Mathematical Tables, a 20/40 scale, a parallel ruler (15in. most suitable), a protractor and all necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper. Traverse Tables may be used. Calculating machines, slide rules, etc., are not allowed in the examination room.

### Subjects of Examination.

10. The examination shall embrace the following subjects:----

(a) Principles and Practice of Surveying-

- Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes; cadastral, stadia, topographical, trigonometrical and underground surveying; setting out areas and curves; barometric and other measurement of heights; the use of contour maps for locating and laying out of roads; designing for the subdivision of town, suburban and country lands; principles of town planning; surveying under the "Real Property Acts"; re-determination of boundaries; plotting and drawing plans, sections and contours.
- (b) Computations-
  - Reduction of traverses, co-ordinates, computations connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.
- (c) Field Astronomy and Geodesy-
  - Solution of spherical triangles, azimuth, altitude, hour angle, right ascension, declination and the relations between them, use of ephemerides; time, corrections to star or sun observations; effect of errors of adjustment of instruments. The principles of elementary geodesy including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of magnetic needle; projection of maps and charts.

- (d) Engineering Surveys ----
  - Computations in connection with levelling, grading, setting out and measurement of earthworks.

### (e) Miscellaneous—

Elementary Physics, Elementary Geology and Elementary Forestry.

*Physics.*—The subject generally as contained in any good elementary text book, with a more detailed knowledge of the laws underlying the construction and use of surveying instruments, *e.g.*:

- The pressure of liquids and gases as affecting the barometer, thermometer, and level.
- The allowances to be made for the effects of heat in the practical work of the surveyor.
- The reflection and refraction of light, lenses, etc. Terrestrial magnetism and variation of the compass.

Geology.—The subject generally as contained in any good elementary text-book with special reference to—

The classification of areas of land according to their formation, rocks, soils, etc., and their adaptability for industrial purposes.

NOTE.—Specimens of rock will be submitted for classification and description.

Forestry.—The distribution of native timbers and their economic values. The influence of forests on climate and water supply. The principles of afforestation.

### PART III.

### Oral and Practical.

11. Each candidate may be required to effect surveys under supervision and shall submit himself for *viva voce* examination in the following subjects :---

- (a) The principles of construction and practical tests in the adjustment and use of all instruments required in modern field practice and office work.
- (b) The practice of surveying with a knowledge of the Acts and Regulations bearing on same.
- (c) Field Astronomy—practical determination of time, latitude and azimuth in the field.

### Evemptions.

12. If a candidate has qualifications as detailed hereunder (documentary evidence of which must be produced) the following exemptions may be granted—

- (a) A field experience of not less than twelve months with a Civil Engineer approved by the Board.
  - \**Exemption.*—Six months' professional service in the field.
- This shall not apply to Bachelors of Engineering.
- (b) A satisfactory certificate or diploma from a University or recognised Public Technical School or College in any one or more of the following subjects, *i.e.*, Elementary Physics, Geology and Forestry.
  - *Exemption.*—Examination therein. The candidate will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted to each subject for which he holds such certificate or diploma.
- (c) A University pass certificate for the first year's course in Civil Engineering or for a special course in Surveying.

*Exemption*.—Six months' professional service in the field and six months' office experience.

- (d) A University Degree of Bachelor of Engineering.
  - *Exemption.*—Twelve months' professional service in field and twelve months' office experience.
- (e) Where this degree has been obtained at a University in which a representative of the Board acts as co-examiner in surveying.
  - Exemption.—(i) Examination in all subjects of Part II., except such subjects as are enumerated under "Principles and Practice of Surveying," and (ii) Eighteen months' professional service in the field and twelve months' office experience.

NOTE.—A candidate producing a University Certificate showing that he has obtained a pass in the subjects prescribed for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th years in the Degree Course in Surveying at the University of Western Australia, will be granted an exemption similar to that provided under Subclause (d). This applies in the State of Western Australia only.

In all other respects, the conditions set forth in Rules 4 to 11 must be complied with.

