WHEREAS by "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any Municipal or Road District a Fire District, and may include such District in parts 2, 3, or 4 of the Second Schedule to the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, constitute the Road District of Sussex a Fire District, under the name of the Sussex Fire District, and doth hereby order and direct that the said Fire District be and the same is hereby included in Part 4 of the Second Schedule to the said Act.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following Regulations governing the admission of Cadet Draftsmen and Cadet Computing Draftsmen in the Lands and Surveys Department and Land Titles Office, and has cancelled the previous Regulations.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE ADMISSION OF CADET DRAFTSMEN AND CADET COMPUTING DRAFTSMEN, LANDS AND SURVEYS DEPARTMENT, AND LAND TITLES OFFICE, CROWN LAW DEPARTMENT.

Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He shall also produce ratisfactory evidence as to character.

Qualifications.

- An applicant shall produce evidence of having passed:-
 - (a) The Junior Certificate Examination of the University of Western Australia in Mathematics, and any other three subjects;
 - (b) The Leaving Certificate Examination of the University of Western Australia in English, Mathematics, and Physics; or (c) Such other examinations as shall, in the opinion
 - of the Public Service Commissioner, be equivalent thereto.
 - (d) He shall also submit satisfactory proof of his aptitude for plan drawing.

Probation.

3. Every Cadet shall in the first instance be appointed on probation for a period not exceeding six months. Before the expiration of the period of probation a report shall be made to the Public Service Commissioner on the manner in which the probationer has performed his duties and upon his general conduct. Upon receipt of such report the Commissioner will confirm or annul the cadetship, or extend the period of probation for a further period not exceeding three months.

Term of Service and Qualifying Examination.

A Cadet Draftsman will be required to serve for a period of four years, during which he will be instructed in drafting, plotting, compilation of standard plans, computations, standard traverses, and the use of Draftsmen's instruments.

If at any time during his term of service his progress and general conduct have not, in the opinion of the Head of the Department, been satisfactory, his services may, with the approval of the Public Service Commissional Public Service Commissions of the Public Service Commissi sioner, be dispensed with.

On the completion of his term of service he will be required to present himself at a qualifying departmental examination, which shall embrace the following sub-

- (a) Drawing: Plan drawing; hill shading and etching; contouring; colouring and drawing for reproduction.
- The use of scales and protractors; (b) Plotting: plotting by means of co-ordinates and by latitudes and longitudes. Adjustment and dispersion of errors of close on standard plans. Plotting from surveyors' field
- (c) Stundard Traverse: Computation of geographical positious on standard traverses, closure and adjustment of circuits.

(d) Projections: Computation of the latitudes and departures from points of origin of the intersections of meridians and parallels. Latitudes and longitudes of rectangular sheet corners.

(c) Instruments: Use of eidograph, planimeter and

calculating machine.

(f) Computations in connection with land surveying,

including azimuth, latitude and time observations.

6. A Cadet Computing Draftsman will be required to serve for a period of four years, during which he will be instructed in drafting, plotting, computations, examination of surveyors' plans and accounts, and issue of instructions.

If at any time during his term of service his progressand general conduct have not, in the opinion of the Head of the Department, been satisfactory, his services may, with the approval of the Public Service Commis-

sioner, be dispensed with.

On the completion of his term of service he will be required to present himself at a qualifying departmental examination, which shall embrace the following sub-

- (a) Drawing: Plan drawing; enlarging and reducing; use of scales and protractors; plotting by coordinates; plotting from surveyors' field books; stump writing and printing; colouring; drawing for reproduction.
- (b) Computing: Examination of surveyors' diagrams and original plans and adjustments of discrepancies in surveys; checking contract surveyors' statements of accounts; computations in connection with land surveying including azimuth, latitude and time observations.

 (c) Issue of instructions and information for survey;

use of planimeter and calculating machine.
7. All Cadets will be examined as to their knowledge of the various Acts and Regulations affecting the work of the Professional Branch of the Department of Lands and Surveys, or Land Titles Office, as the case may be.

- 8. Cadets will be expected to attend at the evening classes of the University of Western Australia, the Technical School, or other approved institution, and will be allowed such leave of absence as may be necessary to attend day lectures in approved subjects at the University of Western Australia at such times as the bylaws of the University may provide; but such leave of absence during working hours shall be without pay unless the Department can conveniently arrange for the Cadet to make up the time.
- 9. The examination prescribed in Sections 5 and 6 shall be conducted as directed by the Public Service Commissioner.
- 10. Should a Cadet fail to pass in the qualifying examination his term of service may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, be extended for a further period not exceeding two years, at the same remuneration as that received for his fourth year of service.

Permanent Appointment.

- A Cadet who has satisfactorily completed his cadetship and obtained his certificate of qualification shall (should he be so required) serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of three years, at a salary in accordance with the Public Service Commissioner's classification of the work upon which he is engaged, but at not less than at the rate of £216 per
- 12. If the Cadet is under 21 years of age when he obtains his certificate of qualification the Commissioner may extend his cadetship, and fix the salary to be paid until he reaches that age.

Public Service Act and Regulations.

During the whole term of his cadetship and any extension thereto, a Cadet shall be subject to the Public Service Act and Regulations relating to the permanent staff, as far as applicable. His service qualifying him for long service leave, however, will not count until after the completion of his cadetship.

Bond.

An agreement and bond, with approved sureties, in a form to be prescribed, to be executed for the due performance of all the terms herein specified.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE ELECTORAL ACT, 1907, AS AMENDED.

Crown Law Department,

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the powers conferred upon him by Section 210 of "The Electoral Act, 1907," has cancelled Regulations Nos. 11 and 12, and Schedule 11, under the said Act, and has approved of the substitution of the following in lieu thereof.

FINANCIAL.

Fees to Officers at Elections, etc.

- 11. (a) Every Officer under the Public Service Act may be required by the Governor to act in the capacity of Returning Officer, Deputy or Assistant Returning Officer, Presiding Officer, Assistant Presiding Officer, Poll Clerk, or Doorkeeper, under the provisions of the Electoral Act.
- (b) While so acting, Officers residing in that portion of the South-West Land Division described in Public Service Regulation No. 64 as "Division No. 1" will be allowed the scale of fees prescribed by paragraph (d) of this regulation.
- (c) Officers residing in the remaining portions of the State described in the said Public Service Regulation as "Divisions 2 and 3," will be allowed the fees so prescribed, with an addition of 20 per cent.

