WHEREAS it is provided by Subsection (2) of Section 102 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that, subject to the said Act, the day on which all shops affected by the said section shall close at one o'clock p.m. shall be Saturday, but that the Governor may by Proclamation at any time and from time to time, on the petition (according to the form in the Sixth Schedule to the said Act) of the majority of the keepers of such shops in any district, substitute in that district for Saturday any other week-day; and whereas a petition in due form has been presented to the Governor by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Shop District of Narembeen praying that Saturday may be substituted in that district for Wednesday as the day on which such shops shall close at one o'clock p.m., and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby substitute Saturday for Wednesday in the Narembeen Shop District accordingly, and do declare that, subject to the said Act, the day on which all shops as aforesaid shall close at one o'clock in the afternoon in the said district shall be Saturday.

WHEREAS it is provided by Subsection (5) of Section 102 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that it shall be lawful for shops to which the said section applies (except those in certain districts named in the subsection) to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week, subject to the provisions of the said subsection, and that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation, issued on the petition of a majority of the shopkeepers affected, determine the day on which such shops shall so remain open in each week for any district; and whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Shop District of Narembeen, praying that the day on which such shops in such district shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Friday, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and determine that, subject to the said Act, the day in each week on which all such shops as aforesaid in the said district shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Friday.

WHEREAS by Section 122, Subsection (1), of "The Health Act, 1911-19," it is provided that no building shall be erected within any Municipal District unless and until plans and specifications thereof have been submitted by the owner or occupier to, and have been approved, in relation to ventilation, lighting, and sanitary construction, and also as to the area of the open space appurtenant to such building by the local authority: And whereas under Subsection (2) of Section 122 the Governor may from time to time declare by Proclamation that Subsection (1) of the said section shall apply in any other district, or in any portion of any other district, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation, and while such declaration remains in force Subsection (1) of the said section shall apply in any such district or portion of such district as if it were a Municipal District: Now, therefore I, the Lieut.-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation declare that Subsection (1) of Section 122 shall apply to the Moora Health District.

The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906.

Municipality of Bunbury—Annexation of Outlying Land.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 349/27.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Governor may annex outlying land, forming with the district of a Municipality one continuous area, to such Municipal District: And whereas it is desirable to annex certain outlying land to the Municipality of Bunbury: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby annex all that outlying land, as described in the Schedule hereto, to the Municipality of Bunbury.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the shores of the Indian Ocean (Koombana Bay) at the South-Western corner of Wellington Location 24, and extending East along the South boundary of the said location to the Western shores of Leschenault Estuary, and Southward and South-Westward along the said Western shore to the North-Eastern boundary of Lot P. 403 (C. Reserve 242), and North-Westward along the said North-Eastern boundary and the North-Eastern boundary of C. Reserve 262 (Location 2818) to the shores of the Indian Ocean, and North-Eastward along the said shores to the starting point.

The Traffic Act, 1919-26.
Darling Range Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1523/26.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a local authority to exercise within its district any power of making regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is advisable to empower the Darling Range Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its district, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Darling Range Road Board, by the By-laws in Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads during such period or periods as the Board may deem necessary within its district, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for that purpose and to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.

Darling Range Road Board.

The Darling Range Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Darling Range Road District:—

The passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic over Brewer Road and Hawtin Road within the Darling Range Road District is prohibited.

For the purposes of this By-law "heavy traffic" shall apply to all vehicles whose load including the weight of the vehicle exceeds two and a-half tons (2½ tons).

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 30 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902-1924," has cancelled the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of August, 1911, relative to subsidies given in connection with the production of merchantable mica and manufactured mica goods, and has substituted the following.

DEVELOPMENT OF MINING.

Part I.—Subsidies on the production of Merchantable Mica and Manufactured Mica Goods.

It is hereby notified, for public information, that for three years from the 1st day of January, 1927, subsidies will be granted in encouragement of the establishment of a local industry in the production of dressed mica and manufactured mica goods from crude mica produced in the State of Western Australia, in the following conditions:—

(1.) Subsidies shall be payable by way of refund of one-half the cost of transport of the crude mica or mica as hand-dressed and sorted at the mine, to the point at which it is manufactured in the State or exported or prepared for export; but if the cost of transport exceeds ten shillings per hundredweight, the subsidy shall not exceed five shillings per hundredweight.

(2.) Claimants for transport subsidies shall render accounts on the Treasury account forms, and shall attach thereto receipts for all the expenditure on which the claim is made.

(3.) No subsidy shall be payable unless the parcel of mineral is of merchantable quality to the satisfaction of the officer appointed by the Government to supervise all subsidised transactions under this notice.

(4.) Subsidies shall also be payable at the rate of fifteen per centum of the selling price realised for mica bringing in a price of not less than two shillings per pound avoirdupois, and twenty per centum of the sale price of such as sells for less than two shillings per pound.

(5.) Claimants for subsidies for mica and mica goods sold shall render accounts on the Treasury accounts forms, and shall attach thereto full accounts

sales to the satisfaction of the Supervising Officer. The subsidies shall be reckoned *ad valorem* on the actual net selling price of the dressed mica or manufactured mica goods in Western Australia.

(6.) Claimants for subsidies either for transport or for dressed mica shall supply the Supervising Officer with all information which he may require in order to check the transactions throughout their whole course, and shall, if required by him, verify such information by making a statutory declaration that it is all true and correct.

(7.) No subsidy shall be payable on any re-sale of mica or mica goods, after subsidy has once been paid or become payable.

(8.) The Supervising Officer appointed by the Government shall have full power and authority to refuse to certify any claims about which he is not fully satisfied, and no such claims will be paid. Details of arrangements as to inspection of mica goods, books, and papers will be left in the hands of the Supervising Officer and claimants must comply with his requirements.

Part II.—Subsidies on Development work for production of Mica.

(1.) A sum of two thousand pounds may be made available for subsidies on development work, first approved by the Supervising Officer, at footage or tonnage rates which shall not exceed the actual half-cost, or such less sum as the Supervising Officer may estimate to be a reasonable half-cost if the work were done by diligent and competent miners.

(2.) Producers of mica wishing to obtain such subsidies shall make application in writing to the Supervising Officer, stating the nature and amount of the work about to be undertaken by them, and their estimate of the cost thereof, and no subsidy shall be payable in respect of any such work done before the date of the application.

(3.) Approved subsidies shall be payable at such periodical intervals as shall be fixed by the Supervising Officer, and the claims therefor shall be put in by each producer in respect of the amount of approved development work done by him in each such period, and will be payable in the order as authorised until the total sum of two thousand pounds shall have been disbursed in subsidy.

(4.) The Supervising Officer shall be the State Mining Engineer or other person duly authorised by the Minister to act as such.

CIGAR, CIGARETTE, AND TOBACCO MANUFACTURERS' EMPLOYEES.

(Registered 20th June, 1927.)

No. 13 of 1927.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this thirteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between Michelides, Ltd. (hereinafter called "the Employer"), of the one part, and the Western Australia Tobacco, Cigar, and Cigarette Manufacturers' Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. Scope of Agreement.—This Agreement shall apply to all employees of the employer who (a) are employed or usually employed in Tobacco, Cigar, and Cigarette Factories, or in establishments engaged in packing, labelling, and distributing such products; (b) whose occupation is that of assisting in the production or putting up for sale of the products or wares of such factories or establishments.

2. Area.—This Agreement shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

3. Term.—This Agreement shall continue in force for a period of three (3) years from and including the eleventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six; provided, that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement hereof, or after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months, any term or terms hereof may be reviewed, revised, and amended at a conference of parties convened by any one party; and provided also, that should the conference fail to arrive at a settlement this Agreement may be terminated and the matter in dispute shall be referred to the Court of Arbitration for settlement.

4. Hours.—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work for all employees; provided that in establishments where at the date of this Agreement a lesser number of hours is being worked, such lesser number of hours shall continue to be observed.

5. Overtime.—For all work performed before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time, overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours, and double time thereafter. For all work performed on Saturday afternoons and Sundays double time shall be paid. For all work performed on specified holidays ordinary time shall be paid in addition to the weekly wage.

6. Holidays.—The following holidays shall be allowed and paid for, viz.:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Anniversary Day, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day, Boxing Day, Christmas Day, Anzac Day, and Labour Day.

7. Annual Leave.—A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of service. An employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his or her service: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of any employee summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

8. Change and Mess Room.—A suitable Change and Mess Room shall be provided for in all establishments.

9. Time and Wages Book.—The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be entered up, a book containing the names of each of his employees to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such employee, and the time during which each such employee has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a representative of the Union during all working hours.

10. First-aid Equipment.—Adequate first-aid equipment shall be provided in all establishments.

11. Engagement.—One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct.

13. Aged and Infirm Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Agreement may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the union. If within twenty-four hours after the worker has notified the secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum, the secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said secretary at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his or her intention to make application to the Magistrate, and the secretary or his agent shall be entitled to attend before the Magistrate and, pending the decision thereon, in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by an employer at the proposed lesser rate. The Magistrate may grant to such worker a permit to work for such wage and for such period not exceeding six calendar months as he thinks fit, and his decision in the matter shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned for such period as may therein be stated until the wage shall have again been settled by the Magistrate, on the application of the said secretary.
