WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Local Courts Act, 1904-1921," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to order that Courts, to be called Local Courts, shall be held at such places as he thinks fit; and may, in like manner, alter the place for the holding of a Court or order that the holding of any Court be discontinued: And whereas it is deemed expedient to discontinue the holding of a monthly Local Court at Toodyay, and to establish a sitting of a Local Court at Toodyay once every two months in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order that the monthly Local Court holden at Toodyay shall be discontinued, and that a Local Court under the said Act shall be holden at Toodyay once in every two months, commencing in June, 1927.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, acting under the powers contained in the said Act and every other power me in this behalf enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, June the 6th, 1927, shall be a public holiday throughout the State, for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, Perth, this 25th day of May, 1927, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Vermin Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS Mount Margaret Road District was duly constituted a Vermin District under the provisions of "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," for the purposes of that Act, to be known as Mount Margaret Vermin District, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1924; and a Vermin Board for the said Vermin District, to be known as Mount Margaret Vermin Board, was duly appointed and constituted under the provisions of the said Act by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the said 19th day of September, 1924; and whereas by Section 50 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," it is enacted that the Governor may, whenever he shall think fit, abolish the board of any district and appoint a board for such district under the provisions of Section 45 of that Act, which shall apply as if the board of the district so appointed had been originally appointed the board of the district; and under Section 45 of the Vermin Act it is enacted that the Governor may appoint the board of any road district to be the board of any vermin district the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the road district: And whereas it is deemed expedient to abolish the Mount Margaret Vermin Board and in lieu thereof to appoint the Mount Margaret Road Board to be the Vermin Board for the Mount Margaret Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby abolish the Mount Margaret Vermin Board hitherto constituted as aforesaid and doth hereby appoint the Mount Margaret Road Board to be the Vermin Board for the Mount Margaret Vermin District for the purposes of "The Vermin Act, 1918."

THE humble petition of the undersigned sheweth as follows:—

1. That your Petitioners are a majority in number of the electors of the Swan Electoral Division of the State of Western Australia living in an area comprised within a circle having a radius of two miles from the Parkerville Post Office, situate in the Township of Parkerville, and being the area approved by the Licenses Reduction Board for the purposes of this Petition.

ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY ACT, 1926.

Regulations.

1. In every case in which an appeal shall be made to the Minister under the last proviso in Section three of the Act the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society shall be furnished with a copy of the notice of appeal and the grounds of appeal at least fourteen days before the Minister shall hear such appeal; and the Royal Agricultural Society shall be entitled to lodge with the Minister a statement signed by the Secretary setting out the grounds of refusal of registration. Such statement shall be lodged with the Minister three days at least before the expiration of the said fourteen days.

2. Every registered Agricultural Society shall elect one delegate to attend any conference convened from time to time by The Royal Agricultural Society, and such delegate shall be empowered to vote at any such conference. Delegates shall be appointed by each Agricultural Society within one month after registration and such appointment shall be deemed to continue for one year from the date thereof, or until other provision be made for such appointment by uniform by-laws of all registered agricultural societies to be passed as provided by Section six of the Act.

3. The registration of any Agricultural Society may be cancelled by The Royal Agricultural Society upon the happening of any of the following events:—

(a) If the Agricultural Society so registered shall fail to hold an Agricultural Show within its district for a period of two years or more.

(b) Upon the breach by any Agricultural Society of any uniform by-law governing all registered Agricultural Societies. Provided that before cancellation of any such registration can be effected the Council of The Royal Agricultural Society shall pass a resolution of such cancellation at a meeting to be specially called for the purpose of dealing with such cancellation, and of which express notice has been given to the Secretary of the Society, the registration of which is proposed to be cancelled, at least fourteen days prior to consideration by the Council. The Secretary or delegate or any other person appointed by the Agricultural Society in question shall be entitled to be present at any such meeting of the Council of The Royal Agricultural Society, and to be heard thereat.

4. The Royal Agricultural Society shall, upon the request of a majority of registered Agricultural Societies, convene a meeting under Section six of the Act, and such meeting shall be convened within three months from any such application being made. Twenty-one days notice at least shall be given to each Agricultural Society of the date fixed for such meeting by a letter addressed to the Secretary of each such society, and each letter shall specify the date, hour and place of meeting and the business to be conducted thereat. The Chairman of the Council of The Royal Agricultural Society shall be the chairman of such meeting, or, in the absence of the Chairman, such other person as is entitled under the by-laws of The Royal Agricultural Society to act as chairman shall preside at all meetings so convened, and in case of an equality of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote. Voting shall take place by a show of hands or in such manner as the chairman shall decide.

