AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 20th day of January, 1927, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Land Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 10186/07.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 5247 (Bedforddale Lot 29) for Picnic and Holiday Resort, at Bedforddale, should be placed under the control of the Armadale-Kelmscott District Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Armadale-Kelmscott District Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

*Lake Grace and Dumbleyung Road Districts—
Alteration of Boundaries.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 16/25.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Coun-

cil sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District: And whereas it is desirable to sever portion of the Lake Grace Road District and annex it to the Dumbleyung Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby sever that portion of the Lake Grace Road District as described in the Schedule hereto and annex it to the Dumbleyung Road District.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Metropolitan Reticulation Main Extension and Improvements—City of Perth—North Perth Ward.

Proposed 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing from existing water main at the intersection of Anzac Road and East Street and proceeding in a Northerly direction along the East side of East Street to Lot 34 (length about 26 chains), together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and including lifting existing 1-inch tubing, as indicated in red on M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., Plan No. 4635.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 28th day of January, 1927.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 423/25.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Metropolitan Reticulation Main Extension—Bayswater Road District.

(a.) Proposed 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing from existing 8-inch main at the intersection of Guildford Road and Grafton Road and proceeding in a North-Westerly direction along the North-Eastern side of Grafton Road to Hayward Street (length about 27 chains).

(b.) Proposed 3-inch diameter cast-iron water main, commencing at the intersection of Grafton Road and Cox Street and proceeding in a South-Westerly direction along the South-Eastern side of Cox Street to Lot 8 (length about 5 chains).

(c.) Proposed 3-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing at the intersection of Grafton Road and Coombe Street and proceeding in a North-Easterly direction along the South-Eastern side of Coombe Street to Lot 11 (length about 6 chains).

(d.) Proposed 3-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing at the intersection of Grafton Road and Hayward Street, and proceeding in a North-Easterly direction along the South-Eastern side of Hayward Street to Moore Street; thence in a South-Easterly direction along the South-Western side of Moore Street to Lot 20 (length about 17½ chains), together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus as indicated in red on M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., Plan No. 4632, and

(e.) Proposed 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing at the intersection of Hayward Street and Grafton Road and proceeding in a North-Westerly direction along the North-Eastern side of Grafton Road to South Crescent; thence North-Easterly along the South-Eastern side of South Crescent to Lot B12 (length about 9 chains), together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, as indicated in red on M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., Plan No. 4633.

BY-LAWS OF THE CRANBROOK ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District may make, alter, and repeal By-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act, the Cranbrook Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, and every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretations.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say:—

- "Board"—The Cranbrook Road Board.
- "Chairman"—The member for the time being acting as Chairman of the Board.
- "Cyclist"—Any person riding, impelling, or otherwise having the management and control of any cycle.
- "District"—The District under the control of the Cranbrook Road Board.
- "Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of a road set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made, kerbed, or otherwise.
- "Member"—A member of the Board, including the Chairman.
- "Motor"—Any vehicle, not including traction engines or steam rollers, moved or impelled by other than animal power.
- "Bridge" shall mean any culvert or bridge in the Board's District.
- "Reserve"—Any land under the control of the Board and notified in the *Government Gazette* as a Reserve.
- "Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.
- "The Act"—"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto.
- "Team" shall mean any vehicle drawn by oxen, mules, horses, or camels, or any of them.

Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of the Secretary shall be:—
- (a) To attend all meetings of the Board.
 - (b) To attend all committee meetings.
 - (c) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of Committees.
 - (d) To conduct all correspondence, and to give other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
 - (e) To answer all questions on the Board's business.
 - (f) To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheet prepared and published in the *Government Gazette*, and other duties set out in the Roads Act.
 - (g) To prepare and place before the Board the quarterly statements in due course.
 - (h) To prepare the rate book, electoral lists, electoral rolls in due season. To arrange for the distribution of electoral rolls prior to elections. To attend all courts of revision and appeal.
 - (i) To summon all members to all Board and Committee meetings.
 - (j) To keep all books entered up to date in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and all other instructions of the Board.
 - (k) To check all accounts sent in to the Board, and to see that all accounts for work have stated in them the authority under which the work was done. To check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's servants, and to see that the duplicates of all receipts given accompany all returns. To supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's servants and payable to the credit of the Board.
 - (l) To report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
 - (m) To pay into the bank weekly, after receipt, to the credit of the Board all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board when such money shall amount in the aggregate to £5 or over.
 - (n) To prepare for each meeting of the Board a statement showing the balance of the several Wards at the date of such meeting, and to show the same to any member at any time during

office hours. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board except by or through the Secretary, as directed by the Board, and the Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms.

