## NAVIGATION ACI, 1904-1926.

Regohations.
Quthification required of Applicanis for Conificutes of Competeney as Wasters of Mabour and River Slacomers.

1. In accordance with Section 50 of "The Navigation Act, 190t," every harbour and river steamer plying within the furisdiction shatl be provided with a Master duly eertificated muter the Act.

It thy person whosoever-
(a) plies on any harbour and river stemer without being duly certifeated, whether such person was cogaged to serve in such capacity or is acting therein without engagement; or
(1) employs any person as such Master without ascertaining that such person is duly certificated,
he is lable for each such offence to a penalty not execeling fifty pomids.

A berson slall not be deemed to be duly certificated within the meaning of the said section moless he is the holder for the time being of a valid cortificate of competeney or of service mader the Aet of a grade appropriate to his station in the steamship or of a higher grade.

## Timo and place of Examination.

2. Examinations for certificates of competency as Masters of harbour and river stemmers are held on any day of the week, excepting Saturdays, Sundays, and publie holidays, at such time as may be appointod by the examiner.

## Testimonials required.

3. Service for at least three years must be proved by written testimonials from an employer or manager.

Testimonals as to character (inelading sobriety), experience, and alility for at least the last twelve months preceding the date of application to be examined will also bo required.
Withont producing these testimonials no candidate will be examined.

## Qualification.

4. Quahifcations required-

Candidates must be not less than 21 years of age and must have hat at lenst three years' expericnee-
(a) in a harbour and river steamer in the capacity of acek hand;
(b) in a certificated motor-boat in the capacity of coxswain; or
(e) at sea as deck boy, ordinary, or able seman. Candidates will be required to read and write a legible hand, and to pass an examination in-
(1) the rule of the road;
(2) the management of liarbour and river steamers;
(3) local knowledge of the port applied for;
(4) the compass;
(5) sight tests as preseribed for the Mereantile Marine.
7. The fee for a Harbour and River Master's examimation shall be fl 10 s .

## Quatificalion for a Marine Motor Engine-driver's Certificalo.

6. The following regulations (i) to (12) shall apply only to vessels propelled by gas, of, fluid electricity, or other mechanical power than steam, and shall not apply to vessels used North of twenty seventh parallel of South Latitude and not elsewhere.
7. Certifieates of Competeney will be granted to those persons who pass the prescribed examination and otherwise comply with the requisite conditions.
8. The application for examination must be made in mriting, signed by the candidate, addressed to the Chief Marbour Master at Fremantle, and the candidate's testimonials and the fee for examination must be sent thererpith.
9. Every applicant must be not less than 21 years of age. Should any doubt exist as to the age of the applicant, he will be required to produce a certificate of birth or baptism.
10. Every applicant must produce satisfactory testimonials as to his sobriety" and general good conduct, and also furnish proof (to the satisfaction of the Examiner) of his services.
11. Every applicant for a Certificate of Competency as a Marine Motor Engine-driver must have had practical experience afloat or ashore in the management and care of oil engines, and must show that he possesses a fair knowledge of marine oil engines, their fittings, and the use of each, and must be able to explain to the satisfaction of the Examiner how a temporary repair should be executed in the event of a derangement of any part of the machinery.
12. The fee for such examination shall be $£ 1$.

Survey of Coal Hull,s, Cargo Lighters, Floating Cranes, or other similar Vessels.
13. For the following regulations (14) to (26) "'lighter" means any coal hulk, cargo lighter, floating crane, or other similar vessel of which the boiler is not used to supply steam for propulsion.
14. The owner of every "lighter" shall cause it to be surveyed once at least every twelve months, and shall pay the prescribed fee.
15. To each boiler a "registered number"' shall be assigned by the Chief Harbour Master, and the ownen shall cause such number to be plainly stamped on some conspicuous part of such boiler in figures not less than three-eighths of an inch in height.
16. Any owner of a boiler which is sold or removed from any "lighter", after survey shall, within thirty days after the removal thereof, give particulars of the removal and destination thereof in writing to the Chief Harbour Master.
17. No owner of a "lighter," the boiler of which has not been surveyed, or for which the certificate las expired, shall work with or use, or permit any person to work or use such boiler.
18. Every boiler of every "lighter" shall be furnished wtih the following fittings and mountings-