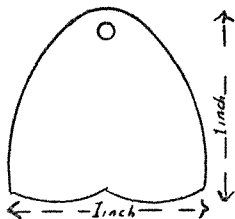

The Dog Act (as amended by "The Dog Act, Amendment Act, 1922").

1. All Regulations previously made under the Act shall be and are hereby repealed as from the 30th day of June, 1927.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation and have the force of law, in every district throughout the State, on and from the 1st day of July, 1927.

3. The registration label for the financial year ended the 30th June, 1928, required by Section 9 of "The Dog Act, 1903," as amended by "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1922," is hereby prescribed to be a flat piece of brass, of the size and shape depicted hereunder, inscribed with the name of the district, the year of registration, and the registration number on the obverse side and the emblem of the State flag upon the reverse side:



4. The registration label, as prescribed to these Regulations, shall be securely affixed to a collar and continually worn round the dog's neck.

5. Registration shall be effected on or within 21 days from 1st day of July, 1927.

6. The registration fees for dogs shall be as set forth in the Third Schedule to the principal Act, as amended by Sections 5 and 16 of the amending Act of 1922, namely:—

(a) Dogs, 7s. 6d.; bitches, 10s. (except those used for tending cattle and sheep).

(b) When any person makes use of any dog or dogs in or about the droving or tending of not less than five head of great cattle or twenty head of small cattle, he shall, on making application in the prescribed form, be entitled to register any such dog at half the prescribed rate, namely:—Dogs, 3s. 9d.; bitches, 5s.

7. The description of cattle shall be as set out in the Second Schedule of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," namely:—Horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, cow, heifer, calf, camel, deer, and foal—"Great Cattle." Ram, ewe, sheep, wether and lamb, goat, kid, and pig—"Small Cattle."

8. The form for application is hereby prescribed as Form "A," in the Fourth Schedule to "The Dog Act, 1903," as issued by the Department of Works and Labour. It must be stated definitely in the last column of the form the number of cattle or sheep for which the dog is used for tending.

9. Any person or persons who contravene any provisions of these Regulations, whether by act or omission shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS AND TRAMWAYS.

The Government Railways Act, 1904-1926.

Appeal Board.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor has approved of the following Regulations under "The Government Railway Act, 1904," and "The Government Railways Amendment Acts, 1907 and 1926":—

(1.) At least four weeks before each election the Commissioner of Railways (hereinafter called "the Commissioner") shall cause to be prepared seven alphabetically arranged lists of voters, viz:—

- (a) Salaried staff (excluding Tramway and Electricity Supply Branch);
- (b) Wages staff in the Traffic and Stores Branches, and other wages employees of branches not specified;
- (c) Wages staff in the Locomotive Running Branch, *i.e.*, all wages staff other than mechanics and their assistants employed by the Locomotive Branch in connection with the running of trains;
- (d) Wages staff of the Locomotive Workshops Branch, comprising all wages employees controlled by the Chief Mechanical Engineer except those provided for in section (e) above;
- (e) Wages employees in the Way and Works Branch;
- (f) Wages employees in the Tramways and Electricity Supply Branch;
- (g) Salaried staff of the Tramways and Electricity Supply Branch.

(2.) Such lists shall embrace as nearly as possible the names of all the staff of the respective sections employed on the twenty-eighth day before the election, and shall be available for inspection in Perth by any employee of the Department at any reasonable time between such day and the fourteenth day before the election. If any employee wishes to object to any list, particulars of such objection must be sent through his immediate superior to the Commissioner, whose decision thereon shall be final.

(3.) No objection shall be entertained unless it reaches the Commissioner not later than the third day before the closing of the lists, which shall take place on the fourteenth day before the election. The lists when closed shall remain closed until after the election, and only those persons whose names appear thereon shall be entitled to vote.

