PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse TO WIT. / McMillan, K.C.M.G., Lieut.-Governor R. F. McMILLAN, in and over the State of Western Lieut.-Governor. Australia and its Dependencies in [L.S.] the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," it is enacted that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Act and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said schedule, and also that any Proclamation whereby the names of other animals or birds are added to the Third Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed expedient to add the names of Kangaroos and Brush Kangaroos to the Third Schedule but to restrict this Proclamation in its operation to Moora Vermin District: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieut.-Governor, as deputy of the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby add to the said Third Schedule of the said Act the names of animals known as Kangaroos and Brush Kangaroos for the purposes of the said Act, but this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to that portion of the State constituted and known as Moora Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act.

Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 6 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette* from time to

time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such regulations under the said Act as may be deemed necessary for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, as deputy of the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Excentive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, does hereby make au additional Regulation to the Stock Diseases Act Regulations as follows:--

Introduction of Frozen Pork, Hogs' Hair, and other Pig by-products into this State.

43A. Frozen pork, hogs' hair, and other pig byproducts shall not be imported into this State from any other State in the Commonwealth of Australia except under and subject to the following conditions, namely:--

- Frozen pork shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by a Government Veterinary Officer of the State of origin that the carcases are those of animals which have not been affected with swine fever, and have not been in contact with animals suffering with swine fever.
- (2.) Hogs' hair and other pig by-products shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by a Goverument Veterinary Officer of the State of origin that the said products have been treated by a recognised process of sterilisation, and are not the products from animals affected with swine fever.

Stock Diseases Act, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*

from time to time prohibit the introduction or importation into this State, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place; and whereas outbreaks of swine fever have occurred in the States of Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania, and it is deemed expedient to prohibit the introduction or importation into this State either by sca or land of pigs from any of the said States for a period of six calendar months: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, as deputy of the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Cruneil, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, does hereby prohibit for a period of six calendar months from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette* the introduction or importation into this State either by sea or land of pigs from any of the States of Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania.

PORT OF FREMANTLE.

Western Australia.

Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners for the control and regulation of vessels and persons carrying or handling Inflammable Liquids within the Port.

THE FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

1. In pursuance of powers conferred upon the Fre-mantle Harbour Trust Commissioners by "The Fre-mantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," and its amendments, the following regulations are made for the purpose of properly controlling the carrying and handling of In-flammable Liquids generally within the Port of Fre-mantle viz :-mantle, viz.:-

In these Regulations-

- (a) "Inflammable Liquid" means liquid petroleum, kerosene, and any oil, liquid or spirit derived wholly or in part from any petroleum, shale, schist, coal, peat, bitumen, or any other similar substance, and which has a true flashing point of less than one hundred and fifty degrees Fahrenheit; and any other liquid which the Governor, by proclamation in the Gazette, declares to be an inflammable liquid.
- (b) "Oil Ship" means any ship having on board or having lately had on board any inflammable liquid as eargo or part cargo, and includes a tank steamer, or barge, or other vessel fitted to carry inflammable liquid.
- (c) "Vessel" means any ship other than an oil ship and includes craft of every description capable of floating.
- (d) "Principal Regulations" means and includes all regulations in force made for the government of the Port of Fremantle by the Fremantle Uarbour Trust Commissioners, and all amend-ments of or additions to same made from time to time by the Commissioners, as prescribed by "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," and amendments.
- (e) "Commissioners" means the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners constituted under "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," and '' The amendments.
- (f) "The Trust," "Trust," "The Fremantle Har-bour Trust" means the Fremantle Harbour Trust constituted under "The Fremantle Har-bour Trust Act, 1902."