(d) The fees payable to Returning Officers, Deputy and Assistant Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, and Doorkeepers at elections are as follows:—

- (e) In districts where more than ten Polling Places have been gazetted for a Council or Assembly election the Minister may grant an additional fee to the Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer, as the case may be; such additional fee shall be at the rate of 10s. per Polling Place gazetted over and above ten in number.
- (f) Public servants are hereby authorised to receive and retain the fees provided by these Regulations.
- (g) Subject to paragraph (i) of this regulation, the fees fixed for Returning Officers and Deputy and Assistant Returning Officers are to cover all services required by the Act, or provided by the Regulations and Instructions, to be performed by such Officers on the day of election and includes subsistence for that day.
- (h) The fees fixed for Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, and Doorkeepers cover all services between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on the day of election.
- (i) Returning Officers and Deputy Returning Officers while engaged on the scrutiny and count of votes shall be paid for such services at the rate of 5s. per hour, and Presiding Officers and Assistant Presiding Officers required to assist at the scrutiny and count shall be paid for such services at the rate of 3s. 6d. per hour, and Poll Clerks and Doorkeepers at the rate of 2s. 6d. per hour.
- (j) For "authorised service" † rendered prior or subsequent to the day of the election the following rate of pay may be allowed, viz.:—

- t"Authorised service" means service for which an application has been made through the Chief Electoral Officer to the Minister, and by him approved, and after such authority has been duly conveyed by the Chief Electoral Officer in writing or by telegraph to the officer applying.
- (k) If an Officer holds simultaneously more than one position under the Electoral Act for which service fees are provided, he shall be entitled to claim pay only for that position for which the highest fee is fixed, where such services can be simultaneously performed. In all other cases he shall be paid the rate fixed for the particular service performed.
- (1) No travelling allowance shall be paid on the day of election, but actual fare will be allowed.
- (m) Officers under the Public Service Act acting as Returning Officers, Deputy or Assistant Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, or Doorkeepers will be granted leave of absence without pay on days of Elections, unless approval is given for such leave to be deducted from the next annual leave.

Travelling Expenses.

- 12. Returning Officers, Deputy and Assistant Returning Officers, Electoral Registrars, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, and Doorkeepers travelling on electoral duty shall be entitled to the following scale of travelling allowances, viz.:—
 - (a) Officers coming under the operation of the Public Service Act shall be entitled to the travelling allowance to which their salary, as public servants, entitles them.
 - (b) Officers not coming under the operation of the Public Service Act shall be entitled to travelling allowances in accordance with Public Service Regulations Nos. 64, 65, 66 and 67, as follows:—

Returning Officers, Deputy and Assistant Returning Officers, the same allowance as public servants classified at a minimum of £240 and under £480 per annum, and the same meal allowance as public servants receiving £312 per annum.

Electoral Registrars, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks and Doorkeepers, the same allowance as public servants classified under £240 per annum, and the same meal allowance as public servants receiving under £312 per annum. (See Schedule II.).

Public Service Regulation 65.

- (a) For journeys, except those mentioned hereunder, necessitating the purchase of one meal, one-fourth of the above allowance will be paid; two meals, one-half; three meals, three-quarters; three meals and a bed, one day's allowance. One-fourth deduction will be made from the above allowances for each item of expense mentioned in the foregoing regulation not necessarily incurred in any day.
- (b) The times for meals, for the purpose of these Regulations, shall be considered to be: breakfast, 8 a.m.; lunch, 1 p.m.; dinner, 6 p.m.
- (c) The period for which travelling allowance may be claimed shall be computed from the time of departure from the officer's headquarters—not his place of residence.
- (d) If no sleeping berth be taken, then the allowance for bed will be granted. The granting of a sleeping berth will be at the discretion of the Head of Sub-department.

Public Service Regulation 66.

Officers stationed in the Metropolitan Area, when within the boundaries of that area, on journeys necessitating the purchase of one or more meals, shall be paid on the following scale: Officers receiving £312 per annum and over, 2s. 6d. per meal; Officers receiving under £312 per annum, 1s. 6d. per meal.

MINING DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1902.

Regulations for Mining Boards.

Department of Mines, Perth, 23rd February, 1927.

1633/26.

HIS Excellency the Governor, in accordance with the provisions of Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to make the following Regulations relating to the Central Mining Board and the District Mining Boards constituted under the provisions of "The Mining Development Act Amendment Act, 1924."

M. F. TROY, Minister for Mines.

CENTRAL MINING BOARD.

- 1. The Central Mining Board of five members shall be appointed by the Minister at his discretion, and shall consist of three officers of the Mines Department and two persons who are not otherwise in the Public Service of the State.
 - 2. The officers of the Mines Department shall be, ex officio-
 - (i.) The Under Secretary for Mines,
 - (ii.) The State Mining Engineer,
 - (iii.) The Government Geologist;

but from time to time the Minister may authorise any officer or officers of the Mines Department to act as deputy or deputies for any of these members of the Board, and such deputies while so acting shall have all the powers and duties of the officers represented by them so far as the proceedings of the Board are concerned.

- 3. The two unofficial members of the Board will be persons whom the Minister may select as suitable representatives of the principal interests concerned with prospecting and mining development operations, and he may from time to time appoint deputies to act when such members are not available, and such deputies shall have all the powers and duties of the members for whom they are acting.
- 4. The Chairman of the Central Mining Board shall be the Under Secretary for Mines or a Departmental officer duly authorised by the Minister to act in his stead. The Chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote in the event of equality of voting.
- 5. The Minister may appoint a suitable officer of his Department to be Secretary to the Central Mining Board, and such Secretary shall have charge of the clerical work and records of the Board, but shall not take any part in its deliberations and actions.
- 6. The proceedings of the Board shall be conducted in accordance with customary practice of Board meetings, as may be directed by the Chairman. If the Chairman's ruling be challenged by more than one member of the Board, it shall be referred to the Minister, whose decision shall be final.
- 7. The Board shall meet in Perth as often as may be required and directed by the Minister, who may also instruct it to visit any mine or mining centre for the purpose of carrying out its duties.
- 8. The Central Mining Board's duty shall be to make such inquiries, reports, and investigations as it may deem necessary to enable it to advise the Minister, and make recommendations to him on any matter in connection with the development of mining which may be referred to it by him, either directly or through his Departmental officers.
 - 9. A quorum of the Board shall consist of not less than three members.

DISTRICT MINING BOARDS.