### General Rules.

### Allocation of Marks.

13. The maximum marks allotted to each subject shall be as detailed in Schedule VI.

### Definition of a Pass.

14. In order to pass the examination each candidate shall—

- (a) Satisfy the Board with regard to all certificates and credentials specified in Part I. The experience indicated by plans, etc., submitted in accordance with Rule 8 will be valued according to the work, nature of field service, etc., the maximum marks allowed being 50. The marks so obtained will be added to the sum of the marks gained in Part II.
- (b) Obtain not less than sixty per centum of the total maximum marks allotted to the papers of Part II., the marks obtained in Part I. being included.
- (c) Obtain not less than sixty per centum of the total maximum marks allotted to the compulsory subjects, *i.e.*:
  - Principles and Practice of Surveying ; Computations A and B ;
  - Levelling and Earthworks;

Astronomy and Geodesy,

and not less than fifty per centum of the allotted marks in any one of these subjects.

Note.—In this connection, the marks obtained in Part I. are not taken into account.

(d) Obtain not less than sixty per centum of the total maximum marks allotted to Part III. and not less than fifty per centum of the marks allotted to each subject therein.

### Consequence of Failure.

15. (a) Candidates who fail to satisfy the requirements of Regulation 14 (a) will not be eligible to proceed in the examination.

(b) Candidates who fail to obtain sixty per centum of marks as specified in Regulation 14 (b) will not be eligible to proceed to Part III. of the examination and must take the whole of Part II. again. (c) Candidates who succeed in accordance with Regulation 14 (b), but fail to obtain the necessary total marks in the compulsory subjects, as detailed in Regulation 14 (c), must take the whole of these subjects again.

(d) Candidates who obtain the requisite number of marks in the compulsory subjects as a whole, but do not secure half marks in any one, or not more than two, thereof, may be allowed to take a "Post" Examination in accordance with Regulation 16.

### Post Examination.

16. Should a candidate fail in not more than two subjects of Part II., the Board may allow him, if his papers are considered of sufficient merit, to sit egain for examination in those subjects only at either or both of the next two succeeding examinations. If he fails to pass at these examinations, he will be required to take the whole of Part II. of the examination again, excepting his original exemptions, if any.

A similar concession may be allowed in Part III. of the Examination.

### , Certificate of Competency.

17. Each candidate who has passed the examination prescribed in these Regulations shall be entitled to a Certificate of Competency (see Form II.) as a Land Surveyor, and, upon complying with the provisions of the Acts and Regulations thereunder (see Form V.) and payment of the prescribed fee (see Schedule VII.) to registration as a Land Surveyor in the State of Western Australia.

### Letter of Recommendation.

18. Either without further examination or upon such viva voce examination as may be deemed necessary, the Board may grant a letter of recommendation (see Form IV.) to any person to whom a certificate of competency has been issued and who desires to be registered in another Reciprocating State. The application for such Letter of Recommendation must be accompanied by the prescribed fee (see Schedule VII.).

Registration upon Qualifications obtained in a Reciprocating State.

19. A land surveyor who applies to the Board for registration without examination, on qualifications obtained in another reciprocating State, shall submit :---

(a) His certificate of competency or of registration or his license to practise as a Land Surveyor.

(b) Evidence as to identity and character.

Provided that-

- (c) Should such certificate or license have been issued upon examination prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a certificate or letter of recommendation dated not more than twelve months previously from the Board of the State in which the certificate or license applies : and
- (d) Should the applicant be prevented by absence from the State in which the certificate or license was granted from obtaining such letter of recommendation, he shall pass such examination under this Regulation as the Board may require.

Subject to compliance with the foregoing provisions and such statutory requirements as may be necessary together with payment of the prescribed fee (see Schedule VII.), he shall be entitled to registration as a duly qualified Land Surveyor in the State of Western Australia.

## Registration upon Qualifications obtained Elsewhere.

20. A Land Surveyor, who applies to the Board for registration on qualifications obtained in any other country, being part of the British Empire, prepared to reciprocate in this particular with the Reciprocating States, shall submit :---

- (a) His credentials of qualification as a Land Surveyor.
- (b) Evidence that such document is still in force.
- (c) Evidence as to identity and character.
- (d) Evidence that he has completed not less than six months service in the field with a practising Registered Surveyor in one of the Reciprocating States; and
- (e) A certificate of competency from that surveyor.

If the Board is satisfied with the evidence submitted and that the qualifications covered by the credentials are equivalent to those prescribed under these Regulations, he shall pass such further examination as the Board may require and, upon compliance with the provisions of the Acts (see Form V.) and payment of the prescribed fee (see Schedule VII.). shall be entitled to registration as a duly qualified Land Surveyor in the State of Western Australia.