- (g) "Harbour Master" means the Harbour Master for the Port of Fremantle appointed on the (h) "the Port of Fremantic appointed on the recommendation of the Commissioners, and shall include the Deputy Harbour Master or any person acting under the instructions of the Harbour Master, and may include the Berthing Master or the Secretary.
 (h) "Wharf Manager" means the wharf manager for the Port of Fremantle appointed by the Governor on the recommendation of the Com.
- Governor on the recommendation of the Commissioners and shall include the Secretary or any person acting under the instructions of the Wharf Manager, and may include the Harbour Master.
- (i) "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commissioners appointed by the Governor on the recommendation of the Commissioners and includes any person empowered to act as Secre-tary during the temporary absence of such officer.
- (j) ''Master'' means and includes every person having the command, charge or management of an oil ship for the time being, and the
- of an oil ship for the time being, and the owners of such oil ship and the agents for the owners of such oil ship or its cargo.
 (k) "The Port" or "The Port of Fremantle" means the inner and outer harbours as described in the Schedule to "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," or amendments thereto made as prescribed in such Act.
 (1) "Berth" means any position appointed by the Harbour Master in which the oil ship is or is to be moored, made fast, or anchored.

2. These regulations shall, unless a contrary intention appears, be read and construed as one with the These regulations shall come into force on their ap-

proval by the Governor in Executive Council and pub-lication in the Government Gazette of Western Aus-tralia, as prescribed in "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," or amendments thereto.

The agents for an oil ship intending to load or 3. 5. The agents for an oil ship intending to load or unload in bulk or containers a quantity in excess of 40 gallons of inflammable liquid shall give at least twenty-four hours' notice to the Wharf Manager. Such notice shall be confirmed by the Master on arrival of an incoming oil ship desiring to discharge and be given on the form supplied.

4. (a) The master of an oil ship shall, when nearing the Outer Harbour, and during the whole of the time that such ship may be within the Outer or Inner Harbour, display at the fore masthead or other conspicuous place clear of all obstructions so as to maintain a clear vision all round the horizon of at least one mile in ordinary weather, by daylight the International Code Flag "B," and during all hours of darkness a red light of similar visibility clear of all other lights on the ship.

(b) The master of an oil ship shall not permit the vessel to enter the Inner Harbour until specifically authorised in writing under the hand of the Harbour Master and until the master of the oil ship is in possession of a copy of these Regulations.

(c) The Master of every oil ship shall moor his ship only at such place as the Harbour Master shall from time to time direct, and he shall not remove his ship therefrom except for the purpose of leaving the Port, without the written order of the Harbour Master.

5. The Master of an oil ship, and all other persons concerned shall observe and perform the provisions of this regulation, namely :-

- (a) After being brought into the Inner Harbour, all holds, tanks and spaces containing inflam-mable liquid shall be kept securely closed and fastened down except when opened for the purpose of discharging.
- (b) An oil ship with her cargo in bulk shall not be berthed until she is ready to load or discharge and shall at all times continue and complete such loading or discharging with all possible despatch.
- (c) No hold, tank or space containing inflammable liquid in containers shall be opened until all trucks or other vehicles into which such goods are to be loaded are placed alongside the vessel and all is in readiness to commence the work.

- (d) Before and at all times after entering the Inner Harbour, all holds, tanks or spaces containing inflammable liquid shall be kept properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the Harbour Master and so as to disperse all dangerous vapour that may be generated by the cargo or collected or lie in such places.
- (e) No inflammable liquid shall be loaded on any vessel until the written permission of the Wharf Manager has been obtained.
- (f) An oil ship loading or unloading inflammable liquid in casks, barrels or other receptacles or containers shall work her cargo or carry out any other work on board only as directed by the Harbour Master.
- (g) No inflammable spirit contained in casks, barrels or other receptacles shall be landed in the Port unless they are staunch and free from leakage and all of such strength and construction as not to be liable to be broken or to leak.
- (h) No inflammable liquid shall be loaded or un-loaded except between the hours of sunrise and sunset, and all holds shall be securely covered immediately such operation is dis-continued and within daylight hours.
- (i) In cases where a ship contains a part cargo of inflammable liquid in containers among general cargo or is to load a part cargo of same amongst general cargo, the holds, tanks or compartments in which such liquid is con-tained or is to be stowed, shall not be opened unless and until the unloading or loading is to be undertaken.
- (j) Should it be desired to work at the general cargo during hours other than daylight hours while the oil ship still carries in any place on board inflammable liquid in containers or in bulk it shall not be done or begun unless or until the written permission so to do from the Harbour Master is obtained, who shall not give such permission until he is shown written permission already given by the Director or Deputy Director of Navigation and until he has made a personal inspection of such ship and satisfied himself that such of these regulations as apply have been duly complied with and that all other measures necessary in his discretion have been taken to ensure immunity from danger of accident. The Harbour Master, on his inspection, shall have the power to order certain things to be done if, in his discretion, such are necessary before giving his permission as aforesaid.

