To Sir Robert Furse McMillan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Chief Justice and Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia.

WHEREAS by Clause 14 of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant-Governor, or if there be no such officer then any other person, to be his Deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute, for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by these our Letters Patent as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others: And whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the seat of the Government: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this Instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you the said Sir Robert Furse McMillan as from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the seat of the Government and during such absence to be my Deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

*The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 584/27.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor-in-Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

*Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—City of Perth.*

Proposed 18in. diameter water main in Murray Street, between Milligan and William Streets, commencing from 30in. main at the intersection of Murray Street and Milligan Street, and proceeding Eastward along the North side of Murray Street to connect with 8in. main in William Street, together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary connections and apparatus. Length about 27 chains, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., and D.D., W.A., No. 4668.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 17th day of June, 1927.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 7 of 1926.

Between Bowra & O'Dea, Donald J. Chipper & Son, C. H. Smith & Co., Arthur E. Davies & Co., and J. C. Semken, Applicants, and Perth, Fremantle, and Midland Junction Undertakers' Assistants and Cemetery Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1. *Wages (Basic Wage, £4 5s. per week).*—The minimum wage shall be—

Coffin-makers	5	5 6
Trimmer	4	15 6
Groom	4	15 6

2. *Hours and Overtime.*—The hours of work for coffin-makers shall be forty-four per week whilst engaged coffin-making, but they may be called upon to assist with other work for a further period of four hours without extra remuneration. Time worked by coffin-makers coffin-making in excess of eight hours of any of the first five days of the week, or four hours on Saturday, shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. All time worked in excess of forty-eight hours in any one week by coffin-makers, in whatever capacity, shall be paid at the above-mentioned rates.

Time worked by coffin-trimmers after 6.30 p.m. on any day shall be deemed overtime, and paid at the rate of time and a-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. All time worked in excess of forty-eight hours per week shall be paid at the above-mentioned rates.

All time worked by grooms over eight hours per day shall be given overtime, and paid at the rate of time and a-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. Time worked in excess of forty-eight hours in any one week shall be paid at the above-mentioned rates.

All time during which a worker is required to be on employer's premises in connection with the business of the employer shall be deemed to be portion of his working time.

3. *Sunday Time.*—All time worked on Sunday by coffin-makers and coffin-trimmers, and all time worked by grooms in excess of two hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half.

4. *Holidays.*—The following holidays shall be allowed and paid for:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, and Christmas Day. Work done on these days shall be paid at time and a-quarter in addition to ordinary rates.

5. *Annual Leave*.—One week's leave of absence on full pay shall be granted after one twelve months' service. In the event of the service of any worker who has served one month or more being terminated before he has completed twelve months' service he shall receive one half-day's wages for each calendar month's service: Provided that in case the worker is dismissed for serious and wilful misconduct the provisions of this clause shall not apply.

6. *Time and Wages Book*.—Each employer shall keep at his place of business, or at each of them if more than one, a book containing—

- (1) The name of each worker employed by him and to whom this Award applies.
- (2) The class of work performed, the hours during which the worker is employed, and the wages paid to each such worker.

Such book may be inspected at any time during working hours by the secretary of the union or other authorised person. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the correct posting up of the book daily.

7. *Uniforms for Drivers*.—The employer shall provide hats and coats required by grooms in the furtherance of the business of the employer.

8. *Term of Award*.—This Award shall remain in force for a term of three years from the date hereof.

9. *Area*.—This Award shall operate over the radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

10. *Apprentices*.—The Court is of opinion that it is not desirable or necessary in the present state of the industry to make provision for apprentices: Provided, however, that approval is hereby given to the terms and the conditions of any agreement of apprenticeship heretofore registered in the Court.

11. *General*.—The foregoing clauses of this Award, with the exception of Clause 10, have been drafted by and agreed to by the parties hereto.

2. *Term*.—This award shall have effect for a period of three years: Provided that any time after the expiration of 12 months from its date the Court may alter or amend the award on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

4. *Overtime*.—Work required to be performed by any worker after he or she has completed eight hours' service on any one day, or in any event after the hours of 5.30 p.m. or 12 noon Saturday, shall be considered overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

5. *Holidays*.—The following days shall be paid holidays, and any worker called upon to work on any of these days shall receive pay at the rate of double time:—Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, New Year's Day, Anzac Day, and Foundation Day.

6. *Junior Workers*.—The number of juniors employed shall be in the proportion of two juniors to one senior: Provided that where especial circumstances arise in any given business, arrangement for the employment of juniors in greater proportion may be made between the union and employer concerned; such arrangement to be negotiated through the W.A. Employers' Federation.

7. *Record Book*.—The employer shall keep or cause to be kept up a book containing the names of each of his employees to whom this award applies, the class of work performed by, and the wages paid to each employee, and the times during which he or she has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a representative of the union at least one day in each week, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

8. *Under Rate Workers*.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and, in default of such agreement, within 24 hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate, upon the application of such worker after 24 hours' notice, in writing, shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

9. By agreement between the parties, the foregoing amendments are to date from the 1st day of March, 1927.