One steam gange capable of registering in pounds per square inch up to one and a-half times the maximum working pressure;
One gun-metal feed cheek valve, flange-jointed;
One stop-valve, flange-jointed, fitted with gunmetal valve and seating, to be fixed between boiler and stean pipe;
One gun-metal blow-off cock, flange-jointed;
One gauge cock, $3 / 8 \mathrm{in}$. Whitworth gas thread, for comnecting surveyor's standard gauge;
A suitable pump or injector, or both, for feeding the boilers;
Two safety valves of ample area and flange-jointed, one of which shall be encased and of locked-rp design approved by the Chief Harbour Master;
One glass water-gauge fitted with cocks complete and two try cocks.
All gange glasses to have approved protectors fltted. 19. No boiler of any 'lighter'" shall be worked or used unless fitted with two safety valves, each of sufficient area to relieve the boiler without increasing the authorised working pressure more than 10 per centum, and one of the valves shall be arranged to the approval of the surveyor so as to be beyond the control of the person in charge. Such safety valves may be on one boiler seat.
20. Any person who works or uses, or causes to be worked or used, any boiler of any " lighter'" which in any respect is not fitted as required by these regulations, and the owner of any such "lighter," shall be grilty of an offence under these regulations.
21. If, upon anyr inspection of a boiler, it appears to the surveyor that the boiler is unsafe, or that it would be dangerous to life and property if it were used in its then state, the surveyor may serve a notice in writing upon the owner or persou in charge requiring him-
(a) to wholly desist from working or using the boiler; or
(b) to desist from working or using the boiler until certain repairs or alterations stated in the notice have been effected; or
(e) to desist from working or using the boiler at a greater pressure than that stated in the notice until certain repairs or alterations stated in the notice have been effected.
22. Any person upon whom such notice has been served who fails or neglects to comply with the terms of each notice shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.
23. Any person who by any means does anything to increase, or that tends to increase the pressure in a boiler beyond the authorised working pressure, or beyoud the pressure stated in any notice served, and any person who aids or abets in increasing the pressure as aforesaid, or procures the pressure to be so increased, shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.
24. The certificate of the surveyor's inspection of the boiler shall be kept aboard the "lighter"," and be exhibited in a frame in some conspicious place, and such certificate shall remain in force for the period stated on the certificate, provided that no material alteration or addition has been made in or to the boiler wihout the approval of the surveyor, and every boiler of a lighter, the certificate of which is not so kept and exlibited, shall be deemed to be not surveyed.
25. On the occurrence of an explosion of any boiler, or any accident cansing damage or injury to any boiler', the ownei of the "lighter"' shall forthwith give notice to the Chief Harbour Master.
The Chief Harbour Master, at his discretion, may institute an inquiry into the circumstances attending such explosion or accident.

In the absence of special permission from the surveyor or other authorised officer of the Chief Harbour Master, no person shall move, alter, or in any way interfere with any boiler, its fittings or appliances, or any part of the same, or any other thing affected which has resulted from the explosion of or accident to any boiler subject to these regulations, except in so far as may be considered reasonably necessary for the prevention of further damage or injury to person or property, until the Chief Harbour Master has completed such inquiry.
26. No boiler shall at any time be in charge or under the control of any person other thau a male person of at least 21 years of age, and who must be the holder either of a third class marine engincer's certificate or a third class engine-driver's certificate, issued under the Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921, and the Regulations.

## Penalty.

27. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing regulations for which a penalty is not prescribed by the Act shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds.

Seale of Fees and Charges.
28. When any owner or other person requires a special inspection and report on any new or secondhand boiler or machinery, he shall make his request in writing, and shall pay in advance, if demanded, in addition to the prescribed fees, all travelling expenses of the surveyor for the time he is engaged on such special inspection and report.
29. The fee for the survey of a ship for a twelve months' certificate of survey shall be according to the following scale:-
Seargoing and Harbour and River Steamships, Motor* Ships, and Sailing Ships.

## Regulations,

These Regulations are divided into parts as follows:-
Part I.--Accident Relief Tund.
Pari II-Certificates to Mining Managers and Under-Managers.
Pand III.-Registration of Boys and Monthly Returns.
Pari TV.-Survey and Plans of Mines.