- (o) To act, when required, as Inspector in connection with the administration of all Statutes coming within the jurisdiction of the Board.
- (p) To readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board, and not specified herein.

Duties of Supervisor.

3. The duties of the Supervisor shall be:—
- (a) To promptly attend to all instructions received through the Secretary in respect to the following matters:—
 - (b) To prepare proper plans, specifications, and estimates of cost for all work and improvements as regards roads and culverts under the control of the Board, examine all materials to be used in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed, and watch the progress and formation thereof, submit all plans and specifications to the Board before tenders are called.
 - (c) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out.
 - (d) To see that no labourers are engaged but those that are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience or insubordination, or found to be incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
 - (e) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
 - (f) To see that all servants under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
 - (g) To attend all Board and Committee meetings if required.
 - (h) To specially examine all the roads in the District at least once in six months, or as required by the Board.
 - (i) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply monthly, or as required, to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

Appointment of Officers.

4. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution of the Board. In the event of there being more than one applicant for such appointment, the election thereto shall be conducted according to the Act, so as to obtain an absolute majority of members present.

5. The election of other servants shall be conducted by a show of hands.

Meetings and Proceedings.

6. Notice shall be given in writing to each member (and posted on the Board's notice board) by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary meetings at least seven days before such meetings, and also of every meeting adjourned for a period exceeding six days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or if, after being present, he shall retire, one of the members chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.

7. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, "ordinary" and "special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be stated on the notice sent to members, for which seven days' notice shall be given.

8. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called; provided that any matter of urgency can be dealt with, with the ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present.

9. Ordinary meetings of the Board shall be held at the office of the Board at Cranbrook, on the third Saturday in each month, unless otherwise arranged by resolution at the previous meeting of the Board.

10. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he thinks proper.

11. Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding Chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

12. At all meetings of the Board where there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

Order of Business.

13. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows:—

- (a) Reading aloud and confirmation of minutes of the last ordinary and special meetings if any.
- (b) Consideration of business arising out of the minutes.
- (c) Chairman's and members' reports.
- (d) Reading of correspondence, in and out, and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (e) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and Committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (f) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (g) General business.
- (h) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (i) In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all other.

14. Any member wishing to rescind any motion carried at any previous meeting of the Board shall give to the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice of his intention to move such rescission, particulars of which shall be immediately sent to all members.

Petitions.

15. Every petition or memorial shall be presented to the Board by a member only. Such petitions shall be temperate and respectful in language, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall affix his name at the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

16. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Committee appointed for that purpose.

Orders of debate. Speakers must not digress.

17. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of the debate.

Motions and amendments.

18. A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.

19. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall first be put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and last on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.

20. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, or be put by the Chairman.

21. In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

22. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

23. No member shall speak twice on the same subject, except by way of explanation, or to an amendment, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last carried motion; nevertheless any member who may have been misunderstood or misrepresented, shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but not after, and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

Appointment of Committee.

24. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and to make a report and recommendation thereon, but no Committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without the specific authority conferred by these By-laws, or a resolution of the Board. The quorum of the Committee shall comprise three members.

Urgent Works.

25. The Chairman with one member, or in the absence of the Chairman, any two members, may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £10. Any one member is empowered to authorise expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5, in cases of urgent necessity upon declared roads, but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

26. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any Committee, or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a Breach of this By-law.

Prevention of Nuisances.

