AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 23rd day of February, 1927, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1899," whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments, which by Order in Council are vested in heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Public Works Department should be vested in Mr. J. R. Verity Williams: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the said J. R. Verity Williams, and any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer, the appointment of foremen and all persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages.

The Land Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 3770/12.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 15004 (at Wyalkatchem)

should vest in and be held by the Wyalkatchem Road Board in trust for Recreation purposes: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Wyalkatchem Road Board in trust for the purpose aforesaid with power to the said Wyalkatchem Road Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

The Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. F. 1088/25 and L. & S. 4199/25.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council declare any Crown lands as Timber Reserves within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act, or may revoke a whole or part of any such reservation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the area and boundaries of Forestry Reserve 65/25 as gazetted November 13th, 1925, and in lieu thereof do declare the area and boundaries of such reserve to be as described in schedule hereunder:—

Timber Reserve 65/25.

Bounded by lines starting from Post A 16 on the road from Augusta and Darradup to Nannup and extending 130deg. 3min., 2,000 links; 220deg. 3min., 9,000 links; 310deg. 3min., 4,000 links; 40deg. 3min., 9,000 links; and 130deg. 3min., 2,000 links to the starting point. (Area, 350 acres 3 roods 27 perches, ex. road.) (Plan 439A/40.)