### Register to be kept.

21. The Secretary shall keep a register of-

- (a) The names and addresses of all articled pupils who have complied with the requirements herein set forth, together with the names of the surveyors with whom they are articled and a complete record of all transfers of such articles.
- (b) The names, addresses and qualifications of all persons to whom certificates of competency have been issued, together with the dates of issue.
- (c) The names and addresses of all persons registered by the Board as land surveyors together with the dates of registration and, where necessary, records of their careers as surveyors.
- (d) All letters of recommendation with dates of issue.

Records of Charges against Surveyors.

22. The Register shall also contain a brief record of any charge that may be laid against a surveyor, together with the finding of the Board.

No. 38 of 1926. THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this nineteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between Pearse Bros., Limited; Goode, Durrant & Co., Limited; West Aus-tralian Boot Co.; Berryman's, Limited; Samuel Trigger (W.A. Slipper Factory), and G. Underwood (Eclipse Slipper Co.), hereinafter called "the Employers," of the one part, and the Boot Trade of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows :---

1. Scope and Area of Agreement.—This agreement shall apply to the Boot and/or Slipper-making Industry, and shall be limited in its effect to an area comprised within a radius of 14 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2. Hours .-- Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in five days, from Monday to Friday inclusive. The ordinary hours of work shall not exceed 8 hours 48 minutes on each day, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. Each employer may fix a starting time for his own factory, and such starting time, when fixed, shall not be altered without a month's notice.

3. Wages.--(Adults): Per week (a.) Basic Wage-Males Females (b.) The minimum rates of wages payable to workers shall be :-

4. Overtime .- Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours, and time and a-half thereafter. All overtime shall start at the usual time for knocking off on each day at the factory. Double time for knocking off on each day at the factory. Double time shall be paid for working on any of the following holidays whenever observed in the State :--New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day. The employer's factory may be worked, when necessary, on Saturdays provided that two consecu-tive Saturdays shall not be worked without first obtaining permission to work the second Saturday from the Secretary of the Union. 5. Apprentices.—(a.) In this Agreement the term "ap prentice" means an apprentice duly registered with the prentice" means an apprentice duly registered with the Clerk of the Court, in accordance with the provisions of this clause, and the term "probationer" means a person work ing as apprentice on probation of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court, in accordance with the providence of this clause. Provided that on an with the provisions of this clause : Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b.) Any employer hereafter taking a probationer or apprentice shall, within fourteen days thereafter, duly register such probationer or apprentice by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court, in the prescribed form (Forms 1 (a) and 1 (b) in Appendix hereto).

(c.) If at the date of this Agreement any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter

(d.) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every three journeymen or fraction of three journeymen employed by him.

(e.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the

number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time. (f.) The term of apprenticeship shall not be less than three years, and not more than five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship. - (g.) Should any employer from unforeseen circum-stances be unable to carry out his obligations to his appren-tice he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete

(v.) Slipper Making :-- The apprentice shall be taught to make a slipper throughout.
 (i.) The following provisions shall-apply in respect of

all apprenticeships :-

- (1.) The employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement, and shall, subject to the provisions of Sub-clause (c), pay the apprentice the rate of wage herein provided.
- (2.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of the apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another emapprentice, transfer him to another em-ployer carrying on business within a reason-able distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this agreement, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the appren-tice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall, nevertheless, give him a cer-
- (3.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for trans-ferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him. (4.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the
- employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge and cause thereof to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).
- (5.) Technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense, and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after
- (6.) In the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

(k.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners, hereinafter constituted, once in every year of his service, when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(l.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the nanes and addresses of all candidates required to submit thenselves to examination. The examination shall be held at such place as shall be from time to time appointed by the Clerk of the Court, and it shall be the duty of each employer to supply such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(m.) The examination will be held in the month of June in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the Workers' Union, one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the employers, and one person to be nominated by the Director of Education, or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. The examiner shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(n.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(o.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certilicate showing the result of his examination (Forn 4 in the appendix hereto), and it shall be lawful for any euployer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in sub-clause (j) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(p.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed, prima facie, guilty of a breach of this Agreement, under Section 97 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(q.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

6. Boys, other than Apprentices.—No lad not apprenticed shall be employed or retained in employment after he has attained the age of sixteen, or on any work other than is comprised under the following heads: Errands, sweeping, last-carrying, sorting and slipping lasts, heel nail feeding and building, drawing tacks, inking heels and edges, socking and sizing, tacking up stuff and putting in shanks, and bottom-alling or skiving shanks and stiffeners, and putting in followers and branding.

