ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Agric. 919/26.

WHEREAS there is reason to believe that the introduction or importation of sheep into Western Australia from the State of New South Wales would cause the disease of anthrax to extend to the State of Western Australia, and it is desirable that steps should be taken Australia, and it is desirable that steps should be taken for its prevention: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby prohibit, for a period of three months from the date of this Order, the introduction or importation into Western Australia from the State of New South Wales either directly or through the States of Victoria or South Australia of any sheep except stud stock accompanied by a certificate from the Chief Veterinary Officer of the State that such study are in sound and healthy condition and entirely stock are in sound and healthy condition and entirely free from disease or any indication of it and have not been in contact with infected sheep.