(4.) By-elections for filling casual vacancies shall be held on dates to be fixed by the Returning Officer, being not later than three months after the vacancy occurs; and not less than one month's notice of the date fixed shall be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(5.) Separate written nominations shall be made on Form "C" in the Schedule hereto for the positions of Member, Deputy and Substitute respectively, by not less than three employees of each section of the staff as enumerated in Clause (1) hereof (hereinafter referred to as the "seven sections"), and the candidate must belong to the same section as the nominators. Such nominations must reach the Returning Officer at Perth not later than noon on the twenty-first day before the election, and each nomination must be endorsed by the candidate signifying his willingness to act if elected.

(6.) Every employee registered in the respective lists shall be entitled to vote for one duly nominated member of his section to serve in each of the three capacities, *viz.*, Member, Deputy, and Substitute.

(7.) Should there be only one nomination for the position of Member, Deputy, or Substitute in any section the person nominated shall be declared duly elected.

(8.) Whenever there is more than one nomination a ballot shall be taken in the manner hereinafter prescribed. The Commissioner shall appoint two Scrutineers for each election, of whom one shall be a salaried officer and the other a wages employee, and shall notify the Returning Officer of such appointments.

(9.) The State Chief Electoral Officer, or, when he is prevented from acting, his substitute appointed under "The Electoral Act," shall be the Returning Officer at the election of any Member, Deputy, or Substitute. The expenses incurred by the Electoral Department, as approved by the Minister administering that Department, shall be defrayed by the Commissioner.

(10.) At least six weeks prior to a triennial election the Returning Officer shall, through the "Weekly Notice" issued by the Commissioner, invite nominations for the positions of Member, Deputy, and Substitute, for each of the seven sections, and such notice shall set out the day appointed by the Returning Officer as the day for nomination, such date not to be later than is provided in Clause (5) hereof. In the case of By-elections a similar procedure shall be followed as far as applicable.

(11.) The Commissioner shall furnish the Returning Officer with copies of the lists of voters immediately such lists have been closed.

(12.) When a ballot becomes necessary in accordance with Clause (8) the Returning Officer shall (on receipt of nominations):—

- (a) Cause the names of the candidates to be published in the earliest possible issue of the "Weekly Notice" issued by the Commissioner, and
- (b) Appoint and publish in such notification the date and hour of the day at which the poll shall close and the names of the Scrutineers appointed.

(13.) Forthwith after the date for receipt of nominations the Returning Officer shall cause Ballot Papers and Counterfoils, on Forms "A" and "B" in the Schedule hereto, to be printed, the ballot papers to show a list of persons validly nominated for each of the seven sections in alphabetical order of their surnames. The full Christian name of each candidate, his position in the Department, and notification of the section for which he is nominated shall also be shown on the Ballot Paper, and a copy thereof and of the Counterfoil sent to each person entitled to vote. The voter's name must not appear on the Ballot Paper.

(14.) Only Ballot Papers received by the Returning Officer up to the time fixed for close of the Poll shall be counted.

(15.) When there are more than two candidates for any vacancy the voting shall be on the preferential system.

(16.) All Ballot Papers and Counterfoils shall be delivered or sent (prepaid) by post, or by train to the Returning Officer, care of the Commissioner, Perth, in envelopes provided for the purpose, and must reach the Returning Officer on or before the date fixed for the election.

(17.) No employee shall be compelled to vote, and no union of employees shall canvass for votes or attempt to influence voters by circular or otherwise.

(18.) On the day next following the date of the election the Returning Officer shall, in the presence of the Scrutineers, proceed to ascertain and declare the results of the vote and to publish such results in the *Government Gazette* and the *Weekly Notice* issued by the Commissioner.

(19.) Should a candidate be nominated for, and receive the largest number of votes for two or more positions, he shall be declared elected to the higher or highest or such positions. For the purposes of this clause the order of such positions from the highest to the lowest shall be (1) Member, (2) Deputy, (3) Substitute. In such cases the candidate receiving the next largest number of votes shall be deemed to be elected for the lower position, provided that where the voting is on the preferential system the Returning Officer shall, in order to determine the result of the election to such lower position, make a recount of the Ballot Papers. At such recount the name of the candidate who has been elected to the higher position and the preferences recorded in his favour shall be disregarded, and wherever his name has received first preference, the second preference shall be reckoned as first preference, and so on through the count with the various preferences.