7. Girls, other than Learners.—Free girls may be employed in slipper-making only on any of the following classes of work, namely:—Tieing, pomming and packing. Provided that no girl upon attaining the age of 17 years shall be so employed.

### 8. Female Learners:

(a.) Female learners may be employed in the proportion of three learners to every journeywoman employed and receiving not less than  $\pounds 2$  12s. per week.

and thereafter the minimum wage for journeywomen.

9. Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wages of any worker employed by him who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

10. Weekly Payments.—Each employee shall at least once in each week be paid moneys due up to the night previous to pay day. Any employee working only a portion of a week must be paid before ceasing work for that week, and all payments to be made in working hours.

11. Termination of Employment.—The engagement of a worker may be terminated upon the employer giving such worker two days' notice that his or her services shall no longer be required. Such notice may be given at any time during the week, and the employer shall be liable only for payment of wages up to the time of the expiration of such notice of termination of employment.

12. Suspension of Work.—Two days' notice shall be given of suspension of work or that any worker will not be wanted to attend at the factory, and the employer shall be liable only to payment of wages up to the time of the expiration of such notice. If at any time work is suspended or a worker is told that he or she will not be wanted to attend at the factory without such two days' notice having been given, a worker shall, nevertheless, be entitled to two days' pay, or to payment for such less time as work may be suspended or the worker is not wanted to attend at the factory respectively, unless the suspension of work arises from some cause beyond the employer's control, in which case, the employer shall not be liable to pay any worker for the time during which work is so suspended. Workmen shall give notice to their employer when they desire to be absent from work, except in case of sickness or emergency beyond their control.

13. Female Workers.—No female worker shall be employed in the clicking, making, inishing, or stuff-cutting department, except in socking, dressing, or boxing or working the Fortuna Skiver on either upper or sole leather.

14. Grindery, etc.—Employers shall find all grindery, workshops, and light, and serve out all colours and materials used in connection with the trade.

15. Posting Notices.—Every employer may allow such shop notices and Union notices as he shall consider unobjectionable to be posted up in an accessible place at the entrance to the factory.

16. Hot Water.—Employers shall provide employees with hot water free of charge for use at lunch time.

17. Piece-work .-- Piece-work is hereby abolished.

18. Certi cates.—An employer shall give to the employee leaving the employer a certificate setting out the length of service worked by such employee.

19. Term.—The term of this Agreement shall be three years from the date hereof; provided, however, that any party hereto may, after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Agreement, or at the end of any subsequent twelve months therefrom, make application to the Court of Arbitration for a variation thereof.

20. Aged and In/rm Workers.—A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon, in writing, between the worker and the Secretary of the Union. If, within seven days of being notil.ed of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wages than that prescribed the said Secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply, in writing, to the nearest Resident or Police Magistrate to tax such lower rate of wages. The worker shall give such Secretary two days' notice of his intention to apply to the Magistrate, and the said Secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The Magistrate may fix the rate of wages, and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by any employer for such less wage for the period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the said Secretary requiring

his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed in this clause: Provided that always the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four competent workers on the minimum wage in any factory.

21. Holidays .- Every worker shall be entitled to a holiday on full pay at the rate of two-thirds of a day per calendar montb. Such holiday may be allowed to accumulate and may be taken as and when the ordinary public holidays usually observed in this State occur. Should the service of a worker terminate at any time he or she shall receive payment in lieu of such accrued holiday as may be due to him or her under this clause.

22. Power to visit factory.—Once weekly the employer's factory may be visited by the Union Secretary during working hours.

23. Definitions .--- "Journeyman" means a male adult worker receiving not less than £5 ls. 3d. per week ; " Journey-woman " means a female worker receiving not less than £2 12s. per week.

24. Deductions .-- No deduction shall be made from the wages of any employee for charities or raffles, or for more than actual time lost by them.