- 10. District Mining Boards, each consisting of three members, will be appointed by the Minister at his discretion at—
 - (i.) Kalgoorlie, to deal with cases arising in the Bulong, East Coolgardie, Kurnalpi, Kanowna, and Yerilla Districts;
 - (ii.) Coolgardie, to deal with cases arising in the Coolgardie and Kunanalling Districts and the Yilgarn and Dundas Goldfields ;

- (iii.) Leonora, to deal with cases arising in the Mt. Margaret, Mt. Malcolm, Niagara, Menzies, Ularring, Mt. Morgans, and Lawlers Districts, and the Broad Arrow Goldfield;
- (iv.) Mt. Magnet, to deal with cases arising in the Yalgoo Goldfield and Mt. Magnet, Black Range, Day Dawn, and Cue Districts;
- (v.) Meekatharra, to deal with cases arising in the Meekatharra and Wiluna Districts and Peak Hill Goldfield;

and shall consist in each case of three persons who are not otherwise in the Public Service of the State.

- 11. One of the members of each Board shall be appointed by the Minister to be Chairman of such Board.
- 12. The Minister may appoint any suitable officer of the Mines Department to be Secretary to each Board, and such officers shall be responsible for keeping proper records of the proceedings of the Boards and for their clerical work, but the Secretaries shall not take any further part in the proceedings of the Boards.
- 13. The three members of the Mining Board shall be persons chosen by the Minister on account of their knowledge of the matters likely to come before the Board, and from time to time he may appoint deputies to act where and while the regular members are not available.
- 14. The proceedings of the District Mining Boards shall be conducted as in the case of the Central Mining Board, as laid down in the foregoing Regulation 6.
- 15. The places and times of meeting of the District Mining Boards shall be fixed by the Chairman of each as he may find most convenient.
- 16. The District Mining Boards shall advise the Minister through the Central Mining Board in regard to any matters relating to the development of mining in their districts or which may be referred to them by the Minister or the Central Mining Board.
- 17. A quorum of a District Mining Board shall consist of not less than two members.

GENERAL.

- 18. Parts of the State not mentioned in the districts specified in Regulation 10 aforesaid for which District Mining Boards are appointed shall be under the Central Mining Board directly.
- 19. The Chairman may invite any officer of the Mines Department to attend any meeting of the Central or any District Mining Board and take part in discussion of cases under consideration, but such officer shall not have any vote at such meetings.
- 20. The Minister, by notice in writing to such member, may cancel the appointment of any member or members of any Board, and at his discretion may appoint other members from time to time.
- 21. Any travelling expenses necessarily incurred by members to enable them to attend meetings of any Board, whether in Perth or elsewhere, shall be paid to them in accordance with the scales of payment in the Regulations under "The Public Service Act, 1904," applying to the travelling expenses of superior officers of the Public Service.
- 22. A fee of one guinea will be paid to each member of each Mining Board, whether Central or District, who is not in the Public Service, for each meeting at which he attends the full sitting, but fees shall not be payable for partial attendance at any meeting unless such partial attendance shall have been permitted by the Chairman.

By-laws of the Upper Chapman Road Board.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," "The WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and other Statutes, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Upper Chapman Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Acts and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

PART I.

Interpretations.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively, that is

to say:—
"The Act"—"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter

come into force.

"Board"—The Upper Chapman Road Board.
"Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.
"District"—The district under the jurisdiction of

the Upper Chapman Road Board.

"Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

All other interpretations to be prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or regulations there-

Duties of Secretary.

- 2. The duties of the secretary shall be-
- (a) To attend all Board meetings.
- (b) To attend all Committee meetings.
- (e) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of Committees.
- (d) To conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instructions, as directed by the minutes, and earry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes.
- (e) To answer all questions on the Board's business.(f) To see that the accounts are audited monthly, and the balance sheets prepared and published in the Government Gazette yearly, and any other duties specified under "The Road Districts Act, 1919."

(g) To prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year.

(h) To supervise the preparation of the rate-books and the Board's electoral lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal, to make the necessary arrangements for the elections, to issue instructions to the supervisor, in accordance with the Board's resolutions.

(i) To summon the members to Board and Committee

meetings.

(j) To keep all books up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board.

(k) To check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the Collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers

and payable to the credit of the Board.
(1) To report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached

thereto.

(m) To pay into the bank, after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board when such moneys shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of £5 or over, with the exception of moneys granted by the Government, which are paid into the Treasury.

(n) To see that all moneys received, with the exception of Treasury credits, are lodged to the credit of the Board in the bank not less frequently than every second day, and more frequently if the total amount held exceeds £50.

(o) To see that no payment to the credit, of the Board shall be made by any officer except through the Secretary, or such other officer as may be acting temporarily in that capacity.

(p) To readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters officialize the finances and

to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified.

(q) To see that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board.

to such matters to the Board.

(r) To report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.

(s) To exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board.

(t) To see that no receipt is on any other than the

(t) To see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Acts and Regulations under which authority is given for the issue of

such receipts.

(u) To be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms, and that all receipts issued are in proper sequence.

Duties of Supervisor.

3. The duties of Supervisor shall be:-

(a) The Supervisor shall have the control of works, plant, and all property of the Board, and shall issue instructions to the Foreman, and shall see that same are faithfully carried out. Should the Foreman be guilty of insubordination or dis-obedience, or be found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him, the Supervisor shall report the matter to the Chairman, who shall inquire into the matter and, if necessary, shall suspend the Foreman and report the matter to the next meeting of the Board.

(b) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads and culverts under the control of the Board; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.

(c) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly car-

ried out.

(d) To see that no labourers are engaged but those that are able-bodied.
(e) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and

bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.

(f) To see that all servants under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
 (g) To attend all Board and Committee meetings if

required.

(h) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least once each six months, or as required by the Board.

(i) To supply monthly, or as required, to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress with remarks thereon.

Duties of Collector.

4. (a) The Collector shall collect moneys that may be due to the Board, issuing receipts on the Board's printed forms for payment and entering particulars of all payments in the book provided by the Board for that purpose.

(b) The Collector shall make his financial report

and payments to the Secretary every three days.

Appointment of Officers.

5. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

6. The election of all officers shall be conducted by a show of hands unless a ballot be demanded.

7. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the appointment, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least a quorum is present.

8. All complaints against servants of the Board must 8. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable shall be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

9. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meetings adjourned.

10. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—
"'Ordinary' and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these Bylaws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 130 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified thereon for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called for: Provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 143 of the Act, and the Standing Orders shall, so far as the Act

and the Standing Orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provisions of the Act shall be first complied with.

11. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board once in each month, on the day and at the hour appointed from time to time by resolution of the Board.

12. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless a quorum is

13. At any meeting of the Board it shall rest with the majority of the members of the Board present to exclude the public from such meeting when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so.

At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, or within 30 minutes after time for which the meeting is called), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute

15. The first business of all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirma-

Voting.

16. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of have one vote, and such Charman shall, in case or equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall, be decided by show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meetings.

17. The Minute Book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

18. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary also special meetings (if any).

(b) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.

(c) Questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board.

(d) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cogsubject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board, by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall, when introduced, take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein.

(e) Reports of sub-committees and officers.

(f) Deputations and presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereof.

The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Orders of Debate-Speakers must not digress.

22. A member, when speaking, shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Correspondence.

All correspondence with the Board shall be addressed to the Secretary and submitted to the Board No letter addressed to the Board shall be presented or read by a member.

Consideration of Reports.

24. (a) If, in a report of a committee, distinct recommendations are made, the decision of the Board may

be taken separately on each recommendation.
(b) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for

further consideration.

(c) The recommendations of any committee, when adopted by the Board, shall be resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

25. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member when speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member shall preserve strict silence, so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the Chairman takes his seat.

Notice of Motion-Absence of Mover.

26. In the absence of a member who has piaced a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deforred until next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

27. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be Seconded.

28. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be withdrawn without consent.

29. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Amendment may be moved.

30. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in writing.

- 31. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the Chairman so directs.
- 32. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
- 33. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

Further Amendment may be moved on amended Question.

34. If an amendment has been carried the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How subsequent Amendments may be moved.

35. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved and so on until there are no further amendments and the question is decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative: Provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

36. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment, when entitled to priority.

37. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Question to be given.

38. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply, and, if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

Questions to be put without argument.

39. Every question shall be put categorically and without argument.

Replies and Objections.

40. No discussion shall ensue upon any reply or refusal to reply to any questions except by permission of the Board.

Mode of addressing Board.

41. Members shall, on all occasions when at a meeting, address the Chairman and speak to each other by their official designation, as Chairman or Secretary, etc., as the case may be, and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from doing so by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in order.

42. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as hereinafter provided for in pursuance of By-law.

Limitation as to number of speeches.

43. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion, and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding further observations than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

Determination of questions.

- 44. (a) All questions shal, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus: Upon a question being put the Chairman shall call for a show of hands for and against the question, and shall declare whether the question has been affirmed by the majority of members present or otherwise. The decision of the Chairman shall be final, unless such decision be immediately challenged and any member rise and demand a division.
- (b) Where any member dissents he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

45. Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by a show of hands, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the Secretary.

Chairman may repeat question.

46. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare same.

Acts of disorder,

or any committee commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee shall have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or committee into contempt shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Ruling of Chairman.

- 48. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the ease, without further argument or comment, and his decisions shall be final in that particular case.
- (b) If the ruling of the Chairman be disagreed with, then the usual Parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

Members called to order more than once.

49. Any member who, having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of this By-law, or for any breach of decorum, shall, upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room—Penalty for continued breach of order, etc.

50. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board room, on being requested so to do by the Chairman, the Chairman may order his retirement until the termination of the sitting, and should such member disobey such order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound.

Disorder.

51. If disorder arise at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes and quit the chair. The Board, on resuming shall, on question put from the chair, decide without debate whether the business be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

52. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

- 53. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the finance committee meeting and the ordinary general meeting, and after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of money paid to the credit of the Board at the Treasury, shall be paid to the credit of the Board's account at such bank. All cheques and orders drawn against the Board's bank or Treasury account must be signed by the Chairman and any one member of the Board, and in all cases countersigned by the Secretary of the Board.
- 54. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or responsible officer directed by the Board to receive same.

The Regulations numbered 21 to 41 inclusive made by His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council under Section 197 of the Act on the 2nd August, 1922, are deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws.

Urgent Work.

- 55. The Chairman, or, in the absence of the Chairman, any three members, may in the case of urgent necessity authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding ten pounds on statutory works or undertakings: provided that in such case they shall report the matter at the next ordinary or special meeting of the Board.
- 56. Any member may in a case of very urgent necessity authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding two pounds on statutory works or undertakines within the Ward he represents: provided that he must report the matter at the next ordinary or special meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

57. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

58. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board,

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

59. Any person guilty of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds:—

(a) Damaging or destroying any building, dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, gate, or other property under the control of the Board.
 (b) Placing any placard or other document, writing,

- (b) Placing any placard or other document, writing, or printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public road, or any wall, fence, gate, or lamppost without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (e) Blasting any rock, stone, or other timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (d) Placing, stacking, or storing within the limits of any townsite, in the open air, any cases, paper, shavings, crates packed with straw or dangerous or inflammable substances so as to be or likely to become a source of danger through fire.

Preservation of trees.

60. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10, and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

Prescribing removal of verandahs.

61. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or over the same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah or balcony or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Encroachment, etc.—Removal of.

62. On the order of the Board the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which shall not exceed £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

Lighting.

e3. Any unauthorised person who shall light, nut out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any land belonging to the Board, or shall damage or destroy such lamp, shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

Water supply.

- 64. Any person who shall injure or destroy any well, here, pine, tank, or place of storage for water, or any whelinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and also shall pay to the Board the sum of such damages.
- 65. Any person who shall waste, or allow to escape, foul, pollute, or taint any water contained in a bore, rine, tank, or lace of storage, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty n t exceeding £20.

- 66. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, tank reservoir, or other water within the district.
- 67. Any person or persons leaving open the lid of any well, or any gate of an enclosure surrounding any dam or other water supply under the control of the Board, shall be guilty of an offence against these Bylaws and notwithstanding any remedy for damages so caused; shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- Any person who shall remove any water from any 68. Any person who shall remove any water from any well, bore, tank, or other place of storage under the control of the Board, except in the direct watering of stock thereat, or for bona fide camping use, or except with the written consent of the Board and payment thereon of such reasonable fee as may be demanded, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 ceeding £5.

Sand and timber.

69. Any person who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands under the control of the Board without a liceuse shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

Barbed wire.