(20.) The Ballot Papers after being counted shall be enclosed in a sealed packet and retained by the Returning Officer. The packet shall not be opened unless a scrutiny is demanded as prescribed herein, when such scrutiny shall be conducted by the Returning Officer and the two Scrutineers. The Ballot Papers shall remain in the Returning Officer's custody for twenty-eight days and shall then be destroyed. Any application for a scrutiny must be made in writing to the Returning Officer by not less than seven voters in the section concerned within fourteen days after the publication of the results.

(21.) Should an elected Member, Deputy, or Substitute leave the service of the Railway Department, or be transferred to any other section than that for which he was elected, his position shall be deemed to have been thereby vacated.

(22.) Whenever there is an equality of votes and the addition of one vote will allow any candidate to be elected, the Returning Officer shall himself record such additional vote. Any candidate may, before such casting vote is given, withdraw from the election.

(23.) In the event of a By-election taking place within three months prior to a triennial election, the person elected shall continue to hold office (subject to Clause (21) hereof) for the ensuing triennial period.

(24.) In all matters not herein provided for and in the preferential system of voting, the provisions of the Electoral Act in connection with Parliamentary elections shall be followed so far as they are applicable to the election of persons to serve on the Board.

(25.) Until after the holding of the triennial elections in February, 1929, the Board shall continue to function as constituted prior to the passing of "The Government Railways Act Amendment Act, 1926."

(26.) Every notice of appeal to the Appeal Board shall be written on the Form "D" in the Schedule hereto, and shall be addressed to and lodged with the Commissioner within fourteen days of the date of the decision to which it relates.

(27.) The Commissioner shall forward such notice to the Chairman of the Appeal Board who, if the notice discloses a ground of appeal within Sections 52 and 69 of the Act, shall thereupon fix a time and place for the hearing and communicate same to the Commissioner.

(28.) The Commissioner shall cause notice of the time and place of the hearing to be given to the other members of the Board and to the appellant, and shall direct where necessary that arrangements be made to allow of the appellant's attendance.

(29.) The attendance of the appellant and his witnesses shall in the first instance and until the Board otherwise directs be at the appellant's cost.

(30.) Any employee wishing to attend before the Board as witness for an appellant must give three days' clear written notice thereof to his immediate superior, and leave for such purpose will thereupon be arranged and will be without pay or be debited against any leave (other than long service leave) which under the departmental regulations may be due to such employee, as he may desire. The Department will issue passes to the appellant and his witnesses when a journey by rail is necessary to enable their attendance before the Board, but in the event of an appeal being dismissed the value of such passes at ordinary fares for departmental privilege tickets may, unless the Board otherwise directs, be charged against the appellant, or with the concurrence of the users thereof may be treated as privilege passes under the departmental regulations.

(31.) The allowance to witnesses for their expenses shall be as follows:—

- (a) To those employed in the Railway Department, ordinary wages and travelling expenses in force from time to time.
- (b) To those not employed in the Railway Department, such witnesses' expenses as are allowed in Local Courts.

Such amounts to be recoverable from the party by whom or at whose instance he was summoned or requested to attend.

(32.) In the event of any dispute or question arising as to the meaning of these Regulations or any portion thereof, or as to anything done or alleged to have been done thereunder or contrary thereto, the same shall be referred to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final.

(33.) The Regulations made under Section 76 of "The Government Railways Act, 1904," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th day of October, 1908, and all Departmental Regulations and instructions or agreements in regard to Appeal Boards in force at the coming into operation of these Regulations are hereby revoked or modified in so far as they conflict herewith.

(34.) These Regulations shall come into force on the 15th day of April, 1927.

THE SCHEDULE.

Add to Class 8:

"Pumpers (other than those whose duties involve travelling by tricycle on running lines")."

BRICKYARD EMPLOYEES.

(Registered 9/5/27.)

No. 11 of 1927.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this seventh day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between Westralian Brickyard, Pottery, and Porcelain Works' Employees' Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and Metropolitan Brick Company, Limited, J. Hesketh, Lewis Whiteman, and Cardup Brick Company (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other parts, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. Hours.

(a) Forty-four hours per week shall constitute a week's work, divided as follows:—Eight hours per day from Monday to Friday, inclusive, and four hours on Saturdays: Provided that at the option of any employer the forty-four hours may be worked from Monday to Friday, inclusive within hours mutually agreed upon by the employer and the union.

(b) Where only one shift is being worked, the day's work shall begin not earlier than seven o'clock and from Monday to Friday, inclusive, shall end not later than half-past five o'clock, and on Saturday not later than a quarter past twelve.

Where two shifts are worked, the hours shall be a matter of arrangement between the employers and the Union.

(c) All overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours or portion thereof, and at the rate of time and a half thereafter.

(d) All time worked on Sunday, Christmas Day, Labour Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, and Anzac Day

shall be paid for at the rate of double time, except that burners shall be paid at the rate of time and a half: Provided that should any time so worked occur on any of the days comprising the twelve days' holiday on full pay provided by Clause 2 hereof, the holidays pay shall not be paid in respect thereof.

(e) All workers brought on duty for any purpose shall be paid a minimum of three hours: Provided that this provision shall not apply if the failure to find work shall arise from circumstances beyond the control of the employer.

(f) Workers under the age of eighteen years shall not where practicable, be called upon to work between the hours of midnight and six a.m.

2. Holidays.

Subject as hereinafter provided, twelve days holiday on full pay shall be granted to every worker during each year of his service.

(a) Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, and the Union Picnic Day (on a date to be agreed upon by the parties on or about the middle of February in each year), shall constitute five of such twelve days holiday; and the remaining seven days holiday shall be taken between the 23rd December and 2nd January, inclusive.

(b) In the event of any worker not having completed a full year of service in the employ of the employer, he shall be allowed a holiday on full pay equivalent to one day for every completed month of his service.

(c) No worker shall under any circumstances be entitled to be paid for any greater number of holidays than shall be equal to the number of his completed months of service.

(d) Should any worker be dismissed for wilful misconduct or dereliction of duty, he shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

3. Wages.

(a) Basic Wage at the rate of £4 5s. per week.

(b) The minimum rate of wages payable to workers covered by this Agreement shall be as follows:—

Provided that nothing in this Agreement shall in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

4. Open Kiln Burners.

(a) Ten hours shall constitute a night's work, starting at 7 p.m. and finishing at 6 a.m., one hour being allowed for meals. Time worked by night shall not count in the week's work.

(b) All burners employed on night shift shall be kept on until after the last complete feed on that night. Burners working on broken shifts, shall be paid one hour in addition to the actual time worked at the conclusion of the last feed.

(c) Not less than two men shall be employed on kilns containing up to fifty-five thousand bricks, when in full fire. On kilns containing over fifty-five thousand bricks, not less than three men shall be employed, and on kilns containing over seventy-five thousand, not less than four men shall be employed when in full fire.

(d) An ordinary burner shall not be allowed to work on one kiln for more than two nights in a week, such two nights not to be consecutive.

(e) No burner shall be called upon to attend to more than one full kiln per night when steaming.

(f) Sunday work shall be paid at time and a-half rates, and shall be confined to duties connected with burning only, and firewood only shall be unloaded when it is required for a kiln then burning.

(g) All firewood stopping and daub required at night shall be provided in proximity to the kilns.

(h) When more than three burners are employed at night one must be placed in charge and paid as head burner.

(i) It shall be optional for a worker to refuse to wheel up a checker after having been employed as a burner on the previous night.

5. General.

(a) Plates or planks shall be provided for all wheelers wheeling into the kiln in all places except where the ground to be wheeled on is hard.

(b) A leading hand shall be placed in charge in every clay-hole where more than three men are employed. Powder monkey shall receive 1s. per day extra, unless he is also the leading hand.

(c) When the average length of wheel from the face to the truck shall exceed seventy-five feet, the clay-hole men shall be paid 1d. per hour extra.

(d) It shall be optional on the part of the employer to provide oilskins.

6. Hoffman Kilns.

(a) Checkers shall not be less than three feet wide and be railed.

(b) The hours of burners shall be forty-eight per week at an hourly rate of 2s. 2½d., with time and a half for Sunday and one clear day off per week.

(c) Where a head burner is employed he shall, when necessary, supervise the work of the burners on other shifts. He shall receive 5s. per week extra, which shall be taken as payment for the extra work involved by such supervision.

(d) All workers employed oiling machinery in pressed brickyards shall be paid half an hour per day extra at ordinary rates for performing such work. All waste and other material required for cleaning shall be supplied by the employer.

(e) Drawers working on piecework rates shall be paid at per thousand on trucks or stack at the rates set forth in wages schedule appearing in Clause 3 hereof.

7. Lower Duties.

A worker called upon to do work carrying a lower rate than his usual rate of pay for less than half a day shall be paid for such work at his usual rate of pay.

8. Aged and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wage, to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the union, or in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application.

After having made application to the secretary, and after lodging the application to the Magistrate, and pending the decision thereon, in either case the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced wage.

The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wages shall be again fixed in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary.

The secretary may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of any such application before a Magistrate.

9. Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid on the job within twenty minutes of the close of the day's work at least once a fortnight.

10. Engagement.

One day's notice on either side shall (with the exception of waste sand and bag boys, in whose case one week's notice shall be required) be necessary to terminate the engagement of all workers: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if after receiving one week's notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

11. Notices.

(a) Notices relating to meetings in connection with the union shall be allowed to be exhibited in each yard.

(b) A printed copy of the conditions of this Agreement shall be kept posted by the employer in a conspicuous position in each yard.

12. Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered, a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which he has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a representative of the union at least one day in each week between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

13. Term.

This Agreement shall operate from the date hereof and shall continue in force for a period of three years from such date: Provided that, after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, or, after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months, the Court may alter or amend the same upon the application of any party or persons affected by its provisions.

14. Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the abovementioned union and to such of the abovenamed Master-brick-makers as are engaged in the manufacture of bricks within an area comprised within a radius of eighty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

The Industrial Agreement dated the twenty-first day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and numbered 58/1925, is hereby and, with the leave of the Court duly obtained, cancelled as from the date hereof.

THIS Agreement, made this day the eighteenth day of December, 1926, in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act of 1912, between the Coal Miners' Industrial Union of W.A., Collie, on the one part, and the Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Ltd., on the other part, Whereby it is mutually agreed that for the period herein specified the following rates and conditions shall apply for cutting in clean coal only at the Co-operative Mine.

(1.) Where stone or brass comes into the holing or cutting part of the seam the places shall be paid extra for, payment for such places to be mutually agreed upon by the machinemen concerned and a representative of the Company.

(2.) All places to be left in a proper condition for cutting, this to apply to removing timber, refuse, water, skips, etc.

(3.) Places that are recognised to have abnormal disabilities shall be paid for at the machinemen's average earnings.

(4.) Any refuse in the seam, with the exception of the recognised band of stone, which is thrown back by the miners, shall be measured and paid for at the coal cutting rates.

(5.) The Company to supply all tools necessary, also sand, lubricating oil and light.

(6.) The Company to keep the machines in good working order, bits and black oil to be supplied as at present.

(7.) In the event of a breakdown of a machine, the machinemen to be paid at their average wage for the remainder of the shift, but during this time the machinemen must carry out any work ordered to be done.

(8.) If no place is ready for cutting or the ordinary work of the machinemen cannot be gone on with, the machinemen to be provided with other work at the day rates at present being paid.

(9.) The cable to be kept within convenient distance of the working faces.

(10.) All road coal filled shall be paid for at the cutting rates, the money to be equally divided amongst all machinemen.

(11.) All machinemen under this agreement to be guaranteed nine days' work per fortnight.

(12.) The minimum wage of £1 8s. 9d. shall be paid; provided further, that no machinemen shall on any separate day receive less than the minimum wage.

(13.) In the event of a machine getting jammed whilst cutting, through the coal setting down, the machinemen shall be compensated for time lost, payment to be mutually agreed upon by the machinemen concerned and a representative of the Company.

(14.) In the event of the miners getting an increase or decrease in wages, the machinemen shall receive proportionate increase or decrease in their rate with the miners.

(15.) If the machinemen desire it a quarterly cavi to be arranged, otherwise to be mutually arranged; mutual arrangements also to apply to new starters and temporary machinemen.

(16.) The Deputy to acquaint the machinemen at the start and change of shifts the condition of places and the situation of the machines.

(17.) At the commencement of this contract the machinemen take the places as they stand, cut or uncut; at the termination of the contract the Company accepts the same number of places, cut or uncut; any places over the present number having coal in them at the time shall be assessed and paid for.

(18.) The rates of pay for cutting clean coal in the Co-operative Mine shall be as follows:—

For coal cut with the Jeffrey Machines on the right hand side, 8d. per ton.

For coal cut with the Jeffrey Machines on the left hand side, 9½d. per ton.

For all coal cut with the Sullivan Machines, 10½d. per ton.

(19.) This agreement to remain in force for a period of twelve months from date hereof.
