WHEREAS by "The Electoral Act, 1907," it is provided that new Rolls for any Province or District and new Rolls generally shall be prepared under the supervision of and issued by the Chief Electoral Officer whenever directed by Proclamation, and shall come into operation at a date to be stated in the same or any subsequent Proclamation: And whereas the Chief Electoral Officer was directed by Proclamation dated the Sixteenth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, to prepare under his supervision and issue new Rolls for each District: And whereas the new Rolls were duly prepared and issued: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby fix Friday, the eleventh day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twentyseven, as the date upon which the new Rolls for each District will come into operation.

DRIED FRUITS ACT, 1926.

Regulations.

1. All dried fruits produced for sale shall be stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, and packed in a packing shed duly registered under the provisions of "The Dried Fruits Act, 1926."

Any grower or other person who produces dried fruit for sale, and stems, processes, grades, sorts, or packs such dried fruit elsewhere than in a duly registered packing shed, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

- 2. Regulation 1 shall not apply to undipped dried grapes known as muscatel table raisins, and any person who produces or deals in such undipped dried grapes shall in respect of such grapes be exempt from furnishing the return required by Section 18 of the said Act.

 3. Whenever the Board imposes a levy on growers under Section 15 of the Act, a notice that such levy has been imposed and the amount thereof shall be published in the Government Gazette.
- 4. The amount of levy shall be paid by the grower to the Secretary of the Dried Fruits Board, or to any representative of the Board authorised in writing to receive the same, and give a valid receipt therefor.
- 5. The amount of levy shall become due and payable-
 - (a) in respect of dried fruit delivered at a registered packing shed to be stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of sale, on the day on which such fruit is packed, or on the 1st day of June in the year in respect of which the levy is made,
 - whichever is the earlier; and
 (b) in respect of dried fruit not so delivered on
 the day on which such fruit leaves the premises of the grower for any purpose other than for delivery at a registered packing shed, or on the 1st day of June in the year in respect of which the levy is made, whichever is the earlier.
- 6. The amount of levy shall be calculated as follows:
 - (a) in respect of dried fruit which has been de-livered at a registered packing saied to be stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of saw, and which has been packed, upon the packed weight of

 (b) in respect of dried fruit which has been so delivered but not packed, upa the estimated packed weight of such fruit; and
 (c) in respect of all other dried fruit, upon the actual weight of such fruit.
- 7. For the purpose of calculating the amount of levy as provided in Regulation 6 hereof, the weight may be ascertained and determined by an inspector appointed under the provisions of the said Act.
- 8. No owner, manager, or occupier of a registered packing shed shall permit any dried fruit to leave such packing shed unless and until a notice in writing has packing shed unless and until a notice in writing has been received by such owner, occupier, or manager from the Dried Fruits Board, or any representative of the Board referred to in Regulation 4 hereof, that (1) the amount of levy upon such fruit has been paid; and (2) that the Board is satisfied that any determination for the time being in force made by the Board pursuant to Section 17 of the said Act has been or will be observed by the grower of such fruit served by the grower of such fruit.
- 9. Any person who commits a breach of Regulation 8 hereof shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.
- 10.