## Pare T.-Acoment Rebief Fund.

1. The trustee to be appointed by the mine owners shall be appointed by momorandum under the hand, or, in the case of an incorporated company, the seal, of a majority of the owners, and such memorandum shall be transmitted to the Minister. Should the mine owners fail to appoint a trustee within one month after notice in writing has been forwardel to them by the Tnspector of Mines, by post, advising them of the vacancy on the Trust, the Minister may appoint some person to act as the representative of the mine owners on the Trust, and such person so appointed shall have the same authority and power as if he had been appointed by the mine owners.
2. The trustee to be appointed by the miners shall be appointed in mamer fol-lowing:-

An Thspector of Mines, or some other person to be nominated by the Minister, shall, by seven days' notice in writing, exhibited on cach mine in the distriet, and by an advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district, at least five days before the meeting, convene a meeting of miners, who, at such meeting, by a majority of miners present, shall appoint a trustee, and the name of the person apointed shall be transmittea by the Inspector or sweh other person as aforesaid to the Minister. Should the mine-workers fatl to appoint a trustee at the mecting so convened, the Minister may appoint some person to act as the representative of the mine-workers on the Trust, and such person so appointed shall have the same authority and power as if he had been appointed by the mine-workers.
3. The persous appointed as aforesaid, with the trustee appointed by the Minister, shall constitute the trustees of the fund, and their appointment shall be notified in the Government Gazettc. Any two trustees shall constitnte a quorum, and may, subject to Regulation 8, operate on the trust account.
4. The Aceident Committee shall consist of five members, to be appointed by the miners at a meeting convence by an Tnspector for that purpose or at a meeting conrened in like mamer as provided for in Regulation 2 for the appointment of a trustee, and the names of the persons appointed shall be transmitted by the Taspector of Mines or such other person as aforesaid to the Minister, and notified in the Govermment Gazettc. Any three members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
5. Bvery trustee and every member of the Aecident Committee shall hold office for one year trom the notifcation of his appointment in the Govornmemt Gazetto, but shall be cligible for reappointment. Should amy member of the Trust, or Committee, fail to attent threc consective meetings of the Trust or Committee, as the case may be, without hasing fumished to the body of which he is a menber a satistactory reason, in writing, for his non-attendance, his seat may be declared vacant, and steps doly taken to fill such vacancy.
6. In the ease of any vacancy in the office of any trustee or nember of an Aceident Committee by death, resignation, or otherwise, another trustee or member shall be appointed in mamer aforesaid.
7. All contributions to the fund shall be pain to the trustees, and shall be paid by them to the credit of a bust aceount, to be called the Aceident Relief Fund Aceount, to be kept in the mamos of the trnstees at a bank approved by the Minister. The trustees may from time to time invest any moneys standing to the eredit of the trast account, in securities approved by the Minister.
8. All moneys withdrawn from the trust aceout slall be paid by the trustees to any person injured, or to the retatives of any person killed or injured, in incordance with the recommemation ath with the approval of the Aecident Committee.
9. In making any recommendation the Aceilent Committee shall be guided by the tollowing rules:-
(a.) Any employee who meets with an aceident in or about a mine shall immediately give notice of the maturs and cause of the accident to the workman nearest him, and to one or other of the overmen, and shall within five days, exchasive of Sundays, of ceasing work as a result of such accident send or cause to bo sent a notice, in writing, to the Secretary of the Aerident Committee giving full particulars as to the time, dito of the accident, and the circumstances attending such accident, together with the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner, or the claim shall not be entertained, and the Secretary of the Accident Committee shall forthwith notify the Inspector of Mines for the district of such accident and of the nature thereof as reported to him.
(b.) Subject to the approval of the trustees first obtained, the Accident Committee may, in the case of an aceident of so serious a nature that the employee injured has been unable to comply with the provisions of Subsection (a) hercof, investigate such aceident and recommend accordingly.
(c.) The allowance that may be paid from the funds shall be as follows:-
(1.) Where disablement results from an accident, a weekly sum of twenty-four slillings, or the rate of four shillings for every working day from the date of the accident, for a period of fifty-two weeks, should disablement so long continue. If disablement shall contimue beyond the term of fifty-two weeks, the employee shall be paid an allowance at the rate of three shillings and twopence per day, for a further period of fifty-two weeks should the disablement so long continue, and after that, during the continuance of the disablement, an allowance at the rate of two shillings and fourpence per day, for every working day. Such payment shall only be made and continued on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner that the employee is unable to work. In the event of au employee being permanently disabled he shall, on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner, be granted a fixed sum not exceeding Fifty pounds in satisfaction of all clams. A person shatl be deened to be disabled when he is wholly incapacitated from attending to his ordinary occupation. The period during which an employee has been in receipt of relief prior to the coming into operation of this regulation shall not be taken into aecount in assessing the rate of allowance payable to him.