### ENGINE-DRIVERS, FIREMEN, AND CLEANERS ON RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION.

(Registered 10th December, 1926.)

No. 41 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 10th day of December, 1926, between the Honourable the Minister for Works for the State of Western Australia, of the one part, and the Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association (West Australian Branch), of the other part; whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

1. Basic Wage.—This Agreement is based on a basic wage of 85s, per week for Perth.

2. Term.—This Agreement shall remain in force for three years from date hereof: Provided that, after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, the Court may amend or revise the Agreement on the application of either of the parties: Provided also, that the rates of pay will be subject to amendment in accordance with the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act Amendment Act, 1925."

3. Area and Scope.—This Agreement shall apply only to members of the Association employed by the Minister for Works in and about the construction of railways in the State of Western Australia.

4. Retirement and Dismissal.—(a) No worker bound by this Agreement shall leave the service until the expiration of seven days' written notice of his intention to do so.

(b) Except in the case of summary dismissal for misconduct seven days' written notice shall be given by the officer in Charge to any worker whose services are no longer required.

5. Qualifications-

(a) Engine-drivers: No person shall be employed as a Locomotive Engine-driver on Railway Construction work unless he holds the necessary certificate required under "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921."

(b) Firemen: No person shall be employed as a Loco. Fireman on Railway Construction work who is under 21 years of age and has not also had previous experience as a fireman or has been employed as Loco. cleaner for twelve months.

(e) The above rates shall apply within District No. 2, as defined in the Australian Workers' Union Railway Construction Agreement dated 13th May, 1926. When working outside Districts Nos. 1 and 2, as defined in the said Agreement, such additional district allowances (above those prescribed therein for District No. 2) as are prescribed in the said Agreement shall be paid.

(f) Drivers of other than Loco. engines used in connection with Railway Construction work shall be paid in accordance with the Arbitration Court's Award No. 29/38 of 1922, plus the district allowances prescribed in the Australian Workers' Union Railway Construction Agreement before referred to.

7. Hours-

(a) For Engine Cleaners the ordinary working hours shall not exceed eight hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, or four hours on Saturday; provided that, at the discretion of the Officer in Charge, the hours may be spread over six days of eight hours each and five days of eight hours each in alternate weeks. Saturday to be the ''off day'' of the five-day week. (b) The actual time worked in preparing and oiling and stabling engines, also in raising steam and banking fires (where such work is performed by driver and fireman) shall be included in total number of hours worked weekly.

### 8. Overtime-

(a) Engine Cleaners: All time worked by engine cleaners in excess of eight hours on the first five days of the week or in excess of four hours on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, except when 48 hours are worked in alternate weeks, as provided in Clause 7 hereof.

(b) Loco. Drivers, Loco. Firemen, and Enginecleaners: All time worked on Sundays shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Loco. Drivers, Loco. Firemen, and Enginecleaners: All time worked on Labour Day, Good Friday, and Christmas Day shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of double time.

(d) Loco. Drivers and Loco. Firemen: For all time necessarily worked in excess of 70 hours in any week time and a half rates shall be paid, calculated on the wages prescribed in Clause 6 (a).

#### 9. Holidays-

(a) Twelve days' paid holidays shall be granted to employees after twelve months' continuous service.

(b) Employees employed for a period of less than twelve months' continuous service shall receive holiday pay as under:—After one month's continuous service, holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

(c) Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Good Friday shall be taken as they come and be treated as portion of the holidays prescribed above.

10. Guaranteed Week's Work.-Loco. Engine-drivers and Loco. Firemen will be guaranteed a week's work, as prescribed in Clause 6 (a), and Engine Cleaners a week's work of 44 hours.

11. Fares.—Each employee shall receive a free fare second class from place of engagement to place of work and return on completion of work; providing his service has been satisfactory to the Officer in Charge.

12. Payment for Pitching, Striking, and Removing Camp.—Employees shall be paid at ordinary rates for actual time taken in pitching, striking, and removing camp. This will not apply to removal of camp on completion of work or to removal to new works.

13. Away from Home Allowance.—Any worker absent from base camp and unable to return thereto at night shall be granted a meal allowance of two shillings per meal for all meals necessarily purchased on days subsequent to leaving the base camp. In such cases where a camp is not provided by the Department a lodging allowance of two shillings per night shall also be paid. The base camp shall, in all cases, be fixed by the Engineer in Charge.

