ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 1480/26.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves set out in schedule attached should vest in and be held by The Hon. Michael Francis Troy, Minister for Mines, in trust for the purpose of Explosives Magazine site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by The Hon. Michael Francis Troy, with power to the said The Hon. Michael Francis Troy to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserves for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

The Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1711/26; L. & S. 5550/26.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may by an Order in Council declare any Crown Lands as Timber Reserves within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the Crown lands described in the schedule hereto a Timber Reserve (No. 72/25) within the meaning and for the purpose of "The Forests Act, 1918."

Timber Reserve No. 72/25.

TRAFFIC ACT, 1919, AND AMENDING ACTS.

Traffic Regulations—Additions and Amendments.

P.W. 2660/21.

ADDITIONAL Regulation 165, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th August, 1926, page 1654, shall be read as Regulation 166.

The Seventh Schedule to the Traffic Regulations is hereby amended as follows:—

Routes Nos. 27, 36, and 37 are hereby revoked.

Prescribing a Route within the Metropolitan Area along which Motor Omnibuses for which "Regular Service" Licenses are granted may ply for Hire.

His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Traffic Act, doth by this Order prescribe a further route within the Metropolitan Area along which motor omnibuses for which "Regular Service" Licenses are granted under the provisions of the Traffic Act may ply for hire; also sections and terminal points and stopping places on such routes, time-tables to be observed by owners of motor omnibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of motor omnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire on such prescribed route, as set forth in detail in the Schedule hereunder:—

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

Bayswater District Road Board—By-laws.

WHEREAS by Section 196, Subsection 8 (b) of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Board of a Road District may make By-laws for preventing any misuse or obstruction of or damage or injury to roads and public places and reserves, buildings, structures, works, appliances, apparatus, and things vested in or under the control of the Board; and whereas by Section 196, Subsection 39, the Board may also make By-laws to prevent and prohibit animals from straying, or, if suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, from being driven or ridden on any road, and for the slaughter and destruction of any animal found so suffering on any road: Now, therefore, the Bayswater District Road Board, in pursuance and exercise of the said powers and of every other power or authority in that behalf it thereunto enabling, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws, subject to the context:—

"Board" means the Bayswater District Road Board.

"Cattle" means and includes horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, calf, foal, sheep, pig, and goat.

"Owner" means the owner or the person entitled to or having the possession of the cattle or animal and reputed to be the owner thereof.

The following words shall have the meanings prescribed by Section 5 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919":—"Public Place," "Reserve," and "Road."

2. Subject as hereinafter provided no cattle shall be permitted to enter or be in or upon any road, public place, land, reserve, drain, building, structure, work, or thing vested in, belonging to, or under the control of the Board.

3. The owner of any cattle so entering or being in or upon any such road, public place, land, reserve, drain, building, structure, work, or thing shall be liable upon conviction to the penalty hereinafter prescribed.

4. If any such cattle whilst entering or being in or upon any such road, public place, land, reserve, drain, building, structure, work, or thing shall be in the charge or under the control of any person other than the owner,

such person shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter prescribed.

5. Nothing in the foregoing By-laws contained shall be deemed to affect or render liable to conviction the owner or any person in charge or having the control of any cattle which shall be *bona fide* driven or led by any person along or upon any road vested in or under the control of the Board, and not feeding, depasturing, grazing, roaming, loitering, or doing damage thereon.

6. No animal shall be—

(a) Permitted to stray upon any road; or

(b) Driven or ridden on any road whilst suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

7. The owner of any animal so straying, driven, or ridden, and any person driving or riding any such animal, shall, upon conviction, be liable to the penalty hereinafter prescribed.

8. The penalty to be imposed upon a defendant convicted of an offence against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be—

(a) For a first offence, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds;

(b) For a second or subsequent offence, a sum not being less than Ten pounds nor more than Twenty pounds.

INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1925.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations made under "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925."

Building Trade Apprentices.

1. The term "Building Trade" as used in Section 125 of the Act, shall mean the following trades, callings, or avocations, namely:—

- (a) Bricklaying (including tuck-pointing).
- (b) Stonemasonry (including all forms of stone-cutting and fixing and monumental masonry)
- (c) Plastering (including modelling but excluding cement and plaster-sheet making and the making of cement tubs, baths and cisterns).
- (d) Carpentry.