70. Barbed wire shall not be allowed on the outer or road side, or on top of any fence along any road within any townsite. Any person offending against this Bylaw shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Fencing.

71. The owner of any land abutting on any road in any townsite shall fence all such boundaries so abutting with such description of fence as may be directed by the Board, and shall maintain every such boundary fence or ested or to be creeted, in good order. In the event of such fence not being erected or repaired after due notice has been given so to do, the Board may fence or repair such fences and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or owners of the land.

Bathing.

72. No person shall bathe in any river or open public water within the limits or abutting on the boundary of the Road District within the jurisdiction of the Board without suitable bathing cost one or clothing. Every person offending against this By-law shall, for every offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Depasturing of cattle.

- 73. Any person who shall turn loose, or suffer any kind of animal belonging to him or under his control to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in or upon any road, recreation ground, or reserve of the district, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 74. The owner of any animal suffering from an infections or contagious disease shall not permit such animal to be ridden or allowed to stray on any road, unfenced land, or reserve within the district. Any animal so suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed without notice and at the owner's expense.
- 75. The owner or driver of any such animal shall be liable, if convicted, of a breach of this By-law to a penalty not exceeding £10 and not less than £2.

Straying stock.

- 76. No owner or person having the custody or control of any animal shall cause, permit, or suffer such animal to stray on any road, public reserve, or other public place, or on any unfenced land abutting thereon within the boundary of the district.
- 77. (a) Any contravention of By-law 76 shall be an offence punishable under these By-laws, if the animal is a bull, boar, or stallion, by a fine not exceeding £20 and not less than £2.
- (b) In any other case, by a fine not exceeding £10 and not less than 10s.
- 78. Provided that this By-law shall not apply in the case of stock whilst in the charge of the Town Ranger duly appointed by the Board.

Registered dairy cows.

79. Registered dairy cows may be placed in charge of the Town Ranger, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. daily, on payment to such Ranger of such herding fee as is from time to time prescribed by resolution of the Board.

Copulation of stock.

80. Any person who, as owner or otherwise, while in charge of an entire horse, bull, or ass shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass cotry to cover any mare or cow within any township with in the district, or shall cause, permit, allow, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or in any other place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be tried or covered except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely and sufficiently screened from public view shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £10.

Goats.

81. (a) No person shall keep any goat within the boundaries of the townsite of the Upper Chapman Road District unless such goat shall have been registered and the registration fee of sixpence paid to the Secretary of the Board.

(b) Every registration shall be renewed in the month

of July in each year.

(c) The Board may refuse to register any goat if in the opinion of the Board suitable accommodation has

not been provided for keeping such goat.

(d) The penalty for breach of any of the preceding clauses shall be a sum not exceeding £5 for each breach, in addition to such sums as the justices may direct as compensation for damages done by such goats.

Crossing places.

82. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any public way requiring access thereto with horse or vehicle from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to countried a grossing of such dimensions and materials. to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and thereafter keep and maintain the same in good repair. Any person not complying with this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

Public pound, etc.

83. In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," the Upper Chapman Road Board has established a Public Pound at Nabawah, at the South-West corner of Location 1364 (being the Stock Saleyards of Messrs. Elder Smith & (co.), and has appointed Mr. Jas. Ascione, of Nanson, Poundkeeper.

84. Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound, fence, gate, lock, shed, trough, or other premises, the property of the Board, shall be liable to a

penalty not exceeding £5.

85. Any person who shall obliterate, deface, or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by "The Cattle, Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

86. Any person who shall release or attempt to re-86. Any person who shall release or attempt to release any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded, whether such cattle be in the pound or on the way to or from the pound, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

87. The following Poundage Fees, Sustenance Charges, and Trespass Scales are made, and shall be charged and collected by the Poundkeeper:—

Heavy Traffic.

The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace or speed at which such engine, vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Damaging Roads.

- 95. No person shall either wilfully or negligently damage or destroy by means of horse team or any other means any road under construction or repair; any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. Any person who.
 - (a) cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, timber, earth, stone, or other material from a road or reserve; or

 - (b) erects, without the consent of the Board, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
 (c) draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
 - (d) draws upon any road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto or any portion of other attachment trails or drags

upon a road, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

- 96. Any person taking any plough, cultivator, or other implement over or along any road and thereby damaging or marking such road in such a manner which in the opinion of the Board may indirectly cause ultimate damage to the road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 97. Any person who draws upon any road any vehicle the wheel or wheels of which are locked, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheels some sufficient protection to prevent damage to such road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

To protect Bridges from Fire.

98. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board), or who shall place any rushes or other inflammable substance under, near, or against any bridge in the district, for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20. ceeding £20.

Prevention of Trees falling across Road.

99. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or reserve without taking proper precaution against such fire spreading.

100. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

101. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district for helding public spaces or appreciated any responsible. holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons or club, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, or trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds and reserves, and shall pay the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasion, and comply with the provisions of these By-laws and any regulations passed by resolution of the Board under which such ex-

clusive rights are granted.

102. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park lands or recreation grounds without the

written permission of the Board.

103. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner; and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police officer or officer of the Board.

104. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recrea-

by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on a Sunday, Christmas Day,

or Good Friday.

105. No person shall offer for sale on any reserve any provisions, refreshments, or other goods of any kind, nor earry on any games, or boxing, or other similar shows, nor use any fire-arms, except with the express sanction of the Board and payment of such fee as may be demanded.

106. The Board, or any person duly authorsed, may make charges for admission to any reserve or defined portion thereof, but such charges shall not exceed Is, for adults and sixpence (6d.) for children under fifteen years of age, with free entry for children (accompanied) under five years of age, and for horses and

vehicles or motor cars 1s.
107. Such person to whom the use of any reserve is given for pienic sports, races, or other use shall be held responsible for the immediate removal of all rubbish brought thereon on the occasion of such use, and a deposit not exceeding £5 shall be paid as a guarantee for the due removal of such rubbish. On the removal of such rubbish, to the satisfaction of the Board, the deposit shall be returned.

No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

109. No horses other than those attached to vehicles shall be allowed on any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves under the control of the Board.

110. The Board may allow to any person who pays the rates for which he is liable, within thirty days of such rates becoming due, a percentage by way of dis-count of five per centum on the amount of such rates.

Hawking.

111. No person shall be permitted to hawk fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise without first having obtained a license from the Board and payment of fees as per Schedule "A" hereto annexed:—

Schedule "A."

