PORT OF FREMANTLE.

Gage Roads to Owen Anchorage—Old Routes across Success Bank closed and "Naval Base" dredged channel adopted.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners notify, for the information of those navigating vessels across the Success Bank between Gage Roads and Owen Anchorage, that the old routes across the bank are hereby

water having been discovered in same.

The channel recently dredged across this bank by the Naval Construction Department to assist in giving access to the proposed Naval Base at Cockburn Sound has been adopted by the Targetter Having Base at Cockburn Sound has been adopted by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners in lieu of the old routes, and is now being marked for navigational purposes.

This channel is one (1) mile and eight (8) cables in length, three hundred (300) feet in breadth, and contains sufficient depth of water to enable the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners to set a limit of seventeen (17) feet six (6) inches to ship draught at low water on ships navigating such channel.

The course through the channel is South 10 degrees

The course through the channel is South 10 degrees

The navigational marks for this channel are as follows:

- (1) At its North-Western corner a red-painted conica' buoy carrying a flashing white gas light, showing one (1) second flash and four (4) seconds eclipse; position Latitude 32 degrees 4 minutes 12 seconds South and Longitude 115 degrees 41 minutes 6 seconds East.
- (2) At its North-Eastern corner a black cask buoy; position 300 feet distant on a bearing of 80 degrees from the red conical buoy at the North-Western corner.
- (3) At an approximately mid-channel spot marking the Western and Eastern edges of the channel the Western and Eastern edges of the channel piles bearing on the Western edge a red disc or ball, and on the Eastern edge a black disc or ball; the position of the Western pile is Latitude 32 degrees 5 minutes 6 seconds South and Longitude 115 degrees 41 minutes 20 seconds East; the Eastern pile is distant 300 feet from on a bearing 80 degrees from the Western pile.
- (4) At the Southern end of the channel are two piles placed on the centre line of the channel and one thousand feet distant from one another. one thousand feet distant from one another. On the Northernmost of these two piles is an inverted triangle and on the Southernmost a triangle; both these devices are painted black and white, and measure four feet across; the Northern is 14 feet and the Southern 16 feet above low water. These marks are to be used as transit leads for traversing the channel, and was to be pressed by westle clear to on the Fast. are to be passed by vessels close to on the East-

are to be passed by vessels close to on the Eastern side of the marks.

The course through the channel is to be maintained by ships heading South till the Mewstone Rock comes on with the high lighthouse at Rottnest Island, then the usual course to the Owen Anchorage Cattle Jetty is taken; on leaving the Owen Anchorage Cattle Jetty the usual course is to be steered till the Mewstone Rock is brought on with the high lighthouse on Rottnest Island, which is to be held till the Southernmost marks of the channel are in transit, when the channel can then be taken, passing these marks close to on their Eastern side and keeping them in transit till the buoys marking the and keeping them in transit till the buoys marking the Northern end are passed.

 - (1) To occupy an area of land of not less than one square mile nor more than three square miles as a bee range, and
 - (2) to occupy an area of land not exceeding three acres situated within the bee range as an apiary site.
- 46 (b.) The rental for a bee range shall be (30s.) thirty shillings per square mile or fractional part thereof per annum, and for an apiary site (15s.) fifteen shillings per annum. Such rental shall be payable in ad-
- 46 (c.) A deposit not exceeding £20 may be required by the Conservator before issue or renewal of the permit as a guarantee for the observance and performance of the conditions contained therein.

BREWERY EMPLOYEES (KALGOORLIE BREWING & ICE CO.).

No. 9 of 1927.
THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twenty-fourth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between the Kalgoorlie Brewing & Ice Co., Ltd., whose registered office is situated at Brookman Street, Kalgoorlie (hereinafter called the employer), of the one part, and the Eastern Goldfields Breweries Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, under the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and having its registered office at the Eastern Goldfields Breweries' Union Hall, Kalgoorlie (hereinafter called the union), of the other part, whereby it is agreed as follows:—

Interpretation.

(a) "Casual Hands" shall mean any person who is employed for not more than forty-four hours ordinary working hours 7.30 a.m. to 4.20 p.m.

The number of casual hands employed shall not exceed one in every ten men permanently employed, or portion of the first ten men employed by each company.

(b) "Cellarmen": The term cellarman whenever used in this Agreement shall mean one who "Racks," "Tops," "Fines," or deals with beer in any way in the cellar, and/or tends "Filter" and/or "Refrigerator."

Schedule.

1. The parties in this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages payable for the following classes of work shall be:—

(The above rates of pay are based on a basic wage of $\pounds 4$ 5s, per week for males.)

Carters: Carters or others feeding or attending to horses shall be paid at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per horse for a week of six days, and an extra eightpence per horse for attention given on Sundays.

Stablemen and Grooms: Fifty-six hours shall constitute a week's work, including Sunday. Stablemen shall be allowed one full day off in each month on full pay. Grooms may, if required to do so, cart rubbish or refuse.

Boiler Cleaning and/or Scraping: Cleaning and painting cylinders shall be paid for at the rate of 2s. 9d. per hour.

Boots: The employer shall, for use during working hours only, supply suitable boots to those employed at the bottle washing, at the tanks, at the tubs, at the filters, at the cask washing shed, at the bottlers, and to any employee working in or about water, such boots to be supplied free of cost.

Oilers and Aprons: Employers shall, for use in their work only, supply oilskin coats, eash and docket satchels, and leather aprons to carters free of cost.