6. From the time that holds or tanks of an oil ship are opened for the purpose of discharging or loading inflammable liquid in bulk and until such time as the operations of discharging or loading have been comoberations of discharging or loading have been com-pleted and the ship has been thoroughly ventilated (as provided for in these regulations), no person shall use or permit or suffer to be used any fire or light either on board or within the danger zone. This regulation shall not, however, prohibit the use of a safety lamp approved by the Harbour Master.

No person shall place any inflammable liquid in any shed the property of the Commissioners or otherwise within the boundaries of the harbour or on any wharf unless and until arrangements satisfactory to the Wharf Manager have been made for either its shipment or delivery off the premises of the Trust within full daylight hours.

The following regulations, numbers 8 to 22, relate more directly to bulk cargoes carried in tank steamers, but except where otherwise indicated, apply to the regulation of oil ships generally:--

During the loading or unloading of inflammable 8. liquid, no person shall smoke or heat any combustible matter, rivet or chip iron, or clean boilers or boiler tubes, or carry out other work likely to cause ignition, on board the oil ship or on any other ship lying alongside, nor shall any person engaged in such loading or unloading carry matches or other appliances for providing or capable of causing ignition.

Before any pumping operations of inflammable liquid are commenced, the Master shall see that a competent signalling staff is in attendance both at the tank installation and on board the oil ship, and that telephonic communication between the same points is established.

A responsible person shall be detailed by the Master for attendance on the wharf to superintend the open-ing and closing of valves and for patrol of the pipe line. Pumping operations shall not be commenced before the correct position of all valves has been

verified by the Harbour Master. 10. During the whole time that pumping operations are in progress, the staff referred to in Regulation No. 9 above shall be maintained. The pipe line shall be efficiently patrolled and every precaution is to be taken to prevent any leakage.

While pumping is in progress, the lids, screw caps or other removable covorings of the tanks shall be kept securely fastened or screwed down except so far as may be necessary to enable discharge of the inflammable liquid to proceed; provided that, immedi-ately upon the removal of any lid, serew cap or other covering, safety wire gauzes are properly fitted or other efficient steps taken to prevent the ignition of the inflammable liquid or vapour. It shall be the duty of the Master to observe this regulation and carry it into effect.

11. Regulation 5, Section (h) shall not prevent the discharge from the tanks of a tank steamer between sunset and survise by means of pumping through a pipe where such discharge shall have been commenced before sunset: Provided that at least four hours previous notice in writing shall be given by the Master to the Harbour Master of the desire to continue pumping after sunset.

In the event of any interruption occurring in the pumping between the hours of sunset and sunrise whereby discharge is discontinued, such discharge shall not be recommenced until after sunrise, nor shall any repairs be effected until sunrise.

12. When a tank steamer has completed discharging, shall the connection or connections to the shore pipe line not be broken until the pipe line for its whole length has been completely and satisfactorily cleared of all in-flammable liquid. The satisfactory condition of the pipe line in this respect shall be verified by the Harbour Master.

Immediately discharge of the inflammable liquid is suspended or completed, all lids, screw caps or other coverings are to be replaced, securely fastened down and made gas tight.

13. So soon as possible following completion of discharge the oil ship shall leave the Inner Harbour.

14. The boiler or galley fires of a tank steamer shall not be alight (and it shall be the duty of the Master to see that such boiler and galley fires are not alight) from the time when holds or tanks are first opened for purposes of discharge unless the written authority of the Harbour Master is first obtained.

The boiler fires of a tank steamer which intends to leave the Port immediately after landing her cargo may, with the written consent of the Harbour Master, be relighted while lying alongside for the purpose of raising steam, but not till lids, caps and other removable cover-ings have been replaced, screwed down, and made gas tight.

Any steam required for the running of a dynamo on board an oil ship or for pumping, must (unless expressly otherwise authorised by the Harbour Master) be obtained from a shore station approved by the Harbour Master.

All pipe lines and connections thereto, flexible or 15. otherwise, which may be permitted by the Harbour Master to be used between the oil ship and the berth shall at all times be kept in an oil and vapour tight condition and shall not leak. Should any leakage occur, pumping operations shall be stopped at once. No in-flammable liquid shall be allowed to escape, whether directly or indirectly, into any waters of the Port.

16. The danger zone shall extend a distance of 100 feet from an oil ship in every direction. Such danger zone shall be defined on the ground, and adequate notices, to be supplied by the Commissioners, shall be displayed and kept displayed by the Master to define the danger zone.

17. The Master of an oil ship shall not vermit or suffer any unauthorised person to be on board the ship while loading or unloading of inflammable liquid is in progress, and shall display and keep displayed at her main gangway while occupying any berth in the Port a conspicuous notice to the following effect:-

NO ADMITTANCE.

NO SMOKING ALLOWED.

18. The Master of every oil ship carrying inflam-mable liquid in bulk shall, immediately on the oil ship being berthed, have a steel wire hawser sufficiently strong to enable the oil ship to be hauled away from the berth to enable the oil ship to be hauled away from the berth placed over the fore and aft ends of such oil ship and made securely fast on board, and such hawsers shall remain so long as any inflammable liquid remains on board and until the oil ship has been properly cleansed and ventilated as provided for. 19. The Master of the oil ship shall take all due

19. The Master of the oil ship shall take all due precautions for the prevention of accident by fire in the discharge of inflammable liquid, and he shall, or shall cause a responsible officer to remain on board the ship, together with a sufficient erew, during the whole time of discharge or while any inflammable liquid remains on board. The presence of the Harbour Master will not relieve the Master of this responsibility. 20. The Master of the oil ship shall, when required so to do by the Harbour Master, afford him every reason-able facility to inspect and examine the inflammable liquid on board such oil ship and all appliances in con-nection with same so as to ascertain whether the pro-visions of these regulations are being observed and all

visions of these regulations are being observed and all other means taken towards general safety. 21. Bunker Supplies.—(1) Should it be necessary for an oil ship to replenish her bunker supplies to enable her to leave the Port of Fremantle on the completion of discharge the her of her ship come the Metre shell some of discharge of her oil cargo, the Master shall cause such bunker supplies to be taken before discharge of the oil cargo is undertaken or any preparation whatever made on board to do this.

(2) During the whole time the ship is lying in a berth

(2) During the whole time the ship is lying in a berth to take or is taking in bunker supplies she shall be guarded by watchmen as laid down in these regulations and shall be treated in all respects as an oil ship. 22. (a) The Commissioners will supply watchmen whose duty it shall be to see that these regulations are properly observed, and they shall be empowered to en-force the strict observance of these regulations and all other applicable regulations of the Port, and all other instructions received from: the Harbour Master to ensure instructions received from the Harbour Master to ensure general safety and immunity from danger of accident. Watchmen shall guard the ship and the berth at which she may be moored during the whole time any inflam-mable liquid shall remain on or at such vessel. The Master shall pay or arrange to pay to the Trust the full cost of such watching before such vessel is granted elearance from the Port.

(b) In like manner the Commissioners will appoint watchmen as is considered necessary by the Wharf Manager to watch and guard any inflammable liquid which may remain on any wharf or on any premises of the Trust during hours not full daylight hours, and whose duty it shall be to enforce the strict observance of these predictions and call the condicional result finance. of these regulations and all other applicable regulations of these regulations and an other applicable regulations of the Port and all instructions received from the Wharf Manager, and the Master of the oil ship landing such liquid or the oil ship into which such liquid is intended to be shipped shall pay or arrange to pay to the Commissioners the cost of such watching before being granted charance from the Port.

23. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Pounds (£100) and in addition to such penalty shall pay to the Commissioners any expense or loss incurred by them in consequence of the breach of any such regulation.