Fees for a Hawker's License.

For a license to hawk fish, meat, poultry, game, For a license to hawk merchandise fruit, or vegetables 5s. A hawker's license shall be issued for a term of twelve months from date of issue.

Penalties.

Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

113. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

POTTERY AND PORCELAIN WORKS EMPLOYEES (Registered 28-1-1927.)

No. 4 of 1927.

AN Agreement made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 25th day of January, 1927, between the Westralian Brickyard, Pottery, and Porcelain Works Employees' Union of Workers, Perth, and the Calyx Porcelain Company, Limited (in liquidation).

- 1. Area and Scope.—This Agreement shall apply to workers of the classes herein specified, and shall be limited in its effects to the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles of the General Post Office, in the City of Perth.
- 2. Term of Agreement.—This Agreement shall be for a term of one year from the date hereof: Provided, however, that should the company go out of business at any time during that period this Agreement shall terminate forthwith.
- 3. Wages.—The following minimum wage shall apply to the undermentioned workers, and are based on a basic wage of £4 5s. per week for males and £2 5s. 11d. for females:—

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- 4. Overtime.—Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter. Overtime shall be paid for all hours worked outside the usual hours of business. Double time shall be paid for working on any of the following holidays:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day. This clause shall not apply to oven work or other necessary continuous work.
- necessary continuous work.

 5. Holidays.—Eight paid holidays shall be granted to each employee once a year, as follows:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and the King's Birthday: Provided that, should the employment of any worker be terminated before such holidays are due, such worker shall be entitled in lieu thereof to one day's pay for each seven weeks of service: Provided also, that should any worker be dismissed for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- 6. Preference to Unionists.—Preference of employment shall be given to unionists.

7. Aged and Infirm Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage herein prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wages, to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the appellant Union, or in default of such agreement within 24 hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary stating that such wage be agreed upon, such rate of wage shall be fixed by the most convenient magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after 24 hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application.

After having made application to the secretary, and after lodging the application to the magistrate, and pending the decision thereon in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for six months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall be again fixed in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary.

The secretary may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of any such application before the magistrate.

- 8. Time and Wages Book.—The employer shall keep and enter up or cause to be entered up and kept a book containing the name of each of his employees to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wage or piece-work amounts paid to each such employee, and the time during which he has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a representative of the Union during working hours.
- 9. Present Rates.—Notwithstanding anything to the contrary no worker at present in receipt of more than the prescribed rate within mentioned shall suffer a reduction in consequence.
- 10. Posting of Agreement.—A printed copy of this Agreement shall be posted by the employer in a conspicuous position in each factory.
- 11. Higher Duties.—A worker who is required to perform work which is prescribed for at a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at such higher rate for such period as he is actually engaged upon.
- 12. Visiting Employees.—The secretary of the Union shall have the right to interview employees at their work during lunch hour on any day at the works.
- 13. Piece-work.—Piece-workers shall not be paid less than the prescribed wages for all classes of work on which they are engaged.
- 14. Termination of Employment.—One hour's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the engagement of any but a casual hand shall be determined: Provided that, at any time, an employer may dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, carelessness in the performance of his duties.
- 16. THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this nineteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tearoom, and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and the persons, firms, and companies, whose names and signatures appear in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:-

Definitions.

- 1. Tearooms may serve beef tea and bovril or such soups as are supplied from bottles or tins, meat pies pasties such as are supplied by wholesale pastrycooks, ham and eggs, eggs cooked in any form, and cold meats of any description. (Cold roast meats must not be cooked on the premises.)
- 2. If any hot dishes other than those mentioned in Clause 1 hereof are served it will constitute the establishment a restaurant.

Hours.

- 3. (a) As to Hotels, Coffee Palaces, Boardinghouses and similar residential establishments: Forty cight hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in five and a half days.
- (b) As to Tearooms and Restaurants: hours shall constitute a week's work for all females, and forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work for all males, to be worked in five and a half days, but to compensate for the extra hours worked by males the minimum rates prevailing prior to this agreement have been increased by one-twelfth (i.e., the equivalent of the proportionate value of four hours' work).
- 4. Any employee except casual workers, cellar hands and those hereinafter referred to in paragraph 41 hereof, who work a lesser number of hours per week, shall be paid the full week's wage. If the employee has permission to leave the premises for any time not less than one hour, but prefers to remain thereon, such time shall not be included in the working time.

$Spread\ of\ Shifts.$

- 5. Daily spread of shifts shall mean the time which elapses from the time when the worker first starts work and the time when he or she finishes for the day. Weekly spread of shifts shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week. The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed sixty-six hours in restaurants, sixty hours in tearooms, and seventy-two hours in hotels, coffee palaces, and boarding
- 6. The longest spread of shifts in any one day shall
- not be more than twelve (12) hours.
 7. In addition to one break for meal hours there shall not be more than one break in any one shift, such break to be not less than two hours, with the exception of one day in the week-either Friday or Saturdaywhen a ten hour working day is permissible, with two breaks of at least one hour each for meals. The excep-tion shall not apply to hotels, coffee palaces, or boarding houses.
- 8. Night shift shall mean where the employee finishes for the day after 8 p.m. Not more than three late nights shall be worked in any one week, or as alternative, day and night shifts alternate weeks. This shall not apply to male workers engaged especially for night work.
- 9. Where the spread of hours, other than in hotels, coffee palaces, and similar residential establishments at present in operation is less than herein provided, such shifts shall not be interfered with unless it can be shown that the general alteration now brought into force have made the continuance of such shifts diffi-

cult, in which case the employer and a duly accredited representative of the Union shall confer with a view to arriving at a mutual arrangement.

10. A day shift worker who on alternate shifts either daily or weekly, becomes a night shift worker in a two or more shift house shall have his or her shift terminated at 6.30 p.m.

Wages.

11. The following shall be the minimum rate of wages per week: -Hotel, Coffee Palaces, Boarding Houses, and similar residential establishments.

These rates are based on a Basic Wage of £4 5s. for males and £2 5s. 11d. for females.

Junior Counter Hands.—One junior may be employed at Tearcom counters as a counter hand with one or more seniors (only one junior counter hand to each establishment) at the rate of £2 11s.

In Hotels, Coffee Palaces, Boarding Houses, and similar residential establishments, Restaurants, and Tearooms male workers under twenty-one years of age may be employed as juniors in any of the occupations mentioned in this agreement except cooks, in the proportion of one to two seniors of the same class of work at the following minimum rate:-

Casuals.