(b) The number of boys employed shall not exceed one in every ten men permanently employed or portion of the first ten men employed by each company.

Hours.

3. Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work for all employees excepting stablemen. Employees shall begin at 7.30 a.m. and conclude at 4.20 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and from 7.30 a.m. to 12.20 p.m. on Saturday, with an allowance of one hour for meals on the first five days.

Shift Cellarmen: Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work for shift cellarmen, and the hours to be worked shall be:—

- (a) Day Shift—8 a.m. to 4.20 p.m., with one hour off between 12 and 1 o'clock for lunch;
- (b) Afternoon Shift—4.20 p.m. to 11.40 p.m. on week days and 3 p.m. to 11 p.m. on Sundays (inclusive of thirty minutes each shift for crib time);
- (c) Night Shift—11.40 p.m. to 7 a.m. on week days and 11 p.m. on Sunday to 7 a.m. on Monday morning (inclusive of thirty minutes each shift for crib time).

The luncheon hour on Saturday to be between 11.30 a.m. and 12 o'clock.

Provided always that the quick shift man shall not work on Sundays, and that the night shift man shall have at least one week on day shift in every four weeks.

Overtime.

4. If any employee works earlier than his starting time or later than his ordinary quitting time, he shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half, each day to stand alone.

Casual Hands.

All casual hands to be paid at the existing rates specified in this Agreement, according to the duties performed by them.

Record Book.

6. Each company shall keep a record of the time of each employee (except stablemen), the time he starts, and finishes each day, the total amount of hours worked, the overtime worked, and the wages paid to each employee. Such record shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of, or any person appointed by the employee's union during working hours. Each employee shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

Sundays.

7. All work performed on Sundays by employees in any department (stablemen excepted) shall receive payment for the same at the rate of time and a half.

Holidays.

8. All work performed by employees in any department on holidays shall be paid for at double time rates, and, as far as reasonably permitted, employees shall be employed on the holiday shift in their turn as holidays

Any employee working any part of a shift on a holiday shall be paid for the full shift at double time rates. All holiday shifts to rotate. If no work be done the ordinary rate shall be paid for holidays. The days to be observed as holidays, according to the provisions of this Agreement, are Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Union Pienic Day, Labour Day, Cup Day, New Year's Day, and Anzac Day. Provided always, that when Boxing Day falls on a Saturday all men required shall work on that day, and another day shall be given in lieu thereof.

- 9. Any employee excepting those as herein provided, at the request of the employer, starting work at a time during the day later than 7.30 a.m., shall continue his employment without a break other than for meals until he has completed on the first five days of each week a service of seven hours twenty minutes per day, and a term of five hours and fifty minutes on the sixth day. During each shift so worked such employee except those as herein provided shall be paid evertime rates after. as herein provided shall be paid overtime rates after 4.20 p.m.
- 10. Twelve days' annual leave on full pay shall become due to workers with twelve months' service, such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed on between the employer and the employees, between the 30th April and the 30th September in each year, in addition to the helidays annually agreed to the service of the addition to the holidays enumerated above. Temporary hands with less than twelve months' service shall on retirement receive a proportion of the annual holidays in ratio to their service.
- 11. Any employee, excepting those as herein provided, on day shift who is required to work before 7.30 a.m. shall not be called upon by the employer to cease work until 4.20 p.m., and shall be paid overtime rates for the time worked previous to 7.30 a.m.
 - No contract or piece-work shall be permitted.
- 13. The engagement between the employee and the employer, except casual hands, shall be weekly, a week's notice from either party to terminate same, except in the case of an employee absenting himself from duty, not obeying lawful commands, or being guilty of misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped through fire or tempest, when such agreement shall be terminated immediately. terminated immediately.
- 14. No employee who has previously been in receipt of higher wages than arranged for in this schedule shall be reduced in wages under his present employment, and shall receive a similar increase to all other employees.
- 15. Any employee being unable through sickness or accident to attend to his duties shall notify his employer not later than 10 a.m. on the day he absents himself from duty, and he shall also satisfy the employer that he is unable to attend to his duties, and if called upon shall provide a medical certificate that he is unfit to perform his work through sickness.
- 16. Any employee who considers himself unfit or not capable of earning the wages hereinbefore prescribed may be paid such less wages as may be agreed upon may be paid such less wages as may be agreed upon between the employer and the secretary of the union. In default of such agreement being arrived at within twenty-four hours after application has been made in writing to the secretary of the union, the matter may be referred to the nearest Resident Magistrate for settlement. Any employee whose wage has been so

fixed may work and be employed by any employer for such less wage for a period of six calendar months then next ensuing and thereafter until fourteen days' notice in writing shall be given to such employee by the secretary of the union requiring his wages to be again fixed.

- 17. All employees on day shift engaged in or about a Brewery or Bottling Works shall, if required to work more than one hour overtime after 4.20 p.m., knock off between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. for refreshments.
- 18. The employers shall make it a condition of employment that all workers covered by this Agreement shall be members of the Eastern Goldfields Breweries Employees' Union and/or become such within fourteen days of their employment under its terms.
- 19. Where any employee is required to take a "leading position" he shall, during the time he occupies such position, receive the sum of two shillings and sixpence per week in addition to his ordinary rate of pay.
- This Agreement shall commence from the 24th day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and apply to the Eastern Goldfields District, and shall remain in force until the 24th (twenty-fourth) day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-