27. Any person who—

Shall keep or cause to be kept any abattoir, slaughter-house, pigsty, manure works, works for boiling down meat, bones, blood or offal, bone mill, bone manure depot, fellmongery, tannery, wool scouring establishment, glue factory, soap or candle works, fish-curing establishments, place for storing, drying, or preserving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins, dairy or other works or establishment; or,

Shall keep or cause to be kept any house, passage, yard, way, cellar, drain, stable, cowshed, earth or other closet or cesspool; or

Shall permit any accumulation of stagnant water, manure, dung, or offal, or other filth upon any premises owned or occupied by him; or

Shall deposit, cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place, the carcase of a dead animal or refuse or offensive matter; or

Shall cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid to flow from any house, land, or premises owned or occupied by him in or upon any road or footpath,

so as to be or likely to become a nuisance or injurious to the public health, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Abatement of Nuisances.

28. If a person shall permit or suffer any of the nuisances contained in the foregoing By-law No. 27 to continue after notice from the Board requiring such person to remedy or abate the same, he shall be liable to a penalty of five shillings a day for every day which such nuisance shall remain unremedied or unabated to the satisfaction of the Board. Such penalty shall not exceed in the aggregate £20.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

29. Any person guilty of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding £20:—

(a) Damaging or destroying any building, dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, gate, or other property under control of the Board.

(b) Placing any placard, sign, printing, or writing on any road, reserve, or other property of the Board without the permission of the Board first had, and the fees demanded thereof paid.

Damaging Roads.

30. No person shall, either wilfully or negligently, damage or destroy by means of horse, team, or any other means any road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Any person who—

- (a) Cuts or removes without the consent in writing of the Board timber, earth, stone, or other material from a road or reserve; or
- (b) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of any road or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d) Draws upon any road stone, timber, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of other attachment, trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

To protect Bridges from Fire.

31. Any person who shall light a fire (except by order of the Board), or shall place any rushes, bushes, or other inflammable material or substance under, near, or against any bridge in the District for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

Prevention of Trees falling across Roads.

32. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading.

33. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track.

Preservation of Trees.

34. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub, or plant, standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection for to such trees, shrubs or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10, and in addition thereto shall pay the Board a sum equal to the damage done.

Setting Traps or Poison on Roads.

35. Any person who shall lay any poison baits or set any traps upon any road or footway shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

Prescribing removal of Verandahs.

36. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footway or roadway, or overhanging the same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person interfering whatsoever or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Encroachments, etc., removal of.

37. On the order of the Board, Secretary, or other appointed officer may direct the removal within 14 days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under control of the Board. In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the

offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall not be more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

Lighting.

38. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or any person who shall damage or destroy such lamp shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

Crossing-places.

39. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any road or public way requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good repair. Any person not complying with this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Straying Animals

40. No animal shall be allowed to stray on any road, reserve or place, and no animal suffering from infectious or contagious disease shall be ridden or driven on any road. Any diseased animal found on any road may be slaughtered or destroyed. The owner of any animal found straying as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty of not less than 10s. and not more than £5.

Public Pound, etc.

41. Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound, fence, gate, lock, shed, trough or any other property of the Board shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

42. Any person who shall obliterate, deface, or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

43. The owner of any bull or stallion straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 in the night-time and not exceeding £4 in the daytime.

Pound Fees.

44. Owners of impounded stock for the release of such shall pay—

For each stallion or bull, £1 first offence; £2 each after offence.

For each head of great stock, 2s. 6d. first offence; 5s. each after offence.

For each head of small stock, 1s. first offence; 2s. 6d. each after offence.

For stock impounded outside a township, half the fees stated.

Sustenance.

45. Owners of impounded stock shall pay for the sustenance of such during the time of their being in the pound—

For each head of great stock, 1s. 6d. per meal.

For each head of small stock, 1s. per meal.

Copulation of Stock.

46. Any owner who, as owner or otherwise, while in charge of an entire horse, or bull or ass, shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to try to cover any mare, or cow within any township, or shall cause or permit, or allow or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or other place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be tried or covered, except in some yard or building or other premises as shall be entirely or sufficiently screened from the public view, shall forfeit and pay on conviction a sum not exceeding £10.

47. No entire shall be led or exhibited in any township at inexpedient hours.

Water Supply.

48. Any person who shall injure or destroy any well, bore, pipe, tank, or other place of storage for water, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and also shall pay to the Board the sum of such damage.

49. Any person who shall waste or allow water to escape, foul, pollute, or taint any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or other place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

50. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, well, tank or reservoir, or other water within the district.

51. Any person who shall remove any water from any well, bore, tank, or other place of storage under the control of the Board, except in the direct watering of stock thereat, or for *bona-fide* camping use, or except with the written consent of the Board and the payment thereon of such reasonable fees as may be demanded, shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding £5.

Sand and Timber.

52. Any person who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands under the control of the Board without a license, shall forfeit and pay on conviction a sum not exceeding £5.

Barbed Wire.

53. Barbed wire shall not be allowed on the outer road side of any fence along any road. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Fencing.

54. The owner of any land abutting on any road in any townsite shall fence all such boundaries so abutting, with such description of fence as may be directed by the Board, and shall maintain every such boundary fence erected or to be erected, in good order. In the event of such fence not being erected or repaired after due notice has been given so to do, the Board may fence or repair such fences and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or owners of the land.

Water and Camping Reserves.

55. No stock shall be depastured on any reserve except *bona-fide* travelling stock (which may remain for 24 hours) without the permission of the Board and payment of the fees prescribed, which shall be : one penny per day for sheep, and one shilling and sixpence per week for great stock. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 in addition to double fees for the time such stock were depastured.

Parks.

56. No stock shall be depastured on reserves or other park lands without the sanction of the Board and the payment of the fees set out. Any stock so admitted with the sanction of the Board shall be held entirely at the risk of the owner, and no responsibility shall rest upon the Board for their safety, or in any other way.

Fees—

Horses, first four days, 6d. per day each.
Horses, after four days, 1s. per day each.
Cattle, first four days, 4d. each per day.
Cattle, after four days, 8d. each per day.
Cows in milk, 1s. 6d. each per week.

57. No race, sports, or other public meeting whatsoever shall be held upon any reserve save with the sanction of the Board or Committee in control first had and obtained and upon payment of such reasonable fee (if any) as may be demanded.

58. Such person to whom use of such reserve is given for picnic, sports, races, or other use shall be held responsible for the immediate removal of all rubbish brought thereon on the occasion of such use, and a deposit not exceeding £5 shall be paid as a guarantee for the due removal of such rubbish. On the removal

of such rubbish to the satisfaction of the Board, the deposit shall be refunded.

59. No person shall offer for sale on any reserve any provisions, refreshments, or other goods of any kind, or carry on any games, or boxing, or other similar shows, nor use any firearms, except with the express sanction of the Board or Committee in control and payment of such fees as shall be demanded.

Gate Permits.

60. All gates erected across roads must be subject to permission from the Board and shall conform to the following By-laws:—

- (a) All gates shall be 14 feet in width, to be optional whether in one or two sections, hung to substantial posts and swinging freely, and opening to a width of not less than 18 feet. To be provided with suitable stops to prevent swinging in when stock or vehicles are passing through, and a convenient fastening when closed.
- (b) The gates shall be placed at right angles to the line of road and in the centre of the line of survey, and an approach cleared for a width of 16 feet for a distance of 1½ chain in either direction from the gate.
- (c) At cross roads, or where one road joins another, the gates shall be placed not less than one chain back from such junction of the roads, and wing fences erected from the gate site to the junction.
- (d) Gates must not be erected where the grade is steeper than 1 in 20, nor within one chain of where any watercourse crosses the road.
- (e) The applicant for a permit must lodge the consent in writing of at least two users of the road, and must post a notice of their intention to apply for a permit at the gate site for at least 21 days previous.

Conformity with By-laws.

61. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of the foregoing By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and any person guilty of an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such breach, where not otherwise provided for.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following amendments to Regulations 29, 79, and 92 of the Education Department:—

Reg. 29 (5): Delete and substitute the following:—

(5) A teacher who wishes to appeal against a decision of the Board of Classifiers must make his appeal in writing, setting out fully the grounds on which he considers that an alteration should be made. The appeal must be made within one month from the publication of the decision appealed against. The appeal will be considered by the Board at its next meeting, and the Board's decision will be final.

Reg. 79 (a): For the word "Minister" in line 2 read "Director."

Add the following:—

(b) The Director may suspend a teacher against whom a serious charge is made. The teacher will receive a copy of the charge. Unless he admits the truth of the charge, a departmental inquiry will be held. If the charge is proved, the teacher will not be entitled to any salary during the time of his suspension.

(c) At a departmental inquiry, the inspector or other officer holding the inquiry may allow a member of the School Board or of the Parents and Citizens' Association to be present. The teacher may, if he wishes, have another teacher present. The complainant may also have a friend or adviser present. With these exceptions only those persons whose attendance is necessary shall be admitted. Facilities must be given for the cross-examination of witnesses on either side.

(d) A teacher who, for alleged misconduct or breach of the Regulations, is fined an amount in excess of fifteen shillings, or is transferred at his own expense, or is reduced to a lower class or grade, or to a position carrying a lower salary, or is dismissed, shall have the right to appeal to the Appeal Board as provided in the Public Education Acts Amendment Act, 1926.

In the matter of Section 87 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and in the matter of Award No. 18 and 19/1922. between the Western Australian Branch of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers and the Metropolitan Master Printers and Allied Trades' Union of Employers, and in the matter of an application for a Board of Reference.

UPON hearing the joint application of the parties to the above Award, and upon hearing Mr. F. G. Saunders on behalf of the Western Australian Branch of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, and Mr. Ernest E. Jarvis on behalf of the Metropolitan Master Printers and Allied Trades Union of Employers, and by consent, it is hereby ordered that a Board of Reference be constituted, to consist of the Chairman and six other members, three to be nominated by the Western Australian Branch of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers and three to be nominated by the Metropolitan Master Printers and Allied Trades' Union of Employers. The functions of the said Board shall be as follows:—

1. To advise the Court as regards apprenticeship matters in the printing industry within the area covered by the Award, and in particular on the following heads:—

- (a) The appointment or reappointment of examiners;
- (b) The preparation of a syllabus for the course of instruction from time to time;
- (c) The methods of instruction to be followed;
- (d) The conduct of examinations of apprentices;
- (e) Schemes for the institution of scholarships and prizes.

2. The said Board shall receive monthly or other periodical reports from the instructors for the purpose of amending or correcting any laxity in attendance or conduct of apprentices at classes of instruction.

3. To assist in selecting the best type of apprentice and to advise upon the ability of any person, firm, or company to effectively train an apprentice or apprentices, and to encourage and foster the study of subjects bearing upon the trade or occupation in the evening classes or other classes instituted for the purpose.

4. To advise the Court and parties interested as to what additional plant is required from time to time for the effective instruction of apprentices.

5. To assist in the promotion of classes for instruction in branches of the industry not already provided for.

6. To formulate and submit to the Court a scheme of instruction for country apprentices.

7. To consider and recommend improvements in the training of apprentices from time to time.

8. The Board shall hold its deliberations in private, unless a majority of the representatives of the parties, or Chairman, otherwise directs.

9. A majority of the members, one of whom must be the chairman, shall constitute a quorum. Provided that in the case of difference of opinion between members representing the said Union of Workers and members representing the said Union of Employers, the decision of the chairman shall be accepted and taken as the decision of the Board.

10. The Board may sit at such times and places as the majority may decide and arrange from time to time and place to place.

11. The decision of the Board may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of any of the parties; provided that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days from the date thereof to the chairman and the opposite parties, and the application lodged with the Registrar asking for such review within fourteen days of such decision: Provided further, that all parties abide by the decision, unless and until the same is altered by the Court.

12. With the consent of the Court either party may at any time vary its nomination of representative member.

13. The members of the Board shall not claim or accept remuneration or payment from the Government for their services.