(2.) Where death results from the accident-
(a.) If deccased was married-
(i.) A weekly sum of fifteen shillings, payable to the widow, if any, while ummarrien and of good conduct.
(ii.) A weekly sum of fire shilhings in respect of each child, if any, of the deceased motil such child attains the age of fifteen years or dies, payable to the widow, if any, during her life, or if there is no widow, or the widow dies while any such sm is payable, to the guardian or person having the care of snch child.
(b.) If the deceasod was mmarried-
(i.) A weekly sum of ten shillings, payable to the father of the deceased during his life, if, in the opinion of the Committee, the father was at the time of his som's death dependent on the deceased for support; or
(ii.) A weekly sma of three shillings payable to the mother of the deceased if a widow, during her life and while she continues a widow, if, in the opinion of the Committee, she was at the time of her sou's death dependent on the deceased for support.
(iii.) If the father and mother of the deceased are dead, or are not entitled to an allowanee, a weekly sum of five shillings in respect of each brother or sister, if any, of the deceased mutil such brother or sister attains the age of fifteen years, payable to the legal guardian of such brother or sister, if, in the opinion of the Committee, he or she was at the time of death dopentent on the deceased for support.
(iv.) A weekly smo: of five shillings for each chind of the mother of the deceased, or of the sister or sisters of the deceased, payable to the mother or legal guardian, or to the sister or brother or sisters or brothers as the case may be, motil such child attains the age of fifteen years, if, in the opinion of the Committee, such mother or such sister or brother, or sisters or brothers was or were at the time of his death dependent on the deceased for support.
(d.) If the Committee considers that any allowance payable to any person for or in respect of a child would not be or is not being properly expended or used by the said person for the benefit of the child, it may recommend the payment of such allowance to such other person as it may think fit for the sole benefit of the ehild or chidren.
10. (a) No payment to any employee shall be recommonded umless accompanied by a certificate signed by the manager or some other responsible official of the mine or by the Inspector of Nimes that the deceased, or the person disabled, was at the time of the accident enployed in or about such mine, and that the accident occurred in or about the workings of such mine; and
(b.) A cortificate signed by a legally gualified medical practitioner or the local Coroner that the disablement or death was caused primarily by the accident referred to. In the case of disablement, the mature and effects thereof shall be stated in such cortificate.
11. When any accident resulting in the disablement of an employee oceurs in any mine situate in a locality remote from settlement, where the services of a duly qualified medical practitioner are not procurable, payment at the prescribed rate may be made for any period not exceeding thirty days from the date of the aceident, on the certificate of the Inspector of Mines for the district, or in his absence, or if there be 10 Inspector, on the certificate of the mine manager.
12. The Committee may at any time require an amployee in receipt of relief to present himself for examination to a qualified medical practitioner whom it may nominate. Such employee shall mot be called upon to submit himself to further examination until after the expiration of three calendar months from the date of such examination; any expense in connection with an cxamination to be a charge against the Fond.
13. Where an emplogee has been examined by a qualified medical practitioner and has prodnced a medical cettifeate in support of his clain to be placed on the Fund, or in support of his clam for any payment from the Fund, and has been examined by a medical practitioner nominated by the Committee as provided for in Regulation 11a, then in the event of a diversity of opinion being expressed by such medical practitioners the Magistrate of the Local Court, on application being made to him, either by the Committee or the employee, may nominate a referee, being a qualified medical practitioner, to whom such employee shall subuit himself for examination, and the certificate of such referee shall be accepted as conclusive evidence as to the state of health of the employee for all purposes of the Fund. The employee shall be provided with a copy of all medical certificates, or reports, other than those obtained and fumished by him, or on his behalf, within seven days of the receipt of such certificates, or reports, by the Commities. Amy expense in comection with an examination by the referee slall be a charge against the Fund.
14. Should an employee be called upon by the Commitec, under Regulation 12 to submit himself for examination to a medical practitioner, or to a referee duly appointed under Regulation 13, and refuses or negleets so to do, or in any way obstructs the same, his rights to payments from the Fund shall be suspended until such examination has taken place, and shall absolutely cease thereafter, moless he summits himself for sueh exammation within one calendar month after being required so to do.
15. No employe shall be entitled to relief for an aceident eansed by drinking intoxicating liquors, fighting, or any kind of athetic sports or game or musement, of any aceident directly attributable to the sexious and wilful misconduct of the employee.
16. If am employee meets with an aceident which proves fatal, a sam not exceed mg liftecn pomels may be granted to any person towards cefraing the funeral expenses of the deceased, and an additional sum not exceding Pifteen pounds may be granted to the widow or any near relative of such deceased employed, if previously dependent amon the deceased for support, in full satisfaction of all chams upon the Fund.
17. Any employee, while in receipt of relief, must be in his man phace of abode by seven o'olock every evening from April to Septenbex, and eight o'cock trom October to Mareh, muless he produces, if ealled upon to do so, to the Committee a medical ecrtificate certifying that such is not detrimental to his recovery nor likely to retard samo, or can show retsonable aduse to the Commitco for being abroad after that hom. For cach breach of this Regulation the Committee may call upon the cmplogee to torteit one day's allowance payable to him from the Fum, and in their recomnendation to the Trust mako provision for the deduetion of sume from any amome that may be dne to him.
18. No momber, while in receipt of yeliof from the Dum, shall engage in any kind of work until he is dectared by a qualifed modical prattitioner to be suffeiently recovered to resume work. In the erent of any member committing a breach of this regulation, his relief shall ease trom the date of such breach.
19. An employee misconducting himself by fighting, being muder the influence of intoxicating liquors, behaving in a riotous or indecent manner, or behaving in any way that constitutes a breach of the public peace, or an offence to morality or common decency while in receipt of relied on accomt of any acedent, shall cease to receive further relief in respect of suel accident from the time that he so misconducts himself.
20. In the event of any momber of the Accident Committee or subseriber to the Fund obtaining, or being placed in the possession of information that an employee in receipt of relief has misconducted himself as aforesaid, it shall be incumbent upon him to make a repont to the members of the Aecident Committee of the said misconduct.
21. In the event of the employee concerned requining an inguiry to be held into the mature of, or circumstonees attending the misconduct with whieh he is charged, the Accilent Committee shall hold such inquiry and receive evidence bearing upon the nature and circumstances attending the alleged misconduct, or evidence rebutting the same.
22. In the event of the Aecident Committtee being satisfied that the employee so charged has exonerated himself, or that a reasonable doubt exists as to his participation in the misconduct with which he is charged, the Committee shall have power to pay any arrears of relief money which have acerued since the charge was made to the employee so charged, or any portion thereof.
23. It shall not be competent for any employee so charged to be represented by any counsel or solicitor at such inquiry.
24. If the trustees are of opinion at ay time that tho sealo of relief provided by these Regulations is inadequate, or, having regard to the state of the funds at their disposal, that the seale shouid be reduced, they shall make a recommondation to the Minister necordingly with the viev to an amendment of Regulation 9: Provided that no recommendation shall be made to increase the rate of relief beyond Thirty shillings per week.
25. In the event of the demmols for reliey being in cxcess of the funds at the disposal of the trustees, relief shall abate proportionately.
26. Tho trustees shall keep proper books of accounts showing the various items of receipts and expenditure in relation to the said account, and such books shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of the Luspector of Mines or other person appointed by the Minister, who may take such extracts therefrom as he may require. After the half-yearly audit of the books and aceounts of the Fund, as provided in Section 67, Subsection 7 of "The Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1902-1026," the trustees shall cause to be printed sufficient copies of the balance-sheet and statement of receipts and expenditure for distribution to contributors to the Fund.
27. Any actual and necessary disbursements attending the appointment of any trustee or mombers of the Committee, or incurred by the trustees or committee in the performance of their duties, or by any individual member or the Trust, or Committee, in the prosecution or defence of tay action which may arise through the discharge of his duty as a trustec or a member of the Committee, and approved by the Minister, may be paid out of the Trast Funds.
-8. The Committee may appoint a Secretary at assary to be fixed annally by the Minister. Such salary shal be paid from the trust funds. Erery nember of the Trust or Aceidont Committee may receive and be paid out of the trust fmods a fee of two shilings and sixpence for cach ordinary fortnightly meeting of the Trust or Committee respectively he shall attend.

## Pare II.-Ceimplcames no Mining Managmas and Under Managmas.

29. The Board will sit in Perth in the months of April and October in every year for the examination of candidates giviag notice of their intention to present themselves for examimation, and for the granting of certificates of compotency or service, without exammation, at such times as the Nimister may appoint. Notice of the intention to hold examination shall be atvertised in a paper or papers cireatating in the coal-mining districts of the State.
30. Any person desirous of presenting himself for examination shall notify the Secretary of the Board of Examiners for Mining Mamagers, Department of Mines, Perth, of the fact on a form (Schedule I.), which may be obtaned from the Seeretary. The notice shatl be accompanied by the fees preseribed in Regulation 35. This fee shall admit to one examination only.
31. On receipt of the notice and fees, an athorisation to present himself for examination (Schedule TT.) shall then be forwarded to the candidate by the seeretary.
32. Gudidates shall forward to the Secretary for the Board of Examiners, at least fourten days before the date of the examination, satisfactory evidence as to sobriety, experience (in couformity with Section 23 ), ability, and general good conduct, a statcment of age and occupation, where and by whom employed during at least the preceding five years. A statntory declaration shall be attached to the effect that all the representations contained in such statement are true.
33. A period of three years apprenticeship may be substituted as an alternative for an equivalent period of practical experience in a mine under the Act, it the apprentice has had, in the discharge of his duties, to go down mines and obtain practical experience therein.
34. If in any case the Board of Examiners do not deem the evidence of sobricty, experience (in conformity with Section 23), general good conduct, statement of age and occupation, where and by whom employed during at least the preceding five years, satisfactory, they shall refuse to allow such candidate to present himself for examination, his application fee shall be forfeited, and such candidate shall be debarred from again entering for examination for a perion of twelve montis.

## Certificates of Competency.

35. The fees payable by applicants for certificates shall be as follows:-

36. Applicants for examination for first-class Certificates of Competency shall be examined in the following subjects, or as many of them as the examiners may deem necessary:-
(1.) Arithmotic.-Thenentary rules; use of vulgar and decimal fractions, aud extract of square and cube root.
(2.) Surveying.-Kuowledge of surface and underground surveying; use of level and theodolite, and making of mine plans.
(3.) Geology.-The elements; the effects that faults produce in coal measures; how to ascertain the direction of a coal seam when severed by a fault; a knowledge of the composition and character of different classes of coal; also the character of the rocks and formation of the country where coal is likely to be found.
(4.) Machinery-Theoretical and effective power of winding, hauling, and pumping engines; boilers; rudiments of electricity; streugth of ropes, chains, and wher material.
(5.) Fentilation.-Theoxy and practice of the various methods of ventilation; construction of airways; velocity and division of currents, and the deductions to be made for friction.
(6.) Dangerous Gases.-TThe nature and composition of explosive and dangerous gases occuring in coal mines; the hability of explosions from coal dust and their prevention: spontaneous combustion.
(7.) Mining of Coal.-Sinking of shafts; opening out of mines; various systems of working coal; drainage of mines; undergromnd haulage; use of explosives; tapping water; construction of dams to keep water back in underground workings.
(8.) Coal Lines Regulation Act.-Knowledge of the provisions of "The Cont Mines Regulation Act, 1902-1926.'
The subjects of examination for second-class Certificates of Competency shall be:-
(1.) Arithmetic.-Tilementary rules.
(2.) Ventilation.-Theory and practice of; nature and properties of gases met with in mines.
(3.) Mining of Coal.-Sinking of shafts; various methods of hewing and working coal; use of explosives; tapping water; maderground hanage.
(4.) Coal Mines Regulation Act-Knowledge of the provisions of "The Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1902-1926.'
(5.) Roadways.--Making, securing, and mantenance of roadways.
37. The examination shall be conducted partly by means of printed or written papers, and partly wiva voco.
38. A minimum aggregate number of marks to qualify for either first or second class Certificates of Competency shall be 66 per eent.
39. On the examination papers with each question shall be stated the possible number of marks obtamable for the answer.
40. The candidates shall write out their answers to the questions in the presence of the Examiners, or of any person appointed by them in accordanee with rules which shall be laid down from time to time by the Examiners.

## Certificates of Service.

41. A person desirous of obtaining a first-class Certificate of Service shall notify the Secretary to the Board of Examiners of the fact on a form (Schedule III.), which may be obtained from the Secretary. The notice shall be accompanied by the fees prescribed in Regulation 35.
42. A candidate for a first-blass Certificate of Serviee shall forwurl to the Seeretary, together with his application, satisfactory evidence that he has acted in the capacity of Inspector of Mines or manager of a coal mine or coal mines for two years within a period of five yeas immediately prior to the commencement of this Aet.
43. A person desirous of obtaining a second-class Certificate of Servico shall notify the Secretary to the Board of Examiners of the fact on a form (Schedule III.), which may be obtained from the Secretary. The notice shall be accompanied by the fees prescribed in Regulation 35.
44. A candidate for a second-chass Certificate of Service shall forward to the Secretary, together with his appliation, satisfactory evidenee either that before the conmencement of this Act he was exereising and has sinoe that date exercised, or that ho has at any time within five years immediately before such commencement exercised for not less than two years, functions substantially corresponding to those of an under manager or overman.
45. If in any case of an application for a Certifieate of Service the Board of Examiners does not deem the evidence of service sufficient or satisfactory, the application fee shall be forfeifod, and such candidate shall bo debarred from making a further application for a period of not less than twelve months.

## Copies of Certificates.

46. Whenever any mino manager, under-manager, or overman has lost a certificate granted under the Aet, a copy of the certificate may be issued, in accordance with Section 28 of this Aet, on payment of the fee preseribed by Regulation 35.

## Examiners.

47. If a member of the Board of Examinexs becomes incapable of acting or refuses or fails to act, or acts negligently in the porformance of his duties as an examiner he may be removed by the Governor in Council and another examiner appointed in his place.
48. No person shall be eligible for a certificate either of competency or of service as a mine manager, under-manager, or overman unless he is 23 years of age.

Part IIt.- Registration of Boys and Monthey Rerurns.
49. The registration of boys, in accordance with Section 9 of the Act, shall be kept at the office of the mine, as per form (Schedule TV, of the Regulations).
50. The returns to be sent to the Tuspector of the District, in accordance with Section 30 of the Act, shall be in aceordance with form (Schedule V. of the Regulations).

## Part TV,-Gurvey and Plans of Mines.

51. The "aceurate plan", to be kept in accordance with Section 31 of the Act shall be made in accordance with the following conditions, viz.:-
(1.) The surveys shall be made and the plans drawn by a licensed surveyor of the State of Western Australia, but surveys may be made by and plans may be accepted from the following persons, viz.:-
(a) A person who holds a certificate as Mining Surveyor in one of the other States of Australia or in the Dominion of New Zealand.
(b) A person who holds a degree, or, not having matriculated, has passed all examinations prescribed for the couse in civil or mining engineering of an Australian University or of any University recognised by an Australian University, and who produces satisfactory evidence of having for not less than 1.2 months assisted to make underground surveys mider a surveyor qualified under this regulation.
(e) A person who holds the certificate of Mine Surveyor from the School of Mines of Western Australia or a certificate in Mining Surveying from any other School of Mines, the course for which certificate is, in the opinion of the persons appointed by the Minister to investigate, equivalent to that prescribed for the Western Australian certificate, and who produces satisfactory evidence that he has assisted to make undergromd surveys for not less than 12 months mider a Surveyor qualified under this regulation.
(d) A person who before the 31st day of October, 1916, produced satisfactory evidence of having, during not less than three years prior to that date, carried out undergromad surveys dither as prineipal or as an assistant to a surveyor qualified to perform mining surveys mder thi regulation.

Provided that all such persons shall first have submitted to the Minister such evi deace of their qualifications as aforesaid as he may trom time to time require, and shall have satisfied him, after reciving the report of the Inspecting Surveyor or such person or persons as he may from time to time appoint to investigate such evidence, that they are competent to perform mining surveys, and also provided that the Minister may at any time refuse to accept plans from any of the aforesaid persons if he is satisfied that any of the surveys made or plans furnished by them are inaccurate or defective.
(2.) The surveys shall be made with instrments of precision, as preseribed in the Survey Regulations for land surveys, or with special mining instruments of equal accuracy to these. All surveys shall be made to the true meridian, using as a datum the bearings of the bountaxies shown on the plan of the lease.
(3.) True bearings shall be carried from such boundaries into the underground workings by an accurate method, and shall be carried on throughout the survey of the underground workings.
(4.) When there are workings on two or more coal seans lying one over another the surveys of the underground workings on each seam shall be connected, wherever practicable, by direct measurements ant boarings taken through any connecting openings.
(5.) All distances moasured in main lines of the survey traverses and in shafts shall be measured by means of accurately divided steel bands which have been compared with standard measured lines and found to be correct. Steel wires may be used for deep shaft measurements. Offset measurements from the main traverse lines not exceeding 100 feet in length may be measured by means of tapes of good quality.
(6.) Accurate levels shall be taken throughout the workings in sufficient quantaty to cnable the level of every point therein to be estimated accurately from the plans. The reduced levels shall be shown on the plans of all intersections of main travelling and working ways.
(7.) The traverses through adjoining groups of workings shall be comected with one another by direct bearings and measurements as often as is reasonably practicable, so that the whole survey may be made up of series of closed traverses linked together:
(8.) Every traverse shall be calculated to meridian and perpendicular, and shall show no closing error greater than 1 in 2,000 . Copies of the traverse sheets shall be sent to the Minister together with the copies of plans and sections.
(9.) The drawings to be supplied to the Minister shall include:-
(a) An accurate plan of all the underground workings on each seam of coal worked in the mine, to a scale of not less than one inch to two chains, and having the reduced levels shown upon it in legible figures, indicating the points at which they have been taken. The plan shall show also the position, direetion, and extent of every known fault, and the amount of the vertical throw thereof, and of every known washout, intrusive dyke, or other break in the contimuity of the seams, and the depths of all shafts, ad of all comecting passages between higher and lower seams.
(b) A tracing on tracing linen of good quality of a plan of the surface above the underground workings, drawn to the same scale as the plan of the undergorund workings, and showing all streets, roads, buildings, ereeks, rivets, bays, swamps, navigable waters and depths of same, and limits of any tidal waters, also position and depth of any boreholes.
(c) Vertical sections of all boreholes and shafts, showing all strata passed through, drawn to a scale sufficient to show all details clearly, and vertical sections of ail seams cut in shafts or boreholes drawn to a scale of one inch to one foot.
(10.) The Minister, or the oficer authorised by him, may require information on any matter comected with the instruments and methods used in making the surveys, and may, if he think fit, call for a copy of all the field-notes used, and such information and copies shall be supplicd to him forthwith.
(11.) The plans shall show the true shape and dimensions of all underground excavations projected upon a horizontal plane.
(12.) The drawings required under (a) and (c) of clause (9) foregoing may be tracings on tracing linen or sun pints on good paper; those under (b) of clause (9) must be tracings on tracing linen. All drawings shall be sent to the Minister rolled on suitable rollers and shall not be folded.
(13.) All copies of plans, sections, traverse sheets, and field notes shall be certified to be eorrect by writing on the face thereof signed by the Surveyor making the surveys.

Prescribing a Route within the Metropolitan Area along which Motor Omnibuses for which "Regular Service" Licenses are granted may ply for hire.

His Exeellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," doth by this Order prescribe a further Route within the Metropolitan Area along which motor omnibuses for which "Regular Service" Jicenses are granted, under the provisions of the Traffic Act, may ply for hire ; also sections and terminal points, and stopping places on such routes, time tables to be observed by owners of motor omuibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of onnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire on such proscribed route, as set forth in detail in the Schedule heremnder :--

## Stopping Places en route.

Pending the fixing of places motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the ronte as may be convenient and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers on the motor omnibuses.

## Fares to be charged.

(6.) Premiums: No employer shall demand or receive a bonus or premium from any worker in respect of her engagement in the trade.