14. Preference of Employment.—Preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement shall be given to members of the Federated Engine-drivers' and Firemen's Association of Workers of Western Australia, except where it is necessary to employ locomotives and crew who are already controlled by existing lines.

15. Existing Customs.—Existing customs and practices will be continued unless the contrary is provided in this Agreement.

### HOSPITAL EMPLOYEES (EASTERN GOLD-FIELDS).

# (Registered 10th December, 1926.)

No. 40 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act of 1912-1925," this eighth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between the Honourable the Chief Secretary for the State of Western Australia, of the one part, and The Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (Eastern Goldfields Branch), of the other part: Whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:

1. Area .- The Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of 14 miles from the Central Post Office in Kalgoorlie.

2. Term.-The term of the Agreement shall be for a period of twelve months from the 1st July, 1926.

3. Hours .- The hours to be worked shall be as follows:

(a) Laundry Staff-Forty-four hours per week, to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and between S a.m. and noon on Saturday, or in such other manner as may be mutually agreed upon between the Secretary of the Union and the Resident Medical Officer.

(b) Orderlies (Mental Ward)-48 hours per week.
(c) All other staff-Forty-eight hours per week, to be worked on any six days of the week.

Overtime-

(a) Laundry Staff-All time worked in excess of forty-four hours per week to be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half. (b) Orderlies (Mental Ward)—For all time worked

in excess of forty-eight hours per week, overtime shall be paid at time and a half.

(c) All other employees—For all time worked in ex-cess of forty-eight hours per week, to be worked on any six days in the week, overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(d) Employees called upon to work in the venereal clinic at night in addition to ordinary duties, shall for time so worked during the night be paid at time and a half rates.

Holidays-5

(a) The following days shall be observed as holi-days, namely:--New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foun-dation Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzae Day. Any employee required to work on the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of time and a half, or be allowed time off in lieu thereof.

(b) A holiday of two weeks on full pay, together with board and lodging allowance of £1 5s. 9d. per week, shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of service. An employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holi-day in proportion to the length of his or her service: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of any employee summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

6. Sick Leave .-- Conditions as at present observed in the Kalgoorlie Hospital to continue.

7. Wages-

Orderlies-£3 4s. 3d. per week, or £13 18s. 6d. per month. with board and lodging. Orderlies, Mental Ward-£3 9s. 8d. per week, or

Contentes, mental want so and lodging. Outdoor orderly, who is a boiler attendant and plant attendant, etc., £4 18s. 11d. per week, or £21 8s. 8d. per month, without board and lodging.

Orderlies performing special duties such as night calls, shaving for surgical purposes orderly, mortuary orderly, V.D. orderly, splint maker, instrument attend-ant, in charge of receipt and issue of stores, and when employed driving motor ambulance or horse, to be paid at the rate of 5s. (five shillings) per week extra.

Workers whose wages are computed on living-in basis and are required to live out, shall receive £1 5s. 9d. per week in addition to the rate specified. If required to lodge out only, they shall be paid 8s. 7d. per week in addition to the rate specified.

Engagement.-One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or, if, after receiving one week's notice, he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

9. Payment of Wages .- Wages, including overtime, if any, shall be paid twice monthly, and such payment shall be made in cash

10. Dressing Room .-- Reasonable facilities for rest rooms for those boarding-in shall be provided.

11. Uniforms.—All uniforms (i.e., uniformity in dress) shall be supplied free of cost to all male workers required to wear them. Female workers to be supplied with 18 (eighteen) yards of uniform material and 12 (twelve) yards of apron material per year. 12. Casual Workers.—All persons engaged for a period of less than six days in any week shall be paid ten per cent on the wards weld in work in a line of the state.

ten per cent. on the wages paid in cash in addition to the rates prescribed, with a minimum engagement of one day. Provided this shall not apply in the case of an employee summarily dismissed for misconduct.

13. General Clauses-(a) No female workers shall be called upon to clean men's lavatories in or about the hospital.

(b) An employee required to take a day off duty not already shown on the roster for such day must be so in-formed before booking off the day previous. (c) All washing to be provided as at present.

(d) Space shall be provided at the employees' quarters for the purpose of posting union notices.