13. Casual workers shall be engaged by the day and shall be paid at the rate of time and a half during the first three consecutive days of employment, and thereafter shall receive the full weekly wage.

14. Casual male workers engaged in work done in connection with racecourses, show, or sports grounds and the like shall be paid 3s. 1½d. per hour, with a minimum of eight hours pay per day, also travelling expenses to

and from employment.

- 15. For casual female workers engaged in such work the rate shall be a minimum of 15s. for the hours computed, from 10 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. with one hour off for meals; all hours in excess at 2s. 6d. per hour; and if the meal hour be not given it to be paid for at the rate of 3s. 6d. per hour; also travelling expenses to and from employment.
- 16. A casual female hand may be employed from 1 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. at a minimum rate of 12s. for the
- 17. Female casual workers engaged upon special suppers, etc., after 7.30 p.m. shall receive 3s. 6d. per hour with a minimum of two hours work, with train or tram fare added.
- The time for casual workers engaged at outside jobs shall count from the time appointed for their attendance on the job until they are discharged.
- 19. The wage payable to casual workers on outside jobs shall be handed to the worker immediately on completion of employment.

20. Any workers engaged at special dinners or suppers after 8 p.m. shall be paid at double time rates after they have worked their usual time for the day.

21. A night cook, where one cook is employed, shall receive a minimum wage of five pounds four and sixpuce (£5 4s. 6d.) in the case of males and five pounds five and sixpuce (£5 5s. 6d.) in the case of females.

22. Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this agreement was being paid a higher rate of pay than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

Overtime.

23. Work done by workers after the completion of forty-eight or (in the case of female workers in tearooms and restaurants and cellarmen in hotels) fortyfour hours in any one week or in excess of the rostered hours in any day shall be deemed overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half, and no female worker shall work for any employer for a longer period of overtime than four hours in any one pay week, except (a) during the period from the 23rd of December to the 6th day of January; (b) the week preceding and the week succeeding Easter Sunday; and (c) the week during which the Royal Agricultural Show was held, when in each of such weeks the maximum period of overtime permissible shall be ten (10) hours, the employer paying double time for all hours worked in excess of four hours in the pay week.

Holidays.

24. All workers employed shall be entitled to and shall receive a full day off duty in each week in establishments which open seven days, and a half day off in

establishments which open six days.

25. In lieu of one full day in hotels where one cook is employed two half days may be given, and in addition the wages paid by such hotel to all employees shall be increased by one-twelfth above the rates herein pro-

26. The half holiday shall commence at 2 o'clock in the afternoon and terminate at the usual starting time next day. 27. The nig

The night porter in all establishments shall be

27. The night porter in an establishments shan be allowed off duty one night per week.

28. Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, and one Union Picnic Day per year shall be holidays in all establisments, except those which cater for boarders.

All work on any of the foregoing days shall be paid for at double time rates.

On these days, except in establishments which cater for boarders, workers shall be free either to work or not as he or she desires, and the employers to open their places of business if they so desire.

29. After completion of twelve months' service an-

nual holidays shall be granted as follows:-

Three weeks on full pay shall be granted to those workers working in establishments which open seven days per week, and two weeks' holiday on full pay to those workers working in establishments which open six days per week.

In the case of tearooms an additional 7s. 6d. per

week, room allowance shall be paid during the holiday

period.

One week's holiday shall be paid to those workers working in establishments which close and pay their employees on all gazetted and public holidays, and the payment of one pound allowance in lieu of board for the aforesaid public and gazetted; provided that the workers in such last-named establishments shall be granted in lieu thereof all the holidays granted to members of the Metropolitan Shop Assistants' Union in any subsequent agreement or award, if the sum should be greater than that herein provided.

Such holiday shall be granted within two months of its becoming due, failing which the employer shall pay double time for all work done after that date.

This penalty shall not apply where it can be shown after consultation with the Union Secretary that it was impossible to find a substitute during that time: Provided also that any worker who shall have served one mouth or over and whose services shall have been terminated by either party before the annual holidays have become due under this clause shall be entitled to a proportionate allowance for the time actually served. Provided also a roster containing the names of the workers and the dates on which their holidays will be granted may be arranged between the employer and the Union. By consent of the employers employees may exchange their rostered holidays with each other.

Preference of Employment.

30. Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Union and preference of employment shall be given to members of the white races. Each employee who is not a member of the Union shall be given one week in which to join the Hotel and Restaurant Union.

Meals.

31. Meals shall be supplied to workers as follows:-In restaurants, hotels, coffee palaces, and boarding-houses, all meals as per menu in such establishments.

In tearooms, breakfast as per menu in such establishments; dinner: soup, roast joint, two vegetables, and sweets; tea: cold meat, cake, scones, and jam.

32. At least one clear hour (or as provided in Section 124 of the Factories Act, 1920) in every six hours shall be allowed off for each worker for meal time, and in tearooms, notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 7, the time may be divided by taking half an hour for morning tea before noon and another half hour before 2.30 o'clock p.m. for dinner.

Women Climbing Ladders.

No waitresses shall be permitted or compelled to climb ladders for the purpose of cleaning electric fans, fanlights, walls or windows.

Roster.

34. A roster of the working hours of all workers shall be exhibited in each establishment in such a place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker, such roster to be compiled weekly and shall denote the hours to be worked by each worker for the week ahead and shall be open for inspection by Union officials during all working hours. A copy of this agreement shall be available at all times in a place where all may peruse it.

Weekly Wage.

35. Wages shall be paid weldy. When no agreement in writing is made determining the period of notice, then a notice of not less than twenty-four hours shall be given by either party of intention to terminate the service.

Board and Lodging.

36. If board is provided the employer may deduct 17s. per week, and if lodging is provided (with the exception of tearcoms, board applies to tearcoms, but not the lodging) 7s. 6d. per week from the wages hereinbefore prescribed.

The employer requiring a worker to sleep in shall provide suitable accommodation. If the worker shall consider the accommodation unsuitable, then the Union may request a health inspector to inspect and report upon same. Employees sleeping in shall be provided with a common sitting room apart from their bedrooms and shall have access to the bathrooms.

The lodging allowance shall not apply to tearooms except in respect to the additional amount being granted during holiday period.

Uniforms.

