THE Embassy of the Turkish Republic has the honour to inform H.B.M.'s Ministry of Foreign Affairs that. according to the terms of a communication from the Republican Government, in order to make a power of attorney (procuration) valid for the purposes of the Turkish judicial authorities, it must be drawn up by a notary public and legalised by the Turkish Con-sulate, or else directly drawn up by a Consulate of the Republic the Republic.

In addition, any document which may have to be produced before a Turkish tribunal must be accompanied by a translation made by a Consulate of the Republic, or by a notary public in Turkey.

The Embassy of the Turkish Republic requests H.B.M.'s Ministry of Foreign Affairs to be good enough to inform the competent authorities to the above effect, and has the honour, etc.