(e) A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate in this Agreement than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate while so employed.

(f) Weekly rosters to be kept posted in a convenient place setting out the hours of starting and finishing and the duties of each employee thereon, together with the day each employee is booked off duty. Such roster must be posted not less than twenty-four hours preceding the day on which the roster commences.

(g) A copy of this Agreement shall be placed in a conspicuous position by the Secretary or Chief Resident Officer of the Hospital.

14. Industrial Agreement No. 60 of 1925 is hereby cancelled.

15. This Agreement is based on a basic wage of eighty-five shillings per week in Perth for adult males and forty-five shillings and eleven-pence per week for adult females at Perth.

### DOCK, HARBOURS, AND RIVERS WORKS.

AN Agreement made this sixth day of March, 1926, between the Minister for Works, Chief Secretary (as the Minister for the State Steamship Service), and Fremantle Harbour Trust of the one part, and the Coastal Dock, River and Harbour Works Union of Workers of the other part.

Whereas an Award of the Arbitration Court of Western Australia was made on the 26th day of September, 1923, and numbered 26 of 1922, and it has been mutually agreed to vary the terms of the said Award as hereinafter expressed.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED BETWEEN THE PAR-TIES:

(Except where otherwise stated the amendments hereunder shall have effect from 26th September, 1924.)

Clause 2. Hours of Duty.

Delete Clause 2 and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

"44 hours shall represent a week's work. The ordinary working hours shall not exceed eight hours Stundays.'' (Operates as from 2nd July, 1924.) Watchmen's hours shall be regulated in ac-cordance with present practice.

Clause 3. Overtime.

Delete Subclause (a) and insert in lieu thereof the following :-

"All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be paid for the first four hours after the usual stopping time, time and a-half, and thereafter double time, provided that employees called to start work within an hour and a-half of the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half until the usual starting time.'

Delete Subclause (b) and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"If the Minister requires an employee to work on Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, he shall be paid at double time, except in the case of watchmen, who shall take such days as ordinary days.

Provided that it may be mutually agreed between the union and the employer that any worker may work at ordinary rates on any or all of the days above specified to facilitate arrangement under Clause 4 (a).'

# Clause 4. Holidays.

Delete Subclause (a) and insert in lieu thereof the fol-

lowing:---''Twelve paid holidays per annum will be granted all employees, provided always that the following days: Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, shall be taken as they come as portion of the holidays; the balance of six days to be granted as annual leave at the convenience of the Department. Payment for holidays shall be made in accordance with the usual hours of work."

Delete Subclause (b) and insert in lieu thereof the

(a) That the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis subject to the following condition, namely: That if in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week no work is available or performed, the employee will only be paid for the time actually worked at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of 44 hours) apportioned to the time actually worked during the week; and

- (b) That notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this re-spect the same as if the employee were em-ployed at an hourly wage.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the cancellation of the Regulations of the Technical Schools under the Education Department and the substitution therefor of the Regulations set out hereunder.

# EDUCATION DEPARTMENT. Technical Schools.

Regulations governing the members of the teaching staff exempt from the provisions of "The Public Ser-vice Act, 1904."

1. The staff shall be classified in three divisions, viz.:

Division 1 .- Fulltime lecturers and assistant lecturers.

Division 2 --- Other full-time teachers.

Division 3 .- Part-time teachers and cadets.

2. The Director of Technical Education shall have the direction and control of the entire staff, and shall from time to time define their duties.

3. When a vacancy in any office of Division 1 of the staff requires to be filled, or an appointment made to a new office in that division, the Director shall obtain mitchle applications for a start of the staff of the start of suitable applications from qualified persons, and shall make a recommendation to the Minister as to the applicant best qualified to fill the vacancy. Such appointments shall be made by the Governor. Vacancies in offices of Divisions 2 and 3 shall be filled by the Director, subject to the approval of the Minister.

4. Full-time teachers cannot be allowed to accept any paid employment from any employer other than the Government, nor can they be permitted to take any office or appointment, whether honorary or paid, with-out the consent in writing of the Minister. 5. The appointment of an officer will date from the

time that he reports himself to the Director for duty, and only train or other fares from the officer's point of departure within the State to his destination will be paid, unless otherwise specified at the time of the appointment.

6. Each officer shall be regular in the times of his arrival at and departure from his duties, and shall not absent himself without leave during class hours.