37. Employers shall pay one shilling per week for the laundering of all stiff white euffs and collars where same are demanded to be worn, and also pay one shilling per week extra to all workers who wear white aprons or coats.

Only a plain black and white or black or white uniform will be recognised as such by the various parties to this agreement. The cost of any alteration in colour or design demanded by the employer must be provided by that employer.

The wearing of all headgear in any establishment is hereby prohibited.

Change Rooms.

38. Employers shall consider complaints made by Union representatives with regard to adequacy or otherwise of change and rest rooms, and where no agreement is arrived at the matter shall be referred to a Board of Health Inspector for decision. Employers agree to make provision for suitable change and rest rooms in all new buildings or extensions. The rooms shall be provided with mirror, wash-basin, soap, bath and towels, and furnished with a couch, chairs, etc., and be well ventilated and lighted.

${\it Under-rate\ Workers.}$

39. Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the Employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the Secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon such wages shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said Secretary who shall if he so desires be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the said Secretary and after lodging the application mentioned and pending the magistrate's decision thereon the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date theref, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said Secretary in the manner prescribed. The Secretary of the Union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

Juniors in Tearoom Kitchens.

- 40. Juniors in tearoom kitchens shall mean girls under eighteen years of age, and they shall not be in a greater proportion than those of one junior to two or part of two seniors. Juniors shall only be permitted to work while a senior is working.
- 41. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained or paragraph 4 hereof, an employer shall be at liberty to employ half-time or three-quarter time waitresses in the proportion of one half-time or one three-quarter time waitress to four full-time waitresses or part thereof and who shall be entitled to wages at the rate of time and one-eighth and allowances as specified herein.

Area

42. This agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the Post Office, Bunbury, Western Australia.

Duration of Agreement.

- 43. This agreement shall come into force from January 24th, 1927, and be operative for three years from the date hereof.
- 44. Provided always that either party shall have the liberty to apply to have the agreement reopened and reviewed after this agreement has been in currency for twelve months from the date hereof, and after such request has been made both parties shall meet at a round table conference for the purpose of reviewing the wages and conditions set forth herein, and to make such changes in the agreement as are necessary and agreed to in the course of discussion. In the event of an agreement not being arrived at between the parties no alteration shall be made in the agreement.

Record.

45. The employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his business premises, or at each one of them, if more than one, a time and wages book, wherein shall be entered the names, occupations, and in the case of juniors the age on his or her last birthday, the time he or she commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked on each day, and the wages paid to each worker each week. Such books shall be entered up from day to day and shall be initialed daily if correct by each worker. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper daily posting up of the book, which shall be open to inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union, who shall be permitted to visit the employer's premises and take extracts therefrom on a portion of the employer's premises during all working hours.

Board of Reference.

- 46. (a) For the purposes of this agreement there shall be a Board of Reference, consisting of two representatives of the employers and two representatives of the Union and a Chairman, to be mutually agreed upon by such representatives or in default of such agreement to be nominated by the Clerk of the Arbitration Court.
- (b) Either party may at any time vary its representatives and fill any vacancies.
- (c) If any dispute or question arises in the carrying out of this agreement between the Union and the Employers or any of them, it may be referred by either party concerned to the Board, and the decision of the Board, or the majority thereof shall be final and conclusive: Provided that nothing herein contained shall empower the Board to vary or amend the rates or wages or any other term or condition set out in this Agreement.
- (d) On any matter being referred to the Board as aforesaid or at the request of any two members of the Board the Chairman shall convene a meeting of the Board to be held at such place and time as he shall appoint, such meeting to be held in any case not later than fourteen days from the date of such reference or request.
- (c) The Chairman shall determine whether any question or dispute properly comes within the province and function of the Board.
- 47. Any employee engaged for two hours or more in any day in work carrying a higher prescribed rate of wages shall receive such higher rate for the time so engaged.
- 48. All parties to this Industrial Agreement agree to have same made a Common Rule.

PART II.

Barmen and Barmaids' Section.

Definition .- Barmen and Barmaids shall mean a person who supplies beverages or drinks of any sort from

The following wages shall be paid to Barmaids and Barmen living in: -£5.

The workers in this section will work a straight shift of eight hours per day on six days per week, with not more than three late nights per week.

All other conditions of Part 1 of this Agreement, except the spread of shifts, will apply to workers in this section.

LICENSING ACT, 1911 (CONSOLIDATED).

To His Excellency the Governor in Council,-

THE humble petition of the undersigned electors resident in Claremont-Cottesloe Licensing District, in the State of Western Australia, in an area comprised in a half-mile radius from the site of the premises known as the Brighton Hotel, showeth as follows:-

- (1) That on or about the 14th day of December, 1921, the license of the Brighton Hotel was reduced. Since that time the premises have been renovated throughout and large addi-tions have been made to the building; comprising 8 new bedrooms, 5 new bathrooms, 4 new closets, over 400 feet 9ft. and 13ft. width of balcony, large new garage, capable of accommodating 25 motor cars, and a new hall at the rear has been erected, 90ft. x 30ft. Two acres more of land have been added to
- Two acres more of land have been added to the premises for the purpose of laying out tennis courts and a cricket pitch, etc.;

 (2) That the premises known as the "Brighton" are well situated for the convenience of the population adjacent thereto, as also for the travelling and visiting public, and are admirably suitable for the purpose of a Publican's General License;

 (3) That the site of the aforesaid premises is in the centre of the largest and most renowned seaside and riverside resort in Western Australia;

tralia;

(4) That the population of the district at the time the license aforesaid was reduced was 18,432 (estimated), and has now increased to 25,000 (estimated), and has now increased to 20,000 (estimated), and this population is greatly enlarged during the summer months by visitors from the Country Districts, Goldfields, and the North-West, Goldfields, and the premises have extensive grounds and gardens covering an area of at least from

gardens, covering an area of at least five acres, and are most beautifully situated on absolutely the best position on the Perth-Fremantle Road;

(6) That the premises are conveniently situated, and give easy access to either the seaside or the river, and are near to the Cottesloc Municipal Tennis Courts and Golf Grounds. In respect to the riverside conveniences the owner of the Brighton Hotel aforesaid has purchased the freehold of half an aere of land, with a frontage to the Swan River, for picnic grounds in connection with the hotel;

(7) That there has been a considerable increase of population in the area comprised within the half-mile radius from the site of the aforesaid premises, and that such increase is of a permanent character;

(8) That there are insufficient licensed premises to meet public requirements within the said

area:
