WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Board declare by proclamation that any road shall be a main road: And whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the schedule hereto shall be a main road within the mean-

ing of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the foot-paths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

Schedule.

Fremantle-Armadale Road.

A strip of land, one chain wide, passing through the Road Board Districts of Fremantle and Armadale-Kelmscott, commencing at the junction of Roads Nos. 1539 and 737; thence along Road No. 737 North-Easterly and South-Easterly to Railway Crossing at Location 542; thence South-Easterly along South side of Jandakot-Armadale Railway Line, along North-Eastern boundary of Location 541, and along North-Eastern boundaries of Locations 298 and 406; thence recrossing Railway Line and continuing South-Easterly and East along North side of abovementioned Railway Line to the Western boundary of the townsite of Armadale.

The Vermin Act, 1918.

IT is hereby published, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 40 of "The Government Savings Bank Act, 1906," the amendment of Regulations 20 and 35, and to make the new Regulation 13a as printed below:—

Regulation 20 is amended as follows:—

(1.) In paragraph (3) the words "other than those at banks" and "not more than one withdrawal shall be made" are deleted and the words "ten pounds" are substituted for the words "five pounds."

(2.) In paragraph (4) the words "and at the agencies conducted by banks" are deleted and the following words are added to the paragraph, viz.:— "unless payment of a larger amount has been authorised by the branch at which the account is kept."

Regulation 35 is amended by substituting the word "upwards" for the words "to five shillings" in paragraph (4), and by inserting a paragraph as follows:—

(6a.) If the account is opened by a relative or parent or by a trustee paragraph (5) will not apply, and subparagraph (a) of paragraph (6) may be dispensed with.

Regulation 13a:—

Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing regulations to the contrary, deposits by and the accounts of any Friendly Society as defined by Section 3 of the Act, may be withdrawn and operated upon by notice of withdrawal and receipt or by cheque signed by the Treasurer or other officer of the Society authorised in that behalf.

PORT OF FREMANTLE.

Gage Roads to Owen Anchorage—Old Routes across Success Bank closed and "Naval Base" dredged channel adopted.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners notify, for the information of those navigating vessels across the Success Bank between Gage Roads and Owen Anchorage, that the old routes across the bank are hereby closed to navigation owing to a decrease in depth of water having been discovered in same.

The channel recently dredged across this bank by the Naval Construction Department to assist in giving access to the proposed Naval Base at Cockburn Sound has been adopted by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners in lieu of the old routes, and is now being marked for navigational purposes.

This channel is one (1) mile and eight (8) cables in length, three hundred (300) feet in breadth, and contains sufficient depth of water to enable the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners to set a limit of seventeen (17) feet six (6) inches to ship draught at low water on ships navigating such channel.

The course through the channel is South 10 degrees East.

The navigational marks for this channel are as follows:—

- (1) At its North-Western corner a red-painted conical buoy carrying a flashing white gas light, showing one (1) second flash and four (4) seconds eclipse; position Latitude 32 degrees 4 minutes 12 seconds South and Longitude 115 degrees 41 minutes 6 seconds East.
- (2) At its North-Eastern corner a black cask buoy; position 300 feet distant on a bearing of 80 degrees from the red conical buoy at the North-Western corner.

(3) At an approximately mid-channel spot marking the Western and Eastern edges of the channel piles bearing on the Western edge a red disc or ball, and on the Eastern edge a black disc or ball; the position of the Western pile is Latitude 32 degrees 5 minutes 6 seconds South and Longitude 115 degrees 41 minutes 20 seconds East; the Eastern pile is distant 300 feet from on a bearing 80 degrees from the Western pile.

(4) At the Southern end of the channel are two piles placed on the centre line of the channel and one thousand feet distant from one another. On the Northernmost of these two piles is an inverted triangle and on the Southernmost a triangle; both these devices are painted black and white, and measure four feet across; the Northern is 14 feet and the Southern 16 feet above low water. These marks are to be used as transit leads for traversing the channel, and are to be passed by vessels close to on the Eastern side of the marks.

The course through the channel is to be maintained by ships heading South till the Mewstone Rock comes on with the high lighthouse at Rottneest Island, then the usual course to the Owen Anchorage Cattle Jetty is taken; on leaving the Owen Anchorage Cattle Jetty the usual course is to be steered till the Mewstone Rock is brought on with the high lighthouse on Rottneest Island, which is to be held till the Southernmost marks of the channel are in transit, when the channel can then be taken, passing these marks close to on their Eastern side and keeping them in transit till the buoys marking the Northern end are passed.

Light Flashing Buoy at Scott's Ledge now being moved.

It is to be noted that the white flashing gas buoy previously placed to the Northward of Scott's Ledge in the position Latitude 32 degrees 4 minutes 10 seconds South and Longitude 115 degrees 40 minutes 45 seconds East is being moved approximately 1,500 feet to the Eastward, on a bearing 9 degrees South of East or a true bearing of 99 degrees, and in the new position marks the North-Western corner of the channel across Success Bank.

Industrial Agreement.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this third day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between the Metropolitan Omnibus Co., Limited, and Yellow Cabs (Western Australia), Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers" of the one part, and the Amalgamated Road Transport Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. *Scope.*—This Agreement shall apply to all persons employed in or in connection with the conveyance of persons and/or passengers by road: Provided that this Agreement shall not apply to any persons who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Agreement registered with the Court of Arbitration.

2. *Area.*—This Agreement shall apply over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

3. *Wages:*

A.—Basic Wage—£4 5s. per week.

B.—The minimum weekly wage to be paid to all workers, other than casual workers, shall be as follows:—

Adult workers—	£	s.	d.
(a) Taxi-car drivers	4	16	0
(b) Char-a-banc drivers	5	0	0
(c) All other workers (including washers and garage assistants)	4	5	0
Junior workers—			
If under 16 years of age	1	10	0
If 16 and under 17 years of age	1	15	0
If 17 and under 18 years of age	2	10	0
If 18 and under 19 years of age	3	0	0
If 19 and under 20 years of age	3	10	0
If 20 and under 21 years of age	4	0	0

Provided that no person under 21 years of age shall be permitted to drive any vehicle except at the rates prescribed herein for adult drivers.

4. *Casual Workers.*—

(a) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 6d. per day in addition to an hourly rate calculated upon the weekly wage prescribed in Clause 3 hereof, and on the basis that 48 hours constitutes a week's work: Provided that the minimum payment to a casual worker for work performed on any one day shall not be less than 5s.: Provided further, that the rate of payment for casual workers for work done on any Sunday or public holiday shall be at the rate of time and a-half of the ordinary rate for casual workers. "Public holiday" for this purpose shall have the same meaning as in Section 4 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920."

(b) The maximum number of casual workers allowed to be employed by any employer shall be in the proportion of one casual worker to every 15 or fraction of 15 weekly workers employed under the provisions of this Agreement: Provided that where a casual worker is engaged to take the place temporarily of a weekly worker such casual worker shall, for the purpose of this sub-clause, be regarded as and be deemed to be a weekly worker.

5. *Hours.*—The hours the different classes of workers may be called upon to work without payment of overtime shall be as follows:—

- (a) Char-a-banc drivers: 48 hours per week, or 10 hours per day.
- (b) Taxi-car drivers: 96 hours per fortnight, or 56 hours per week, or 9 hours per day.
- (c) All other workers: 48 hours per week, or 8 hours per day.

Provided that any time worked on any day or days to make up the hours of duty in any week shall be worked in a continuous shift, except in the case of char-a-banc drivers who may be worked in three periods each day, one of such periods shall not be less than six hours, and each of the remaining periods shall not be less than one hour.

Where an employee is worked in a continuous shift of eight hours or more on any day, one half-hour per day shall be allowed such employee for a meal time, and such time shall not be included when computing the hours worked each day.

6. *Overtime.*—

(a) Char-a-banc drivers shall be paid at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first eight hours of duty in excess of 48 hours in any week, and at the rate of time and a-half for all other overtime worked.

(b) Taxi-car drivers shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for all overtime.

(c) All other workers shall be paid as follows:—
For all time of duty—

Exceeding 48 hours but not exceeding 56 hours in any week, at the rate of ordinary time;

Exceeding 56 hours in any week, at the rate of time and a-half;

Exceeding eight hours but not exceeding nine hours on any day, at the rate of ordinary time;

Exceeding nine hours on any day, at the rate of time and a-half.

All overtime shall stand alone, and shall be paid for in addition to the weekly or casual wage, as the case may be.

7. *Sunday Work.*—No worker shall be permitted to be on duty on more than three Sundays in any period of six weeks unless he shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for all time worked on any Sunday after the third Sunday within such period of six weeks. Where a worker works on a Sunday which work entitles him to Sunday pay increased in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause, such payment shall be for not less than eight hours' pay at the Sunday rate so increased as aforesaid: Provided that where payment has been made for such Sunday work in accordance with the above provisions, the time for which such payment is made shall not be counted as part of the working week: Provided further, that where an employee is absent from home on country work he shall be deemed to have worked at least eight hours each Sunday whether actually working or not. This latter proviso shall not, however, apply to employees engaged on regular routes or in maintaining a regular service upon a route prescribed pursuant to the Traffic Act or the Regulations made thereunder. For the purposes of this clause "period of six weeks" shall mean three successive fortnights, as hereinafter defined.

8. *Holidays.*—Nine days consecutive holidays on full pay shall be allowed to all workers at the expiration of every twelve months of service: Provided that where the engagement of any worker is terminated after three months' continuous service or after any period of continuous service from the previous annual holidays, three-quarters of a day's wages shall be paid to such worker for each month or portion of a month so worked. This proviso shall not apply, however, in any case where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct or neglect of duty.

All time of duty on Good Friday, Labour Day, or Christmas Day shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a-half: Provided that the minimum payment for work on any of these days shall be for four hours at the rates before-mentioned.

9. *Away from Home Allowance.*—Workers engaged on work from which they are unable to return to their homes at night shall be paid such personal expenses as they may reasonably incur: Provided that such expenses shall not be less than seven shillings and sixpence per day.

10. *Payment for Highest Function.*—A worker who is called upon to perform two or more classes of work on any day shall, for the purpose of the wages to be paid to him, be deemed to have worked the day at the class for which the highest rate of wage is prescribed.

11. *Time and Wages Book.*—Each employer shall provide a time and wages book, to be kept at a place where it is easily accessible to the employer and the worker. This book shall show the name of each worker, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked by and the wages and overtime paid to each worker, and the worker's signature therefor. The employer and the worker shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the book daily. Such book shall be open to inspection during working hours, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive, and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon Saturdays, by the Secretary of the Union or any other person

authorised in writing by him: Provided that an employer may at his option, in lieu of a time book, provide a mechanical clock for the purpose of recording the starting and finishing times of employees, in which case a record of the number of hours worked each day by each employee, and the wages and overtime paid to such employee, shall be entered on a card or check (used in connection with such clock), which shall be signed by the employee on receipt of wages each week. The employer and employee shall be jointly responsible for the correct keeping daily of such card or check, which shall be open to inspection in the same manner as the time and wages book before-mentioned.

12. *Term.*—This Agreement shall come into force as from the date hereof, and shall continue in operation for a period of three years therefrom: Provided that, after the expiration of 12 months from the date hereof, or at the expiration of any subsequent period of 12 months therefrom, any term or terms hereof may be amended by agreement between the parties: Provided also, that at any time after the expiration of 12 months from the date hereof, or after the expiration of any subsequent period of 12 months therefrom, any party hereto may make application to the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia to vary any term or terms hereof.

13. *Termination of Employment.*—One week's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the engagement of any but a casual hand shall be determined: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, carelessness in the performance of his duties, or if, after receiving one week's notice, he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

Notice given every week to determine the employment without any intention to determine the employment at the end of the week, but only with a view of dismissing men at any time shall not be deemed notice for the purpose of this Agreement.

14. *Contract of Employment.*—

- (a) Weekly hands ready and willing to work for the whole week, and not dismissed for any reason set out in Clause 13 of this Agreement shall be paid a full week's wages;
- (b) Employers shall, when engaging employees, state definitely whether such employee is engaged as a weekly or casual hand. Failing such notice the employee shall be deemed to be engaged as a weekly employee.

15. *Pay Day.*—All wages shall be paid weekly. No employer shall hold more than three days' wages in hand.

16. *Temporary Change of Garage.*—Where an employer transfers an employee after he comes to work, from one garage or depôt situated more than two miles distant from the garage or depôt at which he usually works, fares to and from such altered garage or depôt shall be allowed by the employer. If he is transferred temporarily to work at a garage or depôt which requires him to travel one mile or more from his home beyond the distance he usually travels, the fares to and from and excess time shall be paid for by the employer.

17. *Uniforms.*—Employers requiring employees to wear uniforms or wearing apparel of any specified description shall provide same free of cost to employees; such uniforms or wearing apparel shall remain the property of the employer, and shall be returned to the employer, on demand, in good order and condition, subject to fair wear and tear.

18. *Definitions.*—For the purposes of this Agreement—

- (a) "Char-a-banc driver" shall mean any person employed to drive a motor vehicle with seating accommodation for more than seven persons including the driver;
- (b) "Taxi-car driver" shall mean any person employed to drive a motor vehicle with seating accommodation for not more than seven persons, including the driver;
- (c) "Casual worker" shall mean any person who is engaged as a casual worker and who is dismissed or refused work without any fault of his own, before the expiration of six days from the date of commencing work;
- (d) "Day" shall also include night;
- (e) "Fortnight" shall mean from the 30th January, 1927, to the 12th February, 1927, inclusive, and each succeeding fourteen days thereafter.