7. The members of the staff are required to conduct their classes regularly, as detailed in the syllabus, at the hours shown on the time table, and to commence their classes at the time specified. The regular hours of duty shall be from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., and from 7 p.m.

to 10 p.m. or an equivalent. 8. Each member of the staff shall be required to prevent an accumulation of arrears of work, and may

be called upon to meet a temporary increase of work without additional payment.

Each member of the staff shall be held responsible for the proper conduct of his classes and the safe keeping of the material and apparatus used in connection with his work. He must at once report to the Director any damage to school property, disobedience to Regulations, and misdemeanour which may come under his notice.

10. Correspondence from members of the staff to the head office must pass through the Director.

11. No information connected with the school or obtained by means of the school appliances is to be made public by any member of the staff, without the knowledge and consent of the Director.

12. Members of the staff are prohibited from seeking the influence or interest of any person in order to obtain promotion, transfer, or other advantage, except with the consent of the Director. All claims for advancement within the service must be made through the Director.

13. No member of the staff, in his official capacity, shall give to any person who is leaving or who has left the school, any written testimonial without the consent of the Director.

14. No address, testimonial, or presentation shall be accepted by any member of the staff without the sanction, in writing, of the responsible Minister. 15. If any member of the staff is on an indictment

convicted of any offence, he shall be deemed to have forfeited his office, and shall thereupon cease to per-form his duties and receive his salary.

16. The recognised summer vacation of ten weeks shall extend approximately from the beginning of the second week in December to the end of the second week in February. Before leaving for the vacation each member of the staff must have completed his year's work to the satisfaction of the Director, and must state his proposed postal address.

The school shall be closed on Public Service 17.

holidays. 18. Teachers on the permanent staff must give three months' notice of intended resignation. No such notice may terminate between the 1st January and 31st March, except for teachers whose term of continuous service began between those dates. Such teachers may resign on any date subsequent to that of their first appointment followed by continuous service.

Teachers not on the permanent staff must give at least one month's notice; no such notice shall terminate between the 1st January and the last day of February.

When full notice is not given, pay may be forfeited at the discretion of the Minister.

19. The appointment of a full-time teacher may be terminated by three months' notice.

The appointment of any member of the staff may, in the case of misconduct, be terminated summarily by the Minister.

20. Members of the staff when travelling on the Public Service will be subject to Section E of the Publie Service Regulations.

21. The granting of long service leave, sick leave. free passes to the coast, and goldfields allowances shall be in accordance with the Education Department Regulations.

# AMENDMENT TO REGULATION.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of Appendix IV. to the Regulations of the Education Department being amended by the 

annually to candidates who wish to become teachers of Science. The successful candidates will be required to devote three years to the course for the B.S.c. degree, and a fourth year to the post-graduate course at the Teachers' College. They will be required to enter into a bond pledging them to teach in the Education Department's service for five years after the completion of their training. The Exhibi-tions will be of the same value as the others, and will be awarded on the results of the Leaving Certificate Examination. Candidates, when giving notice in accordance with Regulation 5, should state that they desire to compete for the "Science Teacher's Exhibitions."

# THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-19. Amendment of By-laws.

M.P.H. 166/19; Ex. Co. No. 3805. WHEREAS the Maylands Local Board of Health, being "Local Health Authority under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," is empowered to make or amend By-laws to be enforced for the Local Health District of Maylands; and whereas the said Board did by resolution published in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of January, 1916, make a By-law dealing with the construction of closets, and known as Part I., By-law 1 (a): Now, therefore, the said Maylands Local Board of Health, being the Local Health Authority for the said Health District of Maylands, doth hereby amend its By-laws by repealing By-law 1 (a) of Part I. of its By-laws and by making the following By-law:-

### Part I.-By-law 1.

(a.) No earth closet shall be erected in any position other than a position directed by the Health Inspector, and the position so directed shall not be within a distance of 20 feet from any dwelling or place of business unless the Local Authority shall otherwise expressly permit; it shall not be within 20 feet of any tank nor within 50 feet of any other water supply, nor within 50 feet of the milking-shed or milk-room of any dairy, and shall be so constructed that the pan may be withdrawn from the rear of the earth closet; it shall be supplied with a sufficient number of pans which shall be purchased from the Local Authority.