2. (i.) In the event of more than one nomination being received for the Apprenticeship Board from the Industrial Unions of Employers or Workers, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) A ballot shall be taken by the Registrar, who shall act as Returning Officer.
- (b) Ballot papers shall be prepared by the Registrar and initialled by him—one such paper shall be supplied to each Industrial Union in such time as to give the Union a reasonable opportunity to vote.
- (c) Each Union shall be entitled to one vote for every duly registered apprentice in the particular trade or calling to which the Union relates. Such votes may be distributed amongst the persons nominated or may all be given to one.
- (d) The ballot paper with the voting recorded shall be returned to the Registrar sealed with the seal of the Union and signed by the President and Secretary within the appointed time.
- (e) At the expiration of the time appointed the Registrar shall count the votes recorded in the ballot papers and report the result to the Court. The person who has received the greatest number of votes shall be deemed to be the nominated member.

(ii.) The members nominated shall be entitled to retain their membership for three years but shall be eligible for re-nomination. It shall be the duty of the Registrar to call for nominations as and when same are required.

(iii.) A member may resign at any time by sending a notification to that effect to the Registrar. A member who absents himself without the leave of the Chairman from three consecutive meetings of the Board shall be deemed to have vacated his position.

(iv.) The presence of the Chairman, and at least one other member, shall be sufficient to constitute a meeting of the Board. The decision of a majority of the members present at a meeting, or if the members present are equally divided in opinion, then the decision of the Chairman shall be the decision of the Board.

3. No person between the ages of fourteen and eighteen years shall be employed in the abovementioned trades, except as a junior worker when the Award or Industrial Agreement provides for such, or an apprentice, including an apprentice on probation.

4. (i.) Any person desirous of becoming an apprentice shall notify the Registrar, who shall keep a register of such persons.

(ii.) Every employer desirous of obtaining an apprentice shall take as an apprentice only a person whose name is so registered.

5. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

6. Subject to Regulation 8, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever may, with the consent of the Board, on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement.

7. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by this award: Provided—

(a) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one month in each year;

(b) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost, if any, of such certificate or certificates not exceeding 5s. to be borne by the employer.

(c) An apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

8. The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount by which the wages prescribed by the industrial

award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

9. When an apprentice is absent from work for any cause other than sickness or in pursuance of the provisions of these Regulations, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time so lost.

10. An apprentice shall be entitled to such holidays as are provided for in the Award or Industrial Agreement covering the occupation in which he is engaged.

11. The Registrar shall prepare and keep a roll of apprentices containing—

- (a) a complete record of all applications to become apprentices ;
- (b) a record of all apprentices and probationers placed with employers ;
- (c) a record of all employers with whom apprentices are placed ;
- (d) a record of the progress of each apprentice recording the result of the examiners' reports ;
- (e) any other particulars the Board may direct.

12. The forms in the Schedule annexed hereto are hereby prescribed as the forms to be used in connection with apprenticeship in the Building Trade as defined herein. The parties, with the consent and approval of the Apprenticeship Board, may amend and/or add to the conditions and stipulations therein contained.

13. Notwithstanding anything herein contained it shall be lawful for the Apprenticeship Board, in the case of any person desirous of acquiring a general knowledge of the above trades with a view to qualifying as a building contractor, architect or engineer, to make such special arrangements as it may deem advisable or necessary.

14. The breach of any of the terms of a contract of apprenticeship shall be deemed to be a breach of the Regulations, but this shall not prejudice or affect the right of any party to proceed for damages or penalties in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

15. Non-compliance by any person with the provisions of these Regulations shall be deemed to be a breach thereof.

16. Any person convicted of a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

17. Proceedings in respect of breaches of these Regulations shall be instituted and conducted and fines and penalties recovered in the same manner as proceedings in respect of enforcement of an Award, and the forms prescribed for such enforcement, modified or altered where necessary, may be used in the proceedings.

18. "Apprentice" means any person of any age who is apprenticed to learn or to be taught any of the industries, crafts or callings to which these Regulations apply, and, where the context so admits, includes an apprentice on probation.
